THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue their first road trip of 2018 tonight with the finale of a three-game set against the Colorado Springs Sky Sox. The 'Cakes claimed eight of 15 meetings with the Sky Sox last year, including five of eight at Security Service Field. New Orleans is looking to avert its first series sweep of the year and losses in its first three road contests for the first time since 2011 (at Nashville).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Keon Broxton had three hits, including a home run, and Brandon Woodruff pitched five strong innings to lead the Sky Sox to a 7-2 win over the Baby Cakes. Colorado Springs grabbed a 1-0 lead in the opening frame for the second straight night, as Ji-Man Choi doubled with two outs and scored on a single by Christian Bethancourt. Woodruff helped himself at the plate with an RBI single in the second, doubling the lead to 2-0. New Orleans cut the deficit in half in the sixth when Isaac Galloway walked, stole second base and scored on a Scott Van Slyke single, but Colorado Springs pulled away against the 'Cakes bullpen. Broxton's solo homer off Colton Murray in the bottom of the sixth boosted the lead back to two, and his RBI single an inning later was part of a four-run rally to put the game out of reach.

ON THE HILL – Sandy Alcantara gets the call for his second start, after making his Triple-A debut on Saturday. He struck out eight batters in 4.2 innings against Nashville and retired the last five batters he faced with runners in scoring position, but came up one out shy of qualifying for the victory in the Baby Cakes' 2-1 win. Alcantara's 15.4 strikeouts per 9.0 IP was the best ratio among PCL starters through the first weekend of the season.

THE SKIPPER – Arnie Beyeler returns to the 'Cakes for his third season at the helm, joining Chris Bando (1993-95), Tony Pena (1999-2001) and Chris Maloney (2002-04) as the only managers to manage the club for three seasons. Entering his 15th season as a minor league manager, during which he has gone 926-909 (.505), Beyeler is 284-279 in four seasons at the Triple-A level, including an International League crown with Pawtucket in 2012, and owns a 124-153 mark with New Orleans. He spent the previous three seasons as the first base coach and outfield instructor for the Boston Red Sox, with whom he won the World Series in 2013.

THE STAFF – Pitching coach Jeremy Powell and hitting coach Tommy Gregg join the staff, along with returning assistant Robert Rodriguez. Powell is in his seventh season in the Marlins organization, the last two of which were with High-A Jupiter, where his 2017 pitching staff ranked second in the Florida State League in ERA and shutouts. Gregg joins the Marlins after 11 years in the Royals system, including the last eight with AAA Omaha. Gregg also worked for five seasons in the PCL as the hitting coach for Memphis. Rodriguez, the older brother of Pirates infielder Sean, is back for a second season after serving as the head baseball instructor for Total Baseball Sports Academy in Miami. Athletic trainer Greg Harrel also returns for his second season in New Orleans following a 10-year run in the Dodgers organization, the last two of which were with AAA Oklahoma City. Strength coach Rob Reichert, a University of Louisiana graduate, and video coordinator Andrew Dunn-Bauman are in their first seasons with the Baby Cakes.

CARRY A BIG SLICK – Scott Van Slyke has reached base 14 times in 24 plate appearances, going 9x19 with four walks and a hit by pitch for a .583 on-base percentage, good for third-best in the PCL. His .474 batting average ranks fifth.

TO THE MOON – Peter Mooney has opened the season on a six-game hit streak, his longest since a six-gamer with AA Jacksonville from July 30-August 4, 2016. His longest hitting streak in 2017 was four games. The club record for longest streak to begin a season is 14 games, shared by Carlos Gomez (2007) and Justin Bour (2014). Mooney is now hitting .354 (23x65) in 16 career games against Colorado Springs with five doubles and a triple.

RISPY BUSINESS – The Baby Cakes were 2x8 with runners in scoring position last night and are hitting .214 (12x56) through the first six games, leading only Omaha (.152) among PCL clubs. NOLA ranked last in the league in each of the last two seasons, batting .250 with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016.

IN THE NICK OF TIME – Nick Wittgren earned the save on Saturday, his first for New Orleans since May 19, 2016 at Albuquerque. It was the 22nd of his NOLA career, moving into a tie with Nate Field (2008-09) for sixth place on the franchise list. Dating back to his 2016 season debut, Wittgren has had 17 consecutive scoreless appearances at Triple-A, totaling 18.1 innings.

RUNNING GAME – 'Cakes catchers have combined to nab just two of nine basestealers. Through seven games last year, they had six caught stealings in eight attempts. Sandy Alcantara had the fifth-lowest stolen base percentage (18.8%) among Texas League starters in 2017.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway's stolen base last night was the 52nd of his New Orleans career, moving into a tie with Adam Everett for third place on the franchise's leaderboard. Only Kyle Logan (53) and Colin Porter (61) have more steals in a New Orleans uniform. Galloway swiped 31 bags in 2016, tied with Duane Singleton (1995) and Brandon Watson (2005) for the fifth-best total in club history, but was limited to 26 games with the 'Cakes last year after suffering a sprained MCL in a home plate collision on 5/17 vs. Salt Lake.

31 ALWAYS – The Baby Cakes announced on Thursday they would be retiring jersey 31 in honor of Wally Pontiff, Jr., who wore the number as an All-American third baseman at LSU prior to his passing in 2002. The Pontiff Classic featuring LSU has been played at the Shrine on Airline in Pontiff's native Metairie annually since 2004 and has raised more than \$1.5 million for charitable organizations. The ceremony, marking the first number to be retired in franchise history, will take place July 27 when the Baby Cakes host Tacoma.

NAWLINS NOTES – New Orleans was not swept in a series last year until July 17-20 in Round Rock ... Sharif Othman picked up the first two hits of his Triple-A career, including a double, to snap an 0x10 skid to begin the season ... In six of the Baby Cakes' first seven contests, the team leading after two innings has gone on to win.

2018 SEASON

SPRING TRAINING – In five outings (two starts) with the Marlins, Alcantara was 0-1 with a one save and a 3.38 ERA (6 ER/16.0 IP). He had 11 strikeouts and six walks and opponents batted .224 (13x58).

DANDY SANDY – Alcantara fanned eight batters in 4.2 innings in his Triple-A debut on 4/7 vs. Nashville, equaling his season high from all of 2017, established twice with AA Springfield. Alcantara limited the Sounds to one hit in six at-bats with runners in scoring position.

2017 IN REVIEW

FAST RISER – Alcantara made his MLB debut with the Cardinals in September after going 7-5 with a 4.31 ERA in 25 games (22) starts with AA Springfield. He finished 11th in the Texas League in strikeouts (106) and 12th in innings pitched (125.1) and his 15 hit batsmen were second-most in the league.

WILD THING – After blanking Frisco for 6.0 innings in his season debut on 4/7, Alcantara unleashed six wild pitches while allowing seven runs in 3.2 innings against the RoughRiders six days later. His 20 wild pitches on the year were the most in the Texas League.

HIGH QUALITY – Half of Alcantara's 22 starts saw him work 6.0 innings or more, including eight quality starts. He permitted two runs or fewer in each of his final seven starting assignments.

CRAZY EIGHTS – Alcantara twice fanned a season-high eight batters in a game, in a loss at Tulsa on 5/6 and a victory at Corpus Christi on 8/12.

SECOND HALF SURGE – Following the All-Star break, Alcantara went 4-0 with a 2.77 ERA (17 ER/55.1 IP) and limited opponents to a .222 batting average (45x203). Included was a three-appearance stint in the bullpen from 8/23-8/29 before having his contract purchased on 9/1.

RUDE AWAKENING – San Francisco's Tim Federowicz began Alcantara's big league career with a home run on his first batter faced on 9/3, but he recovered to fan Buster Posey for his first strikeout.

K MAN – Four of Alcantara's eight major league outings were scoreless and he recorded a strikeout in seven, including striking out the side in order against the Cubs on 9/15.

FALL LEAGUE – Alcantara was named to the Arizona Fall League's Rising Stars Game after ranking fourth among AFL starters with a 2.08 opponents batting average in five starts for the Surprise Saguaros.

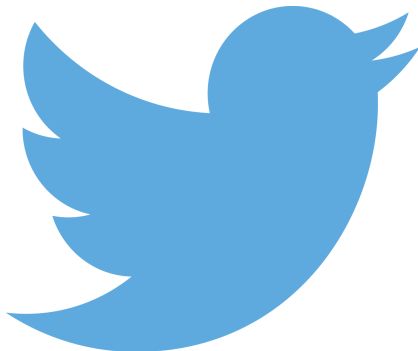
