NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (56-51) AT LAS VEGAS AVIATORS (63-46)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes open August with the rubber match of a three-game set against Las Vegas. The Baby Cakes are in search of their first series win since taking three of five in Memphis from June 29-July 3. New Orleans fell to 50-51 all-time vs. Las Vegas, including 29-28 in Sin City. NOLA is 9-7 against the Pacific Conference and won five of seven in El Paso and Albuquerque from June 12-18.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Two big innings early on were enough for Las Vegas to pull away with a 9-7 victory over the Baby Cakes. New Orleans starter Robert Dugger allowed a four-spot in the first on six hits, including three straight singles and a three-run homer by Corban Joseph. Dugger threw clean innings in the second and third, as the offense chipped away at the early lead with a Peter O'Brien solo home run and an Eddy Alvarez RBI ground out to score Billy Fleming. But the Aviators' bats awakened again in the fourth, this time for five runs, two off Dugger and three unearned runs against reliever Jordan Milbrath, who combined with Tyler Stevens and Brian Moran to keep Las Vegas off the board over the final four frames. The 'Cakes rallied behind Rosell Herrera's RBI single in the sixth, then put up three in the seventh on Magneuris Sierra's triple and Isan Diaz's two-run homer. Herrera drew the 'Cakes within two in the eighth with solo homer, but the comeback effort came up short as Kyle Lobstein retired the side in order in the ninth.

ON THE HILL – Cody Poteet looks to build off a dominant performance last time out in his sixth start at Triple-A. On July 25 at Memphis, Poteet became the third New Orleans starter to pitch into the eighth inning, allowing just one run and five hits over his 7.1 frames. Four of his five starts have come on the road, where Poteet owns a 2.95 ERA (7 ER/21.1 IP), but he has yet to be involved in a decision. The 24-year-old right-hander opened the year with AA Jacksonville and pitched to a 2.25 ERA in 13 starts to earn Southern League All-Star recognition.

DIAZZLING – Isan Diaz launched his career-best 25th home run, five more than his previous high in 2016 with Low-A Wisconsin, tying him for sixth in the PCL. He is the 10th player in franchise history with 25 homers in a season, most recently Kyle Jensen (27) in 2014. With a 17-game hit streak from May 29-June 16 and a 12-gamer from July 12-25, Diaz is the team's first player with multiple double-digit streaks since 2015, when both Reid Brignac and Miguel Rojas did so. In 67 games since May 11, he is batting .339 (83x245) with 14 doubles, 22 home runs, 52 RBI and 61 runs scored. Over the stretch, his 22 homers are tied with Reno's Yasmany Tomas for the PCL lead while his 1.105 OPS paces the circuit. Diaz's 84 runs scored are tied for second in the league and are the team's most since 2007, when Fernando Tatis (90), Andy Tracy (88) and Anderson Hernandez (84) reached the mark.

DINGER DETAILS – The 'Cakes clobbered 42 home runs in July to rank seventh in the PCL and reached 40 home runs in a month for the second time this season, joining the club-record 47 in May. New Orleans had previously hit 40 home runs in a month only three times since 1997. NOLA has eclipsed 30 home runs in four consecutive months for the first time ever to bring its season total to a franchise-record 161, surpassing 2012's total of 153, 86 of which have come on the road, the most since 2012 (90). The Baby Cakes went deep in 22 of 24 games in July and tallied six games with at least three.

DOG DAYS – New Orleans enters August with a winning record for the first time since 2012 (60-51). Since 2013, NOLA has been an average 9.3 games under .500 on August 1, with a franchise-worst 39-68 in 2017. The team's best record on the date came in 2001, at 66-41. The 'Cakes finished July with an 11-13 mark, their first losing month of the campaign.

FOR STARTERS – Despite recent struggles, the Baby Cakes' starting rotation continues to pace the PCL with a 4.28 ERA and .253 opponents average. The starters have notched 571 strikeouts, 61 more than second-place Iowa among PCL clubs, to put them on pace for a team-record 742, surpassing 2012 (645). While working a league-most 563.2 innings, they have issued the third-fewest walks (178). In 17 games since the All-Star break, the rotation has a 6.11 ERA (60 ER/88.1 IP) with five quality starts.

THE WHIFF – The Baby Cakes struck out 10 times to finish with 235 in July, tied for third-most in the PCL. They fanned at least eight times in 19 of 24 games last month, reaching double digits 13 times. NOLA is on pace for a club-record 1,214 strikeouts, surpassing 2013 (1,206).

ROSEY – Rosell Herrera extended his hitting streak to four games to match his season best, after going 1x19 in his previous six. In his last three games, going back to July 26, he has two home runs, a double, three RBI and three runs. Last night was his first multi-hit effort in nine games.

ON THIS DATE ...

2005: Chad Durbin pitches 7.1 scoreless innings, striking out seven to lift New Orleans to a 2-1 win over Tucson. Tyrell Godwin's home run to lead off the fifth breaks a scoreless tie, and his single in the seventh leads to NOLA's other run.

GRASSY NULL – Peter O'Brien recorded his fourth outfield assist and NOLA's 30th, ranking fourth in the PCL and two behind Nashville for the lead. Gabriel Guerrero has eight outfield assists, tied for fifth-most.

MAGNEURIS EFFECT – Magneuris Sierra legged out his team-leading fourth triple and became the fourth Baby Cake to record a double and triple in the same game, joining Lewis Brinson, Yangervis Solarte

and Wilkin Castillo. His nine career triples with the 'Cakes are 11th-most in team history. Sierra hit safely for the fourth time in his last five games after going hitless in six of his previous eight.

ALL I DO IS HIT – Rosell Herrera's home run was the 14th by a NOLA designated hitter, the PCL's second most among NL-affiliated clubs behind El Paso. Baby Cakes DHs have hit safely in 10 of their last 13 games and are hitting .299, third in the league, and rank second with a 1.026 OPS.

ROSTER MOVES – The Marlins activated infielder Jon Berti from the IL and recalled right-hander Tyler Kinley prior to last night's game, and today recalled right-hander Kyle Keller. New Orleans has added lefty Dylan Lee from AA Jacksonville and outfielder Jesus Sanchez, who was acquired from the Tampa Bay Rays in a trade yesterday.

NAWLINS NOTES – New Orleans is 16-11 in series finales, but has lost the last four ... Tyler Stevens struck out four in 2.0 innings in his Baby Cakes debut ... Peter O'Brien hit his first home run in eight games, his longest homerless drought of the season ... Eddy Alvarez committed his fourth error in July, tied with 10 others for the most in the PCL ... Jesus Sanchez (October 7, 1997) becomes the first player in franchise history to be born after the opening of the Shrine on Airline (April 11, 1997) ... Brian Moran has stranded 11 of the last 12 baserunners he has inherited, and 24 of 34 on the year ... New Orleans is 21-32 in games decided by one or two runs, the second-worst record in the PCL (Memphis, 17-32).

2019 SEASON

LAST TIME OUT – Poteet became the third ‘Cakes pitcher to reach the eighth inning, joining Zac Gallen (April 28) and Hector Noesi (June 29), twirling a gem at Memphis on 7/25. Poteet threw seven shutout innings to begin the game, and got one out in the eighth before allowing a single to Randy Arozarena before being relieved. Poteet struck out only three and walked a pair, but induced nine ground outs.

BIRD TAMER – Despite allowing eight hits, Poteet allowed only two runs in the first Triple-A start of his career on 6/30 at Memphis. The Redbirds hit .421 in the game against him, but only one hit went for extra bases. He followed it up with seven shutout innings before an inherited run scored in the eighth on 7/25. The Redbirds, despite going 13x44 (.295) against Poteet in 12.0 innings, mustered only three runs.

QUALITY HITS – For the third time in as many starts, Poteet allowed at least eight hits, reaching a new high (nine) on 7/13 at Nashville. But Poteet also tallied his first quality start at the level, by allowing only two runs, each on solo homers in the sixth. Eight of Poteet's allowed hits came after the fourth.

FORE! – San Antonio hit four home runs in 6.1 innings against Poteet on 7/5, one more than the total he allowed in his first 14 starts of the season. It was the most surrendered by a New Orleans starter since Chris Narveson gave up four in El Paso on 5/16/16. Poteet scattered five runs and eight hits and struck out seven without a walk in a no-decision.

SHOOT TO KRILL – In 13 starts for the Jumbo Shrimp, Poteet went 5-3 with a 2.25 ERA (21 ER/84.0 IP). He gave up only three home runs, and didn't allow a long ball in his last seven games. After allowing five runs (three earned) on 5/6, matching a season high, he lasted at least 6.0 innings in the final eight starts, eclipsing 7.0 four times and 8.0 twice, with a 1.42 ERA (nine ER/57.0 IP).

PROMOTION WORTHY – Poteet allowed only three runs across his final 23.1 innings in Double-A, spanning three starts, before getting called up. His ERA across the stretch sat at 1.16 (three ER/23.1 IP). On 6/9 and 6/14, he turned in back-to-back starts of at least 8.0 innings, including 8.1 on 6/14, a new career-high. On 6/23, he struck out 11, one shy of his career best. Across the trio of appearances he allowed only nine hits and six walks, to a 0.64 WHIP and .117 average against.

2018 SEASON IN REVIEW

JUPITER REFRESHER – After starting the season 2-9 with a 6.10 ERA in his first 15 starts for Jacksonville, Poteet was sent to Jupiter on 7/4. After throwing a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) there, he returned to Double-A. In his final seven games for the Jumbo Shrimp, Poteet pitched to a much-improved 4.16 ERA.

SHOOTING DOWN THE BARON – Poteet reached the 8.0 inning mark for the first time in his career on 8/23, allowing only one run on two hits against the Birmingham Barons. He struck out 12, besting his previous career high by three. Poteet allowed a single in the first, and a home run in the third, but did not allow another base runner until he plunked Alfredo Gonzalez in the eighth.

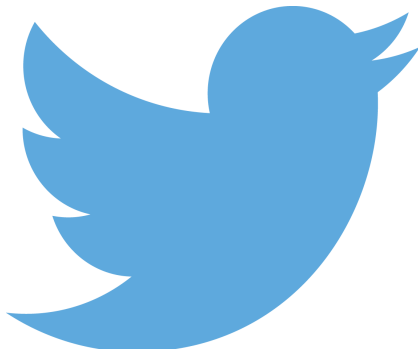
