# uuuuuuuuuuuu TRIBE TIPS

**ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** The Tribe led 4-0 midway through the sixth before the wheels came off in a 10-4 loss to the Clippers. Jordan Luplow belted a solo shot in the second, and Kevin Kramer ripped a three-run dinger with two outs in the sixth to make it 4-0, but Columbus rallied for eight runs in the bottom of the sixth to seal the series and set up a potential sweep today. Francisco Mejia hit a game-tying grand slam off Alex McRae to end the Tribe right-hander's night at 5.1 innings pitched, and Johnny Hellweg showed a crack in his armor by allowing four runs (two earned) before the sixth came to a close. Columbus tacked on two more runs in the seventh against Tanner Anderson, who has a 4.70 ERA (4 ER/7.2 IP) over his last six appearances combined. Luplow finished 3-for-3 with a home run. double, walk and two runs scored, elevating his average to .267.

STAY HOT, RYNO: Ryan Lavarnway pushed his hitting streak to a season-high eight games with a single in last night's loss. He owns a tremendous .922 OPS through 26 games and is batting .306 (26-for-85) with three homers, one triple, six doubles and 11 RBI on the season. He is batting .444 (12-for-27) with all three of his home runs this season, one double, six RBI and four runs scored during his hitting streak. He has also reached base safely in 19 of his last 20 games. Lavarnway's career-high hitting streak is 14 games, set from May 6-June 4, 2009 with Single-A Greenville in the South Atlantic League.

**HAVE A NIGHT, JORDAN:** Jordan Luplow recorded his second three-hit game of the season yesterday, the other coming on June 7 at Rochester (3-for-5, 1 2B, 1 R). He homered in the second off Shao-Ching Chiang for his sixth of the season, walked in the fourth, singled in the sixth and doubled in the eighth off Ben Taylor. He has doubled in each of his last three games and has 20 this year, tied for second most in the International League. He had 25 doubles in 144 games between Double-A Altoona, Indy and Pittsburgh last year. His career high for two-baggers is 36 across 106 games with High-A Bradenton in 2015.

SURVIVE AND ADVANCE: The 2018 College World Series got underway yesterday with North Carolina defeating Oregon State, 8-6, in a 4-hour, 24-minute, nine-inning marathon. Mississippi State then walked off for a seventh time this season in the nightcap, 1-0 over Washington. The Tar Heels and Bulldogs advancement leaves two 2018 Indians very happy -- catcher Jacob Stallings, currently with the Pirates -- played at UNC and played in the CWS in both 2009 and 2011, and Adam Frazier reached the CWS finals with Mississippi State in 2013. Tribe infielder Erich Weiss' alma mater -- the Texas Longhorns -- plays this afternoon at 2 p.m. ET against Arkansas in round one. Weiss played in the 2011 CWS, but his Texas team went 0-2, getting knocked out by Stallings' Tar Heels. 3-0.

**BRUBAKER'S HOMECOMING:** J.T. Brubaker, a Tecumseh High School product out of New Carlisle, Ohio, gets the start for Indy this afternoon in his home state. He stayed home for college as well, attending the University of Akron, where he went 5-4 with a 3.63 ERA (36 ER/89.1 IP) in 15 starts as a junior in 2015 before the Pirates took him in the sixth round of the draft. He led the Zips in strikeouts that year with 72. New Carlisle is just 60 minutes west of Columbus.

11 NO MORE: Christopher Bostick had his season-high 11-game hitting streak snapped with an 0-for-4 performance last night. During the streak, Bostick had collected exactly one hit in eight of the 11 contests. The Tribe outfielder hit .356 (16-for-45) with two home runs, two doubles, five RBI and six runs scored during the stretch, as well. Despite his 0-fer showing at the plate last night, he has hit safely in 47 of his 57 starts this season and is currently tied for second in the league in batting with a .314 average (71-for-226). He also ranks among IL leaders in hits (4th, 71), triples (T-5th, 3) and doubles (T-5th, 19).

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** The Tribe offense has mashed against Clippers pitching, batting .332 (132-for-397) with 40 doubles, two triples, nine home runs and 66 runs scored (6.0 runs per game). The Indians are averaging 4.6 extra-base hits per game against Columbus. Despite the offensive success, the Tribe are just 5-6 against Columbus this year, including a 1-4 mark at Huntington Park. The Indians went 7-6 there last year, marking just the third season since 2006 where Indy won more games than lost on Columbus' home field (also: 2013 and 2014, 8-3 record both years).

.300 OR HIGHER: The Indians' .332 average as a team against Columbus is their best against any single IL opponent so far this season. They are also batting above .300 as a team against Durham (.321, 35-for-109, 3 games) and Rochester (.303, 33-for-109, 3 games). Five current Tribesmen are batting above that .332 mark against Columbus this year, with Max Moroff leading the way (.538, 7-for-13). Ryan Lavarnway (.529, 9-for-17), Wyatt Mathisen (.500, 1-for-2), Kevin Newman (.404, 21-for-52) and Jose Osuna (.346, 9-for-26) have also fared quite well against Clippers pitching.

AMONG THE BEST: Indy's offense is in the top three of nine categories in the International League. They rank first in average (.275), hits (607), doubles (166), OBP (.338), and slugging (.426), second in stolen bases (52), total bases (939) and sacrifice bunts (19) and third in runs scored (295).

**HOLMES ON TRACK**: Clay Holmes continued his recent trend of success with another five innings of one-run ball Wednesday afternoon. His outing was cut short due to a 55-minute rain delay, but he still earned the win thanks to Indy's bullpen consistency. Over his last three starts he has three wins, a 0.50 ERA (1 ER/18.0 IP) and 20 strikeouts.

**Today's Starter:** Right-hander J.T Brubaker will take the hill this afternoon in the series finale at Huntington Park in Columbus. The 6-foot-4 Springfield, Ohio native was selected by Pittsburgh in the sixth round (187th overall) of the 2015 MLB June Amateur Draft out of the University of Akron. He opened the 2018 season with Double-A Altoona, where he went 2-2 with a 1.80 ERA (7 ER/35.0 IP) and 35 strikeouts against just eight walks.

Last Outing: Brubaker gave up two earned runs on six hits and two walks with five punchouts across 5.1 innings last Tuesday against Toledo. He threw 100 pitches, his second-highest total of 2018 (102 on 4/30 with Altoona @ Richmond). The Indians went on to win the game 5-2, giving Brubaker his second straight victory.

Solid on the Road: Brubaker has made six combined starts on the road this year between Altoona and Indy, going 3-1 with a 2.02 ERA (8 ER/35.2 IP).

**Against the Clippers:** Brubaker has never faced Columbus.

Miscellaneous: Brubaker was named the New York-Penn League Pitcher of the Week on July 27, 2015, the lone accolade of his professional career. He attended the University of Akron, where he went 5-4 with a 3.63 ERA (36 ER/89.1 IP) in 15 games (15 starts) as a junior in 2015; led the Zips in strikeouts (72) and starts while finishing second in wins and innings pitched that year. He became the third Akron player to be drafted in the last four years in 2015. Brubaker led the Zips in strikeouts (39) as a freshman in 2013. He was a 2012 graduate of Tecumseh (New Carlisle, Ohio) High School, where he was a two-year letterwinner in baseball; also played basketball up through his sophomore year.




