ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Indians recent late-inning drama continued with three runs in the ninth last night, giving them a 5-4 comeback win over division-leading Toledo. Junichi Tazawa walked three in the frame to set up a two-run single by Jordan Luplow. The throw home skipped away from Jarrod Saltalamacchia, prompting Luplow to take second base. The throw there led to Christopher Bostick racing home and the tag was late, giving Indy its first lead of the night. Tanner Anderson worked around a hit batter and single in the ninth with a 6-4-3 double play and deep flyout to right-center to nail down his first save. Nick Kingham gave up a pair of solo homers over 5.2 innings, allowing just three hits and two walks with nine punchouts. Enny Romero delivered his third scoreless inning in as many outings for the Tribe to earn the win. Kevin Kramer tripled and scored on a Wyatt Mathisen single in the fourth. Two innings later, he doubled to set up a run-scoring single off the bat of Max Moroff. Dovydas Neverauskas had a wild appearance, walking a career-high tying five batters and yielding two runs in one inning of work

FRAZIER RETURNS: Utilityman Adam Frazier returns to the Tribe today after being optioned by Pittsburgh on June 23. The 26-year-old was recalled by the Pirates on June 20 and appeared in two games, going 1-for-4 with a walk. In 58 games overall with the big-league club, he's hit .239 (33-for-138) with three homers, two triples, three doubles and eight RBI. He batted .276 (112-for-406) in 121 games with the Buccos in 2017, logging 32 extra-base hits (6 HR, 6 3B, 20 2B), 53 RBI and nine stolen bases. With Indy this year in eight games, he's posted a .200 average (6-for-30) with three doubles, two RBI and one stolen base.

PROTOTYPE LEADOFF MAN: When batting leadoff and in his first at-bat of the game, Kevin Newman is batting .367 (22-for-60) with one home run, seven doubles and four walks this season for the Tribe. He has hit safely in 12 straight games thanks to another base hit last night, his fifth straight game with exactly one knock and ninth in his last 10 overall. His career-high hitting streak is 16, set from June 21-July 9, 2016 with Double-A Altoona. During his current stretch, he's hit .356 (17-for-50) to raise his average from .297 to .305, tied for the sixth-best mark in the IL. He is first in the IL with 43 runs scored and 18 stolen bases and second in hits (82). He has been a better hitter when behind in the count this season, owning a .340 average (34-for-100) in those situations, compared to a .254 clip (17-for-67) when ahead in the count. He has struck out in just 10.5 percent of his plate appearances this season (31 K/294 PA), the second-lowest percentage in the IL.

EXTRA EFFORT: Kevin Kramer tripled and doubled in last night's game, giving him 32 extra-base hits for the season, third most in the International League. He has 11 home runs, three triples and 18 doubles through 69 games. After batting just .238 (25-for-105) with 10 XBH (4 HR, 1 3B, 5 2B) in 28 May games, Kramer has heated up with a .321 average (26-for-81) and 17 XBH (6 HR, 2 3B, 9 2B) in 22 June contests. He is the only player in Minor League Baseball with 17 XBH since the calendar flipped to June. Minnesota's Eduardo Escobar (20) and Arizona's Paul Goldschmidt (17) are the lone big leaguers with that many XBH in June.

JUST SAYIN': On too of his .321 average and 17 XBH this month. Kramer leads all International League qualifiers in June with 57 total bases, a .704 slugging percentage and 1.067 OPS. He is second in home runs (6) and tied for second in RBI (19) this month, as well. He has hit safely in 15 of his 22 games this month, with a team-high 10 multi-hit performances during that span (Jordan Luplow is second with six multi-hit games in June).

IMPACT BAT: Jordan Luplow has hit safely in 17 of his last 20 overall. He is batting .429 (15-for-35) with one homer, five doubles, five RBI, six runs scored and eight walks against just five strikeouts over his last 11 games. His bases-loaded single in the ninth made him 2-for-6 in those situations this season.

RYAN ROLLING: Indy catcher Ryan Lavarnway is riding a season-high 12-game hitting streak into today's game. He is batting .364 (16-for-44) during his streak with all four of his home runs coming since June 3. He has reached base safely in 17 straight and 23 of his last 24 games overall dating back to May 2.

ROAD WARRIORS: Five IL teams currently own road records at or above .500. Indy has the fifth-best road mark at 18-17. the Indians have finished at or above .500 on the road Rochester (22-15), Toledo (22-16), Durham (20-15) and Lehigh Valley (20-17) are all above .500 on the road. All four playoff spots -- as of today - are occupied by Lehigh Valley (IL North leaders), Durham (IL South leaders), Toledo (IL West leaders) and Indianapolis (IL Wild Card leaders).

AMONG THE BEST: Indy's offense is in the top three of eight categories in the International League. They rank first in average (.275), hits (677), doubles (188), OBP (.339) and slugging (.425) and second in stolen bases (62), total bases (1045) and sacrifice bunts (23). Indy is on pace for 356 doubles as a team; the Victory Field era record for most doubles by a Tribe team is 299, set in both 1998 and 2000.

GREAT JUNE: The Indians' win last night made them 16-7 in June with five games remaining this month. Since 2010 (nine seasons), the Indians will have -- at the minimum -- finished at least four games over .500 in eight of the seasons. The June record breakdown since 2010 is below:

NEVER SAY NEVER: Dovydas Neverauskas walked five batters between the sixth and seventh last night, one being an intentional free pass. It marked his highest total as a reliever and tied a career high, the fifth time he's walked five in a game in his career and first since Aug. 27, 2014 with Low-A West Virginia at Lexington.

Last night's win marked Indy's third of the season when trailing a ballgame entering the ninth inning. The Indians' most recent win when trailing going into the ninth was on Saturday at The Vic against Durham when the Tribe used one in the ninth and one in the 10th to prevail, 7-6. Indy went just 1-49 in those situations in 2017 and 2-55 in 2016, making them a combined 3-104 over the last two seasons when facing a deficit headed to the ninth.

Today's Starter: Right-hander Tyler Eppler gets the nod on the road against rival Toledo. The 6-foot-6, 220-pound Texas native was selected by Pittsburgh in the sixth round (191st overall) in the 2014 MLB June Amateur Draft out of Sam Houston State University, where he was a teammate with former Pirates minor league pitcher Cody Dickson in 2013. On the heels of a 2016 Eastern League midseason All-Star selection with Double-A Altoona, Eppler posted an 8-9 record and 4.89 ERA (74 ER/136.1 IP) for the Tribe last year. His 23 home runs surrendered in 2017 matched a Victory Field era record (1996-present) for home runs allowed in a single season by an individual pitcher.

HT/WT: 6'6" / 220

Last Outing: Eppler benefitted from a storm-shortened game against Norfolk on June 21 to earn his team-high seventh win. He walked just one in 5.2 innings, but allowed a homer in his second consecutive start. The righty faced just two over the minimum in the game's first five innings, striking out three of the first six batters and not surrendering a hit until the fourth.

First Things First: Eppler owns a 6.23 ERA (9 ER/13.0 IP) in the first frame this season and a 2.80 ERA (19 ER/61.0 IP) in all other innings combined.

Against the Mud Hens: Eppler is 2-1 through seven starts against Toledo in his career and owns a 3.69 ERA (16 ER/39 IP) in those appearances. He has totaled 25 punchouts against the Mud Hens, five of which came on the road on April 30, his first game against them in 2018. In that game, Toledo scored four on Eppler through the first three innings, but failed to score again on the hurler over the next three. The Indians eventually won that contest, 10-7.

Home Sweet Home: Eppler is 5-0 with a 1.60 ERA (8 ER/45.0 IP) in eight games (seven starts) at home in 2018. Last year, he dominated the opposition at The Vic, as well, going 6-1 with a 2.70 ERA (22 ER/73.1 IP) in 14 games (11 starts). In 21 career games (17 starts) at Victory Field, he's 11-1 with a 2.28 ERA (30 ER/118.1 IP).

On the Road Again: Eppler's success at Victory Field hasn't carried over on the road in his Tribe career. Eppler is just 4-11 with a 7.04 ERA (72 ER/92.0 IP) in 20 games (16 starts) on the road in the International League.

Miscellaneous: Eppler's wife's name is Marissa; he proposed to her the day he was drafted by the Pirates. He was a second-team All-Southland Conference selection in 2014 at Sam Houston State University. He graduated from Navasota (Texas) High School in 2011, where he played baseball, golf and basketball.


