Buffalo Bisons RHP Nick Tepesch (0-1, 1.64) vs. Pawtucket Red Sox LHP Josh D. Smith (3-3, 2.88)

The Chase Is On - The (tied for) 3rd-place Pawtucket Red Sox and the 2nd-place Buffalo Bisons (AAA-Toronto) play game three of their 4-game series at McCoy Stadium tonight at 6:15 pm. Last night the clubs split a make-up doubleheader with each team winning via shutout...Buffalo took the opener, 4-0 but the PawSox bounced back to blank the Bisons in the nightcap, 6-0. Pawtucket is tied with Scranton/WB for 3rd-place in the IL North (-7½ GB of front-running Lehigh Valley) but the Sox are just -3½ GB of 2nd-place Buffalo. Including these two games at McCoy the next two nights, the PawSox and Bisons will meet 6 times in the next 9 days including a 4-game set in Buffalo next Monday – Thursday.

This Series and Homestand - This series concludes tomorrow (Thursday) with the official start to summer when these teams play the finale of their 4-game set at 6:15 pm live on NESN. The homestand will continue with another exciting weekend on tap when the PawSox host the Syracuse Chiefs to conclude Pawtucket's second of two homestands here in June. Friday at 7:05 pm will be Pedro Martinez replica jersey night, Saturday at 6:15 pm will feature Beatles post-game fireworks, and Sunday at 1:35 pm will be highlighted by a tribute to the Armed Services before the game and Run the Bases after.

Wednesday Hump Day – After tonight, the PawSox will not play another Wednesday home game for over a month...until Wednesday July 25 vs. Columbus. That is Pawtucket's only home Wednesday game during the entire month of July. The Sox do have two Wednesday games in August (Aug. 15 at 12:05 pm vs. Norfolk and Aug. 29 vs. Lehigh Valley at 7:05 pm). Pawtucket is 18-17 at home this season compared to 15-19 on the road.

What Have You Done for Me Lately – Pawtucket has lost 4 of 6 following their 4-game winning streak from June 10-13 (that fell one shy of equaling their longest of the season (the Sox won 5 straight from May 27-31). Pawtucket has still won 6 of 10 and 14 of their last 23 games since May 27. Before that, the Sox had lost 15 of their previous 19 games from May 7-26.

Swimming Up Stream - Pawtucket came up short in their attempt to reach the .500 level for the first time since May 11 on both June 14 and June 16 when they suffered defeats at Lehigh Valley. The Sox (now at 33-36) were last at .500 when they were 16-16 on May 11. In addition, the PawSox had worked their way up from 6th (last) place on June 5 to sole possession of 3rd-place from June 12-15 (they were 5-games out on Friday), but they are now tied for 3rd-place in the division and -7½ GB of front-running Lehigh Valley.

North Face - On June 11 the PawSox began a span of 32 straight games against IL North rivals through July 15 (which is just after the All-Star break). Pawtucket is 19-26 vs. their IL North foes thus far. They are 7-8 vs. the IL West and 7-2 vs. the IL South.

Getting in Tune in June – The PawSox are past the midpoint of June with a 9-9 mark. They are hitting .259 (155-for-599) with 15 HR this month along with a 3.35 ERA (57 ER in 153 IP). Pawtucket, who finished 11-10 this April and 13-17 this May (hitting just .227 in May), had their best month of last season in June going 17-14. They are scheduled to play 29 games in 30 days this June.

The 2018 Season-Series vs. Buffalo – The PawSox and Buffalo are even in their season-series at 5 victories apiece. Pawtucket is 3-4 here vs. the Bisons but 2-1 in Buffalo. The Bisons took 2 of 3 in Pawtucket during the first full week of the season from April 9-11, but the PawSox returned the favor by winning 2 of 3 in Buffalo at the end of the month from April 27-29. Buffalo out-last-ed the PawSox on April 9, 4-3 in 12-innings in the first extra inning game at McCoy with new rules. The Sox evened things with a 3-1 victory the next night, but the Bisons captured the series outright with a 14-8 slugfest victory in the finale on the afternoon of April 11. Just over two weeks later, the PawSox went to Buffalo and won 2 of 3. That series again began with a Sox extra inning victory (9-8 in 10-innings on April 27) followed by a 6-3 Pawtucket win the next day. The Bisons avoided the sweep with a 2-0 triumph in the finale on April 29. Just over a month ago the clubs played an abbreviated 2-game series that began with a 6-5, 10-inning victory for the PawSox on May 14 and ended with a 5-4 Bisons win on May 16 to knot the season-series at 4-4. In between was the May 15 rainout that caused Tuesday night's doubleheader – Buffalo won opener, 4-0 but Sox took nightcap, 6-0.

Stats vs. the Bisons This Season – Pawtucket is hitting .229 in the 10 games vs. Buffalo this season (76-for-332) with 8 HR while PawSox pitchers are 5-5 with a 3.70 ERA vs. the Bisons (37 ER in 90 IP). Buffalo has out-scored Pawtucket, 46-45 thus far in the tight 2018 season-series.

Getting to Know You –The PawSox and Bisons will meet 20 times this season...9 in Pawtucket (but with the final game between the clubs here at McCoy this year tomorrow night) and 11 in Buffalo. The Sox and Bisons will next see each other next week for a 4-game set in Buffalo from June 25-28 beginning next Monday at 7:05 pm at Coca-Cola Field in downtown Buffalo.

Success vs. the Bisons Lately – Pawtucket and Buffalo have had some tight season-series in recent years. The PawSox finished 9-9 vs. the Bisons last season (going 6-5 in Pawtucket but 3-4 in Buffalo). The PawSox were 10-8 vs. the Bisons in 2016, but the Sox finished 8-9 vs. Buffalo in 2015. The 2015 season marked the only time the Sox have lost a season-series to the Bisons since 2008 when they went 6-10.

Always a Battle vs. Buffalo - The all-time series (this is the 21st year) between Pawtucket and Buffalo has gone back and forth in recent times and the PawSox come into play tonight with a 169-163 advantage. These two rivals have battled for 20½ years now since Buffalo returned to the IL in 1998. The PawSox are 93-77 at home (including 0-1 at Fenway Park) vs. the Bisons but 76-86 in Buffalo since '98. Buffalo was a Cleveland affiliate from 1998 – 2008, a New York Mets affiliate from 2009-2012, and currently a Toronto Blue Jays affiliate for the 6th straight year.

Series Business – Pawtucket – even at 1-1 in this 4-game set vs. Buffalo - has posted three 3-game sweeps this season along with a 2-game sweep. They are 7-11-4 in their first 25 series of the season (7 wins, 10 losses, and 4 splits).

A Hectic May - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May with a 13-17 record for the month. The topsy-turvy travel month included four different homestands and four different roadtrips. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May while batters hit .227 with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month.

April Comes up a Winner – The PawSox posted a winning April for the 6th time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in 2nd-place in the IL North (-2 GB of front-running Syracuse at the time). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

Trending – The PawSox (now at 33-36) were a season-low 8-games below .500 on May 26 at 19-27. It was their lowest point since they ended last year with a 67-75 record. On May 6 the Sox had matched their season-high of 3-games over the .500 mark (15-12) from April 28 when they were 11-8. Pawtucket was a season-worst -8½ GB of front-running Lehigh Valley on May 26 and had been in last-place in the IL North for much of the last week of May. The Sox were in 1st-place on May 7.

One and Done – The PawSox are 13-7 in 1-run games this season (.650) – the best winning pct. in 1-run affairs in the league.

Throwing Strikes – Pawtucket pitchers are 2nd in the International League with 631 strikeouts. Durham leads with 675 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April 20), 15 (three times), 14 (twice), 13, 12 (four times), 11 (three times), and 10 (12 times) this season.

Walk This Way – PawSox batters were last in the league in team batting for most of May and into June, but they are now 12th out of 14 with their .237 average...it was .238 as late as June 17 which matched their highest since May 12 also at .238. The Sox are 3rd in the IL with 232 walks.

Defensive – Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are last in the league with a .976 fielding pct. (57 errors in 2385 total chances) as their 57 errors are the most in the IL.

Working Overtime – Pawtucket (5-1) and Buffalo (5-3) have an IL-high five extra inning victories this season. Pawtucket has played five overtime games at home (winning 4 of those 5 extra inning games at McCoy). However, the Sox have not been involved in an extra inning game since May 14 (a 6-5, 10-inning win vs. Buffalo).

Blanketed – The PawSox have been shutout a league-high 9 times this season. Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shutout games last year. They are 5-9 in shutout games thus far in 2018. Prior to Tuesday night's 4-0 loss in Game 1 to Buffalo, the Sox had not been blanked since May 20 (3-0 at Rochester).

A Look Back Before We Go Forth – Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in 4th-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under .500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over .500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went 33-39 on the road.

BOSTON RED SOX DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM –

Portland (26-43) – The Portland Sea Dogs (AA) were swept in a make-up doubleheader at home vs. Reading last night. The Fightin' Phils won the opener, 7-1. Mike Shawaryn (3-6) took the loss – 6.1 IP, 7 H, 6 R, 5 ER, 3 BB, 4 SO. Danny Mars had a single and a double. Reading pulled out a 6-5 win in the nightcap to complete the sweep. Adam Lau (0-3) was the loser despite pitching well in relief – 2.1 IP, 3 H, 1 R. Mars had a single and a triple and scored 2 runs while Jordan Betts went 2-for-3 with 2 RBI.

Salem (32-36) – The Salem Red Sox (A) finished the 1st-half of the Carolina League season in 3rd-place in the Northern Division. The team is off for the All-Star break. Salem had five players appear in the CL All-Star Game last night in Zebulon, NC (home of the Carolina Mudcats) won by the Southern All-Stars (now Salem's club), 7-6. Sox catcher Roldani Baldwin, 1B Jerry Downs, SS Santiago Espinal and relievers Matthew Gorst and Daniel Gonzalez all played for the Northern All-Stars. Salem begins the 2nd half on Thursday vs. Frederick.

Greenville (25-44) – The Greenville Drive (A) finished the 1st-half of the South Atlantic League season in 7th (last)-place in the Southern Division. The team is off for the All-Star break. Greenville had four players and manager Iggy Suarez appear in the SAL All-Star Game at Greensboro, NC last night. Representing the Southern All-Stars, who won 9-5, from Greenville were pitchers Kutter Crawford, Devon Fisher, and Denyi Reyes along with OF Victor Acosta. Greenville begins the 2nd half on Thursday vs. Asheville.

Lowell (3-2) – The Lowell Spinners (short-A) edged Staten Island, 2-1 last night. Taylor Ahearn was the winner with 4 scoreless innings of relief. Alexander Montero turned in a strong start – 5 IP, 1 R, 7 SO. Andre Colon cracked a double and a triple and Kyle Cottom contributed 2 RBI.

One of the most colorful days of the year at McCoy Stadium will take place on Sunday prior to the PawSox game with Syracuse at 1:35 pm. With extra special meaning again this year, please join us as we celebrate our 39th Annual Armed Services Day in a tribute to the men & women who serve our nation. Armed Services Day pre-game ceremonies feature the Colonial Militia, Parade of Flags, and performances from the National Guard's 88th Army Band. That's Sunday when we honor the armed services at McCoy prior to the 1:35 pm game vs. Syracuse.

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES – None today. The PawSox will soon add RHP **Justin Haley** who was optioned back to the PawSox yesterday when the Red Sox recalled Robby Scott. Haley was promoted to Boston on June 8 and made one relief appearance for the Red Sox on June 13 at Baltimore throwing two scoreless innings. He is 3-6 with a 3.18 ERA in 11 starts for Pawtucket this season and is slated to start for the PawSox tomorrow night.

The PawSox are one under the roster limit with 24 active players (rehabbing reliever Tyler Thornburg does not count against the active roster).

Infielder **Tzu-Wei Lin** became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season (not including rehabbing players) on April 10 before returning on May 8. **Marcus Walden** was #2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (but he is now back with the PawSox). **Bobby Poyner** became the third call-up on May 4 – he later returned to Pawtucket, went back to Boston (May 15), back again with the PawSox, to Boston (June 2), and now returned to Pawtucket. 1B/OF **Sam Travis** became the fourth call-up on June 2 (now back with the PawSox), RHP **Brandon Workman** was next on June 5, LHP **Jalen Beeks** followed on June 6 (but has since returned to Pawtucket). RHP **Justin Haley** was the next call-up to Boston on June 8 but was optioned on June 19. LHP **Robby Scott** became the 8th different player promoted to Boston on June 19.

The PawSox have employed 9 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment already this season...LHP Drew Pomeranz (back in Boston), RHP Steven Wright (twice but back in Boston), LHP Bobby Poyner (optioned to Pawtucket, recalled again to Boston, and now back with the PawSox), INF Xander Bogaerts (returned to Boston), RHP Tyler Thornburg (three times), INF/OF Brock Holt (back with Boston), 2B Dustin Pedroia (back with the Red Sox), RHP Austin Maddox (returned to Boston but remains on Red Sox DL), and RHP Hector Velazquez (returned to Boston).

It was another busy player movement year in 2017. The PawSox were involved in 221 player transactions during the 2017 season. Pawtucket employed 55 different players last season (28 pitchers & 27 position players). They had 18 different players promoted to Boston during the 2017 season (not including rehabbing players).
