## NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (9-14) vs. ROUND ROCK EXPRESS (9-15)

**THE BABY CAKES** – The New Orleans Baby Cakes return home tonight to open a four-game set against the Round Rock Express. The 'Cakes lost 11 of 15 meetings with Round Rock last season, including four of seven at the Shrine, where New Orleans is 7-4 this season, but yesterday's defeat left the Baby Cakes 2-10 on the road, tied with Iowa for the worst record in the PCL.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS** – Dustin Fowler went 3x5 with a double, triple and home run to lead Nashville to a 7-2 win over the Baby Cakes in the rubber match of the five-game series. The Sounds broke a scoreless tie in the bottom of the fourth after a one-out triple by Fowler before the 'Cakes responded with two in the fifth, including an RBI single by Austin Dean. But Nashville quickly got the runs back in the bottom half as Jorge Mateo tripled and Fowler doubled and each scored to give the Sounds the lead for good. Fowler's two-run homer in the seventh off Colton Murray capped the scoring. New Orleans stranded 12 baserunners in the game, leaving the bases loaded three times in the first five innings, and were unable to capitalize on six walks by Sounds starter Daniel Gossett. The Baby Cakes were limited to one hit by the Nashville bullpen over the final 4.1 innings.

**ON THE HILL** – Ben Meyer takes the ball for his fifth start of the season. Meyer was dealt a hard-luck loss on Wednesday in Nashville when he went 5.2 innings allowing three runs (one earned) and three hits. He exited in the sixth with a 2-1 lead and two men on base, both of whom scored when Josh Phegley singled off James Buckelew. Meyer has permitted a .211 batting average, and opponents are just 2x18 (.111) with runners in scoring position. He has yet to permit a run in 10.0 innings at home, giving up three hits in 33 at-bats across a pair of starts.

**FOR STARTERS** – Baby Cakes starting pitchers have given up only 16 earned runs in 61.0 innings (2.36 ERA) over the last 11 games and opponents are hitting .214 (49x229). During the last home-stand, Colorado Springs hit .173 (13x75) with one extra-base hit in four games against 'Cakes starters, and Oklahoma City was 9x46 (.196).

**BULLIED** – Over the last 18 games, the New Orleans bullpen owns a 5.27 ERA (42 ER/71.2 IP) and has allowed a home run in 10 of those contests (11 total) while opponents have batted .310 (84x271). The relief corps is 2-7 in that stretch, during which the pen has suffered four blown saves, including three by James Buckelew.

**A LONG ROAD HOME** – New Orleans has surrendered at least seven runs in eight of 12 games on the road, posting a 5.80 ERA (66 ER/102.1 IP) while opponents have batted .318. The staff owns a 2.64 ERA (35 ER/99.0 IP) in 11 home games and has held the opposition to a .224 mark.

**JUMBO-LAYA** – Jumbo Diaz has converted each of his four save chances, putting him in a four-way tie for second place in the PCL, while the rest of the Cakes bullpen has gone 3x8. Diaz has surrendered one hit in 11 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

**FAMILIAR RELATIONS** – Tonight marks the first time this season New Orleans is facing an opponent other than Nashville, Colorado Springs or Oklahoma City. Each of the next 24 games will be against either Round Rock and Omaha.

**MAGNIFICENT MAGGY** – Magneuris Sierra has hit safely in seven of his last eight contests, batting .371 (13x35) with eight runs scored. His four-hit effort on Saturday in Nashville was the first for a Baby Cake since Austin Nola last August 29, and he was a home run away from recording the third cycle in franchise history, and first since Scott Cousins in 2010.

**DEAN OF HITS** – Austin Dean went 2x4 with a walk and an RBI single in his Triple-A debut yesterday. Dean was hitting .420 (34x81) in 22 games with AA Jacksonville, the fourth-best average in all of Minor League Baseball, and is now just one hit behind Albuquerque's Daniel Castro for the minor league lead with 36 hits overall. Yesterday was his 12th multi-hit effort in 22 games with an official at-bat.

**SIR ISAAC** – Isaac Galloway's stolen base Friday night was the 57th of his New Orleans career; only Colin Porter, who swiped 61 bags from 2001-03, has more steals in a New Orleans uniform. He has seven stolen bases this season, and is tied for third in the PCL. Galloway is riding a five-game hit streak after snapping an 0x17 skid.

**STEAL AWAY** – The Baby Cakes are third in the PCL with 21 stolen bases and have been caught seven times, the second-best success rate in the league (75%) behind Colorado Springs, which paces the circuit in both steals (34) and success rate (87%).

### ON THIS DATE ...

2003: Kirk Saarloos allows just a run and three hits over 8.0 innings in a 3-1 win over Memphis. Saarloos extends his winning streak to 15 games, dating to his first start of the 2002 season, and earns a promotion to Houston the following day.

**RISPY BUSINESS** – New Orleans had one hit in 11 at-bats with runners in scoring position yesterday and is hitting .232 (48x207) with RISP on the year, ahead of only Iowa (.220) among PCL clubs. NOLA ranked last in the league in each of the last two years, batting .250 with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016.

**JOHNNY G** – Johnny Giavotella has reached base in each of his first nine games with the Baby Cakes, going 6x25 with eight walks for a .424 on-base. He is playing on the same field where he helped Jesuit High School win the 2005 Louisiana state title. In 27 pro games at the Shrine, Giavotella is batting .337 (33x98) with eight doubles, three home runs and 17 RBI.

**RIDDLE ME THIS** – JT Riddle has joined the Baby Cakes on a Major League rehab assignment. Riddle played two games each at Jupiter and Jacksonville, going a combined 3x13. Riddle began last season with New Orleans and hit .286 in 16 games before making his MLB debut with the Marlins, batting .250 in 70 games. His season ended in July after having surgery to repair his left labrum.

**ROSTER MOVES** – New Orleans has placed outfielder Braxton Lee on the disabled list and added right-hander Trevor Richards. Lee exited the game on Saturday after getting injured while running the bases. Richards was 0-2 with a 4.94 ERA in five starts with the Marlins, but struck out 10 Dodgers in his last outing on Wednesday. Richards had never pitched above Double-A prior to this season.

**NAWLINS NOTES** – NOLA designated hitters are batting .345 (10x29) with two home runs and four RBI ... The Baby Cakes have hit a PCL-low eight home runs, and just one in their last 48.0 innings ... New Orleans drew eight walks yesterday, equaling a season high set three other times ... At 0-10, the 'Cakes are one of three PCL clubs without a victory when trailing after five innings, joining Tacoma (0-10) and Las Vegas (0-12).

### 2018 SEASON

**DAZZLING DEBUT** – Meyer won his Triple-A debut on 4/8 vs. Nashville, tossing 5.0 shutout innings of one-hit ball. He needed only 12 pitches to strike out the side in the first inning and finished with five punchouts.

**HOME SWEET HOME** – In two starts at the Shrine, Meyer has fired 10.0 scoreless frames and yielded a .091 (3x33) batting average against. After shutting out Colorado Springs for 5.0 innings on 4/18, he has allowed one or no runs in 10 of his 15 starting assignments going back to 2017 with Jupiter.

### 2017 IN REVIEW

**YOUNG GRASSHOPPER** – Meyer opened the 2017 campaign with Low-A Greensboro, where he was 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA (7 ER/29.1 IP) in 12 games, all out of the bullpen. He picked up the victory in his season debut on 4/7 vs. Hickory, yielding one run and two hits with four strikeouts in 2.1 innings.

**HEATING UP** – After allowing runs in each of his first five appearances, Meyer was unscored upon in six of his last seven outings with the Grasshoppers, permitting one run in 17.0 innings (0.53 ERA). The run began with 3.0 perfect innings on 4/28 at Asheville, when he fanned six of the nine batters he faced.

**BIG FISH** – Meyer was promoted to High-A Jupiter on 5/28 and notched a 1.98 ERA while limiting Florida State League opponents to a .201 batting average (59x293). He did not surrender a home run in 293 at-bats.

**THE DEAN TEAM** – Meyer went undefeated at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium, winning four games in five home starts with a 1.69 ERA (7 ER/37.1 IP). The Minnesota native held opponents to a .160 batting average (20x125) while striking out 43 batters.

**FUN UNDER THE SUN** – During day games, Meyer was nearly perfect, allowing only one earned run in 28.2 IP (0.31 ERA) while opponents hit .153 (15x98). Included were both of his season-best 7.0-inning outings, victories over St. Lucie on 7/9 and Lakeland on 7/29.

**DOG DAYS** – Meyer allowed 12 earned runs in 21.1 IP (5.06 ERA) in six August games, including four starts. In comparison, Meyer only gave up six earned runs in the 60.2 IP during the rest of the season.

**WHAT A RELIEF** – In 17 relief innings with Jupiter, Meyer gave up just one earned run (0.53 ERA) with 23 strikeouts. He notched his only save of the season with 4.0 shutout frames 7/24 at Daytona, picking up four strikeouts without issuing a walk.
