ABOUT LAST NIGHT...

The Corpus Christi Hooks picked up a dramatic 2-1 walkoff victory over the Round Rock Express in Saturday night's Houston Astros Futures Weekend contest at Whataburger Field. E-Train pitchers tallied 15 strikeouts, however the Hooks scored a pair of runs in the bottom of the ninth to complete the comeback win. Round Rock's lone run came via a Taylor Jones RBI single in the seventh. Hooks DH Granden Goetzman and C Chuckie Robinson teamed up for a pair of RBI singles off Express RHP Cy Sneed in the bottom of the ninth to grab the win.

A NEW ERA

Last September, the Round Rock Express announced that the club would be reaffiliating to rejoin the Houston Astros. The Express spent five seasons as the Astros' Double-A affiliate from 2000-2004, then six more as the team's Triple-A affiliate from 2005-2010.

#20STRONG

The Round Rock Express are celebrating their 20th anniversary season in 2019. The club was originally founded in 2000 as the Double-A affiliate of the Houston Astros, winning the Texas League championship in their inaugural season. The Express advanced to the Triple-A Pacific Coast League to begin play in 2005.



STACKED WITH PROSPECTS

Round Rock's preliminary Opening Day roster is loaded with top prospects. The team is slated to begin with nine of the top 25 prospects in the Houston Astros organization, including four of the top 100 prospects in baseball, according to MLB.com. The top three prospects in the Astros organization are all slated to begin the year in Round Rock: #1 RHP Forrest Whitley, #2 OF Kyle Tucker and #3 OF Yordan Alvarez. Additional top prospects on the E-Train roster include #5 RHP Corbin Martin, #9 RHP Cionel Perez, #14 C Garrett Stubbs, #16 INF/OF Myles Straw, #20 RHP Dean Deetz and #24 Rogelio Armenteros.

GROWN ON THE FARM

All but three of the 25 players on Round Rock's preliminary roster have spent the duration of their professional careers within the Astros organization. Collectively, the group has appeared in 6,855 professional games, with all but 138 of those contests coming with the player as a member of the Astros organization.

NO STRANGERS TO THE PCL GAME

Just three players are scheduled to make their Triple-A debut with the Express in 2019: LHP Ryan Hartman, RHP Corbin Martin and RHP Forrest Whitley. The remaining 22 players on Round Rock's preliminary roster all appeared for the Fresno Grizzlies at some point in 2018. The Grizzlies, who served as Houston's Triple-A affiliate from 2015-2018, fell to the Memphis Redbirds 3-1 in the best-of-five Pacific Coast League Championship Series a year ago.

STATING THE FACTS

American-born players on Round Rock's preliminary roster hail from 14 different states: Alabama, California, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Massachusetts, Missouri, Nevada, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Washington. The squad features five players from the State of Texas: RHP Ralph Garza (Edinburg), RHP Corbin Martin (Houston), INF Jack Mayfield (Del Rio), RHP Brady Rodgers (Richmond) and RHP Forrest Whitley (San Antonio).

Three different nations are represented on the preliminary Express roster. In addition to the 21 players from the United States, RHP Rogelio Armenteros, OF Yordan Alvarez and LHP Cionel Perez hail from Cuba while LHP Reymin Guduan is a native of the Dominican Republic.

WELCOME TO ROUND ROCK

Manager Mickey Storey headlines a brand new coaching staff coming to Round Rock to coincide with the team's reaffiliation to the Houston Astros organization. Storey is joined by Pitching Coach Drew French, Hitting Coach Ben Rosenthal, Performance Coach Josh Peterson, Athletic Trainer John Gregorich and Strength and Conditioning Coach Dwayne Peterson.

EXPRESS MANAGER MICKEY STOREY

Mickey Storey joins the Express from the Class-A Quad Cities River Bandits, where he began his managerial career in 2018. The 32-year-old skipper led the River Bandits to an 81-59 record in 2018, the second-best mark in the Midwest League and the club's highest win total since 2015. Prior to his time in Quad Cities, Storey served as the development coach at Class A-Advanced Buies Creek in 2017. The former right-handed pitcher had a nine-year professional playing career that included one season with the Astros in 2012 in which he posted a 3.86 ERA in 26 appearances with the Major League club.



Storey was born in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where he attended nearby Deerfield Beach High School before moving on to Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton. He was drafted twice in his career, first by the Minnesota Twins in the 22nd round of the 2007 MLB Draft and again by the Oakland Athletics in the 31st round of the 2008 MLB Draft. During his nine-year professional career, Storey pitched at every level of affiliated baseball, including stints with Sacramento and Oklahoma City in the Pacific Coast League. He also posted winter ball stints in the Dominican Republic, Mexico and Venezuela. He finished his playing career in 2016 following two seasons with the Somerset Patriots of the independent Atlantic League. In total, the righty amassed a career 3.52 ERA in 385 games.
