NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (4-6) AT OMAHA STORM CHASERS (6-4)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes wrap-up their first road trip of the year with the final game of the four game set against the Omaha Storm Chasers. Omaha leads the series 2-1. The teams split 16 meetings last season, with each club winning five times on the other's home turf. The Baby Cakes swept four games at Werner Park from May 4-7, the first time New Orleans had swept a series of at least three games in Omaha since taking five straight at Rosenblatt Stadium from May 19-22, 1997.

LAST TIME OUT – A wild offensive game on Sunday had a combined 21 runs and 28 hits and Omaha edged the visiting Baby Cakes 11-10. Omaha had six hitters with multi-hit games led by Nikki Lopez and Bubba Starling's three hits. Isaac Galloway, Matt Snyder each homered for the 'Cakes and Monte Harrison added a grand slam but New Orleans late rally fell a run short. Scott Blewett earned the win and Tim Hill earned his second save of the season.

ON THE HILL – Elieser Hernandez is set to make his second start of the season this afternoon. The 23-year-old was a selected as a Rule-5 draft selection last year and spent the full season with the Marlins and pitched in 32 games. He was 2-7, with a 5.21 ERA in 32 games, six starts in the Majors. He did make a rehab start for New Orleans against Omaha in September and allowed three runs on five hits in 2.2 innings. Hernandez worked five innings in 2019 debut for the 'Cakes allowing two runs on four hits in a no-decision against the Express.

RISPY BUSINESS – The 'Cakes were 3x11 with runners in scoring position yesterday and are now 9x31 in the series. For the season the club has compiled a .198 average (18x91) on the year. The Baby Cakes hit .271 with RISP last year, the team's best mark since 2007.

THE SKIPPER – Keith Johnson leaves PCL foe Salt Lake to take the helm of the Baby Cakes for 2019 as the 16th skipper in franchise history. He managed the Bees from 2011-2018, winning 468 games which was three shy of the franchise record, and was named PCL Manager of the Year in 2013 after reaching the league championship series. In his minor-league managing career, he compiled a career record of 679-711 (.488).

ROAD WARRIOR – Isaac Galloway has homered in three of his last four games and is 7x14 on the road this season. He delivered a pinch hit home run in game two of a doubleheader Saturday. It was the first pinch hit home run for New Orleans since Peter O'Brien smashed one on August 7, 2018 at Albuquerque. The 'Cakes hit a pair of pinch hit home runs last season. Galloway leads the team with four home runs this season. He has 37 career home runs with New Orleans, moving him past Jason Alfaro for sixth place in franchise history. Galloway is second in club history with 380 games played, Raul Chavez is number one at 396. Galloway is also in top five for runs, hits, at bats, and triples.

DAY BASEBALL – New Orleans is on a unprecedented string of five consecutive day games. The 'Cakes are 1-5 this season in day contests this season, and have dropped four of those games by one run. The club is hitting .256 scoring 5.8 RPG and a 5.98 ERA under the sun. The 'Cakes were 15-15 in day games last season.

GALLANT HONOURED – Zac Gallen has been named PCL Pitcher of the Week for April 4-14. Through his first two starts, Gallen has yet to walk a batter and has struck out 19, three more than any other Triple-A pitcher. Opponents are hitting .071 (3x42) and Gallen owns a 0.23 WHIP, both PCL bests and trailing only Buffalo's Dusty Isaacs (.056/0.18) among Triple-A hurlers. This is Gallen's second career weekly award, having taken Texas League honors with Springfield for July 10-16, 2017.

LONELIEST NUMBER – Seven of the ten games have been one-run affairs. Three of the four victories have been decided by one run. The 'Cakes played in a league-leading 51 one-run contests last year, six more than the next-closest team (Omaha), finishing 23-28.

MONTE PYTHON – Monte Harrison has four hits in his last nine at bats and crushed his first Triple-A Grand Slam on Sunday afternoon. A one-time football and baseball commit to the University of Nebraska, Harrison after fell one home run shy of a 20/20 campaign with AA Jacksonville in 2018. He ranked second among Marlins farmhands in homers (19) and stolen bases (28) while picking up mid- and postseason Southern League All-Star accolades, then hit .290 with a .383 on-base in 19 Arizona Fall League games to earn a spot in the Rising Stars Game.

THE LONG BALL – New Orleans has allowed 17 home runs, second most in the PCL, Reno has allowed a league leading 18. NOLA gave up 14 homers in the five-game series vs. Round Rock, the most in franchise history through the season's first five contests, surpassing the eight allowed to Memphis in 2017.

NO RELIEF – Brian Moran's blown save Thursday was the Baby Cakes' fifth through seven games, behind only San Antonio (8) for tops in the PCL. The relief corps has surrendered 11 home runs in just 30 innings. Tommy Eveld has yielded homers in three of first four Triple-A outings and four overall, doubling his total in 110 previous career appearances (127.0 IP).

HITS KEEP COMING – Harold Ramirez has hit safely in eight of ten games, going 9x36 (.250) with a double, a home run and six RBI. Ramirez won the Eastern League batting title with New Hampshire last year (.320), then claimed the Venezuelan Winter League crown as well (.381).

ROBBERY – The 'Cakes allowed a season high six stolen bases on Sunday, the most since May 16, 2008 in Nashville. The team allowed a season high three last season. Opponents have been successful nine of thirteen times this year.

THE DH – New Orleans designated hitters are batting .194 on the season (6x31) with one home run and two RBI. New Orleans is 3-4 against American League foes.

NAWLINS NOTES – The 'Cakes are 16-8 all-time on Patriots Day, and 4-1 against Omaha. NOLA lost to Omaha in 2017. Jon Berti has reached base in each of his nine games and owns a .486 OBP, second in the PCL with ten walks ... Bryan Holaday has five hits, three have been doubles; he had five last year in 61 games with Miami ... New Orleans has dropped three of five games when leading after five innings. The Baby Cakes have split both doubleheader's this season and have another one scheduled for Wednesday against Iowa.

2019 SEASON

DOUBLE TROUBLE– Hernandez gave up only four hits in his season debut on April 9 at Iowa. The problem, however, was that they came back-to-back twice, and three of them were doubles, resulting in a run in each of the first and fifth innings. Apart from those four at-bats, Hernandez walked a pair and hit two batters.

EL-EASING INTO IT– Hernandez made a pair of two-inning appearances early in MLB spring training: 2/26 vs. Houston and 3/4 vs. Washington. In both outings, he allowed only one hit. In the first game, the Astros did not score and struck out twice. The Nationals, however, drew a pair of walks and were hit by a pitch, leading to two scores. In both games, Hernandez recorded the win.

2018 SEASON

ELIESER IN WONDERLAND – Miami selected Hernandez in the Rule 5 Draft, committing to placing him on the 25-man roster if healthy for the entirety of the season. He made 32 appearances for the Marlins, including six starts. He was placed on the DL twice, and pitched in six minor league games to rehab.

MONTH IN THE MAYKING – Hernandez made his MLB debut on 5/10, after recovering from a tooth infection and making four minor league appearances. A month after his expected arrival, he made up for lost time by allowing only three runs in 13.0 innings across May to start his career with a 2.50 ERA.

THE BIG DAY – After the game got out of hand against the Braves on 5/10, Hernandez took an MLB mound for the first time in the seventh inning on the wrong side of a 7-2 score. In two innings, he allowed only two hits, throwing 21 of his 32 pitches for strikes.

POULTRY DINNER – It took two months and 15 games for Hernandez to get his first win, which came in relief on 7/11 against Milwaukee. He struck out three, issued a walk and allowed one hit in the 11th and 12th innings before Starlin Castro walked it off with a single. He wouldn't have to wait long for his next victory, which came in his next appearance four days later vs. Philadelphia.

SLUGGER SLAYER – Hernandez handled the top of the order better than the rest of the lineup on the first rotation through, pitching to a 1.29 ERA in the first frame of the game. In seven first innings at the MLB level, he allowed only one run on six hits, striking out five and walking two. His second inning ERA jumped to 4.70, and his third inning reached 6.75.

ROADSIDE ASSISTANCE – After 27 MLB appearances, Hernandez worked backwards and made his AAA and Baby Cakes debut on 9/2, in a rehab start. He threw 2.2 innings against Omaha, striking out a pair but allowing three runs (two earned) on five hits with a homer. He was activated from the DL two days later and returned to the Marlins.

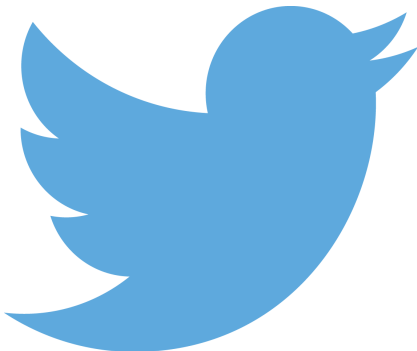
