NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (4-7) AT OKLAHOMA CITY DODGERS (8-1)

RHP Zac Gallen (1-1, 1.50) vs. RHP Walker Buehler (1-0, 2.00)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes conclude their first road trip of 2018 tonight with the finale of a four-game set against the Oklahoma City Dodgers. NOLA is looking to avoid its first series sweep at Bricktown Ballpark since dropping four in a row from June 15-17, 2010.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Alex Verdugo's three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning gave Oklahoma City an 8-6 win over the Baby Cakes. Henry Ramos got the Dodgers off to a hot start with a grand slam in the first inning en route to a 4x5 afternoon. Rob Segedin answered a pair of 'Cakes runs in the top of the second with an RBI single in the bottom half to put OKC in front, 5-2. The Baby Cakes rallied against the bullpen, tying the score on Rafael Ortega's RBI single in the seventh and two more tallies in the eighth. NOLA jumped in front in the 10th on Isaac Galloway's single, but Nick Wittgren could not protect the lead, issuing a leadoff walk in the bottom of the 10th before Verdugo's walk-off blast. Chris Mazza and Severino Gonzalez combined for 7.1 scoreless frames in relief of Adam Conley, who lasted only 2.2 innings, before Wittgren's blown save.

ON THE HILL – Zac Gallen makes his third start, having turned in the Baby Cakes' only two quality starts through the season's first 11 contests. Gallen, who went 10-8 with a 2.93 ERA at three levels in the Cardinals system last year, limited Nashville to four hits in 6.0 shutout frames in his season debut, then scattered two runs and nine hits in a loss to Colorado Springs on Wednesday. Gallen made his Triple-A debut against Oklahoma City last June 26 and took the loss after allowing three runs and six hits in 5.0 innings with eight strikeouts.

THE SKIPPER – Arnie Beyeler returns to the 'Cakes for his third season at the helm, joining Chris Bando (1993-95), Tony Pena (1999-2001) and Chris Maloney (2002-04) as the only managers to manage the club for three seasons. Entering his 15th season as a minor league manager, during which he has gone 926-909 (.505), Beyeler is 284-279 in four seasons at the Triple-A level, including an International League crown with Pawtucket in 2012, and owns a 124-153 mark with New Orleans. He spent the previous three seasons as the first base coach and outfield instructor for the Boston Red Sox, with whom he won the World Series in 2013.

THE STAFF – Pitching coach Jeremy Powell and hitting coach Tommy Gregg join the staff, along with returning assistant Robert Rodriguez. Powell is in his seventh season in the Marlins organization, the last two of which were with High-A Jupiter, where his 2017 pitching staff ranked second in the Florida State League in ERA and shutouts. Gregg joins the Marlins after 11 years in the Royals system, including the last eight with AAA Omaha. Gregg also worked for five seasons in the PCL as the hitting coach for Memphis. Rodriguez, the older brother of Pirates infielder Sean, is back for a second season after serving as the head baseball instructor for Total Baseball Sports Academy in Miami. Athletic trainer Greg Harrel also returns for his second season in New Orleans following a 10-year run in the Dodgers organization, the last two of which were with AAA Oklahoma City. Strength coach Rob Reichert, a University of Louisiana graduate, and video coordinator Andrew Dunn-Bauman are in their first seasons with the Baby Cakes.

ROCKY ROAD – New Orleans has dropped its first six road games for the first time in franchise history; the longest previous streak was three in a row (2006 at Albuquerque and 2011 at Nashville). The 'Cakes longest losing streak of last season was an 0-8 trip through Sacramento and Fresno from July 25-August 1, only the third time the club was winless on a road trip of at least six games, joining a 0-8 trek through Oklahoma City and Colorado Springs from April 28-May 4, 1999 and its previous California visit in August 2015.

SERIES-LY – New Orleans suffered its first series sweep of the year, after going until July 17-20 last season (at Round Rock) before getting swept. The 'Cakes did not win a series in 2017 until taking two of three against Omaha from July 4-6, but won four of five from Nashville to begin 2018.

TO THE MOON – Peter Mooney has a hit in each of his eight starts this season. He had a seven-game hit streak halted on Friday in a pinch-hit role. Mooney is 6x19 (.316) in his five starts on the road trip, with one double and one triple.

IN THE NICK OF TIME – Nick Wittgren suffered his first blown save with New Orleans since May 2, 2016, also in Oklahoma City, a span of 16 appearances. Dating back to his 2016 season debut, Wittgren had not allowed a run at Triple-A over his last 18.1 innings prior to yesterday.

ON THIS DATE ...

1993: In the first pro baseball game in New Orleans since 1977, the Zephyrs fall to Buffalo 8-7 in 12 innings, their first loss of the year after a 5-0 start. Matt Mieske appeared to score the winning run in the 9th but was sent back to third base when Larry Sheets' would-be walk-off double rolled under the right field fence.

BACKSTOP BOPPERS – New Orleans catchers opened the season hitless in five of the first six games but have followed up with hits in each of the last five, hitting .471 (8x17).

RISPY BUSINESS – The Baby Cakes are hitting .212 (22x104) through the first 11 games, leading only Omaha (.177) among PCL clubs. NOLA ranked last in the league in each of the last two seasons, batting .250

with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016. New Orleans left 10 men on base yesterday, a season high.

CARRY A BIG SLICK – Scott Van Slyke netted his team-leading fourth multi-hit effort, and became the first 'Cakes player this season to score three times in a game. Van Slyke has reached base in 10 of 11 contests and his .538 on-base percentage ranks third in the PCL.

31 ALWAYS – The Baby Cakes announced on Thursday they would be retiring jersey 31 in honor of Wally Pontiff, Jr., who wore the number as an All-American third baseman at LSU prior to his passing in 2002. The Pontiff Classic featuring LSU has been played at the Shrine on Airline in Pontiff's native Metairie annually since 2004 and has raised more than \$1.5 million for charitable organizations. The ceremony, marking the first number to be retired in franchise history, will take place July 27 when the Baby Cakes host Tacoma.

NAWLINS NOTES – Yesterday marked the fifth consecutive start, dating back to last season with Miami, that Adam Conley failed to work more than 3.0 innings ... Three of the last four games have been walk-off defeats; the Baby Cakes did not have three walk-off losses until June 11 last year ... New Orleans has surrendered at least seven runs in five of the six games on the road trip, posting a 7.07 ERA (39 ER/49.2 IP). The staff owns a 3.00 ERA (15 ER/45.0 IP) in five games at home.

2018 SEASON

SPRING TRAINING – In three games (two starts) with the Marlins, Gallen was 0-2 with a 37.38 ERA (18 ER/4.1 IP). He walked eight, struck out three and opponents batted .577 (15x26) with three homers.

GALLANT EFFORT – Gallen blanked Nashville on four hits for 6.0 innings in his season debut on 4/6, becoming the first New Orleans pitcher to finish with at least 6.0 scoreless innings in his team debut since Sam Dyson shut out Reno for 6.0 innings on August 5, 2013.

2017 IN REVIEW

MOVING FAST – Gallen saw time at three levels of the Cardinals system in his first full professional campaign, combining to go 10-8 with a 2.93 ERA (48 ER/147.2 IP) between High-A Palm Beach, AA Springfield and AAA Memphis. He ranked sixth among St. Louis farmhands in ERA and tied for fifth in victories.

ALL-STAR – Florida State League All-Star honors were bestowed upon Gallen after he went 5-2 with a 1.62 ERA in nine starts with Palm Beach. He surrendered one or no earned runs in seven of those starts and struck out 56 batters against 10 walks in 55.2 IP.

YOU COMPLETE ME – Gallen was credited with a 6.0-inning complete game in dropping the first game of a doubleheader on 4/13 at Clearwater, despite yielding just one run. He then fell one out shy of a complete game in his final FSL start on 5/30 vs. Lakeland, giving up one run and four hits in 8.2 innings. He owned the league's second-best ERA and third-best opponents average (.215) when promoted.

DEBUTS – With 5.2 innings of one-run ball on 6/6 at NW Arkansas, Gallen picked up the win in his Double-A debut. He then moved on to Triple-A for three starts from 6/26-7/7, including a win over New Orleans on 7/1 where he gave up one run and four hits with eight punchouts in 6.0 innings.

IT'S A MAJOR AWARD – Upon returning to AA Springfield on 7/16, Gallen allowed one baserunner in 7.0 innings against NW Arkansas to be named Texas League Pitcher of the Week. He retired the final 14 batters he faced, including four of the last five via strikeout, after allowing a third-inning single.

A REDBIRD RING – Gallen joined the Memphis rotation in September, getting a pair of no-decisions at Colorado Springs, first in the regular season finale on 9/4 and again in Game 4 of the PCL Semifinals. He then took the loss in Game 4 of the PCL Finals at El Paso, yielding five runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings.
