NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (23-24) AT IOWA CUBS (16-29)

RHP Ben Meyer (2-3, 3.71) vs. RHP Jen-Ho Tseng (1-4, 7.01)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue a season-long nine-game road trip tonight with the opener of a five-game series against the Iowa Cubs. The 'Cakes dropped nine of 16 meetings last year, including five of eight at Principal Park, and have not won the season series from the I-Cubs since 2013.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Jack Lopez homered on the second pitch of the bottom of the ninth, giving Omaha Storm Chasers a wild 11-10 win over the Baby Cakes. Lopez's home run off Jumbo Diaz came moments after he turned a double play to get Omaha out of a bases loaded, one-out jam in the top of the inning. Both offenses took advantage of 15-20 mph winds blowing out to left field, as the teams combined for 21 runs and 30 hits. The 'Cakes squandered a 5-1 lead in the fourth, falling behind 9-5 when the Storm Chasers scored five times in the fifth, only to respond with five runs of their own in the sixth to regain the lead, 10-9. Omaha pulled even in the eighth on Cam Gallagher's bunt to score Terrance Gore from third. Six different players had two hits for the 'Cakes, including Cito Culver, Jon Rodriguez and Chad Wallach, who each homered. Dillon Peters, facing the Chasers for the third time in as many Triple-A starts, was charged with seven runs on 10 hits in 4.0 innings.

ON THE HILL – Ben Meyer makes his ninth start of the season, looking to rebound from a career-worst outing six days ago against Round Rock when he allowed seven runs on seven hits in 2.1 IP. Meyer had never allowed more than five runs in 30 career starts, and had carried the league's third-best ERA (2.40) into the game, along with a PCL-leading WHIP (0.87) and opponents batting average (.188). He was named PCL Pitcher of the Week for April 30-May 6 during a run of three consecutive quality starts lasting at least 7.0 innings apiece, the first NOLA pitcher to do so since Jose Urena in May 2015.

MAY DAYS – New Orleans boasts a .296 team batting average this month trailing only Albuquerque (.303) among PCL clubs. The 'Cakes had hit just .225 in April, the club's lowest over a full month since hitting .222 in May 2008, while the .296 mark would be the best over a full month since hitting .298 in July 2011.

ARMS RACE – Over the last seven games, the Baby Cakes pitching staff owns a 8.36 ERA (52 ER/56.0 IP). 'Cakes starting pitchers had a 2.25 ERA (45 ER/180.0 IP) over the previous 27 games and an opponents batting average of .205 (139x679). New Orleans starters had turned in a quality start 15 out of 17 games before their recent stretch which has produced one quality start in the past seven contests (Trevor Richards on Sunday).

BULLIED – The New Orleans bullpen suffered its ninth blown save, the most in the PCL, and has now permitted 51.2% of inherited baserunners (22x43) to score. The Baby Cakes lost for the second straight game when leading after seven innings, and their four such defeats on the year (16-4) are the most in the league.

HOT SOUP – Over his last 25 contests, dating to April 26, Eric Campbell is batting .407 (37x91), second in the PCL in that span to Fresno's J.D. Davis (.442). His .495 on-base percentage also ranks second while his 37 hits are tied for third-most. Campbell has hit safely in eight of nine career games vs. Iowa, going 10x35 with five doubles, a home run and seven RBI.

WALK-OFF WONDERS – Last night was the Baby Cakes' seventh walk-off defeat of the season, surpassing their total from all of last year. New Orleans held the lead entering the opposition's final at-bat in each of the previous four walk-off losses, and led in the eighth inning last night.

DEAN OF HITS – In his first 23 games with New Orleans, Austin Dean is hitting .317 (26x82) with 16 RBI and 12 walks for a .414 on-base percentage. Dean was hitting .420 (34x81) in 22 games with AA Jacksonville and was honored as April's Southern League Player of the Month after pacing the circuit in batting average, hits, total bases (53), slugging percentage (.654) and OPS (1.120). His .368 batting average overall ranks 10th in MiLB, and he is one of 11 players in the minors to amass 60 hits.

TOMAS THE TANK – Tomas Telis has a hit in 10 of his last 11 games, batting .463 (19x41) with seven multi-hit efforts and 10 RBI. In 11 games vs. Omaha, he is hitting .457 (21x46) with nine RBI. Dating back to last May 23, Telis owns a .353 batting average (79x224) over his last 58 games with New Orleans.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway has 11 stolen bases, tied for third-most in the PCL, and has tied Colin Porter's record (61) for most stolen bases in franchise history. Galloway ranks eighth on the club's career leaderboard in games played (321) and his next at-bat will be his 1,117th to tie Chris Aguila for eighth place. He has also moved into a tie with Jason Alfaro for seventh in runs scored (149).

LONELIEST NUMBER – The Baby Cakes have played 15 one-run games (6-9), and 26 games decided by one or two runs (11-15), third-most in the PCL to Round Rock (28) and Omaha (27). NOLA has won its last five one-run affairs at home, but has dropped all eight on the road.

STEAL AWAY – Rafael Ortega improved to 9x9 in stolen base attempts on Wednesday, the most of any player in the PCL without being caught. It was the Baby Cakes' 39th steal of the season, tied for fifth-most in the PCL. Ortega and Isaac Galloway (11) are one of two sets of teammates with at least nine steals, joining Colorado Springs' Keon Broxton (15) and Nate Orf (9).

THE LONG BALL – Baby Cakes pitchers served up four home runs in a game for the first time since last July 21 vs. Nashville. The 'Cakes have surrendered 14 dingers over the last eight games, and their 22 home runs allowed this month are second-most among American Conference clubs (Memphis, 25). New Orleans hit three homers last night, a season high, and Jon Rodriguez became the first player to homer in back-to-back games since Peter Mooney went deep in three straight in Memphis last August 20-22.

NAWLINS NOTES – The Baby Cakes lost when scoring at least 10 runs for the first time since a 15-11 setback in 10 innings last June 11, also in Omaha ... New Orleans finished 14-10 during a stretch of 24 consecutive games against Omaha and Round Rock ... An error charged to Magneuris Sierra in the eighth inning last night was only the 26th miscue by the 'Cakes this season, second-fewest in the PCL (Fresno, 24) ... Austin Nola has hit safely in seven of his last eight contests, batting .379 (11x29) with four doubles, one home run and six RBI.

2018 SEASON

DAZZLING DEBUT – Meyer won his Triple-A debut on 4/8 vs. Nashville, tossing 5.0 shutout innings of one-hit ball. He needed only 12 pitches to strike out the side in the first inning and finished with five punchouts.

HOME SWEET HOME – In three starts at the Shrine, Meyer owns a 1.06 ERA (2 ER/17.0 IP) and a .107 (6x56) batting average against. After shutting out Colorado Springs for 5.0 innings on 4/18, he had allowed one or no runs in 10 of his 15 starting assignments going back to 2017 with Jupiter.

SEVENTH HEAVEN – His 7.0 innings in a no-decision on 4/30 vs. Round Rock tied a career high, set twice last July with Jupiter, and was his first quality start of the season.

NO APRIL FOOL – Through his first five starts, Meyer sported the lowest opponents batting average (.192) among all PCL starters, including a .171 mark (7x41) for left-handed hitters. Meyer ranked 2nd in the league in fewest baserunners per 9.0 innings pitched (9.55).

A MAJOR AWARD – The PCL named Meyer its Pitcher of the Week for 4/30-5/6 after he allowed three runs and five hits in 14.0 IP over a pair of starts. He faced only two over the minimum in his 7.0 innings on 5/4 at Omaha, with the only two hits he allowed coming in a three-batter sequence.

2017 IN REVIEW

YOUNG GRASSHOPPER – Meyer opened the 2017 campaign with Low-A Greensboro, where he was 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA (7 ER/29.1 IP) in 12 games, all out of the bullpen. He picked up the victory in his season debut on 4/7 vs. Hickory, yielding one run and two hits with four strikeouts in 2.1 innings.

HEATING UP – After allowing runs in each of his first five appearances, Meyer was unscored upon in six of his last seven outings with the Grasshoppers, permitting one run in 17.0 innings (0.53 ERA). The run began with 3.0 perfect innings on 4/28 at Asheville, when he fanned six of the nine batters he faced.

BIG FISH – Meyer was promoted to High-A Jupiter on 5/28 and notched a 1.98 ERA while limiting Florida State League opponents to a .201 batting average (59x293). He did not surrender a home run in 293 at-bats.

FUN UNDER THE SUN – During day games, Meyer was nearly perfect, allowing only one earned run in 28.2 IP (0.31 ERA) while opponents hit .153 (15x98). Included were both of his season-best 7.0-inning outings, victories over St. Lucie on 7/9 and Lakeland on 7/29.

WHAT A RELIEF – In 17 relief innings with Jupiter, Meyer gave up just one earned run (0.53 ERA) with 23 strikeouts. He notched his only save of the season with 4.0 shutout frames 7/24 at Daytona, picking up four strikeouts without issuing a walk.

Career: A native of Cuba, spent high school and collegiate years in South Florida and was signed by the Marlins in 2016 as a non-drafted free agent out of Broward College, where he ranked in the conference's top five in batting average, on-base, OPS and stolen bases as a sophomore. Debuted in the Gulf Coast League in 2016 then divided 2017 between Batavia and Greensboro, combining to hit .243 with nine doubles, one triple, two homers and 11 RBI in 39 games. 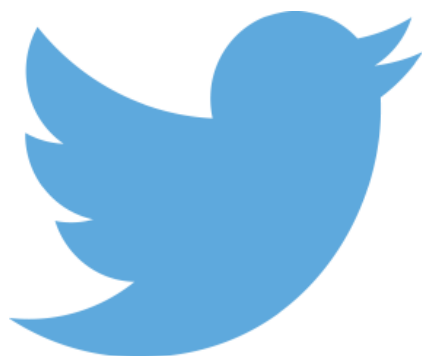
