NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (5-10) vs. COLORADO SPRINGS SKY SOX (10-4)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue a seven-game homestand tonight with the finale of a four-game series against the Colorado Springs Sky Sox. New Orleans fell in all three meetings at Security Service Field last week and has lost eight of the last 10 to the Sky Sox dating back to last season. Following a 4-1 start to the campaign, the Baby Cakes have dropped nine of 10 contests.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Corbin Burnes struck out nine in 6.1 scoreless innings and combined with two relievers on a three-hit shutout of the Baby Cakes in a 3-0 win for Colorado Springs. Burnes gave up back-to-back singles to Magneuris Sierra and Cristhian Adames to put men at the corners with one out in the first inning, but he bounced back to strike out Jonathan Rodriguez and Rafael Ortega, and the Baby Cakes managed just three baserunners the rest of the night. Joe Gunkel matched Burnes for 5.0 innings while limiting the Sky Sox to two hits and equaled his career high with eight strikeouts. The Sky Sox broke the ice in the seventh with three consecutive singles to start the inning against Chris Mazza, including one from Burnes, and a Johnny Davis with the bases loaded brought in the game's first run. Mazza's wild pitch later in the inning extended the lead to 2-0, and Christian Bethancourt's home run in the eighth provided an insurance tally. Nick Ramirez worked 2.1 innings of hitless relief, and Erik Davis recorded the final out.

ON THE HILL – Adam Conley gets the call for his fourth start of the year and second against Colorado Springs. Conley has worked just 7.1 innings over his first three outings, going 0-2 with a 19.64 ERA, including a loss to the Sky Sox on April 10 where he recorded five outs and surrendered four runs. He is 2-5 with a 6.47 ERA in eight career starts vs. Colorado Springs, and has a 14.46 ERA in three starts against the Sky Sox over the last two seasons. Conley has not pitched more than 3.0 innings in his last five starts dating back to last September with the Marlins.

JOHNNY G – Johnny Giavotella is 2x9 with two walks and an RBI double in his first three games with the 'Cakes, playing on the same field where he helped Jesuit High School win the 2005 Louisiana state championship. Giavotella went on to earn All-American honors in his three seasons at the University of New Orleans before being drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the second round in 2008. In 26 pro games at the Shrine, Giavotella is batting .344 (33x96) with eight doubles, three home runs and 17 RBI.

RISPY BUSINESS – The Baby Cakes are hitting .217 (31x143) through the first 14 games, leading only Omaha (.184) among PCL clubs. New Orleans ranked last in the league in each of the last two seasons, batting .250 with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016.

31 ALWAYS – The Baby Cakes announced last Thursday they would be retiring jersey 31 in honor of Wally Pontiff, Jr., who wore the number as an All-American third baseman at LSU prior to his passing in 2002. The Pontiff Classic featuring LSU has been played at the Shrine on Airline in Pontiff's native Metairie annually since 2004 and has raised more than \$1.5 million for charitable organizations. The ceremony, marking the first number to be retired in franchise history, will take place July 27 when the Baby Cakes host Tacoma.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOE – Joe Gunkel notched eight strikeouts to match his career high accomplished two other times, most recently on August 18, 2016 at Durham while pitching for Norfolk. It also tied Sandy Alcantara for the most by a Baby Cakes pitcher this season (April 7 vs. Nashville). Gunkel lowered his ERA to 1.13 (2 ER/16.0 IP), tied for sixth-best in the league. He paces all PCL hurlers in WHIP (0.69), opponents batting average (.133) and fewest baserunners per 9.0 IP (5.54).

GOOSE EGGS – The Baby Cakes were shut out for the second time this season (Opening Day vs. Nashville) and the third time in the last eight meetings with Colorado Springs at the Shrine, joining 1-0 setbacks last June 24 and August 24. NOLA was blanked 13 times in each of the last two seasons, leading the league both years.

BULLIED – Over the last 10 games, the New Orleans bullpen owns a 6.98 ERA (31 ER/40.0 IP) and has allowed a home run in eight of those contests (nine total) while opponents have batted .343 (59x172). A 'Cakes reliever has taken the loss in each of the last six defeats, during which the pen has suffered three blown saves.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway's stolen base on Monday was the 54th of his New Orleans career, moving past Kyle Logan into sole possession of second place on the franchise's all-time list. Only Colin Porter (61) has more steals in a New Orleans uniform. Galloway has hit safely in six of his last seven contests, going 9x23 (.391) with one triple, one home run and four RBI.

STEAL AWAY – The Baby Cakes are tied for fifth in the PCL with 12 stolen bases and have been caught only twice, the second-best success rate in the league behind Omaha (8x9).

ADAMES FAMILY – Cristhian Adames has a hit in five consecutive games and in 11 of his last 13 contests, batting .269 (14x52) in that stretch. He is one of 14 players in the PCL to collect at least two triples over the first two weeks of the season, both of which have come at home, where he is 8x27 (.296).

FAMILIAR RELATIONS – The 'Cakes are playing all but one game in April against the same three opponents. NOLA is in the midst of playing 14 straight games against Colorado Springs and Oklahoma City, around a pair of five-game sets against Nashville.

ROSTER MOVES – Miami has recalled right-hander Nick Wittgren, who was 0-2 with a 10.13 ERA in seven appearances with New Orleans, and the Baby Cakes have added righty Colton Murray from extended spring training. Murray pitched in a pair of games with the 'Cakes last week, allowing eight runs (six earned) on seven hits in 1.2 innings.

NAWLINS NOTES – Jonathan Rodriguez is 5x15 with four walks in six games vs. Colorado Springs ... The Baby Cakes have outscored opponents 25-21 over the first three innings, and have been outscored 60-29 from the fourth inning onward ... Cito Culver is mired in a 1x17 slump with 11 strikeouts over his last five games ... Since becoming a Marlins affiliate in 2009, NOLA has posted a winning April only twice, going 15-9 in 2012 and 13-12 in 2013 ... Austin Nola is a career .327 hitter (34x104) in 31 games vs. Colorado Springs with nine doubles, two triples and 12 RBI.

2018 SEASON

OPENING DAY – Conley was given the nod on Opening Day vs. Nashville and yielded seven runs on seven hits in 3.0 innings. His only previous Opening Day start came in his first full pro season in 2012 with Low-A Greensboro, when he fired 5.0 scoreless innings and fanned seven in a win over Lexington.

ROCKY START – Conley worked a combined 7.1 innings over his first three starts and allowed 16 runs on 20 hits (19.64 ERA). His 1.2 IP against Colorado Springs on 4/10 marked the third time in his last four starts, dating to September 2017 with Miami, that Conley did make it out of the second inning.

2017 IN REVIEW

APRIL SHOWERS – After a season-opening win against the Mets on 4/8, Conley surrendered 21 runs (18 earned) in 10.2 innings across his final three starts with Miami as his ERA ballooned from 3.00 to 7.53. He was optioned to New Orleans following his 5/8 defeat vs. St. Louis.

IN NOLA – In his first Triple-A start since July 28, 2015, Conley took the loss on 5/15 vs. Salt Lake after yielding three runs on three hits in 4.1 innings with four walks and four strikeouts. He was locked in a 1-1 game until the fifth when the Bees scored five times, with two of the runs being charged to Conley.

NO FLY ZONE – Dating back to his 2015 season with New Orleans, Conley had gone 17 consecutive Triple-A starts without allowing a home run until Round Rock's Will Middlebrooks went deep on 6/1. It snapped a streak of 96.0 innings without a homer, since Memphis' Ed Easley on May 9, 2015.

WIN COLUMN – Conley picked up his first win in five starts with the Baby Cakes on 6/6 vs. Memphis, holding the Redbirds to two runs and three hits over 7.0 innings. He did not surrender a hit after back-to-back doubles in the third inning, remaining undefeated in seven games in the month of June with NOLA dating back to 2015, posting a 2.06 ERA (9 ER/39.1 IP) and .167 average against (23x137).

WILD ONE – On 6/22, Conley lasted only 2.2 IP, his shortest start since going one inning prior to a rain delay in his 2016 season debut with Miami. Conley also tossed three wild pitches for the first time in his career, the most by a New Orleans pitcher in nearly two years, a number he would match on 7/7 vs. Oklahoma City.

HEATING UP – Conley opened July with back-to-back victories in quality starts on 7/2 at Memphis and 7/7 vs. Oklahoma City. He surrendered a combined three runs on nine hits with 13 strikeouts in 13.0 innings, including a season-high eight punchouts of the Dodgers.

BACK IN THE BIGS – Upon being recalled on 7/18, Conley went 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA (4 ER/20.2 IP) in his first three starts. He set a new career high with 11 strikeouts in defeating the Mets on 8/20 after going without a punchout in 6.1 innings vs. San Francisco on 8/14, becoming the first pitcher since the Cardinals' Joe Magrane in 1990 to fan more than 10 immediately following a game in which he went at least 6.0 strikeout-free innings.


