THE LAST TIME OUT: A wild back-and-forth in the late inning saw Binghamton deliver the last big blow with a two-run ninth to beat the Curve, 7-5. Quinn Brodey connected on a go-ahead, RBI double off **Angel German** followed by a solo homer by Will Toffey to pad the late lead. Altoona built a 4-1 lead with a four-run fifth, highlighted by RBI hits from **Mitchell Tolman**, **Jared Oliva** and **Robbie Glendinning**. Binghamton charged back with two-run homers by Patrick Mazeika and Barrett Barnes to take a 5-4 lead. **Alfredo Reyes** and **Brett Pope** hit back-to-back doubles in the home half of the eighth to tie the game, 5-5.

TODAY'S GAME: The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve play the third and fourth games of five-game series against the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, Double-A affiliate of the New York Mets. Today's double-header will make up a rain out on Father's Day at NYSEG Stadium and is the fifth twin bill of the season for Altoona. All four double-headers for the Curve have been one-sided with Altoona sweeping two and being swept two other times. The current series will complete the 10-game season series against Binghamton and is the only visit to Altoona for the Rumble Ponies. Binghamton took 2 of 3 in mid-May at NYSEG Stadium before the Curve returned to sweep the abbreviated, two-game set two weeks ago. The Curve are playing the 14th and 15th of 16 straight National League-style games through the end of June before the designated hitter returns for all but four games in July.

THE CURVE: The Curve are 17-8 in June, trailing only Bowie (19-6) for the best record in the Eastern League this month, and have won 6 of their last 7 series. The club is poised to have one of the winningest months in team history, which has been done with 20 wins on three occasions: August 2018, August 2010 and June 2004. The Curve have won at least 18 games in a month 15 times in team history and reached 19 wins in a month on seven occasions. The last time the Curve won at least 17 games in June was 2010. Altoona is third in the league in hitting (.253) this month and have gone deep 18 times after a league-low 30 home runs in April and May. Altoona has the best intra-division record (31-21) in their half of the league but are 9-15 against the Eastern Division. The Curve have reached the E.L. Playoffs in each of the last four seasons, the longest active streak in the league and tied for the longest run in franchise history (2003-06).

THE RUMBLE PONIES: Binghamton, a league-worst 8-17 in June, is in the midst of playing or completing nine games in six days. They finished a suspended game against Erie on Monday before playing a double-header on Wednesday. The Rumble Ponies have lost 7 of 9, including a three-game sweep to Richmond and losing 3 of 4 to Erie on their latest homestand. Binghamton is the best road team in the league with a 27-13 mark away from NYSEG Stadium. The Rumble Ponies lead the Eastern League with 4.3 runs per game and rank second in total team batting average (.245) and second with runners in scoring position (.262) but have hit the fewest homers (44) on the circuit. The pitching staff ranks 11th with a 3.86 ERA.

FOR ALTOONA: Left-handed pitcher **Brandon Waddell** will make his third start of the season with the Curve after be made 21 relief outings with Triple-A Indianapolis to start the year. Waddell struck out four and allowed two runs over four innings of a no-decision in his last outing in Richmond. A native of Houston, Waddell has spent the majority of his pro career with Double-A Altoona by pitching 245.2 innings of 418.2 career frames in a Curve uniform. He reached Double-A in his first full season in 2016 and went 12-13 with a 3.64 ERA over 46 outings before his first Triple-A promotion at the end of May 2018. He was originally drafted by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2015 draft out of the University of Virginia and pitched the clinching game for the Cavaliers in the 2015 College World Series...**For more on Waddell, see page two.**

Left-handed pitcher **Sean Brady** will make his 10th start for the Curve and 15th outing overall in 2019 during game two. He picked up the win in his last start at Hartford, allowing only a solo homer last Sunday at Hartford over seven innings. Today marks his 40th Double-A start, owning a 10-14 record and a 4.72 ERA. He spent the first six years of his professional career in the Indians organization and was released by Cleveland on May 1 and signed with the Pirates on May 6. He was originally drafted by the Indians in the fifth round of the 2013 draft out of high school...**For more on Brady, see page three.**

FOR BINGHAMTON: Knuckleballer Mickey Jannis takes the hill for his 10th appearance overall and ninth with Binghamton. He started the season on the injured list before he allowed just one run over his first 15 innings this season. He appeared in one game for Triple-A Syracuse and surrendered 14 runs over 3.1 innings and returned to Binghamton. He last worked 10 days ago in New Hampshire and allowed one run in 5.1 innings. Originally a 44th-round pick by the Rays from Cal State Bakersfield in 2010, the 31-year-old from Carson City, Nev. spent parts of four years playing independent baseball before signing with the Mets in July 2015. He makes his 80th start for Binghamton and is 24-27 with a 4.13 lifetime ERA in the Eastern League.

Right-hander Joe Zanghi takes the hill for his second career start and 18th outing overall with Binghamton. He also made five outings in relief for Triple-A Syracuse this year. In his last appearance, he pitched four scoreless innings against Erie during the first start of his professional career. He was signed by the Mets as an undrafted free agent in 2016 and is in his second Double-A season.

NO OFFENSE: The Eastern League batting average stands at .237 while teams are scoring 3.96 runs per game. The last time the league average finished under .250 and 4.0 runs per game was in 1989 (.249/3.95). The last time the E.L. saw offenses hit below .240 and score fewer than 4.0 runs per game was in 1971 (.234/3.57).

GLOVE TRAIN: The Curve defense has the highest fielding percentage (.985) and have committed the fewest errors (42) in Minor League Baseball while turning the third-most double plays (73) among Double-A clubs. Curve defenders have made plays on a high rate of balls in play while pitchers have the fewest strikeouts (537) in the Minors and the fifth-fewest walks (209) in Double-A. The Curve have set the franchise record for highest team fielding percentage in each of the last three seasons, which was .980 in 2016 and 2017 before the 2018 club held a .985 mark.

BRAKE MEN: Curve pitchers entered play on May 16 with a 4.22 ERA, which ranked last in the league. The staff has lowered that mark to 3.68 over the last 38 games by holding 3.15 ERA (115 ER/328.2 IP), the third-best mark in the league over that period. In June, Altoona pitchers have the second-lowest ERA (2.89) in the league after carrying the highest in the E.L. during May (5.00). Additionally, the bullpen owns a 2.60 ERA (20 ER/69.1 IP) over the last 22 games that included an eight-game stretch of 22 consecutive scoreless innings from June 12-June 21.

G'DAYS FOR ROBBIE: Robbie Glendinning keeps hitting to lead the Pirates organization with a .342 average between Altoona and A-Adv. Bradenton while pacing the system with 78 total hits. He also owns career-best totals with 11 homers, 20 doubles and 43 RBIs. A 2019 Florida State League All-Star, the Western Australian native is hitting .370 (17/46) with six extra-base hits, 13 RBIs and six walks in his last 12 games since he rejoined the Curve on June 13. Glendinning was on the Curve's Opening Day roster and hit .300 (6/20) over nine games before he was sent to down on April 18. He responded with a FSL-best a .340 average, .599 slugging percentage and .992 OPS over 43 games with the Marauders.

OLIVA COMING ALIVE: Jared Oliva has been on base in 21 of his last 22 games while batting .305 (25/82) with seven multi-hit games, eight doubles, two homers, eight steals, 14 runs and 11 walks since June 3. The Pirates' seventh-round choice in 2017 out of Arizona was hitting a season-low .193 before he started his recent upswing to .234. In his last 12 games, he is hitting .356 (16/45) with seven doubles, six steals and six walks. Oliva's eight steals in June are second-most in the league while his 16 steals overall are third-most in the E.L. and ranks tied for second in the Pirates system. A native of Southern California, Oliva was a 2018 MiLB.com Pirates Organization All-Star after he hit .275 for A-Adv. Bradenton with 33 stolen bases.

BLIGH GUY: Bligh Madris has enjoyed a fruitful June with 21 hits over his last 23 games since June 2, batting .266 (21/79) with three homers, five doubles, one triple, 10 walks and 14 RBIs during seven multi-hit games. Madris hit .326 (29/89) over his first 21 games at Double-A through April 28 with seven doubles and nine RBIs before slumping to a .156 (14/90) pace with three doubles and five RBIs over his next 28 from April 29-June 1.

TOLMAN AT THE TOP: Since taking over the leadoff role on June 19, **Mitchell Tolman** has hit .345 (10/29) and been on base in 7 of 8 games with 10 runs scored. Tolman has led off in 16 games this season and owns a .295 (18/61) ledger from the top of the lineup. Since June 3, he has reached base in 19 of 22 and is batting .310 (26/84) with 14 runs, six steals and five extra-base hits.

PROSPECT WATCH: The Curve active roster features two of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects in outfielder **Jared Oliva** (No. 19) and right-handed pitcher **Cody Bolton** (No. 21). Oliva is ranked by *B.A.* as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system. MLB.com has three Top 30 Pirates prospects in Altoona with Oliva (No. 9), Bolton (No. 23) and right-handed reliever **Blake Cederlind** (No. 30).

Sean Michael Brady...Attended Ida S. Baker High School in Cape Coral, Fla...Drafted by the Cleveland Indians in the fifth round (141st overall) in the 2013 draft...Committed to play collegiately at the University of Florida before signing pro contract...Spent part of first seven seasons with the Indians organization, reaching Triple-A in 2018 and 2019...2014 New York-Penn League All-Star with short-season Mahoning Valley and finished seventh in the league with a 2.79 ERA...Pitched four-most innings in Midwest League during 2015 with Single-A Lake County...Won a career-best 12 games in 2016 with A-Adv. Lynchburg, which was tied for the most victories on the circuit...
