**JULY 8<sup>th</sup> SCRANTON/WB (45-41) at PAWTUCKET (41-45) 1:35 pm**

Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders LHP Justus Sheffield (2-3, 2.61) v Pawtucket Red Sox RHP Fernando Rodriguez, Jr. (3-1, 4.19)

**Paws Needs a Pause** – The Pawtucket Red Sox and the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders (AAA-Yankees) play the rubber game of their 3-game weekend series this afternoon at 1:35 pm at McCoy Stadium (live on myRITV) in the final game before the Triple-A All-Star break. After 20 straight playing days between June 19 – July 8, the PawSox will finally catch a breather with the three-day All-Star break tomorrow (Monday) through Wednesday marking their first scheduled day(s) off since June 18. Scranton/WB won the opener of this 3-game set on Friday night, 3-2 before the PawSox evened matters with their 4-2 triumph last night. After today, these two rivals will not meet again until the final weekend of the regular-season when they face each other in a 4-game home & home series...the first two games at Scranton/WB on August 31 & September 1 before the regular-season ends with a pair of games in Pawtucket on September 2 and Labor Day Monday September 3.

**Another Sunday Finale with Scranton** – Last weekend, Scranton/WB took 2 of 3 from the PawSox at PNC Field as the RailRiders won the opener a week ago Friday, 7-4; rallied for their 7-6, 10-inning victory last Saturday; but Pawtucket was able to salvage the finale with a 2-0 shutout victory one week ago today last Sunday afternoon. The PawSox lead season-series between the Red Sox and Yankee affiliates by a 7-6 margin, but Scranton/WB is 4-games over .500 (at 45-41) while the PawSox are 4-games under .500 (at 41-45).

**Rest for the Weary** – In a rarity, the Triple-A All-Star break this coming Monday - Wednesday occurs one week prior to the Major League All-Star break which will take place next week with the MLB All-Star Game on July 17 in Washington, D.C. Legend has it that officials in Washington, D.C. lobbied Major League Baseball to play their All-Star Game one week later than normal to give the city and surrounding area more time to prepare following the 4<sup>th</sup> of July festivities last week in the nation's capital. PawSox closer Ryan Brasier (13 saves and a 1.34 ERA in 34 RA) and outfielder Rusney Castillo (.311 in 80 games) will represent Pawtucket on the International League All-Star team during the Triple-A All-Star Game to be played this Wednesday in Columbus, OH.

**Return to Action** - After the upcoming 3-day break, the PawSox will swing back into action to begin their descent into the final 52 regular-season games of 2018 (25 at home and 27 on the road) starting with a 4-game series at McCoy Stadium vs. Syracuse from July 12-15. Last year at the All-Star break (July 10-12, 2017) the PawSox were 44-44 and in 4<sup>th</sup>-place (-10½ GB). They come into play today at 41-45 and in 5<sup>th</sup>-place (-9½ GB).

**Travelocity** - Today will be the 87<sup>th</sup> game of what has become a 139-game schedule for the PawSox in 2018 - so about 63% of the season will be complete by the time the Sox reach the All-Star break. The good news for the PawSox is they finish just before the break at home at McCoy and begin after the break right here at McCoy again. It's a well-deserved respite for a Pawtucket club that made an arduous 9 separate roadtrips during the first two and a half months of the season. By contrast, by the time the Boston Red Sox reach the Major League All-Star break from July 16-19 (one week after the Triple-A break), the Red Sox will have made 7 different roadtrips...and that also includes a 6-game season-opening trip that took place from March 29 – April 3 *before* Pawtucket's season even began.

**Ocean's Eleven** – The PawSox have dropped 8 of their last 11 games since last Tuesday (June 26) and have scored 2 runs or less in 7 of those games (30 runs total in their last 11 games). The Sox are hitting .210 in their last 11 games (74-for-353). Pitchers are 3-8 with a 3.87 ERA (41 ER in 95.1 IP).

**Home Had Been Sweet** – Pawtucket has lost 3 of their last 4 at home after winning 5 of their previous 6 games at McCoy from June 19-24. The PawSox are 23-21 at home (they had equaled their season-high of 4-games over .500 at McCoy on June 24). The Sox are 18-24 on the road.

**Nice While it Lasted** - After winning on June 25, the PawSox went over the .500 mark at 38-37 for the first time since May 8. They also (for one night anyway) moved into sole possession of 2<sup>nd</sup>-place in the IL North for the first time since they were alone in 1<sup>st</sup>-place on May 11. However, Pawtucket is now 41-45 and in 5<sup>th</sup>-place in the IL North as they trail front-running Lehigh Valley by 9½ - games in the division.

**Last Sox/Yanks Series at McCoy** – This weekend (the RailRiders won the opener on Friday, 3-2 but the Sox prevailed, 4-2 on Saturday) marks Scranton/WB's first visit to McCoy Stadium since May 21-24 when the teams split a 4-game series. After back-to-back come-from-behind victories the first two nights of that series by the PawSox, the RailRiders rebounded to win the final two games by 7-1 and 3-1 scores to snap Pawtucket's 5-game winning streak against Scranton/WB dating back to May 4. On May 21 the Sox scored a run in the 7<sup>th</sup> and another in the 8<sup>th</sup> to pull out a 5-4 win in the series-opener, and then the next night, the Sox erased an early 4-0 deficit and held on for a 7-6 victory. These teams will face each other 18 times this season with 11 in Pawtucket and 7 in Moosic, PA. The next meeting will come during the final weekend of the regular-season when the teams face each other in a 4-game home & home series...the first two games at Scranton/WB on August 31 & September 1 before the regular-season ends with a pair of games in Pawtucket on September 2 and Labor Day Monday September 3. Pawtucket leads the season-series, 7 games to 6.

**Up and Down vs. Scranton/WB** - Pawtucket had a 5-game winning streak vs. the RailRiders in May (with victories...5-4 on May 4 in Moosic, PA; 2-0 on both May 5 & 6 at McCoy; and 5-4 & 7-6 at McCoy on May 21 & 22) until suffering four straight defeats on May 23 & 24 at McCoy (7-1 & 3-1) and then June 29 & 30 at Scranton/WB (7-4 & 7-6 in 10-innings). The PawSox did snap that 4-game skid vs. the RailRiders with a 2-0 victory on July 1, but have dropped 5 of their last 7 vs. Scranton/WB.

**Stats vs. the RailRiders** - Sox pitchers are 7-6 with a 3.50 ERA vs. Scranton/WB thus far (45 ER in 115.2 IP) while Sox hitters are batting .229 (95-for-415) with 13 HR (4 by Ohlman, 3 by Olt, 2 by Tavaréz, and 1 each from Miller, Flores, Tavaréz and Travis).

**The 2018 Season-Series vs. Scranton/WB** – The PawSox lead the season-series over Scranton/WB by a 7-6 margin including a 5-3 mark here at McCoy and 2-3 in Moosic. On May 3 in PA, in the first meeting between these two long-time rivals, the RailRiders earned a walk-off, 4-3 victory with a run in the bottom of the 9<sup>th</sup> after the Sox had rallied to tie the game with a run in the top half of the inning. On May 4 the Sox gained the split in Moosic by scoring twice in the 8<sup>th</sup> to snap a 3-3 tie and then holding Scranton/WB to only one run in the bottom of the 9<sup>th</sup> for a 5-4 win. The clubs then moved to McCoy for a pair of games in Pawtucket on May 5 & 6 with the PawSox posting a pair of 2-0 victories. The winner on May 5 was Chandler Shepherd (7 IP) with relief help from Tyler Thornburg (1 IP) and save to Robby Scott (1 IP). On May 6 it was Justin Haley with the victory (5+ innings) followed by Brandon Workman (3 IP) and SV to Bobby Poyner (1 IP).

**House of Horrors** - PNC Field has been more like PAIN Field for the PawSox in recent times as the Sox have lost 15 of their last 18 games in Moosic. The Sox are 2-3 this year at PNC (splitting a 2-game set from May 5-6 and dropping 2 of 3 from June 29 – July 1). Pawtucket went 1-10 last year at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre – their only win at PNC in 2017 coming June 24, 8-0 – and dropped their final two games at PNC in August of 2016 so it adds up to 3-15 in their last 18 in Moosic. Overall last season the Sox went 5-13 vs. the RailRiders (1-10 in Pennsylvania but 4-3 in Pawtucket).

**Dynasties** - The Red Sox and (especially the) Yankee Triple-A affiliates have “owned” the International League North Division over the past 12 seasons as either Scranton/WB (9 times) or Pawtucket (2 times) has won the IL North regular-season pennant during 11 of those 12 years. The only other club to win the IL North during that span is Syracuse in 2014. While Scranton/WB has earned 9 division titles, they finally won another Governors' Cup Championship in September of 2016 to go with their only other Cup Championship in 2008. The RailRiders lost to Durham in the Cup Finals last season. Pawtucket has captured two Governors' Cups in the last six years and both came when the Sox qualified for the IL Playoffs as a wild card (2012 & 2014).

**The Real Evil Empire** – Pawtucket has lost the season-series with the RailRiders four years in a row. The PawSox went 5-13 last year, 7-9 vs. Scranton/WB in 2016, 6-13 in 2015, and 5-11 in 2014. The PawSox won the 2013 season-series over Scranton/WB, 11-5. Those 11 victories vs. the RailRiders in 2013 represented Pawtucket's most in a single-season vs. the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre franchise since they became a Yankee affiliate in 2007. The PawSox won the season-series over the RailRiders in each of the 2011, 2012, and 2013 seasons after four straight non-winning years vs. Scranton/WB from 2007-2010 (one tie and three losers). The Sox finished 2-14 vs. the Yanks in 2007, 8-8 in 2008 (and then 1-3 in the 2008 playoffs), 4-12 in 2009, and 7-9 in 2010. Since then the Sox have gone 10-6 vs. Scranton/WB in 2011, 9-7 in 2012 (3-1 in the playoffs en route to winning the Governors' Cup), 11-5 in 2013, but 5-11 in 2014, 6-13 in 2015, 7-9 in 2016, and 5-13 in 2017.

**Bring Back the Red Barons** - The PawSox had dominated the former Scranton/WB Red Barons over parts of three years (2004-2006) before SWB became a Yankee affiliate going 23-4 in their last 27 meetings while SWB was a Phillies' affiliate.

**What Have You Done for Me Lately** – Despite losing 8 of their last 11 games, Pawtucket is 9-9 in their last 18 games. After winning 6 of 7 games from June 19 (G2) to June 25, the PawSox suffered a 5-game losing streak from June 26-30 (which matched their season-high from May 23-26) before snapping that skid with a 2-0 victory at Scranton/WB on June 30. The Sox had a pair of 4-game winning streaks last month from June 10-13 and G2 on June 19-22. Those fell one shy of equaling their longest of the season when the Sox won 5 straight from May 27-31. Over a longer stretch, Pawtucket is 14-13 in their last 27 games and have won 22 of their last 40 games since May 27. Before that, the Sox had lost 15 of their previous 19 games from May 7-26.

**North Face** - On June 11 the PawSox began a span of 32 straight games against IL North rivals through July 15 (which is just after the All-Star break). Pawtucket is 27-35 vs. their IL North foes thus far. They are 7-8 vs. the IL West and 7-2 vs. the IL South.

**Series Business** – Pawtucket – even 1-1 in this 3-game set - is 10-14-4 in their first 28 series of the season (10 wins, 14 losses, and 4 splits). They have posted three 3-game sweeps this season along with a 2-game sweep and a 1-game sweep (in Rochester on July 4).

**July Underway** – The Sox are 3-3 thus far in July batting .198 (37-for-187) with 4 HR and posting a 3.00 ERA (18 ER in 54 IP). They are now scheduled to play 26 games in 31 days this July. Pawtucket went 15-14 last July.

**Last Tune in June** – The PawSox – due to a 5-game losing skid to end the month of June – finished with a losing record in June at 14-15. They hit .258 with 27 HR in 29 games during the month along with a 3.41 ERA. Pawtucket finished 11-10 this April and 13-17 this May (hitting just .227 in May). They had their best month of last season in June going 17-14.

**A Hectic May** - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May with a 13-17 record for the month. The topsy-turvy travel month included four different homestands and four different roadtrips. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May while batters hit .227 with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month.

**April Comes up a Winner** – The PawSox posted a winning April for the 6<sup>th</sup> time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in 2<sup>nd</sup>-place in the IL North (-2 GB of front-running Syracuse at the time). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

**Trending** – The PawSox (now at 41-45) were a season-low 8-games below .500 on May 26 at 19-27. It was their lowest point since they ended last year with a 67-75 record. On May 6 the Sox had matched their season-high of 3-games over the .500 mark (15-12) from April 28 when they were 11-8.

**One and Done** – The PawSox are 16-10 in 1-run games this season (.615) – the 2<sup>nd</sup> best winning pct. in 1-run affairs in the league behind Columbus (12-7, .632).

**Throwing Strikes** – Pawtucket pitchers are 2<sup>nd</sup> in the International League with 775 strikeouts. Durham leads with 819 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April 20), 15 (three times), 14 (twice), 13 (twice), 12 (four times), 11 (four times), and 10 (16 times) this season.

**Hit or Miss** – PawSox batters were last in the league in team batting for most of May and into June, but they are now 12<sup>th</sup> with their .237 average...it was .242 on June 24 which was their highest since April 28 also at .242.

**Defensive** – The PawSox have made just 1 errors in their last 8 games. Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are next to last in the league with a .978 fielding pct. (65 errors in 2987 total chances) as their 65 errors are one more than all of last year. Buffalo is last with a .976 fielding pct. and an IL high 69 errors on the year.

**Working Overtime** – Pawtucket is 5-2 in extra inning games this season (tied with Columbus for the best pct. in the league). Pawtucket has played five overtime games at home (winning 4 of those 5 extra inning games at McCoy). Until their 7-6 loss in 10-innings at Scranton/WB on June 30, the Sox had not been involved in an extra inning game since May 14 (a 6-5, 10-inning win vs. Buffalo).

**Blanketed** – The PawSox have been shutout a league-high 9 times this season. Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shutout games last year. They are 6-9 in shutout games thus far in 2018. Prior to the 4-0 loss in Game 1 to Buffalo on June 19, the Sox had not been blanked since May 20 (3-0 at Rochester).

**A Look Back Before We Go Forth** – Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in 4<sup>th</sup>-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under .500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over .500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went 33-39 on the road.

## **BOSTON RED SOX DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM –**

**Portland (34-52)** – The Portland Sea Dogs (AA) were blanked at Hartford last night, 5-0 snapping their 3-game winning streak. Matt Kent (5-6) was the loser – 6 IP, 8 H, 4 R. Michael Chavis made his 2018 Portland debut as the DH and went 0-for-4 with 4 strikeouts.

**Salem (9-7)/(41-43)** – The Salem Red Sox (A) slugged their way past Potomac, 9-4 last night. 3B Bobby Dalbec continued to put up impressive power numbers as he drilled his league-leading 19<sup>th</sup> homerun (a 2-run shot) and also added a double and a triple to key the attack. SS C.J. Chatham also had 3 hits including an RBI double. Tanner Houck upped his record to 4-10 with a strong start – 7 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 5 SO.

**Greenville (8-9)/(33-53)** – The Greenville Drive (A) fell at Asheville, 10-5 last night. Emmanuel De Jesus (2-2) took the loss – 5.1 IP, 13 H, 9 R, 6 ER. Ryan Fitzgerald (3-run HR #3) and Kervin Suarez (solo HR #4) provided the offense.

**Lowell (9-13)** – The Lowell Spinners (short-A) lost at home to Hudson Valley, 3-1 last night. Eduard Bazarzo was sharp but was not involved in the decision - 6 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 0 BB, 0 SO. Andrew Politi (0-1) was the loser in relief – 2.1 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 0 BB, 6 SO. Kole Cottom crushed a solo HR (#2) for the only Lowell run.

That's the next Free Youth Clinic of the season on July 14 from 2:00-3:15 pm followed by a 6:15 pm game against Syracuse with post-game fireworks as well.

### **JULY 14 FIREWORKS SHOW 6:15 pm vs. Syracuse (Post-Game)**

On July 14<sup>th</sup> the PawSox will stage their next Saturday Night Fireworks Shows after they host Syracuse at 6:15 pm at McCoy Stadium. After the game, fans will be treated to a spectacular Fireworks Show set to Margaritaville Music thanks to B101 Radio.

### **JULY 15 BRONSON ARROYO ON COX LEGENDS DAY 1:35 pm vs. Syracuse**

The PawSox will once again be hosting a "Legends Day" at McCoy Stadium this summer, presented by Cox Communications, on Sunday, July 15 and this year's guest is 2004 Red Sox World Series Champion and former PawSox pitcher Bronson Arroyo. 15 years ago Bronson tossed just the fourth perfect game in the history of the International League on August 10, 2003 in a 7-0 PawSox win over Buffalo at McCoy Stadium. Arroyo appeared in 419 MLB games with Boston, Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, and Arizona. Bronson will throw the Ceremonial First Pitch before Pawtucket's 1:35 pm game against Syracuse on July 15 and greet PawSox fans during the game at the Vertikal 6 Fan Center on the main concourse behind home plate at McCoy.

**PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES** – The Boston Red Sox this morning recalled RHP **William Cuevas** and selected reliever **Ryan Brasier** from Pawtucket. Cuevas was the scheduled PawSox starter today. Brasier, the dominating PawSox closer (13-for-14 in save opportunities, a 1.34 ERA in 34 RA, and no earned runs allowed in 22 innings since May 12), was slated to fly to Columbus, OH this evening to take part in the Triple-A All-Star Game on Wednesday.

**Cuevas**, 27, appeared in one game in his only stint with Boston this season, allowing one run on two hits over 2.0 innings in the Red Sox' 11-4 win at Washington on July 3. The right-hander was optioned to Pawtucket after that game and has not pitched since. Signed by Boston as an international free agent in 2008, Cuevas has made 15 starts for the PawSox this season, going 5-5 with a 3.65 ERA (35 ER/86.1 IP), 67 strikeouts, and 25 walks.

**Brasier**, 30, has a 1.34 ERA (6 ER/40.1 IP) and a .215 opponent batting average in 34 appearances for the PawSox this season, recording 40 strikeouts against only eight walks while converting 13 of 14 save opportunities. Named a 2018 International League All-Star, the right-hander has not allowed an earned run in any of his last 22 outings (beginning May 14). Signed by the Red Sox as a minor league free agent on March 2, 2018, Brasier was originally selected by the Los Angeles Angels in the sixth round of the 2007 June Draft. His lone major league experience came in 2013 with the Angels, when he appeared in seven games and allowed two runs in 9.0 innings.

The PawSox are thus two under the roster limit with 23 active players (rehabbing starting pitcher Drew Pomeranz does not count against the active roster).

Infielder **Tzu-Wei Lin** became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season (not including rehabbing players) on April 10 before rejoining Pawtucket on May 8, returning to Boston on June 23, and now back with Pawtucket (July 2). **Marcus Walden** was #2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (but he is now back with the PawSox). **Bobby Poyner** became the third call-up on May 4 – he later returned to Pawtucket, went back to Boston (May 15), back again with the PawSox, to Boston (June 2), and now returned to Pawtucket. 1B/OF **Sam Travis** became the fourth call-up on June 2 (now back with the PawSox), RHP **Brandon Workman** was next on June 5, LHP **Jalen Beeks** followed on June 6 (but has since returned to Pawtucket). RHP **Justin Haley** was the next call-up to Boston on June 8, was optioned on June 19, recalled to Boston again on June 26, and optioned back to Pawtucket on July 2. LHP **Robby Scott** was promoted to Boston on June 19 but was optioned to Pawtucket on June 23. RHP **William Cuevas** was promoted to Boston on July 2, optioned back on July 4, but now recalled again on July 8. Reliever **Ryan Brasier** became the 10<sup>th</sup> different player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston on July 8.

The PawSox have employed 9 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment already this season...LHP Drew Pomeranz (twice and currently now), RHP Steven Wright (twice but back in Boston), LHP Bobby Poyner (optioned to Pawtucket, recalled again to Boston, and now back with the PawSox), INF Xander Bogaerts (returned to Boston), RHP Tyler Thornburg (three times but now in Boston), INF/OF Brock Holt (back with Boston), 2B Dustin Pedroia (back with the Red Sox), RHP Austin Maddox (returned to Boston but remains on Red Sox DL), and RHP Hector Velazquez (returned to Boston).

It was another busy player movement year in 2017. The PawSox were involved in 221 player transactions during the 2017 season. Pawtucket employed 55 different players last season (28 pitchers & 27 position players). They had 18 different players promoted to Boston during the 2017 season (not including rehabbing players).
