NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (35-36) AT MEMPHIS REDBIRDS (43-29)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes begin a four-game series tonight against the Memphis Redbirds, the only four road contests in a 21-game game stretch leading up to July 4th. NOLA claimed three of five matchups with Memphis at the Shrine from May 30-June 3. A victory tonight would inch the 'Cakes within seven games of the division leaders for the first time since May 26 and return them to .500 for the first time since owning a 23-23 record on May 23.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Scott Van Slyke's sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth scored the game-winning run as the Baby Cakes rallied to beat Sacramento, 9-8. The 'Cakes allowed leads of 5-0 and 7-5 to slip away before answering to complete the four-game sweep. Van Slyke opened the scoring with a two-run homer in the second, and NOLA added three runs in the fifth before the River Cats used back-to-back home runs off Pablo Lopez in the sixth to close within 5-3. Tyler Kinley allowed three consecutive two-out hits in the eighth, capped by Trevor Brown's two-run double as Sacramento tied the game, only for the Baby Cakes to get a pair of runs in the bottom half to go back in front, 7-5. But Kinley was again unable to protect the lead, giving up four straight singles to open the ninth, and Mike Kickham hit a batter with the bases loaded for an 8-7 River Cats lead. The 'Cakes came back with two walks and a single against Tyler Rogers in the bottom half, and a walk to Eric Campbell forced in the tying run ahead of Van Slyke's game-winning fly ball.

ON THE HILL – Jarlin Garcia makes his third start for the Baby Cakes. Garcia surrendered a three-run homer in the first inning of his Triple-A debut on June 7 in Las Vegas, but has since worked 6.1 scoreless frames, including blanking Fresno for 4.1 innings last Thursday, when he held the Grizzlies hitless in seven at-bats with runners on base. Garcia held a 4.41 ERA (25 ER/51.0 IP) in 12 appearances (six starts) for the Marlins while limiting opponents to a .219 batting average (41x187) before being optioned to New Orleans on June 3.

DEAN OF HITS – Despite striking out as a pinch hitter on Tuesday, Austin Dean has hit safely in 13 of his last 15 games, batting .328 (20x61). Dean owns a .346 average overall between NOLA and AA Jacksonville, ranking 12th in all of Minor League Baseball, after hitting .420 (34x81) in 22 games at Double-A to be named April's Southern League Player of the Month, pacing the circuit in batting average, hits, total bases (53), slugging (.654) and OPS (1.120). Dean is batting .343 (35x102) in 25 games for the 'Cakes since moving into the leadoff spot.

HOT SOUP – Over his last 46 games, dating to April 26, Eric Campbell is batting .374 (61x163), second-best in the PCL in that span to Reno's Socrates Brito (.382). His .460 on-base percentage in that time leads the league, while his 39 RBI are tied for fourth-most. Campbell has driven in 20 runs in June, tied with Fresno's AJ Reed for the league lead this month, and has posted three straight multi-hit games to boost his team-leading total to 23. Campbell is 10th in the PCL batting race (.337).

JUNE BOOM – New Orleans boasts a .288 team batting average this month, ranking sixth among PCL clubs. The 'Cakes had hit just .225 in April, the club's lowest over a full month since hitting .222 in May 2008, while the .288 mark would be the best over a full month since hitting .298 in July 2011. NOLA has scored 97 runs in 17 games, averaging 5.7 per contest, after averaging 3.5 in April and 5.4 in May.

HOME SWEEP HOME – At 22-13, the 'Cakes own the third-best home record in the PCL, behind Oklahoma City (27-9) and Colorado Springs (22-12). New Orleans completed its first home sweep of a series of at least three games since taking four straight against Omaha from June 9-12, 2016. The only other series sweep of Sacramento was a four-game set at the Shrine from June 2-4, 2001.

SLYKE FATHER SLYKE SON – Scott Van Slyke homered in back-to-back contests for the second time in the last eight games (June 11 and 13). Over his last nine games, he is 11x29 (.379) with six walks, three doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI. His four RBI on Tuesday were a season high and was the sixth four-RBI effort by a Baby Cake this season, lifting his June RBI total to 17, tied with Omaha's Frank Schwindel for third-most in the PCL. Van Slyke had been 2x28 in his previous seven games since returning from a one-month stint on the disabled list on June 2.

TOMAS THE TANK – Tomas Telis has hit safely in 13 of 15 games at home, where he is hitting .390 (23x59). On the road, Telis is batting .247 (19x77). Since joining the 'Cakes on May 4, Telis has picked up 41 hits - 38 of which have been singles - to rank among the top 20 in the PCL in that span. Dating back to May 23 last season, Telis owns a .330 batting average (94x285) over his last 73 games with New Orleans.

ON THIS DATE ...

2007: New Orleans scores five times in the bottom of the eighth to rally past Omaha, 9-5. Mike DiFelice finishes with three RBI, including a run-scoring single in the winning rally, which is highlighted by Jake Gautreau's three-run homer.

MAGNIFICENT MAGGY – Magneuris Sierra has hit safely in 15 of his last 18 games, hitting .310 (22x71). In his last 24 starts, Sierra has compiled a .307 average (31x101) with six doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and 16 runs scored. During the five-game set against Memphis at the Shrine three weeks ago, Sierra went 7x19 with two doubles and two homers.

MR. ECLIPSE – Peter Mooney reached base in all four plate appearances on Tuesday, going 3x3 with a hit by pitch. He has hit safely in 10 of his 11 starts this season, encompassing a two-month stint on the disabled list (fractured thumb). Mooney homered in three consecutive games in the Baby Cakes' visit to AutoZone Park last August 20-22, and all four of his home runs in 2017 were against Memphis.

WHAT A RELIEF – Javy Guerra has pitched 8.1 shutout frames in six appearances since being activated from the disabled list. Dating back to his final six outings with the Baby Cakes last season, owns a 17.2-inning scoreless streak. Guerra has not surrendered a hit in converting each of his three save opportunities.

COMEBACK CAKES – The Baby Cakes recorded their 17th come from behind victory, a mark not reached until August 13 last season. NOLA notched its fourth walk-off win, and second when trailing entering the bottom of the ninth (May 1 vs. Round Rock).

ROSTER MOVES – Right-hander Jumbo Diaz has been placed on the disabled list, and right-hander Nick Wittgren has been reinstated from the Marlins' disabled list, ending his rehab assignment. 1B/OF Garrett Cooper has joined New Orleans on a rehab assignment (wrist tendon).

NAWLINS NOTES – The Baby Cakes went 13x34 (.382) with runners in scoring position in the Sacramento series, after going 15x69 (.217) in the previous seven games ... Cristhian Adames is hitting .452 (14x31) over his last eight road games, with five doubles, one triple, two homers and 7 RBI.

2018 SEASON

JARLIN THE MARLIN – Appearing on the first Opening Day roster of his career, Garcia pitched in 12 games (six starts) for the Marlins, going 1-1 with a 4.41 ERA.

STARTING STRONG – Through his first six appearances, Garcia held a 1.09 ERA (3 ER/31.0 IP), and his 0.78 ERA (2 ER/23.0 IP) as a starter led all MLB starting pitchers with at least four starts. Opponents were hitting .132 in those starts, the best mark in MLB ahead of Justin Verlander (.146) and Johnny Cueto (.150), and Garcia had allowed one hit in 21 at-bats (.048) with runners in scoring position.

BEAT THE BOMBERS – Garcia earned his first win as a starter on 4/17 at Yankee Stadium, limiting New York to one hit 5.0 shutout innings. With his 4.0 hitless innings to start the game, he tied Bobo Holloman (1953) for the most consecutive hitless innings to begin career as a starter since 1900.

I LOVE LA – On 4/23 at the Dodgers, Garcia tied a career high with 6.0 innings pitched and recorded a career-high seven strikeouts, while allowing one run, four hits, and one walk. Became the only Marlins starter in franchise history to limit opponents to four-hits-or-fewer and one-or-no runs in each of his first three career starts.

STINGY – Garcia allowed a total of five hits over his first three starts and 10 hits over first four starts, both the fewest of any starter in Marlins history. Four others held the previous three-start record of nine, while Brad Hand had the four-start mark, limiting opponents to 13 hits over his first four starts in 2011. Dating back to 1913, only 10 MLB pitchers allowed fewer hits in their first four career starts.

TRIPLE-A DEBUT – In his Triple-A debut on 6/7 at Las Vegas, Garcia allowed three runs on four hits in 3.0 innings of a no-decision. He surrendered a three-run homer to Patrick Kivlehan in the opening frame and permitted five of the six right-handed hitters he faced to reach base (3x4 with two walks).

2017 IN REVIEW

HEY ROOKIE – In his first MLB campaign, Garcia led the Marlins bullpen with 68 appearances to rank 18th in the National League and second among NL rookies to Cincinnati's Wandy Peralta (69). He stranded 34x42 inherited baserunners (81.0%), seventh-best among NL relievers, and his .235 batting average against ranked sixth among NL rookie relievers.

MLB DEBUT – Garcia started the season with AA Jacksonville, hurling 4.0 scoreless frames in three games before being recalled on 4/14. In his debut that night against the Mets, he tossed a scoreless sixth inning and fanned Rene Rivera for his first career strikeout.

BIG FISH – Garcia allowed one run in 9.0 IP over his first 10 appearances. Through an 18-game stretch from 5/23-6/29, he surrendered one earned run in 12.0 innings.
