THE LAST TIME OUT: Portland evened the series with a 6-1 win over the Curve on Wednesday. Starters **Sean Brady** and **Tanner Houck** were locked in an early pitchers duel as Brady faced the minimum over the first five frames and let up two scores through seven while Houck also pitched into the seventh with one run allowed. A three-run eighth for Portland pushed their lead to 5-1. Altoona loaded the bases in the seventh and eighth innings but were limited to the one score, a sacrifice fly by **Jason Delay**.

TODAY'S GAME: The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve play the rubber match of a three-game set and the season finale against the Portland Sea Dogs, Double-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. Portland won 3 of 4 games at Hadlock Field over Memorial Day weekend on May 24-27 and claimed the season series with the win on Wednesday. This is the lone visit to Altoona for the Sea Dogs this season. Altoona stands 4-12 against Eastern Division opponents in 2019. Today's contest will be Altoona's last game with the designated hitter for the remainder of June before all but four games in July will feature an additional batter.

THE CURVE: The Curve are an Eastern League-best 8-3 in June. Coming off back-to-back series wins for the first time this season (three-game sweep at Erie and 3 of 4 vs. Akron), Altoona looks to win three series in a row for the first since rolling to five consecutive series wins last August 14-26. Despite a .227 (77/339) team average this month, Altoona has hammered nine homers in June after hitting a league-low 30 home runs through the first two months of the season. Curve pitchers entered play May 16 with a 4.22 ERA, which ranked last in the league, before a 3.28 ERA (75 ER/205.2 IP) over the last 24 games brought it down to 3.87. In June, Altoona pitchers have the fourth-lowest ERA (2.94) in the league after carrying the highest in the E.L. in May (5.00).

THE SEA DOGS: The Sea Dogs are on a three-city, nine-game road trip that will go from Altoona to Akron before making their final stop in Erie. Portland is 9-8 over their last 17 games after they entered play against the Curve on May 24 a season-low 13-31, 18 games below .500. On their most recent homestand, Portland went 2-4 and lost the rubber match in extra innings to both Richmond and Bowie. The Sea Dogs are batting the league average of .237 while ranking 10th in the league with 3.7 runs per game and .233 average with runners in scoring position. Portland's pitching staff owns the highest ERA on the Eastern League circuit at 4.03 aided by the most walks allowed in the league.

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander **James Marvel** makes his team-high 13th start of the season. Marvel tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four runs, three earned, with seven strikeouts during his last outing in Erie before the Curve rallied late for a 9-8 victory over the SeaWolves on Monday. Marvel was the Curve's Opening Day starter and started the year 3-2 with a 1.98 ERA over his first six starts before he was tagged with 14 runs in 10 innings over his next two outings. In his four most recent outings since May 18, Marvel is 2-1 with a 2.55 ERA (7/24.2 IP) and 23 strikeouts. A native of the Bay Area, Marvel was drafted by the Pirates in the 36th round in 2015 after injury limited the righty to just 13 collegiate outings at Duke University. *For more on Marvel, see page two.*

FOR PORTLAND: Left-hander **Matthew Kent** takes the hill for his 13 appearance of the season and eighth with the Sea Dogs, including his fourth start. His latest appearance on June 8 was for Triple-A Pawtucket and he allowed six runs over six innings in a loss to Rochester (Twins). Kent started the year with Portland and went 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA before moving up for an 0-4 record and 10.50 ERA with the Paw Sox. Kent was an Eastern League All-Star with the Sea Dogs in 2018 and went 11-8 with a 3.58 ERA in 27 games, 23 starts. His 11 wins were third-most in the league while he ranked sixth in ERA and strikeouts (123) in the second-most innings (143.1) a year ago. Kent was a 13th round pick by the Red Sox in 2015 out of Texas A&M.

HOME COOKIN': Altoona is 10-6 and have won 3 of their last 4 series at PNG Field since May 10 when the club entered play with a 5-10 home record. The Curve's home record has been over .500 for one day this season, which followed a walk-off victory in their home opener on April 11 before losing the last five games of the team's first homestand of 2019.

MAKING THE PLAYS: The Curve defense shares the highest fielding percentage (.984) in Minor League Baseball with Triple-A Iowa (Cubs) while the Pirates' Triple-A club, Indianapolis, ranks third with a .983 mark in the field. Altoona defenders have put away outs while their pitchers have put a high rate of balls in play with the fewest strikeouts (425) in the Minors and the fifth-fewest walks (174) in Double-A. The Curve have set the franchise record for highest team fielding percentage in each of the last three seasons, which was .980 in 2016 and 2017 before the 2018 club held a .985 mark.

BOUNTY HUNTER: Third baseman **Hunter Owen** ran into his fourth homer in 11 games with his league-high 14th of the season on Tuesday. Owen's 45 homers since 2017 are the most by any Pirates minor leaguer. The Evansville, Ind. native is on a record-setting, 32 home run pace, which would break Adam Hyzdu's franchise record of 31. Pittsburgh's 25th round pick in 2016 is also on pace rank in the top five in club history in RBIs (95), runs (90) and extra-base hits (65). Owen has been hit by a league-high 11 pitches, which is on pace to surpass Chris Duffy's team record of 20 during the 2003 season. Owen also leads the Eastern League in runs scored (40) and is third with a .296 average while he ranks second in RBIs (42), extra-base hits (29), and slugging percentage (.573). He has hit safely in 23 of his last 31 games since May 7 while batting .303 (33/109) with seven homers and 16 RBIs. *For more on single-season club records, see page 100 of the Curve Media Guide.*

OLIVA COMING ALIVE: **Jared Oliva** is riding a season-best, nine-game on-base streak in which he has also hit safely in 7 of 9 with a .265 (9/34) average. During his last nine contests, Oliva has homered in back-to-back games on June 4-5 at Erie to double his total for the season and has been hit by two pitches to raise his tally to seven on the year, fourth-most in the league. The Pirates' seventh round choice in 2017 out of Arizona was hitting a season-low .193 before he started his recent run. A native of Southern California, Oliva was a 2018 MiLB.com Pirates Organization All-Star after he hit .275 with A-Adv. Bradenton with 33 stolen bases.

SUMMER CATCH: Altoona's catching tandem **Jason Delay** and **Arden Pabst** have the most extra-base hits by any team in the league at the position (23) and are hitting a combined .259, which ranks as the second-best unit in the league. Pabst, drafted out of Georgia Tech, has 10 RBIs in his last 12 games with six extra-base hits, including two homers, while batting .326 (14/43). Delay, who played collegiately at Vanderbilt, is hitting .297 (22/74) with five homers, six doubles, one triple and 18 RBIs over his last 20 games.

DOING THE SPLITS: Harrisburg became the first team to punch their ticket to the Eastern League Playoffs as First-Half Western Division Champions. The playoff berth for the Senators is their first since 2013, tied with Erie for the longest playoff drought in the Western Division. The Curve have six games remaining in the first half before the standings reset on June 19. Altoona joined the Eastern League in 1999 and is experiencing a split season for the first time in franchise history, which was last played in the E.L. in 1982 at the end of a five-year run from 1978-82. The league also implemented a split-season format during the 1934-35, 1958 and 1975 seasons.

YINZERS N'AT: The Curve will become the Allegheny Yinzers for the third time and are 0-2 in the Black and Yellow. Part of a seven-game rebranding series, the term "yinzers" is a unifying, self-identification for the blue-collar people of Western and Central Pennsylvania. The term comes from the second-person pronoun "yinz", commonly used in Pittsburgh's regional dialect.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve active roster features one of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects in outfielder **Jared Oliva** (No. 19). Oliva is ranked by *B.A.* as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system. MLB.com ranks Oliva as the No. 9 overall prospect in the Pirates organization and RHP **Blake Cederlind** is rated No. 30.

He is in his seventh season as a manager in the Pirates organization, leading the Bradenton Marauders from 2015-16 and the West Virginia Power from 2014-15. He steered Bradenton to a 70-66 record in 2016 and won the Florida State League championship. Ryan played 15 professional seasons, including five in the majors, after he was a fifth-round draft choice by the Minnesota Twins in 1996.
