Syracuse Chiefs RHP John Simms (2-3, 3.48) vs. Pawtucket Red Sox LHP Jalen Beeks (4-4, 2.65)

The Last Sunday in June - The Pawtucket Red Sox play their final home game in the month of June (rather amazingly) when they host the Syracuse Chiefs (AAA-Washington) in the rubber game of their 3-game weekend series this afternoon at 1:35 pm at McCoy Stadium (live on myRITV). Five has been the lucky number thus far in the series...the PawSox won the opener on Friday, 5-4 but the Chiefs evened things with a 5-3 victory last night. That loss snapped Pawtucket's 4-game winning streak – one shy of their season-long 5-game winning streak. A little more than a week and a half ago the PawSox swept a 3-game series in Syracuse from June 11-13 by scores of 3-1, 5-3, and 5-1. Pawtucket's 4-game winning streak vs. the Chiefs was stopped last night.

This Homestand - This 7-game homestand – Sox are 4-2 thus far after taking 3 of 4 from Buffalo last week and going 1-1 vs. Syracuse this weekend) concludes today with this remarkably being the last Sunday in June already. After today, the PawSox will be gone all of this week for a 7-game roadtrip that begins with 4-games in Buffalo tomorrow (Monday) night vs. the 2nd-place Bisons. The first three games of that series (Mon. – Wed.) will all be at 7:05 pm with the finale on Thursday afternoon at 1:05 pm. The Sox will then slide south to Moosic, PA for a 3-game weekend set at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Friday (7:05 pm), Saturday (6:35 pm), and Sunday (1:05 pm). The Sox will head home after the Sunday afternoon game and be back at McCoy for just two games – the traditional July 2 & 3 Patriotic Firework games (both at 6:15 pm vs. Rochester) one week from this Monday and Tuesday evenings.

Hovering Around .500 – Pawtucket did return to the .500 mark on Friday night at 36-36 for the first time since May 11 (16-16). However, the defeat last night prevented the Sox from pulling above .500 for the first time since May 8 at 15-14.

Home Sweet Home – The PawSox 4-game home winning streak came to an end last night. Pawtucket is 21-18 at home after equaling their season-high of 4-games over .500 at McCoy on Friday (from May 22 at 12-8). The Sox are 15-19 on the road.

The Chase Is On - The (tied for) 3rd-place Pawtucket Red Sox (with Scranton/WB and Rochester) are just a ½ GB of 2nd-place Buffalo. The PawSox are -6½ GB of front-running Lehigh Valley in the IL North who have opened a 6-game lead and in the division. The last time the Sox were closer than 5-games out was June 3 (-4½ GB).

What Have You Done for Me Lately – Pawtucket has presently won 4 of their last 5 games following a 3-game losing streak. The Sox have had a pair of 4-game winning streaks from June 10-13 and G2 on June 19-22. Those fell one shy of equaling their longest of the season when the Sox won 5 straight from May 27-31. Over a longer stretch, Pawtucket has won 9 of 14 and 17 of their last 27 games since May 27. Before that, the Sox had lost 15 of their previous 19 games from May 7-26.

Getting in Tune in June – The PawSox are into the final week of June with a 12-10 mark. They are hitting .267 (195-for-731) with 19 HR this month along with a 3.19 ERA (67 ER in 189 IP). Pawtucket, who finished 11-10 this April and 13-17 this May (hitting just .227 in May), had their best month of last season in June going 17-14. They are scheduled to play 29 games in 30 days this June.

North Face - On June 11 the PawSox began a span of 32 straight games against IL North rivals through July 15 (which is just after the All-Star break). Pawtucket is 22-27 vs. their IL North foes thus far. They are 7-8 vs. the IL West and 7-2 vs. the IL South.

Series Business – Pawtucket – even at 1-1 in this 3-game set vs. Syracuse – is 8-11-4 in their first 26 series of the season (8 wins, 10 losses, and 4 splits). They have posted three 3-game sweeps this season along with a 2-game sweep.

Giddy Up – For what it's worth...Syracuse has grounded into the most double plays in the league with 67 GIDP while Pawtucket is next with 64 GIDP.

Getting to Know You – Pawtucket is 5-4 this season vs. Syracuse after going 15-5 vs. the Chiefs last year. These clubs will have met a total of 10 times over a one month span since June 11 through July 15...including this weekend set in Pawtucket (the first time the Chiefs have come to McCoy Stadium this season). The teams will be back in Pawtucket for a 4-game series just after the All-Star break from July 12-15. Overall these two teams will face each other 18 times this season...11 in Syracuse and 7 in Pawtucket.

2018 Season-Series vs. Syracuse – Prior to this weekend (Friday night's 5-4 Sox triumph and last night's 5-3 Chiefs win), Pawtucket most recently had swept a 3-game series in Syracuse last week from June 11-13. The PawSox won by scores of 3-1, 5-3 (rallying for 3 runs in the top of the 9th to win that game) and then completed the sweep with a 5-1 victory on June 13. Syracuse took 3 of 4 from the PawSox one month prior to that at NBT Bank Stadium in their first series against each other. The Chiefs won the opener on May 10, 6-4; the Sox notched their only victory of the series the next night, 12-2; but Syracuse won both games over the weekend by 6-5 and 9-1 scores on May 12 & 13.

Stats vs. the 'Cuse - The Sox are hitting .275 in the 9 games vs. the Chiefs (83-for-302) with 4 HR (Lind, Ohlman, Olt, and De Jesus) and 43 runs scored. Sox pitchers vs. the Chiefs are 5-4 with a 3.91 ERA (34 ER in 78.1 IP) allowing 37 runs (with 4 homers for Syracuse).

2017 Season-Series vs. Syracuse – Pawtucket will have to go a ways to have similar success against Syracuse this season as they did last year when they went 15-5 vs. the Chiefs including a 9-1 record at NBT Bank Stadium in Syracuse. The PawSox were actually 15-2 at one point vs. Syracuse last season before getting swept in a 3-game set last August 1-3 vs. the Chiefs at McCoy. The 15 wins in 2017 against one opponent in a season tied a PawSox franchise-record...the Sox have won 15 games against an International League club on a couple of occasions – most recently prior to last year when they went 15-1 vs. Lehigh Valley in 2008 – but they have never won 16 games vs. another IL team in a single season.

Stats vs. the Chiefs in 2017 - The PawSox out-scored the Chiefs, 107-61 in the season-series in 2017. The Sox hit .293 in the 20 games vs. Syracuse (easily their best against any other club) with 25 HR including 7 HR by Rusney Castillo (Rusney hit .368 in 18 games vs. the Chiefs with 9 2B, 7 HR and 16 RBI last year). PawSox pitchers went 15-5 with a 3.05 ERA vs. Syracuse last year.

A Hectic May - The PawSox finished an extremely busy May with a 13-17 record for the month. The topsy-turvy travel month included four different homestands and four different roadtrips. Pitchers posted a 3.60 ERA in May while batters hit .227 with 22 HR and 97 runs in 30 May games (for an average of 3.2 runs per game). The Sox played 30 games in 31 days in May with just one scheduled off-day (May 17) during the entire month.

April Comes up a Winner – The PawSox posted a winning April for the 6th time in the last 8 years as they finished the month with an 11-10 record and in 2nd-place in the IL North (-2 GB of front-running Syracuse at the time). Pawtucket has had just one losing month of April since 2010 and that came last year (10-12). The Sox hit .233 in April with 16 HR in 21 games while pitchers were 11-10 with a 3.51 ERA along with a league-leading 230 strikeouts in 190 innings.

Trending Positive – The PawSox (now at 36-37) were a season-low 8-games below .500 on May 26 at 19-27. It was their lowest point since they ended last year with a 67-75 record. On May 6 the Sox had matched their season-high of 3-games over the .500 mark (15-12) from April 28 when they were 11-8. Pawtucket was a season-worst -8½ GB of front-running Lehigh Valley on May 26 and had been in last-place in the IL North for much of the last week of May. The Sox were in 1st-place on May 7.

One and Done – The PawSox are 14-7 in 1-run games this season (.667) – the best winning pct. in 1-run affairs in the league.

Throwing Strikes – Pawtucket pitchers are 2nd in the International League with 658 strikeouts. Durham leads with 6702 SO. Sox hurlers have posted strikeout games of 20 (April 9), 18 (April 20), 15 (three times), 14 (twice), 13, 12 (four times), 11 (three times), and 10 (13 times) this season.

Walk This Way – PawSox batters were last in the league in team batting for most of May and into June, but they are now 12th with their .241 average...their highest since April 28 at .242. The Sox are tied with Lehigh Valley for the IL lead with 255 walks.

Defensive – Last year the PawSox led the International League with a .987 fielding pct. while making a league-low 64 errors on the season (both new franchise-records). This season the Sox are next to last in the league with a .977 fielding pct. (59 errors in 2541 total chances) as their 59 errors are 2nd most in the IL (Buffalo has 62 errors).

Working Overtime – Pawtucket (5-1), Rochester (5-2), and Buffalo (5-3) have an IL-high five extra inning victories this season. Pawtucket has played five overtime games at home (winning 4 of those 5 extra inning games at McCoy). However, the Sox have not been involved in an extra inning game since May 14 (a 6-5, 10-inning win vs. Buffalo).

Blanketed – The PawSox have been shutout a league-high 9 times this season. Pawtucket was blanked 9 times total in 2017. They went 18-9 in shutout games last year. They are 5-9 in shutout games thus far in 2018. Prior to the 4-0 loss in Game 1 to Buffalo on June 19, the Sox had not been blanked since May 20 (3-0 at Rochester).

A Look Back Before We Go Forth – Pawtucket finished 67-75 last year and in 4th-place in the IL North for the second straight season. They dropped to a season-low 9-games under .500 on August 26 at 62-71. On July 18, 2017 the PawSox were a season-best 6-games over .500 at 50-44. Pawtucket finished 34-36 in games played at McCoy Stadium last season. Thus they finished with just their second losing season at McCoy in the last 8 years. The Sox went 33-39 on the road.

BOSTON RED SOX DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM –

Portland (27-46) – The Portland Sea Dogs (AA) fell to Trenton, 8-4 last night as the Thunder blasted a game-winning grand slam in the top of the 10th. The decisive blow came off Jordan Weems. Jordan Betts belted a 2-run HR (his first with the Sea Dogs) and another former PawSox Chad De La Guerra added 2 hits and 1 RBI.

Salem (2-1)/(34-37) – The Salem Red Sox (A) edged Frederick last night, 7-6 on a walk-off single by Jordan Procysen in the bottom of the 9th. Trenton Kemp delivered a clutch 2-run double to tie the game at 6-6 in the 9th and then scored the game winner on the Procysen single. Bobby Dalbec drilled a 2-run double in the 8th that at the time put the Sox up 5-4. Yankory Pimental (1-1) could not nail down the save (giving up 2 runs in the top of the 9th) but became a winner thanks to the Salem rally in the bottom half.

Greenville (1-2)/(26-46) – The Greenville Drive (A) fell to Asheville, 4-3 in 10 innings last night. Devon Fisher (3-5) was charged with an unearned run in the 10th to take the loss. Isaias Lucena was 3-for-3 with 2 RBI and Victor Acosta crushed a solo HR (#7).

Lowell (4-5) – The Lowell Spinners (short-A) lost at Tri-City, 8-2 last night.

PAWSOX PLAYER MOVES – None today. The PawSox are at the roster limit with 25 active players (rehabbing reliever Tyler Thornburg does not count against the active roster).

Infielder **Tzu-Wei Lin** became the first player promoted from Pawtucket to Boston this season (not including rehabbing players) on April 10 before rejoining Pawtucket on May 8 and then returning to Boston on June 23. **Marcus Walden** was #2 following his quick recall on April 12 and then another recall on May 2 (but he is now back with the PawSox). **Bobby Poyner** became the third call-up on May 4 – he later returned to Pawtucket, went back to Boston (May 15), back again with the PawSox, to Boston (June 2), and now returned to Pawtucket. 1B/OF **Sam Travis** became the fourth call-up on June 2 (now back with the PawSox), RHP **Brandon Workman** was next on June 5, LHP **Jalen Beeks** followed on June 6 (but has since returned to Pawtucket). RHP **Justin Haley** was the next call-up to Boston on June 8 but was optioned on June 19. LHP **Robby Scott** became the 8th different player promoted to Boston on June 19 but was optioned to Pawtucket on June 23.

The PawSox have employed 9 different Red Sox players on a rehab assignment already this season...LHP Drew Pomeranz (back in Boston), RHP Steven Wright (twice but back in Boston), LHP Bobby Poyner (optioned to Pawtucket, recalled again to Boston, and now back with the PawSox), INF Xander Bogaerts (returned to Boston), RHP Tyler Thornburg (three times), INF/OF Brock Holt (back with Boston), 2B Dustin Pedroia (back with the Red Sox), RHP Austin Maddox (returned to Boston but remains on Red Sox DL), and RHP Hector Velazquez (returned to Boston).

It was another busy player movement year in 2017. The PawSox were involved in 221 player transactions during the 2017 season. Pawtucket employed 55 different players last season (28 pitchers & 27 position players). They had 18 different players promoted to Boston during the 2017 season (not including rehabbing players).
