NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (17-15) AT ROUND ROCK EXPRESS (11-22)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue an eight-game road trip tonight with the second of a four-game set against the Round Rock Express. The ‘Cakes have claimed four of five meetings this season, including three in their final at-bat last week at the Shrine. Last night matched the second-largest margin of victory for New Orleans in 105 all-time matchups at Dell Diamond (nine-run wins four times).

YESTERDAY’S NEWS – The Baby Cakes used a 14-hit attack to defeat Round Rock, 10-2 for their sixth consecutive victory. Eric Campbell had a two-run single in the first inning to give the Baby Cakes an early lead, and added an RBI single in the third and a sacrifice fly in the fifth to finish with a season-high four RBI. Campbell tacked on his third single of the night during a three-run eighth inning. Magnerius Sierra also had three hits, and Isaac Galloway and JT Riddle chipped in two apiece as the top four hitters in the ‘Cakes lineup combined to go 10x19. Austin Nola drilled his first home run of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth which pushed the Baby Cakes’ lead to 7-0. Adam Conley blanked the Express for five innings before tiring in the sixth, when he allowed a two-run homer to Tommy Joseph and was removed after making 100 pitches. Joe Gunkel gave up a single and a walk to the first two batters he faced in the sixth, then retired the last 10 in a row to earn the save.

ON THE HILL – Zac Gallen brings a 2.50 ERA, eighth-best in the PCL, into his seventh start of the year. Last Thursday against Round Rock, Gallen blanked the Express on four hits over 7.0 innings with a season-high six strikeouts, but did not factor into the decision as the game remained scoreless into extra innings. Gallen has yet to permit a run in 20.0 innings in his three home starts, where the opposition is batting .176. In three road starts, he owns a 5.63 ERA and a .366 batting average against. Gallen has surrendered just one home run in 36.0 innings.

FOR STARTERS – Baby Cakes starting pitchers have a 2.27 ERA (31 ER/123.0 IP) over the last 20 games and opponents are hitting .197 (93x472). Last night saw Adam Conley fall one out shy of posting the team’s ninth consecutive quality start, during which the staff owns a 2.00 ERA (14 ER/63.0 IP). NOLA is 11-2 when receiving a quality start.

DEAN OF HITS – Austin Dean has gone 11x35 (.314) with seven walks and eight RBI in his first 10 Triple-A contests. Dean was hitting .420 (34x81) in 22 games with AA Jacksonville and was honored as April’s Southern League Player of the Month after pacing the circuit in batting average, hits, total bases (53), slugging percentage (.654) and OPS (1.120). Dean’s 45 hits overall are tied for third-most in the minors, two behind Salt Lake’s David Fletcher and San Antonio’s Josh Naylor, and his .388 batting average (45x116) ranks eighth in MiLB (Fresno’s J.D. Davis, .432).

GOLDEN GOPHER – Right-hander Ben Meyer has been named PCL Pitcher of the Week, after going 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 ER/14.0 IP) in a pair of starts. Meyer gave up just five total hits, limiting opponents to a .109 average (5x46) to lower his league-leading batting average against to .172 (21x172). He also ranks second in the PCL in WHIP (0.84) and fourth in ERA (2.10). The University of Minnesota alum had finished 7.0 innings in two of his 26 career starts before doing so in both outings last week. Meyer is the first New Orleans pitcher to win the weekly honour since last July 3-9, when Justin Nicolino captured the award.

ROAD WARRIORS – After losing each of their first nine road games of the season, the ‘Cakes have won seven of the last eight, including five in a row for the first time since July 12-27, 2015. The last six-game road winning streak was a seven-game run vs. Round Rock and Memphis, June 12-26, 2007. New Orleans has won the first five games of a road trip for the first time since its season-ending trek through Oklahoma City and Round Rock from August 27-31, 2007 which clinched the club’s last division title.

HOT SOUP – Eric Campbell extended his hitting streak to 11 games, the fifth-longest active streak in the PCL and the longest by a NOLA player since Reid Brignac had a 19-game streak from August 2-26, 2015. He is batting .489 (22x45) during the run, which includes multi-hit efforts in six of his last seven contests. Campbell charted the Baby Cakes’ first four-RBI game of the season, giving him 18 RBI in his last 17 games.

HIT PARADE – New Orleans reached double-digit hits for the fifth game in a row. After outhitting Omaha 56-27 in four games, the ‘Cakes outhit Round Rock last night, 14-7. The Baby Cakes have batted .350 (70x200) in the five contests, after entering the road trip with a PCL-worst .225 team batting average.

RIDDLE ME THIS – JT Riddle recorded his fourth straight multi-hit game and fifth in six starts since joining the Baby Cakes, which includes four games with three hits. In seven games overall, he is hitting .483 (14x29) with three doubles, one triple, one home run and 10 RBI.

JUMBO-LAYA – Jumbo Diaz has converted each of his five save chances, putting him tied for fifth place in the PCL, while the rest of the ‘Cakes bullpen has gone 4x10. Diaz has surrendered two hits in 18 at-bats (.111) with runners in scoring position.

MAGNIFICENT MAGGY – Magueuris Sierra stretched his hitting streak to a season-best six games and has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 contests, during which he is batting .343 (24x70). Sierra is hitting .325 since moving into the second spot in the lineup, after going 5x40 (.125) batting leadoff.

STEAL AWAY – The Baby Cakes stole three bases in a game for the first time this season to boost their season total to 29, tied with Omaha for third-most in the PCL. Magueuris Sierra joined Rafael Ortega as the only ‘Cakes players to swipe two bags in a game. Isaac Galloway’s steal was his eighth of 2018 tied for third-most in the league, and the 58th of his New Orleans career, three behind the all-time franchise leader Colin Porter.

NO ORDINARY JOE – With 3.1 innings of one-hit relief last night, Joe Gunkel lowered his ERA to 1.67 (5 ER/27.0 IP), qualifying him for second-best in the PCL behind Nashville’s Daniel Gossett (1.05). Gunkel owns the league’s best WHIP (0.74) and third-best batting average against (.184) and has struck out 21 batters against only two walks.

NAWLINS NOTES – Austin Nola’s home run was his first since last July 19, also at Dell Diamond ... The Baby Cakes own a plus run differential (135-134) for the first time this season ... New Orleans boasts the PCL’s best team ERA (2.19) in May and the second-best team batting average (.309) ... The ‘Cakes have lost all four of their Wednesday games.

2018 SEASON

GALLANT EFFORT – Gallen blanked Nashville on four hits for 6.0 innings in his season debut on 4/6, becoming the first New Orleans pitcher to finish with at least 6.0 scoreless innings in his team debut since Sam Dyson shut out Reno for 6.0 innings on August 5, 2013.

SEVENTH HEAVEN – With 7.0 shutout innings on 4/21 vs. Oklahoma City, Gallen became the first Baby Cakes pitcher to work at least 7.0 innings in 2018. Gallen held the Dodgers to four hits and fanned five to record his second victory. He repeated the feat on 5/3 vs. Round Rock with 7.0 scoreless frames in a no-decision with a season-high six strikeouts.

HOME SWEET HOME – Gallen did not surrender a run over his first three starts at home, pitching 20.0 consecutive scoreless innings to open the season. Opponents batted .176 (12x68), including .077 (1x13) with runners in scoring position.

2017 IN REVIEW

MOVING FAST – Gallen saw time at three levels of the Cardinals system in his first full pro campaign, combining to go 10-8 with a 2.93 ERA (48 ER/147.2 IP) between High-A Palm Beach, AA Springfield and AAA Memphis. He ranked sixth among St. Louis farmhands in ERA and tied for fifth in victories.

ALL-STAR – Florida State League All-Star honors were bestowed upon Gallen after he went 5-2 with a 1.62 ERA in nine starts with Palm Beach. He surrendered one or no earned runs in seven of those starts and struck out 56 batters against 10 walks in 55.2 IP.

YOU COMPLETE ME – Gallen was credited with a 6.0-inning complete game in dropping the first game of a doubleheader on 4/13 at Clearwater, despite yielding just one run. He then fell one out shy of a complete game in his final FSL start on 5/30 vs. Lakeland, giving up one run and four hits in 8.2 innings. He owned the league's second-best ERA and third-best opponents average (.215) when promoted.

DEBUTS – With 5.2 innings of one-run ball on 6/6 at NW Arkansas, Gallen picked up the win in his Double-A debut. He then moved on to Triple-A for three starts from 6/26-7/7, including a win over New Orleans on 7/1 where he gave up one run and four hits with eight punchouts in 6.0 innings.

IT'S A MAJOR AWARD – Upon returning to AA Springfield on 7/16, Gallen allowed one baserunner in 7.0 innings against NW Arkansas to be named Texas League Pitcher of the Week. He retired the final 14 batters he faced, including four of the last five via strikeout, after allowing a third-inning single.

A REDBIRD RING – Gallen joined the Memphis rotation in September, getting a pair of no-decisions at Colorado Springs, first in the regular season finale on 9/4 and again in Game 4 of the PCL Semifinals. He then took the loss in Game 4 of the PCL Finals at El Paso, yielding five runs on seven hits in 5.0 IP.
