



There are very few things in life that I've committed 10 years to, but Charlotte Sports Park is one of them. When asked to sit down and write a reflection of the last 10 years, I honestly didn't know where to start, for a couple of reasons. For starters, I didn't want to bore you with the minute details from my cat-bird seat. And secondly, this article is more about the great fan experiences had at Charlotte Sports Park from all perspectives. Because when it boils down to it, we are all fans of the game. Baseball is the perfect game, without question. CSP is the perfect environment for the perfect game. And while this article definitely has some imperfections, here is my A-Z list of some of the great memories of the first 10 years of Charlotte Stone Crabs baseball.

A- All-Star Game - The Stone Crabs held the 2012 All-Star Game at Charlotte Sports Park in front of 5,678 fans. The South squad, led by Stone Crabs All-Stars C.J. Riefenhauser, Chris Rearick, Derek Dietrich, and Mikie Mahtook led the South Division to a 6-3 victory.

B-Rocco Baldelli - A brainchild of former marketing manager Jonathan Gantt, the Stone Crabs hosted Rocco Baldelli Mustache Night on August 4th, 2010. Baldelli,



who was rehabbing for the Tampa Bay Rays, is not only responsible for the greatest upper-lip wear in Stone Crabs history, but the single greatest promotion held at CSP.

C- Alex Cobb - Cobb, a fourth round pick of the Rays in 2006, threw the first pitch in Stone Crabs history. Cobb would finish the season with an 8-5 record in '09 before becoming a lynchpin in the Rays rotation in 2011.

P- Dollar Drafts - Thursday is a favorite amongst fans at Charlotte Sports Park, as fans have been able to purchase dollar draft beers and dollar fountain sodas. However, in 2018, the Stone Crabs have unveiled 50 cent draft beers from 4:30-5:30 p.m. Can't find a better deal than that!

E- Eleven-in-a-row - During their championship run in 2015, the Stone Crabs struggled mightily in August. From July 31st through August 12th, the Stone Crabs dropped 11 games in a row. Despite winning their next two games, they then lost eight in a row to cap off the worst month in franchise history.

F- Jared Forma - Forma took over the sinking Stone Crabs' front office in 2013 as the fourth GM in four years. Forma has solidified the front office while rejuvenating the fan experience at Charlotte Sports Park. Known better as the "Fans' Man," Forma is always up for a good conversation with the Charlotte Sports Park faithful.

G- Greg Thomas - Thomas, along with Jim Dumais, Ralph Miller, Ken and Marianne Rambo, and Jack Scheiffler, have been guiding fans to their seats and helping solve the world's problems (well, CSP problems) since 2009.

H- Joe Hart - Hart, the Stone Crabs General Manager from inception in 2008, until late 2011, deserves many thanks from the Charlotte County community as his community-centered focus helped bring back good feelings about baseball in Charlotte County.

/- Independence Day Celebration - Each year, the Stone Crabs hold our Third of July Spectacular to honor America. Widely considered the greatest night of the year, each one gets bigger and better!

J- Michael Johns - Johns, who started managing in the Rays system in 2010, took over in 2015 for now-Durham Bulls manager, Jared Sandburg. In his first year, Johns guided the Stone Crabs through the greatest first half in franchise history (45-25), labored through the worst August stretch in franchise history (6-20) and ultimately, raised the Florida State League Championship trophy.

K-Kevin Kiermaier -The current face of the Rays spent 57 games here at CSP in 2012. Kiermaier hit .260 with seven doubles and 12 RBI before a wrist injury sidelined him for the rest of the season. While the offensive numbers were less than spectacular, his defensive prowess showed his potential as a platinum-glove outfielder.

L- Hak Ju-Lee - Lee was acquired in the franchise-altering trade between the Rays and Chicago Cubs, which also brought Brandon Guyer, Sam Fuld, and All-Star starting pitcher, Chris Archer, to Tampa Bay. Lee hit .318 in 97 games with the Stone Crabs and looked to be on the fast track to the Major Leagues. However, in 2013 with the Triple-A Durham Bulls, Lee suffered a torn ACL and sadly, has never regained his 2013 form.

M-Roy Morales - On May 19th, 2017, as the Stone Crabs hosted the Jupiter Hammerheads, Morales went back behind home plate to catch a routine foul ball. As the catcher dove into the protective netting to catch the pop-up, the net ripped off its moorings attached to the stadium. Due to the severity of the damage and difficulty of putting it back up, the Hammerheads and Stone Crabs were forced to continue the postponed game, and play another on the backfields of Charlotte Sports Park. Stone Crabs GM Jared Forma, along with assistant GM Jeff Cook, gave out free hot dogs, hamburgers, drinks, and chips to the faithful fans who stayed in attendance.

N-New Ownership - It was 2016 and it was time for a change. The Caribbean Baseball Initiative, led by former Pawtucket Red Sox GM/Owner Lou Schweccheimer, bought the Stone Crabs from then-owners, Ripken Baseball. The CBI Rays family-friendly strategy and community-based initiatives have and will continue to pave the way for future baseball success in Charlotte County for years to come.

O- Opening Day - The Stone Crabs' have a 5-4 record on opening day, with two of those wins coming against this year's opening day opponent, the Fort Myers Miracle (2012, 2015).

P- Perfect Game - Late in the 2012 season and eliminated from playoff contention, the Stone Crabs continued to play out the rest of the regular season on a hot, August night against the Palm Beach Cardinals. Chris Corrigan, a 30th round pick in the 2009 draft, tossed the first perfect game in Charlotte Sports Park history, blanking the hapless Stone Crabs, 8-0.

Q- Juniel Querecuto - One of the unlikeliest call-ups in Tampa Bay Rays history, Querecuto hit .293 in 41 games as a Stone Crab in 2015. The infielder never hit higher than .242 between Montgomery and Durham, but was a late-season call-up by the Rays in 2016.

R- Cal Ripken, Jr. - The "Iron Man" along with his brother, Billy, purchased the then-Vero Beach Rays, and moved them to Port Charlotte in 2009. If not for them and the Tampa Bay Rays, there may still have been a baseball void in Charlotte County to this day.

3- Blake Snell - Not many pitchers can top what Snell did in 2015. Snell went 15-4 with a 1.41 ERA, across three levels. The lefty started in Port Charlotte, and ran a 3-0 record while not allowing a run, before being called up to Montgomery. In fact, Snell did not allow a single run until May 23rd; his fifth start with the Biscuits.

7- Tim Tebow - Tebow-Mania visited Charlotte Sports Park from July 29th-August 1st and August 22nd-24th of 2017. Although Tebow struggled mightily against the Stone Crabs (3-for-18, .166), his seventh-inning home run in front of a record attendance of 7,515 electrified the crowd, both Mets and Stone Crabs fans alike.

V- Melvin Upton - The artist formerly known as B.J. Upton took the first offensive swings for the Stone Crabs while on rehab assignment from Tampa Bay. Upton went 4-for-9 in three games with the Stone Crabs before returning to the Rays lineup.

V- Stephen Vogt - Arguably the single greatest player/personality in Stone Crabs history, Vogt led the FSL with a .345 average with eight home runs and 47 RBI in 2010. Vogt's affable demeanor and willingness to interact with staff and fans alike made him a fan favorite with all at CSP.

W- Kean Wong - As the Stone Crabs' starting second baseman for a large part of the season, Wong hit .274 with 36 RBI, but is remembered by most as the player who drew the walk-off walk in the Stone Crabs' FSL Championship-clinching game.

X- No X's - Although the Stone Crabs have never had a player's name who started with an X, there has been a player with two X's in their first name. Maxx Tissenbaum was a member of the Stone Crabs' for the 2014-2015 seasons. Tissenbaum, who was an FSL All-Star for Charlotte in 2014, hit .275 with 25 doubles and 84 RBI in 159 games in a Stone Crabs' uniform.

Y- YOU - The Charlotte Stone Crabs attribute all of the success we've achieved because of YOU, our fans. We firmly believe that we have the greatest fan base in the Florida State League! Thank you!

Z- Zach Quate - Arguably the greatest closer in Stone Crabs' history, Quate saved 25 games in 2010. Using his devastating slider, Quate was almost untouchable, finishing the season with a 1.49 ERA, while holding opponents to a .199 batting average.





Bayer ranked third on Low-A Bowling Green in strikeouts (95) last season, holding Midwest League hitters to a .229 average. His funky delivery makes his low-90s fastball tough to hit. Bayer began his college career at Richmond University before transferring to Cal Poly Pomona, where he struck out 103 batters in 2016 to lead the conference.

BROCK BURKE: PITCHER

A third round pick out of high school in 2014, Burke went 11-6 with a 2.99 ERA at two different levels last year. The lanky lefty posted a 1.04 ERA with a 0.77 WHIP over his final four starts with Bowling Green, earning a promotion to the Stone Crabs on June 8. His track record of strong performance goes back to 2016, when he finished tied for the team lead in strikeouts (61) for Low-A Hudson Valley.

J.D. BUSFIELD: PITCHER

Busfield mastered his control last year for the Hot Rods, allowing just 20 walks over 109.1 innings of work. He posted a 2.43 ERA in the first half of the season, inducing twice as many ground balls as fly balls with his sharp sinker. A seventh round pick out of Loyola Marymount in 2016, Busfield set the school's single-season record for saves (14) as a sophomore in 2015.

Fox headlines a group of returners from the 2017 Stone Crabs team that made a strong playoff push in the second half. Named the Rays' Baserunner of the Year, Fox stole 30 bases last season, the second most in the organization. Fox joined the Stone Crabs on July 25 and quickly wowed the crowd with his remarkable range at shortstop. He was acquired in the Matt Moore trade in 2015 after signing with the Giants out of the Bahamas.

Acquired from the Pirates in the Corey Dickerson trade on February 22, Gray immediately impressed the Rays with his versatility, athleticism and advanced approach. Those attributes earned him a spot with the Stone Crabs in his first full pro season after being drafted in the 13th round out of Rice. Gray drove in 37 runs in 53 games for Low-A West Virginia last summer after leading Rice in hitting (.313) while clubbing eight home runs during his college season.

A YOUNG OUTFIELD READY TO SHINE IN 2018

A YOUNG OUTFIELD READY TO SHINE IN 2018

Get ready, Stone Crabs fans, because one of the most talented, promising and electrifying outfields in Minor League Baseball is about ready to shine bright at Charlotte Sports Park in 2018.

Three of the top 11 prospects in the Tampa Bay Rays' organization will eventually be playing the same outfield together for the Stone Crabs. Garret Whitley, Josh Lowe and Jesus Sanches are all 21 years old or younger, all drove in 55 runs or more last season, and are all considered excellent defenders.

"We don't ever want to let anything drop," Garrett Whitley said. "We have the potential to be one of the best outfields in the minor leagues. All three of us play a real good outfield and we can get to a lot of balls."

Which is good, given the amount of real estate there is to patrol at Charlotte Sports Park. Whitley, who will start on the disabled list with a shoulder injury, is the elder-statesman of the group at the ripe age of 21.

Two-thirds of the trio are first round picks. Whitley was taken out of high school in upstate New York in 2015, while Josh Lowe was selected 13th overall the year after. Sanchez, meanwhile, was signed for a reasonable price of \$400 thousand out of the Dominican Republic and has done nothing but hit ever since.

"He's an amazing hitter," Whitley said about Sanchez. "That dude, it's like every ball he hits falls in. It's crazy. He's just an exciting guy to see at the plate."

Sanchez was named the Rays' Minor League Player of the Year in 2017 after he hit .305 with 15 home runs and 82 RBI for Low-A Bowling Green, leading both the organization and Midwest League in a number of statistical categories.

A Winning Team

But Sanchez' promise stretches far beyond the numbers.

"It's really tough to phase Jesus Sanchez, no matter how much pressure you put on him," Rays Assistant Director of Minor League Operations Jeff McLerran said. "You can throw him into any situation and he's going to take it on like he's playing on the back fields. That goes beyond his physical tool set and is something that sets him apart. You're going to get the same guy at bat, the same guy in the field and the same guy on the bases."

Sanchez was recognized as a top-60 prospect in the sport by both Baseball America and MLB Pipeline in the offseason, drawing the praise of many scouts and front offices around baseball.

"He's going to be somebody that is going to be in the lineup every single day, whether it be in left, center or right," said McLerran. "We think he has the ability to play all three. For him, it's taking on that next challenge and being able to continue to put up the performances that he's had."

The trio of Sanchez, Whitley and Lowe will be linked together in the minds of many as they climb the Rays' system together. While Port Charlotte poses just another rung on the ladder, they hope to continue to grow their friendly yet competitive relationship in 2018.

"It's a really good relationship," Whitley said about the three of them. "Having that kind of competition between all of us, all being around the same age and striving towards the same goal, is cool because you can push each other and also lean on each other when you need help. When you get close on the field, you're going to gravitate towards each other off the field too."

When asked what Stone Crabs fans should expect to see from them this year, Whitley quickly summed it up, "They should expect to see some exciting defense, some really exciting baseball on both sides of the ball."

BRENDAN MCKAY LOOKS TO BREAK THE MOLD



"Two-way player" is a term more often used in football – a player who can play both offense and defense, usually someone with supreme talent that the head coach just can't afford keep off the field.

This year, two players are carrying that title into professional baseball in an experiment that many fans are excited to see unfold but skeptical to believe will work. Those players would be the Los Angeles Angels' Shohei Ohtani, and the Tampa Bay Rays' first round pick in 2017, Brendan McKay.

Ohtani's path has been welldocumented. He delayed the baseball offseason by asking all 30 front offices to give him a comprehensive, businessstyle sales presentation, courting him like a top high school recruit.

"I'm curious to see how it works out," McKay said about the Ohtani experiment. "That can give a lot more insight to other teams and I was in Japan and Taiwan, I



obviously, the Rays. When Tampa Bay Rays' First-Round Draft Pick Brendan McKay

would see him on TV all the time doing commercials. I've seen him there and seen what he's about."

Ultimately, McKay is trying to follow Ohtani's lead to become part of a new, rare breed of baseball player who can pitch and hit at the MLB level.

"You can expand a roster from 25 to 26 to give your team more options throughout a game and throughout a season, especially when you run into a late-game situation or extended games," McKay said. "You've got more options than a traditional 25-man roster."

It's more than just the strategic advantage that highlights the Rays' desire to let McKay pursue both sides of the ball as a pro. For a club that's always been on the cutting edge, their \$7 million investment in the 21-year old signifies their belief that he can not only be a hybrid chess piece, but be one of the sport's future stars.

McKay was the best player in college baseball over the last three years. He won (continued on next page) 33





the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award all three years while also being named a First Team All-American. As a junior in 2017, he took home every single National Player of the Year Award, including the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Award. He went 11-3 with a 2.56 ERA on the mound while leading the ACC in strikeouts. As a hitter, he batted .341 with 18 home runs and 57 RBI, placing topfive in the ACC in four categories.

His accolades and trophies could fill an entire room, but for McKay, 2018 is all about planning for the future. The Rays and McKay worked closely in Spring Training to develop a schedule that would allow him to develop both as a hitter and pitcher, while also keeping his body fresh enough to have success over a 140-game minor league schedule.

"(The Rays) took a lot of input from me from what I had done in college," he said. "They took my schedule and advanced it to the minor leagues and that sort of schedule." It's basically the same workload, but you've got more intensity each day with a game instead of a practice."



Many critics believe that McKay will eventually have to pick one side of the ball, something he said he is willing to do if the organization's evaluators feel it's the best course of action. But for now, his preference is to remain a two-way player, something he's been for his entire life.

"That's the ultimate goal," McKay said about doing both in the Majors. "It could be two, three years. It could be more than that, but we'll see. I want to do it as long as it takes me."

McKay will likely spend the season with Low-A Bowling Green, High-A Charlotte, or both. While Port Charlotte has made a good first impression on the Rays' two-way prospect, he's spent more time near Bowling Green, which is less than two hours away from the Louisville campus.

"I don't know much about either place, but I've driven through Bowling Green and we played Western Kentucky near the Hot Rods' stadium. I'm excited to get a full season under my belt, whether it be in Bowling Green or Port Charlotte. I think it's going to be a fun season to see how it goes with 140-plus games in a season."

He won't be lacking for friends, either. Two of his college teammates, Grant Kay and Nick Solak are already in the Rays' organization.

"It was totally impressive watching McKay go about his business - how focused he is, how he is able to handle both success and failure," Solak said about their two years at Louisville together. "His head is in the right place all the time. He loves being able to do both and to help the team win in as many ways as he can."

If McKay can replicate his Louisville results as a professional, the sky is the limit for one of the most intriguing prospects in the game. While the skeptics will surround him until he finally proves them wrong, McKay's closest allies in the sport haven't been shy to voice their full support.

"He's going to go through the ups and downs, but he's going to go through a lot of ups and a lot of success and it'll be fun to watch him go out there and play the game," Solak said.

When asked if he thinks McKay can play both ways at the Major League level, Solak said, "Absolutely, I do. If there's somebody that can do it, it's McKay."
