NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (1-1) vs. NASHVILLE SOUNDS (1-1)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue their season-opening five-game series tonight against the Nashville Sounds. The 'Cakes dropped 11 of 16 meetings with Nashville last year, including five of seven at the Shrine. Prior to last night, the Sounds had won five straight games in New Orleans, including a four-game sweep to conclude the 2017 campaign.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Zac Gallen pitched 6.0 scoreless innings in his Marlins organizational debut, and the Baby Cakes rode a four-run first inning to a 5-1 victory over Nashville for their first win of the season. Gallen allowed just four hits without issuing a walk and struck out four, including a punchout of Nick Martini to strand a runner at third base in the sixth on the final batter he faced. The Baby Cakes gave Gallen all the support he would need by batting around in the first inning, scoring four times to chase Sounds starter Frankie Montas. Back-to-back one-out doubles by Isaac Galloway and Jonathan Rodriguez plated the team's first run of the year, and two batters later, a bases loaded walk to J.B. Shuck forced in another run. Eric Campbell singled up the middle to extend the lead to 3-0 and reliever Josh Lucas issued a bases-loaded walk to Sharif Othman. Campbell added his second RBI single of the night in the third inning.

Alcantara went 7-5 with a 4.31 ERA in 25 games (22 starts) with AA Springfield last year, ranking 11th in the Texas League in strikeouts and 12th in innings pitched before shifting to the bullpen in preparation for his September call-up to St. Louis. In eight big league appearances, he allowed six runs - four earned - and nine hits with 10 strikeouts in 8.1 innings. Tonight marks his first Triple-A start.

THE SKIPPER - Arnie Beyeler returns to the 'Cakes

for his third season at the helm, joining Chris Bando (1993-95), Tony Pena (1999-2001) and Chris Maloney (2002-04) as the only managers to manage the club for three seasons. Entering his 15th season as a minor league manager, during which he has gone 926-909 (.505), Beyeler is 284-279 in four seasons at the Triple-A level, including an International League crown with Pawtucket in 2012, and owns a 124-153 mark with New Orleans. He spent the previous three seasons as the first base coach and outfield instructor for the Boston Red Sox, with whom he won the World Series in 2013

THE STAFF – Pitching coach Jeremy Powell and hitting coach Tommy Gregg join the staff, along with returning assistant Robert Rodriguez. Powell is in his seventh season in the Marlins organization, the last two of which were with High-A Jupiter, where his 2017 pitching staff ranked second in the Florida State League in ERA and shutouts. Gregg joins the Marlins after 11 years in the Royals system, including the last eight with AAA Omaha. Gregg also worked for five seasons in the PCL as the hitting coach for Memphis. Rodriguez, the older brother of Pirates infielder Sean, is back for a second season after serving as the head baseball instructor for Total Baseball Sports Academy in Miami. Athletic trainer Greg Harrel also returns for his second season in New Orleans following a 10-year run in the Dodgers organization, the last two of which were with AAA Oklahoma City. Strength coach Rob Reichert, a University of Louisiana graduate, and video coordinator Andrew Dunn-Bauman are in their first seasons with the Baby Cakes.

PROSPECT WATCH – The 'Cakes roster includes three of the Marlins' top 14 prospects, according to MLB Pipeline, all of whom were acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals in an offseason trade for All-Star outfielder Marcell Ozuna. Right-handed pitchers Sandy Alcantara and Zac Gallen are rated third and 14th respectively, while outfielder Magneuris Sierra is ranked seventh on the list.

GALLANT EFFORT – Zac Gallen became the first New Orleans pitcher to finish with at least 6.0 scoreless innings in his team debut since Sam Dyson blanked Reno for 6.0 innings on August 5, 2013. Gallen has turned in quality starts in three of his last four regular season outings dating back to last year and has limited Nashville to a .231 average (9x39) in his two career starts against the Sounds.

DOUBLE THE FUN – The Baby Cakes collected four doubles last night and have six through the first two games of the season, trailing only Las Vegas (8) among PCL clubs. Isaac Galloway had his first two-double game since last April 23 while with AA Jacksonville.

EXTRA EXTRA – Each of Jonathan Rodriguez's last three hits have been for extra bases, dating to his home run vs. Pawtucket in the 2017 finale. He has doubled in each of the first two games this year and is 5x19 (.263) with a pair of doubles, a home run and three RBI in five career games vs.

Nashville.

WALK THIS WAY – Seven different players accounted for eight walks last night, the most in a game since taking nine free passes last August 7 vs. Albuquerque. The 'Cakes did not draw a walk on Opening Night.

IN THE NICK OF TIME – Nick Wittgren retired all three batters in the ninth inning on Opening Night and has retired 17 of the last 18 Sounds dating back to

the 2015 season. In nine career appearances against Nashville, Wittgren owns a $1.80~{\rm ERA}~(2~{\rm ER}/10.0~{\rm IP})$ with three saves.

NEW FACES – Of the 25 players on the Opening Day roster, only six have appeared in a New Orleans uniform: pitchers Adam Conley, Severino Gonzalez and Nick Wittgren, catcher Austin Nola, infielder Peter Mooney and outfielder Isaac Galloway.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway enters 2018 in seventh place on the team's career stolen base chart with 50. Galloway swiped 31 bags in 2016, tied with Duane Singleton (1995) and Brandon Watson (2005) for the fifth-best single-season total in club history, but was limited to 26 games with the 'Cakes last year after suffering a sprained MCL in a home plate collision on 5/17 vs. Salt Lake. Prior to the injury, Galloway had just been named the PCL's Player of the Week after slugging five home runs during a three-game stretch in Reno, becoming the first NOLA player to earn the weekly honor since Jake Marisnick in July 2014.

NAWLINS NOTES – Jumbo Diaz needed only seven pitches, all strikes, to retire the side in order in the ninth inning ... New Orleans and Las Vegas are the only PCL teams without a home run through two games ... Baby Cakes hitters leading off an inning are 3x17 (.176) ... Since becoming a Marlins affiliate in 2009, NOLA has posted a winning April only twice, going 15-9 in 2012 and 13-12 in 2013.



2018 SEASON

SPRING TRAINING – In five outings (two starts) with the Marlins, Alcantara was 0-1 with a one save and a 3.38 ERA (6 ER/16.0 IP). He had 11 strikeouts and six walks and opponents batted .224 (13x58).

2017 IN REVIEW

FAST RISER – Alcantara made his MLB debut with the Cardinals in September after going 7-5 with a 4.31 ERA in 25 games (22) starts with AA Springfield. He finished 11th in the Texas League in strikeouts (106) and 12th in innings pitched (125.1) and his 15 hit batsmen were second-most in the league.

WILD THING – After blanking Frisco for 6.0 innings in his season debut on 4/7, Alcantara unleashed six wild pitches while allowing seven runs in 3.2 innings against the RoughRiders six days later. His 20 wild pitches on the year were the most in the Texas League.

HIGH QUALITY – Half of Alcantara's 22 starts saw him work 6.0 innings or more, including eight quality starts. He permitted two runs or fewer in each of his final seven starting assignments.

CRAZY EIGHTS – Alcantara twice fanned a season-high eight batters in a game, in a loss at Tulsa on 5/6 and a victory at Corpus Christi on 8/12.

SECOND HALF SURGE – Following the All-Star break, Alcantara went 4-0 with a 2.77 ERA (17 ER/ 55.1 IP) and limited opponents to a .222 batting average (45x203). Included was a three-appearance stint in the bullpen from 8/23-8/29 before having his contract purchased on 9/1.

RUDE AWAKENING – San Francico's Tim Federowicz began Alcantara's big league career with a home run on his first batter faced on 9/3, but he recovered to fan Buster Posey for his first strikeout.

K MAN – Four of Alcantara's eight major league outings were scoreless and he recorded a strikeout in seven, including striking out the side in order against the Cubs on 9/15.

FALL LEAGUE – Alcantara was named to the Arizona Fall League's Rising Stars Game after ranking fourth among AFL starters with a 2.08 opponents batting average in five starts for the Surprise Saguaros.


