NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (49-56) vs. TACOMA RAINIERS (52-53)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue a seven-game homestand tonight with the second of a four-game set against the Tacoma Rainiers. The 'Cakes have gone 1-4-1 over the last six matchups with Tacoma, including dropping three of four at Cheney Stadium last year. New Orleans had won six straight against Pacific Conference foes until falling the last two nights.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Former New Orleans right-hander Bryan Evans carried a shutout into the seventh inning, and Tacoma snapped a nine-game losing streak with a 4-2 win over the Baby Cakes. David Freitas led off the second with a double and scored after an error by Isan Diaz, and another leadoff double - by Adam Law in the fifth - led to Tacoma's second run on a John Andreoli single. Cam Perkins opened the sixth with a home run to boost the Rainiers' lead to 3-0. The 'Cakes threatened in four of the first five innings but were held hitless in nine at-bats with runners in scoring position against Evans, until Austin Dean delivered a bases-loaded single off Tyler Higgins in the seventh to draw New Orleans within a run. Tacoma tacked on an insurance run against Joe Gunkel in the ninth on Ian Miller's sacrifice fly, and Shawn Armstrong worked around a walk and an infield single in the bottom half to record the save. Dillon Peters took the loss by allowing three runs - two earned - in 5.2 IP.

ON THE HILL – Zac Gallen is set to make his team-leading 19th start of the season. After needing only seven pitches to retire the side in order in a spotless sixth inning during the Triple-A All-Star Game, Gallen has won back-to-back starts since the break, yielding one run and seven hits in 12.0 innings. Tonight marks his first start at home in a month, since allowing five runs in 5.2 innings of a June 28 loss to Iowa. Over his first six outings at the Shrine, Gallen was 3-1 with a 0.50 ERA, including 29.0 straight scoreless innings to begin the year. His 3.80 ERA entering tonight ranks seventh in the PCL.

HOT SOUP – Eric Campbell moved into a tie for the team lead with his 19th double last night. He also leads the team in multi-RBI efforts (16) and multi-hit games (29). Over his last 74 games, since April 26, Campbell tops the PCL in batting average (.344) and ranks second in on-base percentage (.455), while also placing ninth in RBI (53) in that span. The PCL All-Star is eighth in the league batting race (.322) and ranks second in OBP (.435). In 26 career games against Tacoma, Campbell is hitting .305 (29x95) with five doubles, two triples, two home runs and 11 RBI.

TO THE MOON – Peter Mooney recorded an RBI in every game of the Reno series, finishing the series 5x10 with four runs scored and four RBI. He is 18x57 (.316) in his last 18 games with 18 RBI and four home runs, after totaling just four RBI and zero home runs in his first 28 games. In 22 games at the Shrine, Mooney is batting .370 (27x73) compared with a .238 mark (15x63) in 22 contests on the road. Mooney's 18 RBI in July rank 11th in the PCL, and are the most in any month during his seven-year career, surpassing the 10 RBI in July and August last season.

31 ALWAYS – The Baby Cakes retired jersey number 31 during a pre-game ceremony last night in honor of Wally Pontiff, Jr., who wore the number as an All-American third baseman at LSU prior to his passing in 2002. The Pontiff Classic featuring LSU has been played at the Shrine on Airline in Pontiff's native Metairie annually since 2004 and has raised more than \$1.5 million for charitable organizations.

DEAN OF HITS – Austin Dean had three hits and drove in both 'Cakes runs last night, and has hit safely in seven of his last eight games, batting .400 (12x30). It was his 20th multi-hit effort and fifth game with at least three hits. Dean owns a .332 batting average between NOLA and AA Jacksonville, good for 15th in all of Minor League Baseball. He hit .420 (34x81) in 22 games at Double-A to be named April's Southern League Player of the Month, pacing the circuit in batting average, hits, total bases (53), slugging (.654) and OPS (1.120). Dean is hitting .326 (68x207) when hitting in the top half of the Baby Cakes lineup, compared with .224 (13x58) when hitting sixth or lower.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway is batting .328 (22x70) in his last 23 games with four home runs and nine RBI, despite going hitless last night for the first time in 12 starts. He is one home run away from becoming the first player in club history to have multiple seasons reaching double-digit home runs and stolen bases (10 homers, 31 stolen bases in 2016). His 20 stolen bases are tied for fourth-most in the PCL and have extended his New Orleans career record to 70, and he is tied for fifth in the PCL with 63 runs scored.

CALL TO ARMS – The 'Cakes boast a 3.51 ERA in 23 July games, behind only Memphis (2.45) for the league lead this month. In 15 games since the All-Star break, New Orleans starters have pitched to a 2.92 ERA (31 ER/95.2 IP). Dillon Peters gave up two earned runs or fewer for the fourth consecutive start, posting a 2.78 ERA in that span.

AWW SHUCKS – J.B. Shuck reached base in all four plate appearances last night, going 2x2 with a pair of walks, and is 10x24 (.417) with three doubles in his last seven games. Shuck is 14x43 (.326) when hitting in the lower third of the lineup, and 2x21 (.095) when hitting first through fifth.

ERRONEOUS – The Baby Cakes had just two errors in 10 games before committing a season-high four on Thursday and two more last night, both by Isan Diaz. It was the second straight game a Baby Cake had two errors (Jon Rodriguez); Austin Nola was previously the only other player with a two-error game this season, on July 7 at Colorado Springs. New Orleans, which has not finished lower than fourth in the league in fielding since 2014, has dropped from fourth to seventh (.981).

FRIENDLY CONFINES – Jose Quijada recorded the final seven outs on Wednesday, including three via strikeout, the eighth time in 16 outings he has worked at least 2.0 innings. In eight appearances at home, Quijada has surrendered one run in 14.0 innings (0.61 ERA) with 23 strikeouts, and opponents are batting .154 (8x52).

ROSTER MOVES – Left-hander Mike Kickham has been placed on the disabled list, retroactive to July 25, and the 'Cakes have added lefty Dylan Lee from AA Jacksonville. Lee was unscored upon in 15.0 innings with the Jumbo Shrimp, going 1-0 with three saves, 19 strikeouts and one walk.

NAWLINS NOTES – Austin Nola has a hit in eight of his last nine games compiling a .333 average (10x30) ... New Orleans fell to 23-34 in contests decided by one or two runs, a .404 win percentage which is second-worst in the PCL (Albuquerque, .386) ... Eric Campbell started at shortstop for the first time since April 26, 2014 vs. Tacoma while with Las Vegas.

2018 SEASON

GALLANT EFFORT – Gallen blanked Nashville on four hits for 6.0 innings in his season debut on 4/6, becoming the first New Orleans pitcher to finish with at least 6.0 scoreless innings in his team debut since Sam Dyson shut out Reno for 6.0 innings on August 5, 2013.

SEVENTH HEAVEN – With 7.0 shutout innings on 4/21 vs. Oklahoma City, Gallen became the first Baby Cakes pitcher to work at least 7.0 innings in 2018. Gallen held the Dodgers to four hits and fanned five to record his second victory. He repeated the feat on 5/3 vs. Round Rock with 7.0 scoreless frames in a no-decision with a season-high six strikeouts.

HOME SWEET HOME – Gallen did not surrender a run over his first four starts at home, pitching 26.0 consecutive scoreless innings to open the season. Opponents batted .204 (19x93) and just .048 (1x21) with runners in scoring position. The streak ended at 29.0 IP on 6/2 vs. Memphis when Anthony Garcia led off the fourth inning with a home run.

K MAN – With nine strikeouts in 6.0 IP on 5/9 at Round Rock, Gallen equaled his career high, set twice in 2017 with High-A Palm Beach. It was Gallen's fifth quality start in his first seven outings of the season.

CENTURY MARK – Gallen threw 107 pitches in a no-decision on 6/2 vs. Memphis, a new career high. Gallen had never thrown more than 100 pitches, a plateau reached twice in 2017 while with High-A Palm Beach. He surpassed the mark with 111 pitches on 6/28 vs. Iowa, most by a NOLA pitcher in 2018.

LIMITING THE DAMAGE – Though opponents batted .284 against Gallen through his first 13 starts, he yielded only a .213 average (20x94) with runners in scoring position. Each of the four home runs he surrendered came with the bases empty.

DIRTY DOZEN – Colorado Springs knocked Gallen for 12 hits in 4.2 innings on 7/3, matching Jarlin Garcia (6/27 vs. Iowa) for the most hits surrendered by a Baby Cakes pitcher in 2018. The Sky Sox used three home runs, a career high against Gallen, to score nine runs, the first time in 45 career starts he allowed more than five runs in a game.

YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR – For the second straight season, Gallen earned league All-Star honors as he was selected to the PCL squad by ranking ninth in the league with a 3.43 ERA through his first 15 starts. Gallen needed just seven pitches to retire the International League side in order in the sixth inning of the Triple-A All-Star Game on 7/11.

ROAD WOES – Across his first nine road assignments, Gallen went 1-3 with a 6.85 ERA (33 ER/43.1 IP). Opponents batted .358 (67x187), and plated at least four runs in six of the nine starts.

BACK ON TRACK – Gallen snapped a nine-start winless drought with 6.0 innings of one-run, three-hit ball on 7/16 at Oklahoma City. He finished 2-0 with a 2.50 ERA in three starts against the Dodgers.
