Pawtucket Red Sox RHP Chandler Shepherd (7-9, 3.93) vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders RHP Erik Swanson (2-2, 4.09)

August Finale to Start Final Four – The Pawtucket Red Sox will try to play the role of spoiler and put the finishing touches on a fine month of August (17-12) when they meet the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders (AAA-Yankees) for the final four games of the regular-season beginning tonight. The home and home series features a pair of games at PNC Field in Moosic, PA (tonight at 7:05 pm and tomorrow at 6:35 pm) and then two games at McCoy Stadium in Pawtucket on Sunday at 6:15 pm(with post-game fireworks) and Labor Day Monday at 1:35 pm. That will be it for the PawSox who were eliminated from post-season consideration on Wednesday evening while Scranton/WB still has their sights set on yet another post-season berth. The RailRiders are currently less than a pct. point ahead Indianapolis (although in a virtual tie) for the IL Wild Card race with four games remaining for each team (SWB at .52238 while IND at .52205). Because Scranton/WB had two games cancelled due to weather (one in June and on in July) they will only play 138 games while Indy will play 140...hence those two teams can not end the season in a tie.

House of Horrors - PNC Field has been more like PAIN Field for the PawSox in recent times as the Sox have lost 15 of their last 18 games in Moosic. The Sox are 2-3 this year at PNC (splitting a 2-game set from May 5-6 and dropping 2 of 3 from June 29 – July 1). Pawtucket went 1-10 last year at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre – their only win at PNC in 2017 coming June 24, 8-0 – and dropped their final two games at PNC in August of 2016 so it adds up to 3-15 in their last 18 in Moosic. Overall last season the Sox went 5-13 vs. the RailRiders (1-10 in Pennsylvania but 4-3 in Pawtucket).

Series Matters - The PawSox are coming off a tough series loss (2 games to 1) against the International League Northern Division Champion Lehigh Valley IronPigs (AAA-Philadelphia) the past three nights at McCoy Stadium. The IronPigs won both of their games by scoring unearned runs in the top of the 9^a inning (1 run last night for a 5-4 win and 6 unearned on Tuesday in the series opener for a 9-3 victory. The PawSox won the middle game, 5-3. It was Pawtucket's first series loss in four tries since August 14 & 15 when they dropped 2 of 3 at home to Norfolk. The PawSox are 16-21-6 in their 43 series this season (16 wins, 21 losses, and 6 splits) with two series results still pending (2-game sets at Scranton/WB and vs. Scranton/WB).

Wait 'Til Next Year – On Wednesday, Pawtucket was officially eliminated from playoff contention for the 4^a year in a row. The PawSox had qualified for post-season play in four straight years (2011-14) but now have four consecutive non-playoff years (2015-18). It marks Pawtucket's longest playoff drought since a five year stretch from 1998-2002 when they failed to make the IL Playoffs.

Wild Race Indeed - Lehigh Valley, who clinched their first-ever IL North division title at home last weekend with a walk-off winner vs. Scranton/WB, can't make any post-season travel arrangements quite yet as they must still await their playoff foe for a semi-final series that will begin next Wednesday at the eventual wild card winner. The first two games will be played in either Scranton/WB, Indianapolis, Toledo, Norfolk, or Gwinnett - before the best of 5 series shifts to Allentown for the final three game as necessary over the weekend. The IL wild card race is among the best in all of baseball right now as Scranton/WB currently leads Indianapolis by less than a pct. point followed by Toledo who is just a $\frac{1}{2}$ -game behind and then Norfolk and Gwinnett who are both $-\frac{2}{2}$ GB.

Look Out Below - The PawSox – who have won 4 of 6 and 13 of their last 22 games – can not finish at or above .500 this season as they are 65-70 with four games remaining. The Sox were 67-75 last season so this will mark the first time since 2009 & 2010 that they have finished below .500 in consecutive years.

Red Sox Rehabbers Status TBD – Three key members of the Boston Red Sox, all currently on the Red Sox disabled list, began injury rehab assignments with the PawSox this week. Pitcher **Steven Wright**, who has been on the DL since June 23 with left knee inflammation (related to his knee surgery a year ago May), started for Pawtucket Tuesday night and tossed 2 hitless innings. Wright is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA in 10 games (4 starts) for Boston this season (from May 15 – June 22) and is 0-0 with a 4.30 ERA in 4 games (2 starts) during a rehab assignment with the PawSox from April 20 – May 11.

Rehabbing Red Sox catcher **Christian Vazquez** was behind the plate for the PawSox Tuesday night going 0-for-3, was the DH on Wednesday (2-for-4 with an RBI and run scored), and caught the entire game last night (1-for-4 with a walk). He has been on the Sox DL since July 8 with a fractured right pinky finger suffered on a head-first slide while stealing 2⁻⁻⁻ base on July 7 in Kansas City. Vazquez, who went 1-for-2 with a SF while catching rehabbing Red Sox LHP Eduardo Rodriguez on Monday night in Portland, was hitting .213 in 60 games (59 as catcher) for Boston with 3 HR & 14 RBI. He was coming off a fine June, however, when he batted .298 during the month.

Wednesday the Red Sox sent 3B **Rafael Devers** to Pawtucket. Wednesday night batting second and playing third he went 1-for-3 with a double and a run scored. He was the DH last night going 0-for-3 with a walk and run scored. Devers has had three stints on Boston's disabled list this season with this most recent coming on August 16 when he was placed on the DL with a recurring left hamstring strain. Rafael has also been on the DL from July 11-21 with left shoulder inflammation and from July 29 – August 8 with the left hamstring strain. In 102 games for the Red Sox this season (100 at 3^a base) he is batting .242 with 22 doubles, 16 HR & 55 RBI. He also rehabbed for one game with (short-A) Lowell on August 6 and went 1-for-4 with a 2-run HR in that game and then rejoined the Red Sox on August 8 for six games before going back on the DL.

August Moon – Pawtucket has posted some fine numbers in August with the finale on tap for tonight. Officially, the Sox are batting .285 in 28 games this month (278-for-975) with 18 HR & 129 runs scored (4.6 runs/game). The PawSox hit .233 in April, .227 in May, .258 in June, and .251 in July. Sox pitchers in August are 17-11 with a 3.08 ERA (84 ER in 245.1 IP).

Pitching in for Offense – Back in early-August, Pawtucket took over the International League lead in Team Pitching when they surpassed Rochester. The PawSox had remained on top of the league until the last weekend in August when the Red Wings moved back ahead. The Sox are now 2^{nd} at 3.45 while Rochester currently leads with their 3.42 ERA. Pawtucket has also gone on a big upswing this month offensively and they are now up to 7th in the IL with their Team Batting average of .252 (a season-high).

Records are Made to be Broken – PawSox pitchers have already established a new franchise-record for Most Strikeouts in a season as Sox hurlers have 1189 strikeouts on the year (previous record was 1118 SO in 2011). Two other club-records to keep an eye on come in the "fewest" category. Pawtucket has hit 10 triples this season…their record for fewest triples is 12 in 2015. And PawSox pitchers have just one complete game this season (Mike Shawaryn a 7-inning CG on August 14 in G2 vs. Norfolk). The team mark for fewest CG is 1 set in both 2005 & 2011.

Battling for a Batting Title – PawSox All-Star outfielder **Rusney Castillo** currently has a 5 point lead in the International League batting race as he looks to become the first Pawtucket player to win the IL Batting Title in 37 years...since Wade Boggs hit .335 in 1981. Rusney, who is hitting .322 on the season, has the lead in the race over Joey Meneses of Lehigh Valley who is at .315 with five games remaining for both players. Castillo (151) also leads the league in hits over Meneses (149). Rusney is bidding to join some select company and become the 6th PawSox player to win the IL Batting Championship following...Juan Beniquez (.298 in 1973), Jim Rice (.337 in 1974), Wayne Harer (.350 in 1977 – the highest batting average in PawSox history), Garry Hancock (.325 in 1979), and Boggs (.335 in 1981).

Furthermore, Castillo's 151 hits are already the most by a PawSox player in a single-season in 10 years since INF Joe Thurston had 160 hits in 2008. The club-record for Most Hits in a season is 169 set by Dave Stapleton in 1979. Only four PawSox players have ever led the league in hits in a season...Mike Cummings in 1973 (139 hits), Stapleton in 1979 (169), Boggs in 1981 (167), and Thurston in 2008 (160). Rusney also has 115 singles and is just 6 shy of matching Glenn Hoffman's franchise-mark of 121 singles set in 1979.

Night Owls – The PawSox are 5-games under .500 this year but they are over .500 at night posting a 50-49 record in night games this season compared to 15-21 in day games. The Sox have one day game remaining...Labor Day Monday vs. Scranton/WB (1:35 pm) in the season-finale.

More Hits and More Runs – The PawSox have out-hit their opponents on the season by a wide margin (1138 hits to 1098) and have been out-scored by the opposition by just 5 runs on the year (Sox have scored 528 runs and allowed 533 runs).

Road Getting Smoother – The PawSox have won 9 of their last 12 road games since August 9 and are now 30-37 on the road – they had the worst away mark in the league until this recent road surge. They had dropped 15 of their previous 20 on the road between June 26 – August 8. The Sox have won 11 of their last 21 games at home dating back to July 14. Pawtucket was a season-high 5-games over .500 on August 4 and they are now 35-33 at McCoy.

What Have You Done for Me Lately – The PawSox are 17-12 since August 1 after going 3-11 in their previous 14 games between July 17-31. Included during that stretch was a season-high 6-game losing streak from July 17-22. Their recent 4-game winning streak (August 9-12) marked the first time they had been able to win more than two in a row since a 3-game winning streak from July 14-16.

Dynasties - The Red Sox and (especially the) Yankee Triple-A affiliates have "owned" the International League North Division over the past 13 seasons (including this year) as either Scranton/WB (9 times) or Pawtucket (2 times) has won the IL North regular-season pennant during 11 of those 13 years. The only other clubs to win the IL North during that span have been Syracuse in 2014 and Lehigh Valley this year. While Scranton/WB has earned 9 division titles, they finally won another Governors' Cup Championship in September of 2016 to go with their only other Cup Championship in 2008. The RailRiders lost to Durham in the Cup Finals last season. Pawtucket has captured two Governors' Cups in the last seven years and both came when the Sox qualified for the IL Playoffs as a wild card (2012 & 2014).

When Last We Met – These teams have not faced each other for nearly 8 weeks since Scranton/WB took 2 of 3 from the PawSox at McCoy on the weekend of July 6-8. The RailRiders won the opener of that 3-game set, 3-2 before the PawSox evened matters with their 4-2 the next night. Scranton/WB won the rubber game on the afternoon of July 8, 3-2 despite 18 strikeouts by five different PawSox pitchers that day.

The 2018 Season-Series vs. Scranton/WB – The season-series between these rivals is deadlocked at 7-7. The PawSox are 2-3 in Moosic but 5-4 in Pawtucket.

Stats vs. the RailRiders - Sox pitchers are 7-7 with a 3.47 ERA vs. Scranton/WB thus far (48 ER in 124.2 IP) while Sox hitters are batting .226 (101-for-447) with 13 HR (4 by Ohlman, 3 by Olt, 2 by Tavarez, and 1 each from Miller, Flores, Tavarez and Travis).

Up and Down vs. Scranton/WB - Pawtucket had a 5-game winning streak vs. the RailRiders in May (with victories...5-4 on May 4 in Moosic, PA; 2-0 on both May 5 & 6 at McCoy; and 5-4 & 7-6 at McCoy on May 21 & 22) until suffering four straight defeats on May 23 & 24 at McCoy (7-1 & 3-1) and then June 29 & 30 at Scranton/WB (7-4 & 7-6 in 10-innings). The PawSox did snap that 4-game skid vs. the RailRiders with a 2-0 victory on July 1, but have dropped 6 of their last 8 vs. Scranton/WB.

The Real Evil Empire – Pawtucket has lost the season-series with the RailRiders four years in a row. The PawSox went 5-13 last year, 7-9 vs. Scranton/WB in 2016, 6-13 in 2015, and 5-11 in 2014. The PawSox won the 2013 season-series over Scranton/WB, 11-5. Those 11 victories vs. the RailRiders in 2013 represented Pawtucket's most in a single-season vs. the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre franchise since they became a Yankee affiliate in 2007. The PawSox won the season-series over the RailRiders in each of the 2011, 2012, and 2013 seasons after four straight non-winning years vs. Scranton/WB from 2007-2010 (one tie and three losers). The Sox finished 2-14 vs. the Yanks in 2007, 8-8 in 2008 (and then 1-3 in the 2008 playoffs), 4-12 in 2009, and 7-9 in 2010. Since then the Sox have gone 10-6 vs. Scranton/WB in 2011, 9-7 in 2012 (3-1 in the playoffs en route to winning the Governors' Cup), 11-5 in 2013, but 5-11 in 2014, 6-13 in 2015, 7-9 in 2016, and 5-13 in 2017.

Bring Back the Red Barons - The PawSox had dominated the former Scranton/WB Red Barons over parts of three years (2004-2006) before SWB became a Yankee affiliate going 23-4 in their last 27 meetings while SWB was a Phillies' affiliate.

Low Point – The PawSox (now at 65-70) were a season-low 10-games below .500 on July 31 and August 2 (49-59) for the first time in almost three years since they ended the 2015 season with a 59-85 record.

Sad Endings - The PawSox lost a game in the opponent's final at-bat 10 times between July 17 – August 8. Pawtucket had suffered just 5 losses in the final at-bat of a game previously during their first 92 games of the season. During that span the Sox lost games in the bottom of the 11^{th} -inning, bottom of the 9^{th} , bottom of the 8^{th} , bottom of the 9^{th} , bottom of the 10^{th} , top of the 10^{th} , bottom of the 11^{th} -inning the provide the 8^{th} . Overall this season, the Sox have lost 17 games during the opposition's last AB while winning 11 times during their own last AB (6 walk-offs).

Left at the Altar – The PawSox lead the league with 986 runners left on base this season for an average of 7.3 LOB per game. The club-record is 1121 LOB in 2005 in 144 games (or an average of 7.8 per game).

Series Business – The PawSox are 16-21-6 in their 43 series this season (16 wins, 21 losses, and 6 splits). They have posted four 3-game sweeps along with a 2-game sweep and a 1-game sweep (in Rochester on July 4). The PawSox have been swept in a series four times this season (suffering three 3-game sweeps and a 2-game sweep).

North Face - Pawtucket is 39-46 vs. their IL North rivals. They finished 13-11 vs. the IL West and 13-13 vs. the IL South.

Bye to July - The PawSox concluded July with a 10-16 record in which they battled in a wave of close games. Pawtucket finished the month 2-9 in one-run games, 1-4 in extra innings, and lost 7 games in the opponents' final at-bat in July. It marked their third consecutive losing month...they went 11-10 in April, but then 13-17 in May, 14-15 in June, and 10-16 in July. The Sox batted .251 in July with 15 HR in 26 games while posting a 3.54 ERA.

Last Tune in June - The PawSox - due to a 5-game losing skid to end the month of June - finished with a losing record in June at 14-15. They hit .258 with 27 HR in 29 games during the month along with a 3.41 ERA.

A Hectic May - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May with a 13-17 record for the month. The topsy-turvy travel month included four different homestands and four different roadtrips. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May while batters hit .227 with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month.

April Comes up a Winner – The PawSox posted a winning April for the 6th time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in 2nd-place in the IL North (-2 GB of front-running Syracuse at the time). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

Throwing Strikes – Pawtucket pitchers are 2nd in the International League with their new club-record of 1189 strikeouts. Durham leads with 1231 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April 20 & July 8), 15 (three times), 14 (three times), 13 (seven times), 12 (eight times), 11 (six times), and 10 (16 times) this season.

Defensive - Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are 12th in the league with a .978 fielding pct. (103 errors in 4730 total chances).

Blanketed – The PawSox have been shutout 13 times this season (8-13)...Rochester (11-14) has been blanked the most in the league. Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shuout games last year.

A Look Back Before We Go Forth - Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in 4th-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under .500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over .500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went 33-39 on the road.

Portland (60-76) – The Portland Sea Dogs (AA) lost to New Hampshire, 4-2 last night. Kyle Hart turned in a solid start – 6 IP, 8 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 6 SO. Harrison Cooney suffered the loss. Chris Madera (RBI single) and Deiner Lopez (RBI grounder) drove in the Portland runs.

Salem (30-35)/(62-71) - The Salem Red Sox (A) were routed at Winston-Salem, 13-0 last night. Kevin McAvoy (1-5) was ineffective – 4 IP, 9 H, 10 R.

Greenville (36-30)/(61-74) – The Greenville Drive (A) fell at Rome, 5-1 last night. Eduard Bazardo was the loser. Jarren Duran drove in the Greenville run with an RBI single. The Drive host Lexington for a 4-game series to end the regular-season starting tonight and they must sweep the series as they trail Lexington by 3-games in the Southern Divison.

Lowell (34-37) – The Lowell Spinners (short-A) were 3-2 losers to Tri-City last night.

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES – None today – maybe! It might just be the calm before the Septebmer 1st storm tomorrow!

The PawSox have been involved in 62 player moves since July 22. The Sox are at the roster limit with 25 active players as rehabbing pitcher Steven Wright, catcher Christian Vazquez, and 3B Rafael Devers do not count against the active roster. Pawtucket has used 58 different players this season (29 position players & 29 pitchers) – three more than the amount they employed last year (28 pitchers & 27 position players). The club-record is 70 players used in both 1995 and 2006.

More on the rehabbers...

Wright, who underwent cartilage restoration surgery on his left knee on May 8, 2017, has spent time in Pawtucket in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and again in 2018. He is 23-15 with a 3.90 ERA in 65 games (44 starts) in the big leagues all with Boston (142 ER in 327.2 IP). Steven was named to the 2016 American League All-Star Team and finished that year with a 13-6 record and a 3.33 ERA in 24 starts for the Red Sox. His ERA was 10^a best in the American League and his 4 complete games ranked tied for 3^a in all of Major League Baseball. Originally a member of the Cleveland Indians organization, he spent his first four years in the minor leauges as a traditional pitcher before converting to a knuckleball pitcher at the beginning of the 2011 season.

Vazquez had a terrific 2017 season with Boston batting .290 in 99 games with 5 HR & 32 RBI. He has thrown out 40% of runners attempting to steal in his Major League career (50 CS in 126 attempts) which puts him among the leading catchers in MLB since 1987 (minimum 200 games). Christian missed the entire 2015 season recovering from Tommy John surgery performed on his right elbow. He split time between Pawtucket (.270 in 42 games) and Boston (.227 in 57 games) during his comeback season of 2016.

Devers, who at the age of 21 is one of the youngest players in all of Minor League Baseball, was indeed the youngest active player in the majors when he made his big league debut on July 25 of last season in Seattle. That promotion came after a quick and successful 9-game stint with the PawSox when he hit .400 with 2 HR after joining the PawSox that July 14^s. He made an immediate impact with Boston belting 8 homers in his first 20 Major League games to become the first player ever to do so before turning 21-years-old. Devers was selected as a league All-Star in each of his first four pro seasons from 2014-2017 before earning the call-up to Boston.

Infielder Tzu-Wei Lin became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season (not including rehabbing players) on April 10 before rejoining Pawtucket on May 8, returning to Boston on June 23, back with Pawtucket (July 2), again in Boston (July 12), back with the PawSox (July 25), to Boston again on July 29, and back with Pawtucket on August 1. Marcus Walden was #2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (he came off the PawSox DL on July 25). Bobby Poyner became the third call-up on May 4 - he later returned to Pawtucket, went back to Boston (May 15), back again with the PawSox, to Boston (June 2), returned to Pawtucket (June 7), back to Boston (July 14), and now with the PawSox (July 22). 1B/OF Sam Travis became the fourth call-up on June 2, returned to the PawSox on June 12, back to Boston on July 13 and now back to Pawtucket on July 16. RHP Brandon Workman was next on June 5 and spent almost two months with the Red Sox before being optioned on July 26, recalled on July 31, optioned on August 12 (added Aug. 14), and then recalled again on August 18. LHP Jalen Beeks followed on June 6 (returned to Pawtucket on June 8, recalled to Boston on July 10, back with the PawSox on July 11, and traded to Tampa Bay on July 25). RHP Justin Haley was the next call-up to Boston on June 8, was optioned on June 19, recalled to Boston again on June 26, and optioned back to Pawtucket on July 2. LHP Robby Scott was promoted to Boston on June 19 but was optioned to Pawtucket on June 23 before another promotion to Boston on July 11, and now optioned to Pawtucket on July 16. RHP William Cuevas was promoted to Boston on July 2, optioned back on July 4, recalled again on July 8, optioned on July 10, recalled as the Red Sox 26th man for their August 11 doubleheader, and optioned on August 12 (added on August 15). Reliever Ryan Brasier was selected to Boston on July 8. On August 3 catcher Dan Butler was selected to the Red Sox roster and was added to the PawSox roster on August 16. On August 4 INF Tony Renda became the 12th different player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston (and the next night he scored the winning run in the bottom of the 10th-inning as a pinch runner to cap the Red Sox 4-game sweep of the Yankees at Fenway). Renda returned to Pawtucket on August 9.
