**THE LAST TIME OUT:** On Friday, the Curve recorded their eighth shutout win of the season, 3-0, behind six scoreless innings from starter **Brandon Waddell** and a nine-out save for **Beau Sulser**. Waddell surrendered two hits and fanned a season-best seven hitters over a season-high six innings on 81 pitches. Sulser worked around a bases-loaded, one-out spot in the seventh to keep the shutout bid alive. The Curve provided two runs in the fourth on a sacrifice fly by **Jerrick Suiter** and an RBI single by **Alfredo Reyes**. In the fifth, **Mitchell Tolman** and **Jared Oliva** combined for a pair of singles to post the third run of the night.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The 21st season of Altoona Curve Baseball continues as the Curve play the final game before the All-Star Break against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. The two clubs will convene on Thursday at UPMC Park to start a four-game series when play resumes. Erie returns for one more series on July 22-24 to conclude the 23-game season series, which now includes a double-header on July 23 to make up yesterday's rain out. The Curve swept the last series in Erie on June 3-5.

**NO STRANGER TO THE RAIN:** Saturday's postponement was the eighth rain out of the season for the Curve and the third at home. Six of those postponed games have already been made up in double-headers. Altoona also has endured nine rain delays and one suspended game.

**THE CURVE:** The Curve have won 6 of 7 and are a season-best eight games over .500 for the best full-season record in the division. Four of their recent wins resulted in late-inning rallies, including two walk-off wins and a pair of eighth-inning charges in Akron. Since June 1, the club is 23-10, the second-best record in the league behind Bowie (25-8) over that period, and have also won 9 of 10 series, including five straight at home. Altoona has the best intradivision record (35-22) among Western Division clubs and have reached the E.L. Playoffs in each of the last four seasons, the longest active streak in the league and tied for the longest run in franchise history (2003-06).

**THE SEAWOLVES:** The SeaWolves have won 13 of 17 to start the second half but have lost back-to-back games for the first time since the final two games of the first half. Owner's of the largest run differential in the league (+47), the SeaWolves lead the league in hitting at .248 and rank fifth with 4.1 runs per game. From a pitching perspective, Erie's starting rotation paces the circuit with a collective 3.11 ERA while the bullpen is ranked 10th with a 3.59 ERA to give the entire staff a 3.30 ERA, second-best in the E.L.

**FOR ALTOONA:** Left-hander **Domingo Robles** makes his seventh Double-A start and 18th overall. His last start lasted 2.1 innings, the second shortest of his pro career, when he required 31 pitches and allowed five runs to get one out in the third inning. Robles was the Opening Day starter for A-Adv. Bradenton this season and is ranked 11th in the Pirates minor league system with a 3.53 ERA between the two levels. Robles, a 21-year-old native of the Dominican Republic, was signed by Pittsburgh as an international free agent on July 2, 2014...*For more on Robles, see page two.*

**FOR ERIE:** Left-hander **Tarik Skubal** climbs the hill for his Double-A debut. In his second professional season, the 22-year-old went 4-5 with a 2.58 ERA, seventh-best in the Florida State League, in 15 starts for A-Adv. Lakeland where he was a FSL All-Star. His 97 strikeouts led the circuit while his 1.01 WHIP was second-best and .209 batting average against ranked fourth. He missed most of 2016 and all of 2017 due to Tommy John surgery while attending Seattle University. Skubal was drafted by Detroit in the ninth round during the 2018 draft out of Seattle and is rated by MLB.com as the Tigers' No. 17 prospect.

**TOUGH YEAR TO HIT:** The league-wide average stands at .238 with teams are scoring 3.97 runs per game. The last time the league average finished under .250 and 4.0 runs per game was in 1989 (.249/3.95) while 1971 (.234/3.57) was the last season offenses hit below .240 and scored fewer than 4.0 runs per game. The Curve are above the league average with 4.04 runs per game and rank second in hitting at .246. The lowest batting average in team history stands at .252 during the 2013 season. In their last 10 games since June 27, the Curve have scored 46 scored (4.6 per game), third-most in the E.L.

**BRAKE MEN:** Curve pitchers have been one of the best staffs in the league since May 16, pitching to a 3.12 ERA (138/398.2 IP) over the last 46 games, third-best in the E.L. The prolonged run has lowered the team ERA from a league-high 4.22 to 3.61. The bullpen owns a 2.18 ERA (23 ER/95.0 IP) over the last 30 games. Friday's shutout win over Erie was the club's third since June 3 while the team own's a 2.90 ERA (87 ERA/270.0 IP) since that date, the best mark in the league.

**G'DAYS FOR ROBBIE:** **Robbie Glendinning**, has racked up 18 RBIs in 20 games, fourth-most in the E.L. since June 14, while batting .329 (24/73) with nine extra-base hits. A 2019 Florida State League All-Star, the Western Australia native tops the Pirates minor league system with 85 hits and is tied for first with 23 doubles while his .333 average is second-highest (min. 200 plate appearances). He also ranks among the top performers in the Pirates system with 11 homers (6th) and 48 RBIs (5th), all career-highs. Glendinning was on the Curve's Opening Day roster and hit .300 (6/20) over nine games before he was sent to down on April 18 to lead the FSL with a .340 average, .599 slugging percentage and .992 OPS over 43 games for A-Adv. Bradenton.

**OLIVA COMING ALIVE:** **Jared Oliva** is leading the E.L. is hitting since June 14 with a .417 (30/72) average, 1.048 OPS and 13 steals in 19 games to go with nine doubles and 10 multi-hit games. He has reached base in 28 of his last 30 games since June 3 at a .358 (39/109) pace with 12 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three homers, 14 RBIs, 13 steals, 19 runs and 13 walks. He was hitting a season-low .193 before he started his uptick to .265. Oliva's 22 steals this year rank second in the E.L. and Pirates system. He was a 2018 MiLB.com Pirates Organization All-Star after he hit .275 for A-Adv. Bradenton with 33 stolen bases, third-most in the system.

**LOOKIN' SHARPE:** **Chris Sharpe's** 16 RBIs since his promotion to Double-A on June 21 are second-most in the E.L. He has collected 13 of those RBIs in the last seven games that included a walk-off single last Saturday, a go-ahead grand slam on Sunday, drove in three during a comeback win on Monday, sparked a four-run eighth on Wednesday with a solo homer, and a three-RBI night on July 4 that included a two-run homer. A 2019 Florida State League All-Star for A-Adv. Bradenton, Sharpe ranks fourth in the Pirates system with .277 overall batting average (min. 200 plate appearances), third with a .366 on-base percentage and third with 15 stolen bases.

**TOLMAN AT THE TOP:** Since taking over the leadoff role on June 19, **Mitchell Tolman** has reached base in 15 of 16 games, including 11 in a row, while hitting at a .323 (20/62) pace with 17 runs scored, tied for the most in the league since the start of the second half. Tolman has hit leadoff in 24 games this season and owns a .298 (28/94) ledger from the top of the lineup. Since June 3, he has reached base in 27 of 30 and is batting .308 (36/117) with 21 runs, eight steals and seven extra-base hits.

**BLIGH GUY:** **Bligh Madris** has reached base in eight straight games and owns a .357 average (10/28) with three extra-base hits and three multi-hit games since June 29. He has reached base in 26 of his last 31 since June 2, batting .290 (31/107) with four homers, seven doubles, one triple, 13 walks and 17 RBIs during 10 multi-hit performances. Madris hit .326 (29/89) over his first 21 games at Double-A through April 28 with seven doubles and nine RBIs before slumping to a .156 (14/90) pace with three doubles and five RBIs over his next 28 from April 29-June 1.

**RYAN'S REIGN:** Indiana, Pa. native **Michael Ryan** is nearing the 200-win milestone as Curve manager. Currently at 198 wins, he is has the third-most victories in club history behind Dale Sveum (2001-03) and Tim Leyer (2006-08) at 213. Ryan's .547 winning percentage is also the second-highest in franchise history behind Tony Beasley's .569 (2004-05). Over his seven-year managerial career, Ryan is a two-time league champion and is 478-433.

**PROSPECT WATCH:** The Curve active roster features two of *Baseball America's* Top 30 Pirates prospects in outfielder **Jared Oliva** (No. 19) and right-handed pitcher **Cody Bolton** (No. 21). Oliva is ranked by *B.A.* as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in Pittsburgh's system. MLB.com has three Top 30 Pirates prospects in Altoona with Oliva (No. 9), Bolton (No. 23) and right-handed reliever **Blake Cederlind** (No. 30).

**HANG A STAR ON THAT ONE:** The Curve are sending three players to the Eastern League All-Star Game with right-handed pitchers **Pedro Vasquez** and **Beau Sulser** joining catcher **Jason Delay**. Sulser was selected to join the Western Division roster after **James Marvel** was promoted to Triple-A on Monday. The 2019 Eastern League All-Star Game will be in Richmond on Wednesday, July 10.
