### IKIRF IIL?

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Jacob Stallings and Pablo Reyes combined for three two-out RBI singles, Mitch Keller struck out six over 6.0 innings of one-run ball and the Indians swept the IronPigs with a 3-1 victory on Thursday. The Tribe never trailed in the series and grabbed a 1-0 lead in the first inning of the finale, as Stallings' first run-scoring single to left brought home Jason Martin, who had singled and stolen second base to set up the RBI. Zach Green evened the score in the second with an RBI double off the wall in right-center, but Keller settled in and delivered his first quality start in a Tribe uniform (6.0ip, 4h, 1r/er, 1bb, 6k). Reyes put the Indians on top for good with a single in the sixth that scored Kevin Newman, and Newman again crossed home in the eighth on another clutch hit by Stallings. Alex McRae (0.2ip, 1h, 0r, 2bb, 2k) walked the tightrope in the ninth for his first career save.

THIS LITTLE PIGGY HAD NONE: The Indians earned their second-ever sweep over Lehigh Valley with last night's 3-1 triumph, sweeping away the IronPigs in dominant fashion by outscoring them 19-9 in the series. The sweep was Indy's fifth three-game sweep of 2018 (6/5-7 @ ROC, 6/19-21 vs. NOR, 6/25-27 @ TOL, 7/6-8 vs. COL, 8/7-9 vs. LHV). Lehigh Valley had only been swept once all season (5/15-17 @ SWB) prior to the series. In the head-to-head series dating back to 2008, Indy's only other sweep of the 'Pigs came in 2015 (3 games, 5/1-3 at Victory Field).

MATHIS-TEN: Wyatt Mathisen has hit safely in a season-high 10 consecutive games dating back to 7/29 vs. BUF. During his hitting streak, he's batted .343 (13-for-37) with two homers, two doubles, 12 RBI and six runs scored. He's also walked and struck out just three times apiece during the streak. The hot stretch has raised his average from .250 to .270, its highest point since it was at .271 on 7/15. His 3-hit performance Tuesday night matched a season high previously accomplished two other times (5/15 @ NOR, 5/28 @ CHA).

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES: Since 7/22 (19 games, 14-5 record), the Indians have had 14 games decided by two runs or less, going 10-4 in those contests. Indy was 19-22 in games decided by two or less prior to the recent stretch.

SUCCESS VS. PAWTUCKET: Since 2002 (16 seasons), the Indians are 9-4-3 in their season series against the PawSox. Indy needs to win just one game this weekend to guarantee a season-series split with the PawSox. The Tribe have not lost a series to Pawtucket at Victory Field since 2005, winning sets in 2006-07, 2010-12 and 2015 while earning splits at The Vic from 2008-09, 2013-14 and 2016-17.

OFF AND RUNNING: Newman has a league-best 27 stolen bases in 36 attempts. He ranks fourth among Pirates organizational leaders in stolen bases behind Jared Oliva (29), Alfredo Reyes (28) and Cole Tucker (28). He has more than doubled his previous career high for stolen bases in a season (2015, 13 SB in 15 attempts). The Indians have had a player lead the International League in stolen bases just twice in team history. Don Buford swiped a league-leading 42 bases on Indy's 1963 Governors' Cup Championship team, and Alen Hanson tied for the IL lead in SB with 35 in 2015, matching Pawtucket's Quintin Berry.

RYAN ROLLING: Ryan Lavarnway celebrated his 31st birthday on Tuesday and gave himself a belated gift with a 3-for-4 performance Wednesday night, including his ninth homer of the season. Six of his nine long balls have come at Victory Field, five of which have gone out to right and right-center field. He's batting .341 in 25 home games compared to a .275 mark in 33 road contests. Lavarrnway's .302 average for the season is the highest it's been since he had it at .303 on 6/20. He has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games, batting .426 (23-for-54) with four homers, five doubles, eight RBI and eight runs scored during that stretch, which dates back to 7/21.

DOUBLE PLAY COMBO LOVES DOUBLES: Kevin Newman has racked up a team- and career-high 30 doubles this season, the second-highest mark in the IL behind Columbus' Brandon Barnes (33). His previous career high for doubles in a season was 29 between Double-A Altoona (18) and Indianapolis (11) in 2017. His double play partner, Kevin Kramer, recorded his 27th double of the season Tuesday night, bringing him within two of his career high of 29 set in 2016 with High-A Bradenton. His 27 doubles this year are tied for third in the IL.

LIRANZO LIGHTS OUT: Jesus Liranzo has pitched multiple innings in four of his last six appearances out of the 'pen, including 2.0 shutout frames and three strikeouts Wednesday night. He has a 0.87 ERA (1 ER/10.1 IP) and 10 strikeouts over his last six outings. Liranzo has struck out at least one batter in 21 of his 25 appearances for the Tribe and owns a 1.80 ERA (3 ER/15.0 IP) and .100 batting average against (5-for-50) in 11 appearances at Victory Field.

BIG TEX: Tyler Eppler picked up win No. 12 Tuesday night and is slated to start the homestand finale on Sunday. His most recent outing ended with four runs being charged to him in the seventh, but he mastered the IronPigs through the first six frames, surrendering just two hits while striking out five. Eppler ranks among IL leaders in wins (1st) and innings pitched (4th, 125.0) and is just outside the top 10 in ERA (3.67). He is the first Tribe pitcher with a dozen wins in a season since Rick van den Hurk tallied 13 victories in 2012.

DIGGING FOR SECOND: The Indians have racked up 268 doubles through 116 games this season (2.3 doubles per game), the most two-baggers in all of professional baseball. The Tribe are on pace for 323 doubles and have eight players with 17-plus doubles so far this year. The Boston Red Sox have the second-most doubles in pro ball with 257 in 116 contests.

OFFENSIVE JUGGERNAUT: Indy's offense ranks in the top three of 13 categories in the International League. They are first in average (.275), hits (1,058), doubles (268), RBI (501), total bases (1,635), sac bunts (40), OBP (.337), SLG (.425) and OPS (.762). The Indians are second in runs (529), fewest strikeouts (859) and stolen bases (97) and third in triples (27).

**Tonight's Starter:** Left-hander Brandon Waddell will take the mound tonight for Indy in the series opener against Pawtucket. The 24-year-old began his 2018 campaign with Double-A Altoona, where he went 2-1 with a 2.68 ERA (16 ER/53.2 IP) in nine games (eight starts). He entered the season ranked as Pittsburgh's No. 19 prospect by *Baseball America*, who also tabbed him as having the "Best Changeup" among Pirates farmhands prior to both the 2017 and 2018 seasons.

Last Outing: Waddell couldn't get through 5.0 innings to qualify for the win last Friday at Toledo. Instead he settled for a no-decision as Indy held off the Mud Hens in a slugfest, 12-7. He allowed six runs -- five earned -- on six hits and three walks in 4.1 innings pitched, fanning two along the way. His last win was nearly a month ago -- July 13 vs. Toledo at The Vic.

**Against the PawSox:** Waddell took the loss in his only career start against Pawtucket on June 10 at McCoy Stadium. The PawSox scored five runs off Indy's southpaw, totaling five hits and three walks. The 11-1 loss snapped a seven-game winning streak for the Tribe, their longest of 2018.

**Miscellaneous:** Waddell pitched three years at the University of Virginia (2013-15) and won a NCAA National Championship with the Cavaliers his junior season. At UVA, he holds the program records in career starts with 53; the Cavaliers went 39-14 in those starts. He made five College World Series starts in his career, and UVA went 5-0 in those games. He attended Clear Lake High School in Houston, Texas. During his pro career, he was an MiLB.com Organization All-Star in 2016 and has won three Pitcher of the Week Awards, two in 2016 (Florida State League, 5/2/16; Eastern League, 6/27/16) and one this season (International League, 7/16/18).
