## NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (61-51) vs. RENO ACES (53-61)

**THE BABY CAKES** – The New Orleans Baby Cakes begin a seven-game homestand with a three-game set against the Reno Aces. New Orleans is 10 games over .500 for the first time since August 27, 2012. NOLA is 14-7 against Pacific Conference foes, winning each of its four road series, but is 3-4 at home. The 'Cakes are 17-21 all-time against Reno, taking two of three at the Shrine last season.

**LAST TIME OUT** – The Baby Cakes rallied for five runs in the seventh inning to defeat Salt Lake, 5-2 and complete a four-game sweep. Kolton Mahoney, from nearby Ogden, pitched 5.0 solid innings in his second Triple-A start, yielding only run-scoring singles to Nick Franklin and Jo Adell in the fourth for a 2-0 Bees lead. New Orleans was kept off the board for six innings by Nick Tropeano, who permitted only two hits, but the 'Cakes sent 10 batters to the plate against reliever Jason Alexander in the seventh. Peter O'Brien's RBI double got NOLA on the board, and an RBI ground out by Tyler Heineman plated the tying run. Gabriel Guerrero doubled to put the 'Cakes in front, and Magneuris Sierra followed with a two-run homer. Parker Bugg worked the sixth to earn the win, Brian Moran fanned four in two innings, and Brett Graves escaped trouble in the ninth, working around a single and a walk to pick up his second save.

**ON THE HILL** – Cody Poteet looks to carry momentum from his first Triple-A victory into his seventh start with New Orleans. Poteet limited Las Vegas to two runs and four hits over the first six innings last Thursday, and earned the win despite yielding a pair of runs in the seventh. It was his second straight start completing 7.0 frames, after tossing 7.1 innings of one-run ball on July 25 in Memphis. In his lone home start, July 5 vs. San Antonio, Poteet allowed four home runs, the most by a New Orleans pitcher since 2016. Opponents have just three hits in 20 at-bats (.150) with runners in scoring position against Poteet, who had a 2.25 ERA in 13 starts with AA Jacksonville.

**FOR STARTERS** – The Baby Cakes' starting rotation leads the PCL with a 4.27 ERA, .254 batting average against, and 1.28 WHIP. The starters have 595 strikeouts, 64 more than second-place Round Rock among PCL clubs to put them on pace for a team-record 738, surpassing 2012 (645). While working a league-high 592.0 innings, they have issued the third-fewest walks (189).

**WINNING WAYS** – The Baby Cakes' five-game win streak to open August is the longest of the season and ties the longest streak to begin a month in club history, achieved four previous times (April '93, July '94, April '99 and June '01). The 'Cakes won five straight road games for the first time since a stretch of seven from August 4-15 last season, and their 34 road wins is tied for fourth-most in the PCL. The series sweep was the first of the season and the first in 14 all-time visits to Salt Lake. They need only nine wins in the final 27 games to clinch the first winning season since 2012 (73-67).

**DINGER DETAILS** – The 'Cakes have clobbered 14 home runs through the first five games in August (second behind Las Vegas's 16), already putting them nearly halfway to a fifth consecutive month with at least 30 dingers. NOLA had never had more than three straight months with 30 homers, and has reached 40 home runs twice this season, slugging 42 in July after a club-record 47 in May. New Orleans had previously hit 40 home runs in a month only three times since 1997. The 'Cakes have 175 on the year, seventh in the PCL and shattering 2012's team record of 153.

**MAGNIFICENT MAGGY** – Magneuris Sierra homered to extend his hitting streak to five games, after putting together four straight multi-hit efforts. Over the stretch, Sierra is 10x23 with two doubles, three triples and a pair of home runs. His 1.543 OPS since July 31 is seventh in the PCL, and his 1.043 SLG is third. A hit tonight would extend his streak to six games, matching his longest of the season (May 30-June 5) and one shy of his Triple-A best (May 30-June 6, 2018).

**ROSELL THE BOAT** – Rosell Herrera stretched his hitting streak to eight games, a Triple-A career best, during which he has gone 15x30 (.300) with two doubles, three home runs and six RBI. Herrera is batting .458 (27x59) in 16 road games, compared with a .158 mark (3x19) in six games at home. His .556 average (10x18) in August is sixth-best in the PCL. The longest streak of Herrera's career is 14 games, from June 11-27, 2013 for Asheville.

**DEAN OF HITS** – Austin Dean has a hit in 10 of his 11 games since the All-Star break, spanning a stint on the IL, going 18x42 (.429) with three doubles, five homers and 10 RBI. Entering the break, he hit .200 (8x40) in 15 games after being optioned from Miami on June 20. His 14 home runs for the 'Cakes are the most at one level in his career, and trail only the 16 he swatted last year between Jacksonville, New Orleans and Miami. Dean owns a .363 average (95x262) in his last 74 Triple-A games dating back to last season, with 62 RBI and 59 runs scored.

### ON THIS DATE ...

**1998:** J.R. Phillips sets a club record with eight RBI as New Orleans blasts Las Vegas, 18-10. Phillips goes 5-for-6 with two home runs, including a grand slam that highlights a seven-run seventh inning. He had hit a three-run shot the previous inning.

**THE WHIFF** – The 'Cakes struck out 10 times on Monday and have fanned at least eight times in 27 of their last 34 games, reaching double digits 19 times. NOLA is on pace for a club-record 1,221 strikeouts, surpassing 2013 (1,206). Peter O'Brien's 46 strikeouts since July 1 are the most in the PCL.

**STEAL AWAY** – New Orleans upped its PCL-leading stolen base total to 120. NOLA has never led the PCL

in steals, but finished second in 2006 with 168. Magneuris Sierra swiped his 16th bag since making his season debut on May 30, tied for third-most in the league over that span and giving the team three players with at least 15 stolen bases for the first time since five reached the plateau in 2006.

**EDDY THE JET** – Eddy Alvarez has charted at least two hits in six of his last nine contests, going 16x37 (.432) with three doubles, a triple, a home run and 10 RBI. His .351 batting average since joining the team on June 14 places 15th in the league in that span. He has also committed six errors, one behind Fresno's Jake Noll for the most in the PCL in that stretch.

**ROSTER MOVES** – Miami selected the contract of RHP Hector Noesi to make last night's start in New York. RHP Kyle Keller was optioned to New Orleans after making his MLB debut on Sunday, tossing 1.2 innings. Today the Marlins selected INF Deven Marrero while RHP Robert Dugger was optioned to NOLA and INF Yadier Rivera was designated for assignment.

**NAWLINS NOTES** – New Orleans is 20-9 in series openers with wins in each of the last four at home ... The bullpen owns a 2.70 ERA (11 ER/36.2 IP) with 49 strikeouts over the last 11 contests ... The Baby Cakes scored five runs in an inning for the 12th time, but only the second since June 23 ... Deven Marrero's six walks at Salt Lake ties with Jon Berti (April 13-15) and Monte Harrison (April 19-22) for most by a Baby Cake in four-game set ... NOLA improved to 40-19 in games decided by three runs or more, the best winning percentage (.678) in the PCL.

### 2019 SEASON

**LAST TIME OUT** – Poteet secured his first Triple-A win after drawing a no decision in his first five starts. He pitched through the seventh for the second straight time, and held the Aviators to four runs in the offense-heavy Las Vegas Ballpark. Poteet allowed six hits, including a pair of solo home runs. Poteet won two in a row and each of his last three decisions for Jacksonville before his promotion.

**BIRD TAMER (PART 2)** – Poteet became the third 'Cakes pitcher to reach the eighth inning, joining Zac Gallen (April 28) and Hector Noesi (June 29), twirling a gem at Memphis on 7/25. Poteet threw seven shutout innings to begin the game, and got one out in the eighth before allowing a single to Randy Arozarena before being relieved. Poteet struck out only three and walked a pair.

**BIRD TAMER** – Despite allowing eight hits, Poteet allowed only two runs in the first Triple-A start of his career on 6/30 at Memphis. The Redbirds hit .421 in the game against him, but only one hit went for extra bases. He followed it up with seven shutout innings before an inherited run scored in the eighth on 7/25. The Redbirds, despite going 13x44 (.295) against Poteet in 12.0 innings, mustered only three runs.

**QUALITY HITS** – For the third time in as many starts, Poteet allowed at least eight hits, reaching a new high (nine) on 7/13 at Nashville. But Poteet also tallied his first quality start at the level, by allowing only two runs, each on solo homers in the sixth. Eight of Poteet's allowed hits came after the fourth.

**FORE!** – San Antonio hit four home runs in 6.1 innings against Poteet on 7/5, one more than the total he allowed in his first 14 starts of the season. It was the most surrendered by a New Orleans starter since Chris Narveson gave up four in El Paso on 5/16/16. Poteet scattered five runs and eight hits and struck out seven without a walk in a no-decision.

**SHOOT TO KRILL** – In 13 starts for the Jumbo Shrimp, Poteet went 5-3 with a 2.25 ERA (21 ER/84.0 IP). He gave up only three home runs, and didn't allow a long ball in his last seven games. After allowing five runs (three earned) on 5/6, matching a season high, he lasted at least 6.0 innings in the final eight starts, eclipsing 7.0 four times and 8.0 twice, with a 1.42 ERA (nine ER/57.0 IP).

**PROMOTION WORTHY** – Poteet allowed only three runs across his final 23.1 innings in Double-A, spanning three starts, before getting called up. His ERA across the stretch sat at 1.16 (three ER/23.1 IP). On 6/9 and 6/14, he turned in back-to-back starts of at least 8.0 innings, including 8.1 on 6/14, a new career-high. On 6/23, he struck out 11, one shy of his career best. Across the trio of appearances he allowed only nine hits and six walks, to a 0.64 WHIP and .117 average against.

### 2018 SEASON IN REVIEW

**JUPITER REFRESHER** – After starting the season 2-9 with a 6.10 ERA in his first 15 starts for Jacksonville, Poteet was sent to Jupiter on 7/4. After throwing a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) there, he returned to Double-A. In his final seven games for the Jumbo Shrimp, Poteet pitched to a much-improved 4.16 ERA.

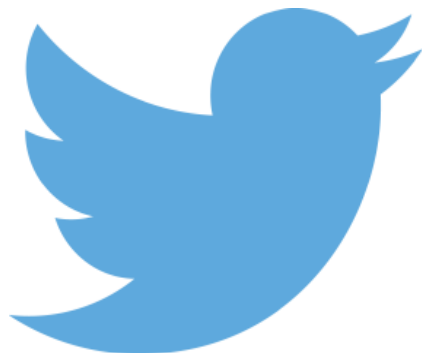
