carer night when he clubbed two home runs，a three－run blast in the fourth and a two－run shot during the sixth to total five carer night when
RBIs for the night．

TODAY＇S GAME：The Curve open a four－game series in Maryland against the Bowie Baysox，Double－A affiliate of the Balti－ more Orioles．Altoona claimed the last series played between the two clubs at PNG Field last weekend．However，the Bay－ sox won each of the previous two sets in Altoona on May 6－8 and in Bowie on July 18－21．The next victory in the series for Bowie would clinch a share of the season series for the third straight season．The Baysox are the only team in the Western
Division with a winning record against the Curve under manager Michael Ryan（14－28）．Altoona is in the final two weeks of Division with a winning record against the Curve under man
the season with 12 games remaining over the next 12 days．

THE CURVE：The Curve have won 7 of 13，including five via the shutout，while winning back－to－back series for the first time since four straight series wins from June 24－July 7．Since the All－Star Break，the Curve are 16－26 and have been outscored
$188-155$ while batting .239 （ $320 / 1337$ ），the fourth－lowest average in the league over that stretch．Altoona has also won just two series since the break，including 2 of 3 over Bowie to start the homestand．The Curve went 25－10 from June 3－July 13， including wins in 7 of 8 entering the All－Star Break，to climb from a season－low five games under ． 500 （24－29）to a season－ best 10 games over（49－39）
four in a row since 2015 ．

THE BAYSOX：Bowie brought a $7-23$ record into their first meeting with the Curve on May 6 ，won 2 of 3 at PNG Field during that series and have rolled to a league－best 63－35 record since．The Baysox won 2 of 3 over Binghamton to start their last homestand of the season and are two games behind Erie for the Western Division＇s final playoff spot．The Baysox pitch－ ing staff leads the Eastern League with a 3.25 ERA and 16 shutouts while their starters rank second（3．39）and bullpen is third－best（3．02）．Offensively，Bowie leads the league with runners in scoring position（．264）with the second－best overall
average（．247）and score runs at the third－best rate in the league（ 4.22 per game）．Bowie＇s 89 homers are the sixth－most on the circuit．

FOR ALTOONA：Right－hander Pedro Vasquez will make his 22nd outing for the Curve and 24th overall between Double－A and Triple－A．In his latest outing，he threw eight scoreless innings against the Baysox for the longest start of his career shird Jning in third inning in the Eastern League All－Star Game in Richmond to aid a $5-0$ victory for the Western Divison over the Easter Domingo was originally signed by Seattle as an international free agent in 2015 and was acquired by the Pirates in a trade on September 1， 2016 as a player－to－be－named later for RHP Arquimedes Caminero．．．For more on Vasquez，see page two．
FOR BOWIE：Left－hander Zac Lowther makes his 24th start of the year and fourth against the Curve．Lowther，a 2019 Eastern League All－Star，took his second straight loss despite seven three－run frames in his last start at PNG Field last Saturday．In three starts against the Curve，Lowther is $1-2$ with a 3.60 ERA（ 8 ER／20 IP）．He pitched a scoreless fourth in－ Eastern Division．A native of Northeast Ohio，the lefty leads the E．L．in wins（12）while he ranks fourth in EAR（2．77），second in strikeouts（13i），third in batting average against（．197），sixth in WHIP（1．15）and has issued the second－most walks（60） over the fourth－most innings（ 130 ）among E．L pitchers．Lowther was the 74th overall selection by the Orioles in the second俍

RYAN＇S REIGN：Indiana，Pa．native Michael Ryan became the winningest manager in Curve history with his 214 th win on 365th game on July 12 in Erie．Over his seven－year managerial career，Ryan is a two－time league champion，which include the 2017 Eastern League Championship with the Curve，and has a career record of 496－459．
HEROES OF THE ZEROES：Monday＇s 3－0 win over Hartford was the 15th scoreless effort by the pitching staff in 2019 ， the second－highest total by a team in the Eastern League and one shy of a team record．The 2015 Curve pitching staff obliterated the previous r

BRAKE MEN：A number of relievers have been reliable options out of the Curve bullpen．Blake Cederlind has a 1.95 ERA （6 ER／27．2 IP）with 27 strikeouts in his last 21 games since June 14．Matt Eckelman is the ninth player in club history to record 20 saves in a single season while his 33 career saves with Altoona are second－most in franchise history．Eckelman has，allowed just five earned runs，seven total，with 30 strikeouts in 28 games since the start of June for a 1.50 ERA（ 5
$E R / 30$ IP）．During his last 25 games since May 19，Angel German has yanked his ERA down from 7.07 to 3.67 with 20 scor less outings，allowing just 18 hits，struck out 35 and has a 2.25 ERA（ 9 ER／36 IP）．In parts of two seasons with the Curve， Jesus Liranzo has allowed just one earned run and 17 hits over 36 innings．

YEAR OF THE PITCHER：Eastern League pitchers in 2019 have handcuffed hitters to a .239 league－wide batting average with teams scoring 3.96 runs per game．The last time the league average finished below ． 240 and fewer than 4.0 runs wer scored per game was in 1971 （．234／3．57）．The league average has finished under． 240 just five times since becoming a
Double－A league in $1963: 1971$（．234），1968（．219）， $1967(.228), 1966$（．234）and 1965 （．236）．The circuit has witnessed eight

CRUZ CONTROL：Oneil Cruz is hitting． $377(20 / 53)$ with 13 RBIs，six extra－base hits and six walks over his last 16 games since August 5 to raise his batting average from ： 136 to .307 ．The 6 －foot－ 6 shortstop was limited to 35 games for Adv． Bradenton due to a right foot fracture in late April but he still hammered seven homers for the Marauders．Since he was
activated from the injured list on June 30 until his promotion to Double－A，Cruz led the Florida State League with six hom ers over a 24 －game period along with a $330(31 / 94)$ average， 13 RBIs and 18 runs to earn FSL Player of the Month honors for July，Cruz is the 11 th 20 －year－old to play for the Curve and the first since Cole Tucker made his Double－A debut on July

J．O．ON A ROLL：Since June 3，Jared Oliva has resurected his batting average from a season－low ． 188 to ． 287 ，fourth in the E．L．，by reaching base in 61 of 71 games and hitting． 342 （ $90 / 263$ ）， 23 points higher than second－best，and has a． 401 seventh in on－base percentage（．357），fifth in hits（117），second in triples（6）and fifth in runs（66）．In the stolen base depart ment，Oliva ranks second in the E．L．and leads the Pirates system with 33 steals and is the ninth player in club history to surpass 30 stolen bases in a single season．Defensively，Oliva＇s 102 games in the outfield and 270 total chances are the most by any outfielder without an error in Minor League Baseball．
KING OF THE HILL：Logan Hill was named Eastern League Player of the Week for August 12－18 by leading the leauge with three homers，nine RBIs，a ． 958 slugging percentage and ． 438 OPS while hitting $.458(11 / 24)$ over six games．Since August 10 ，Hill has hit safely on 8 of 11 and is batting .326 （14／43）with four homers，four doubles and 14 RBIs．Hill is ranked fifth in the Eastern League with 62 RBIs，fourth with 40 extra－base hits and sixth with 26 doubles．
BLIGH GUY：Bligh Madris is ranked 10th in the Eastern League with a career－high 25 doubles and seventh with 112 hits， which also ranks fourth among Pirates minor leaguers．In 20 games since July 11 Madris is batting ． 317 （ 15 extra－base hits and 21 RBIs All eight doubles．Over his last 45 games since July 2，Madris is hitting 293 （ $43 / 147$ ）with 15 extra－base hits and 21 RBIs．All eight
of his home runs have occurred on the road while five of them have been go－ahead or game－tying blasts in Curve wins．

POPE＇S POKES：Brett Pope has gotten stronger at the plate as the season has progressed．Over his last 60 games since May 25，he has raised his batting average from ． 169 to .254 by batting $.297(49 / 165)$ with 10 doubles，one triple，one homer and 14 walks for a .357 on－base percentage．After Pope batted a season－best .291 through the month of June，he is hitting

PROSPECT WATCH：The Curve active roster features four of Baseball America＇s Mid－Season Top 30 Pirates prospects with infielder Oneil Cruz（No．3），right－handed pitcher Cody Bolton（No．5），right－handed reliever Blake Cederlind（No．24）and right－handed pitcher Cody Ponce（No．30）．After the latest MLB．com Mid－Season update，four Top 30 Pirates prospects are in Altoona with Cruz（No．3），Jared Oliva（No．11），Bolton（No．13）and right－handed reliever Cederlind（No．28）．Across all of baseball，Cruz is ranked by Baseball America as their No． 79 overall prospect while MLB．com ranks him at No． 62 ．
