NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (14-15) AT OMAHA STORM CHASERS (11-18)

RHP Trevor Richards (0-0, 2.45) vs. RHP Heath Fillmyer (2-1, 5.32)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes have won five of their last six games and continue eight-game road trip today with the third of a four-game series against the Omaha Storm Chasers. The ‘Cakes went 6-7 vs. Omaha last year, with losses in four of six meetings at Werner Park, where they gave up 6.7 runs per contest. The teams will face each other 12 times over during this 20 game stretch.

YESTERDAY’S NEWS – The ‘Cakes offense erupted with a seven run fifth inning to defeat Omaha for the second consecutive night, 13-2. Ben Meyer pitched seven innings, allowed one run on two hits to earn the victory. It was the second consecutive game that New Orleans put up season highs in runs and hits. Tomas Telis’ four hits and three RBI paced New Orleans. Eric Campbell, JT Riddle, Jon Rodriguez and Magneuris Sierra all had multi-hit nights at the plate.

ON THE HILL – Trevor Richards is set to make his second start of the season for New Orleans. In his first start against Round Rock, he worked seven and a third innings, and allowed one run on six hits. The 24-year-old opened the season in the Marlins rotation and made five starts. He was 0-2 with a 4.94 ERA. He struck-out ten batters in his final start on April 25th against the Dodgers. Richards was named Marlins’ Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2017 by going 12-11 with a 2.53 ERA in 27 games (25 starts) between Class A Jupiter and Class AA Jacksonville.

FOR STARTERS – Baby Cakes starting pitchers have given up only 24 earned runs in 104.1 innings (2.07 ERA) over the last 17 games and opponents are hitting .193 (74x384). In the last 10 home games, the opposition is hitting .183 (41x224). New Orleans starters worked at least 7.0 innings in six consecutive games, after doing so just once in the season’s first 23 games. The club also has six consecutive quality starts and improved to 9-2 in those starts.

HIT PARADE - The ‘Cakes have topped their season high in hits and runs in back to back games. The ‘Cakes are hitting .398 (33x83) in the series scoring 21 runs. The club finished its recent four game series against Round Rock scoring ten runs and had 29 hits over four games.

POWER OUTAGE – The Baby Cakes have hit a league-low eleven home runs, Indianapolis has the fewest in Triple-A with ten. Nine homers came in April, marking the first time New Orleans did not reach double digits over a full month since going yard five times in April 2003.

SEIZE THE DAY - The ‘Cakes are 3-3 in day games this season. Dating back to last season the club has won 12 of its last 19 games under the sun.

BATTLE OF THE BAMBINOS – The Baby Cakes and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, aka the Baby Bombers, are engaged in an online contest to determine which team has the better baby mascot. Fans are asked to visit www.battleofthebambinos.com and vote on Twitter through July 30. The team that loses the hashtag voting competition will donate \$2,500 to the winning team’s charity. The Baby Cakes have chosen the Junior League of New Orleans, and will be hosting five diaper drives at upcoming games.

DEAN OF HITS – Austin Dean has gone 7x22 with seven walks and five RBI in his first seven Triple-A games. Dean was hitting .420 (34x81) in 22 games with AA Jacksonville and was honored as the Southern League’s Player of the Month for April after pacing the circuit in batting average, hits, total bases (53), slugging percentage (.654) and OPS (1.120). Dean’s 41 hits overall are second-most in the minors, one behind former Marlins farmhand Josh Naylor, now with AA San Antonio, and his .398 batting average (41x103) ranks sixth in MiLB.

HOT SOUP – Eric Campbell notched the sixth multi-hit effort in his last ten games, hitting safely in nine of those contests. His eight game hit streak is the longest on the club this season. Campbell has at least one RBI in eight of his last 15 games, during which he is hitting .380 (19x50) with two doubles, two home runs and 13 RBI. He is 12x30 (.400) in 10 home games, compared with 11x46 (.239) in 12 games on the road.

MAGNIFICENT MAGNEURIS - Magneuris Sierra has hit safely in 11 of his last 13 contests, batting .316 (18x57). He delivered his first three RBI of the season last night. His first RBI came on his 100th at bat of the season on an infield hit.

GOOSE EGGS – The ‘Cakes recorded their fourth shutout, one fewer than Nashville for the league lead. The Baby Cakes were involved in 24 shutouts last year and 26 in 2016, leading the PCL both seasons. The last time NOLA played a scoreless game through nine innings was May 6, 2017 at Tacoma, which they also won 1-0 in 10 innings.

CLOSE CALLS – Nine of NOLA’s last 14 games have been decided by one or two runs, with the ‘Cakes going 5-4 in those contests. New Orleans has played 16 such games, one more than Omaha for the league high.

JUMBO-LAYA – Jumbo Diaz has converted each of his four save chances, putting him tied for sixth place in the PCL, while the rest of the ‘Cakes bullpen has gone 3x9. Diaz has surrendered one hit in 17 at-bats (.059) with runners in scoring position.

RISPY BUSINESS – New Orleans went 9x17 with runners in scoring position yesterday and moved out of last place in the league. The .251 (67x267) with RISP on the year, is 14th. NOLA ranked last in the league in each of the last two years, batting .250 with RISP in 2017, and .257 in 2016.

THE DH - The ‘Cakes designated hitter has a hit in three consecutive games and for the season is batting .333 (17x51) with 8 RBI.

NAWLINS NOTES – The 2.35 ERA for New Orleans in the month of May is the best in the league for the month.... Yesterday’s win is the seventh consecutive win for the club on the day the Kentucky Derby is run... New Orleans improved to 4-1 on Saturday’s this season, the club is 1-2 on Sunday. New Orleans has 26 steals on the year, third-most in the PCL ... Scott Van Slyke is 2x23 (.087) with 11 strikeouts over his last six games ... Joe Gunkel retired all six batters he faced in his first relief appearance since Opening Day, lowering his ERA to a league-leading 1.90 (5 ER/23.2 IP) ... NOLA has won three of four series at home, a total not reached until July 21-24 last season.

ON THIS DATE ...

2001: Brian Powell fires the PCL’s first nine-inning no-hitter in nearly five years in a 5-0 win over The Omaha Golden Spikes. Powell was perfect through 5.2 innings until Nick Ortiz botched a ground ball near the second base bag, and the only other blemish came on a questionable play in the eighth on which Kevin Burns was charged with an error for pulling his foot off the bag. Powell strikes out five and induces 18 ground ball outs, and does not issue a walk for the fourth straight game.

2018 SEASON

BIG LEAGUER – Richards began the season in the Miami Marlins' starting rotation, making his MLB debut on 4/2 vs. Boston. Richards retired the first seven Red Sox he faced, including fanning Anthony Benintendi for his first career strikeout, but was nicked for five runs across the fourth and fifth innings and was dealt the loss.

WALK THE PLANK – Though he did not factor into the decision, Richards fired 7.0 innings of two-hit ball in his third start on 4/14 vs. Pittsburgh. He did not surrender a hit until Francisco Cervelli doubled with one out in the fifth and became the first Marlins rookie starter to work at least 7.0 innings and allow two or fewer hits since Justin Nicolino on September 26, 2015 vs. Atlanta.

K MAN – Richards struck out 10 Dodgers on 4/25 at Los Angeles, one shy of his career high set on June 2, 2017 vs. Dunedin while pitching for High-A Jupiter. Richards fell one out shy of qualifying for his first MLB victory in outdueling Clayton Kershaw, whose third-inning single was the only hit Richards surrendered. Richards was optioned to New Orleans the next day when Miami activated Martin Prado.

DOMINANT DEBUT – In his first career Triple-A start on 5/1, Richards blanked Round Rock on three hits into the eighth inning, when he was nicked for a pair of runs and settled for a no-decision. Richards racked up nine strikeouts, a season high for a 'Cakes starter, and retired 11 in a row at one point.

2017 IN REVIEW

KING FISH – Richards was honored as the Marlins' Minor League Pitcher of the Year by going 12-11 with a 2.53 ERA (41 ER/146.0 IP) in 27 games (25 starts) between High-A Jupiter and AA Jacksonville. He set career highs in wins, innings pitched and strikeouts (158) in his first full minor league season and led Miami's system in ERA and strikeouts.

ALL-STAR NOD – After going 7-4 with a 2.17 ERA (17 ER/70.2 IP) in 13 games with Jupiter, Richards was named a Florida State League All-Star. He was especially tough over his final four starts, going 3-0 with a 0.77 ERA with 30 strikeouts and two walks, culminating in a FSL Pitcher of the Week award after an 11-strikeout performance on 6/2 vs. Dunedin.

NO JUNE SWOON – The Marlins named Richards their Minor League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 4-0 with a 1.65 ERA, which included a win over Jackson in his Double-A debut on 6/23.

TAKE A SEAT – Richards recorded his second career 10-strikeout game when he blanked Biloxi for 7.0 innings on 7/9. From 7/1 through year end, his 71 strikeouts were fourth-most in the Southern League.

CLOSING STRONG – Richards did not surrender an earned run in three of his last five starts, helping Jacksonville clinch the second half division title. In his lone postseason appearance, he scattered two runs and six hits in 5.0 innings of a no-decision in Game 3 vs. Pensacola.

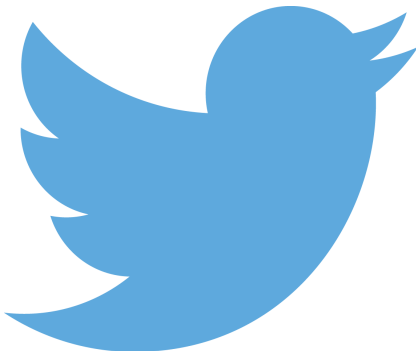
