NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (4-1) AT COLORADO SPRINGS SKY SOX (3-1)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes embark on their first road trip of 2018 with the opener of a three-game set tonight against the Colorado Springs Sky Sox. The ‘Cakes claimed eight of 15 meetings with the Sky Sox last year, including five of eight at Security Service Field. New Orleans batted .307 vs. Colorado Springs last season, compared with a .247 mark against the rest of the PCL.

YESTERDAY’S NEWS – The Baby Cakes scored five times in the first inning on Monday afternoon and held off the Nashville Sounds, 7-4. Each of the game’s first two hitters reached on errors by Nashville third baseman Sheldon Neuse, opening the door to a big inning. Scott Van Slyke ripped a one-out double into the right field corner to score both runners, and Cristhian Adames followed with a triple, then scored on an infield single by J.B. Shuck. With two outs, Shuck stole second base and raced home on Peter Mooney’s single to left for 5-0 lead. The ‘Cakes took advantage of a third Sounds error, this time a dropped fly ball by center fielder Dustin Fowler, to score a run in the fifth inning, and Jonathan Rodriguez hit his first home run of the year in the seventh to extend the advantage to 7-1. Nashville nicked Colton Murray for three runs in the ninth before Jumbo Diaz entered to record the final two outs and earn his first save. James Buckelew worked 4.0 shutout innings in relief of spot starter Joe Gunkel.

ON THE HILL – Adam Conley gets the call for his second start, coming off an Opening Night defeat where he yielded seven runs and seven hits in three-plus innings vs. Nashville. Conley split last season between the Marlins and Baby Cakes, going 8-8 with a 6.14 ERA in 22 games (20 starts) at the big league level and 3-3 with a 5.49 ERA in 12 starts at Triple-A. He is 2-4 with a 5.80 ERA in seven career starts vs. Colorado Springs, and was hit hard in a pair of outings last year, including a season-high eight runs allowed in a June 22 home loss.

THE SKIPPER – Arnie Beyeler returns to the ‘Cakes for his third season at the helm, joining Chris Bando (1993-95), Tony Pena (1999-2001) and Chris Maloney (2002-04) as the only managers to manage the club for three seasons. Entering his 15th season as a minor league manager, during which he has gone 926-909 (.505), Beyeler is 284-279 in four seasons at the Triple-A level, including an International League crown with Pawtucket in 2012, and owns a 124-153 mark with New Orleans. He spent the previous three seasons as the first base coach and outfield instructor for the Boston Red Sox, with whom he won the World Series in 2013.

THE STAFF – Pitching coach Jeremy Powell and hitting coach Tommy Gregg join the staff, along with returning assistant Robert Rodriguez. Powell is in his seventh season in the Marlins organization, the last two of which were with High-A Jupiter, where his 2017 pitching staff ranked second in the Florida State League in ERA and shutouts. Gregg joins the Marlins after 11 years in the Royals system, including the last eight with AAA Omaha. Gregg also worked for five seasons in the PCL as the hitting coach for Memphis. Rodriguez, the older brother of Pirates infielder Sean, is back for a second season after serving as the head baseball instructor for Total Baseball Sports Academy in Miami. Athletic trainer Greg Harrel also returns for his second season in New Orleans following a 10-year run in the Dodgers organization, the last two of which were with AAA Oklahoma City. Strength coach Rob Reichert, a University of Louisiana graduate, and video coordinator Andrew Dunn-Bauman are in their first seasons with the Baby Cakes.

THE FOUR THE MERRIER – The Baby Cakes’ four-game win streak equals their longest from all of last year, accomplished twice (July 9-15 and August 6-9). New Orleans last won five in a row from August 17-21, 2016. A win tonight would push NOLA four games above .500 for the first time since being 53-49 on July 21, 2014, which was also the last time the club was in first place past Opening Day.

SERIES-LY – New Orleans clinched the season-opening series, the first time doing so since taking three of four from Nashville to begin 2012. Last year, the Baby Cakes did not win a series until winning two of three against Omaha from July 4-6, a span of 21 series where they lost 12 and tied nine, the longest drought in franchise history.

DOCTOR OF STYLE – Scott Van Slyke has reached base 11 times in 19 plate appearances, going 7x15 with three walks and a hit by pitch. Van Slyke’s .579 OBP is tied for fifth in the PCL. After hitting the Baby Cakes’ first home run of the season on Sunday, he doubled twice yesterday to tie Jonathan Rodriguez for the team lead with three extra-base hits.

DAZZLING DEBUTS – James Buckelew earned the win yesterday with 4.0 shutout innings out of the bullpen, the third straight game a ‘Cakes pitcher picked up his first Triple-A victory. Chris Mazza was the winner in relief on Saturday in his Triple-A debut, as was Sunday’s starter Ben Meyer. Along with Sandy Alcantara, the four NOLA hurlers who had yet to see Triple-A action entering 2018 have combined to go 2-0 with a 1.06 ERA (2 ER/17.0 IP).

IN THE NICK OF TIME – Nick Wittgren earned the save on Saturday, his first save for New Orleans since May 19, 2016 at Albuquerque. It was the 22nd of his NOLA career, moving into a tie with Nate Field (2008-09) for sixth place on the franchise list.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway stole his first base of the year yesterday and the 51st of his New Orleans career, moving into a tie with Carlos Hernandez, Tim Barker and John Finn for fourth place on the franchise’s leaderboard. Galloway swiped 31 bags in 2016, tied with Duane Singleton (1995) and Brandon Watson (2005) for the fifth-best single-season total in club history, but was limited to 26 games with the ‘Cakes last year after suffering a sprained MCL in a home plate collision on 5/17 vs. Salt Lake.

PROSPECT WATCH – The ‘Cakes roster includes three of the Marlins’ top 14 prospects, according to MLB Pipeline, all of whom were acquired from the St. Louis Cardinals in an offseason trade for All-Star outfielder Marcell Ozuna. Right-handed pitchers Sandy Alcantara and Zac Gallen are rated third and 14th respectively, while outfielder Magneuris Sierra is ranked seventh on the list.

NAWLINS NOTES – NOLA has won four of the first five games for the sixth time in club history, and the first time since starting a franchise-best 8-1 in 2012 ... Magneuris Sierra snapped a 0x15 skid to open the year with a bunt single in the fourth inning yesterday ... Austin Nola is a career .344 hitter (33x96) in 29 games vs. Colorado Springs with nine doubles, two triples and 11 RBI ... Cristhian Adames hit .364 (28x77) in 21 games at Security Service Field as a member of the Sky Sox in 2014 ... New Orleans leads the PCL with a .989 fielding percentage (2 errors in 186 chances) ... NOLA is 14-11 all-time in road openers, including wins in four straight.

2018 SEASON

SPRING TRAINING – In four outings with Miami, Conley went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (6 ER/10.0 IP). He had three strikeouts and three walks and allowed opponents to hit .310 (13x42).

2017 IN REVIEW

STARTING STRONG – Conley opened the season with the Miami Marlins on 4/8 with a victory on the road against the Mets, tossing 5.0 innings, allowing one hit and one earned run on a home run.

LAST START – Across his final three starts with Miami, Conley surrendered 21 runs (18 earned) in 10.2 innings, as his ERA ballooned from 3.00 to 7.53. He was optioned to New Orleans following his 5/8 defeat vs. St. Louis.

IN NOLA – In his first Triple-A start since July 28, 2015, Conley took the loss on 5/15 vs. Salt Lake after yielding three runs on three hits in 4.1 innings with four walks and four strikeouts. He was locked in a 1-1 game until the fifth when the Bees scored five times, with two of the runs being charged to Conley.

NO FLY ZONE – Dating back to his 2015 season with New Orleans, Conley had gone 17 consecutive Triple-A starts without allowing a home run until Round Rock's Will Middlebrooks went deep on 6/1. It snapped a streak of 96.0 innings without a homer, since Memphis' Ed Easley on May 9, 2015.

WIN COLUMN – Conley picked up his first win in five starts with the Baby Cakes on 6/6 vs. Memphis, holding the Redbirds to two runs and three hits over 7.0 innings. He did not surrender a hit after back-to-back doubles in the third inning, remaining undefeated in seven games in the month of June with NOLA dating back to 2015, posting a 2.06 ERA (9 ER/39.1 IP) and .167 average against (23x137).

WILD ONE – On 6/22, Conley lasted only 2.2 IP, his shortest start since going one inning prior to a rain delay in his 2016 season debut with Miami. Conley also tossed three wild pitches for the first time in his career, the most by a New Orleans pitcher in nearly two years, a number he would match on 7/7 vs. Oklahoma City.

HEATING UP – Conley opened July with back-to-back victories in quality starts on 7/2 at Memphis and 7/7 vs. Oklahoma City. He surrendered a combined three runs on nine hits with 13 strikeouts in 13.0 innings, including a season-high eight punchouts of the Dodgers.

BACK IN THE BIGS – Upon being recalled on 7/18, Conley went 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA (4 ER/20.2 IP) in his first three starts. He set a new career high with 11 strikeouts in defeating the Mets on 8/20 after going without a punchout in 6.1 innings vs. San Francisco on 8/14, becoming the first pitcher since the Cardinals' Joe Magrane in 1990 to fan more than 10 immediately following a game in which he went at least 6.0 strikeout-free innings.
