NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (7-12) AT NASHVILLE SOUNDS (10-9)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes tonight play the second game of a five-game set against the Nashville Sounds. The 'Cakes are still in search of their first road victory of the season, having dropped all eight away from home. New Orleans has lost eight of its last 11 games at First Tennessee Park after winning 12 of its first 15 in the three-year-old stadium.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Nashville took advantage of an error, a wild pitch and a hit batter to score a pair of unearned runs in the sixth inning and come from behind to defeat the Baby Cakes, 4-2. New Orleans trailed 1-0 when the offense strung together five hits in the second inning, with RBI from Eric Campbell and Johnny Givottella to grab a 2-1 lead. Ben Meyer sailed into the sixth inning, when the Sounds capitalized on New Orleans miscues. A throwing error by Campbell extended the inning, and a wild pitch put two runners in scoring position for Josh Phegley, who laced a two-out, two-strike single into left field against reliever James Bucklew to plate both runs and vault Nashville in front. The Sounds added an insurance run in the seventh, and Daniel Coulombe and Kyle Finnegan combined for five strikeouts in three shutout innings of relief to preserve the victory for Brett Anderson, who retired all 15 batters he faced outside of the second inning.

ON THE HILL – Joe Gunkel will head into his fourth start and fifth

appearance of the season still looking to earn his first victory despite a 1.13 ERA (2 ER/16.0 IP) which ranks fourth in the PCL. Gunkel pitched twice against Nashville in the season-opening series, working 3.0 innings of relief on Opening Night before starting the series finale and yielding a solo home run in 3.0 innings. That was the last run Gunkel has allowed, as he has tossed 5.0 shutout frames with two hits surrendered in each of his last two starts. He equaled a career high with eight strikeouts in his last outing vs. Colorado Springs, a mark he last reached in August 2016 at Durham.

FOR STARTERS – Baby Cakes starting pitchers have given up only five earned runs in 39.1 innings (1.14 ERA) over the last seven games and opponents are hitting .176 (25x142). Colorado Springs hit .173 (13x75) with one extra-base hit in four games against 'Cakes starters, and the Dodgers were 9x46 (.196) in two games before Ben Meyer limited Nashville to three hits in 21 at-bats last night.

JOHNNY G – Johnny Givottella has reached base safely in each of his first six games with the Baby Cakes, going 3x15 with six walks and an RBI double. He is playing on the same field where he helped Jesuit High School win the 2005 Louisiana state championship. Givottella went on to earn All-American honors in his three seasons at the University of New Orleans before being drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the second round in 2008. In 27 pro games at the Shrine, Givottella is batting .337 (33x98) with eight doubles, three home runs and 17 RBI.

BULLIED – Over the last 14 games, the New Orleans bullpen owns a 5.92 ERA (34 ER/51.2 IP) and has allowed a home run in eight of those contests (nine total) while opponents have batted .319 (68x213). The relief corps is 2-6 during that stretch, during which the pen has suffered four blown saves, including three by James Bucklew. The five blown saves overall are tied with Memphis for second-most in the PCL (Oklahoma City, 6).

ROCKY ROAD – New Orleans has dropped its first eight road games for the first time in franchise history; the longest previous streak was three in a row (2006 at Albuquerque and 2011 at Nashville). Their 0-7 road trip to open the year was just the fourth time ever the team went winless on a road trip of at least six games, joining a 0-8 trek through Oklahoma City and Colorado Springs from April 28-May 4, 1999 and each of its last two visits through Sacramento and Fresno, going 0-8 in both 2015 and 2017. The winless trip through California last year marked the tail end of a club-record 13-game road drought from July 13-August 1, surpassing the 12 in a row from April 28-May 17, 1999.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway's stolen base last night was the 55th of his New Orleans career; only Colin Porter, who swiped 61 bags from 2001-03, has more steals in a New Orleans uniform. Galloway's seventh-inning single snapped a 0x17 skid during which he had struck out eight times.

SLYKE FATHER, SLYKE SON – Scott Van Slyke ranks sixth in the PCL with a .469 on-base percentage. Van Slyke leads the club in batting average (.333) and walks (12) and is tied for the lead in hits (17), doubles (3) and home runs (2).

RISPY BUSINESS – The 'Cakes are hitting a PCL-worst .216 (35x162) with runners in scoring position through the first 18 games. New Orleans ranked last in the league in each of the last two years, batting .250 with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016.

JUMBO-LAYA – Jumbo Diaz has converted each of his three save opportunities, putting him in a four-way tie for second place in the PCL, while the rest of the Cakes bullpen has gone 2x7. Diaz has surrendered one hit in 10 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

STEAL AWAY – The Baby Cakes are tied for sixth in the PCL with 15 stolen bases and have been caught only four times, the fourth-best success rate in the league (78.9%). Isaac Galloway is one of six players in the league with at least five steals.

A LONG ROAD HOME – New Orleans has surrendered at least seven runs in six of eight games on the road, posting a 6.48 ERA (48 ER/66.2 IP) while opponents have batted .336. The staff owns a 2.64 ERA (35 ER/99.0 IP) in 11 home games and has limited the opposition to a .224 mark.

NOLA'S NOLA – Austin Nola is riding a five-game hit streak, going 7x18 with two doubles and two RBI. Dating back to last season, Nola is batting .409 (9x22) over his last six road contests.

FAMILIAR RELATIONS – The 'Cakes are playing all but one game in April against the same three opponents. NOLA is in the midst of playing 14 straight games against Colorado Springs and Oklahoma City, around a pair of five-game sets against Nashville.

NAWLINS NOTES – The error by Eric Campbell was the team's first in the last 43.1 innings ... New Orleans is the only team in Minor League Baseball without a road victory ... NOLA has clinched its eighth non-winning April in the last 10 seasons ... Last night was the fifth time in the last six games the Baby Cakes struck out at least 10 times, totaling 64 punchouts in that span ... Jonathan Rodriguez had been 3x23 since his last multi-hit game on April 12.

2018 SEASON

SPRING TRAINING – Appeared in one big league spring game with the Marlins, earning the save with one strikeout in an inning of work.

IN THE PEN – Gunkel made his season debut on Opening Night, tossing 3.0 innings of relief. Gunkel inherited the bases loaded with no outs in the fourth inning on 4/5 vs. Nashville and allowed all three runs to score, in addition to a run charged to him. In all, he surrendered four hits and struck out two.

START ME UP – Across his first three starts, Gunkel gave up just one run (a solo homer) and six hits in 13.0 innings while issuing one walk. He fired 5.0 shutout frames at Oklahoma City on 4/14 and exited with a 2-0 lead before the bullpen allowed three runs late, then added another 5.0 scoreless innings on 4/19 vs. Colorado Springs.

K MAN – Gunkel recorded eight strikeouts on 4/19 vs. Colorado Springs to equal a career high set two other times. His other eight-strikeout outing at Triple-A came on August 18, 2016 at Durham.

2017 IN REVIEW

NEW FISH – Gunkel opened 2017 in the Dodgers system at AAA Oklahoma City, where he appeared in three games, including one start on 4/20 vs. Nashville. He allowed four earned runs on 12 hits and did not walk a batter with six strikeouts in 9.0 innings and picked up one save. Gunkel was claimed off waivers by the Marlins on 4/27 and assigned to AA Jacksonville, where he spent the rest of the year.

JUMBO SHRIMP – With Jacksonville, Gunkel finished 6-10 with a 4.92 ERA in 24 games (21 starts). His 10 losses were the most on the club, but his six victories were tied with Dillon Peters for second behind Matt Tomshaw (13). Seven of his 21 starting assignments were quality starts.

THE LONG BALL – Gunkel served up 17 home runs, third-most in the Southern League. Twice he allowed three home runs in a game: 7/3 vs. Mobile and 8/14 vs. Mississippi.

WINNER WINNER – After going winless through his first six starts with Jacksonville, Gunkel broke into the win column after surrendering just one unearned run and five hits in 7.0 innings on 6/10 vs. Biloxi. It sparked a four-start stretch where he won twice and posted a 2.52 ERA (7 ER/25.0 IP).

PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Gunkel did not permit an earned run in 13.0 innings over a pair of starts, 7/21 vs. Tennessee and 7/28 at Mississippi, yielding five hits without a walk. For his efforts, he was honored as Southern League Pitcher of the Week.

NO FREE PASSES – In eight of his last nine starts, Gunkel did not issue an unintentional walk, totaling just two free passes in that span. His 20 unintentional walks in 115.1 innings (1.56 per 9.0 IP) led all Southern League starters.
