Tonight's Game: The Charleston RiverDogs (affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays) continue a 12-game road trip by visiting the Kannapolis Cannon Ballers (affiliate of the Chicago White Sox) for the third game of six at Atrium Health Ballpark. This series represents the first and only meeting of the season between the two teams. **RiverDogs-Cannon Ballers Season Series in 2021:** Overall: RiverDogs 2, Cannon Ballers 0. **At Atrium Health Ballpark:** RiverDogs 2, Cannon Ballers 0.

Last Time Out: The RiverDogs put up a crooked number in the first inning and never looked back on the way to an 8-5 win over the Cannon Ballers on Wednesday night. The offense put up four runs in the opening frame with the help of an RBI double from Diego Infante, a two-run triple from Abiezel Ramirez and a double steal with men on the corners. That score stuck until the sixth inning when both teams traded home runs over the sixth and seventh innings. Johan Lopez and Brett Wisely blasted solo home runs for the RiverDogs while both Harvin Mendoza and Chase Krogman homered for the second straight night as Kannapolis pulled within 6-5. The RiverDogs scored a single run in each of the final two frames to reach the 8-5 final margin. Taj Bradley earned the win by allowing just one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings.

Playoff Plans: On Wednesday night, Minor League Baseball announced plans to hold a postseason for teams at the Low-A, High-A and Double-A levels. The top two teams in each league will meet in a best-of-five series between September 21-26. The RiverDogs are currently own the best record in the Low-A East and hold a 4.5 game cushion over third place Down East.

String of Success: As of May 30 this year, the last time the RiverDogs had won six consecutive games was in April of 2016. With a win tonight, the RiverDogs will stretch a winning streak to at least six games for the third time in the last month. This year's squad won seven straight games in June.

G'Days Mate: Australian Curtis Mead has been a problem for opposing pitching staffs all season. After a quiet opening week, the third baseman has registered a hit in 33 of the last 36 games he has played in. Since May 11, he has not gone hitless in consecutive games. Mead has 17 multi-hit games in the stretch. He leads the league in hits and doubles, second in extra-base hits and total bases, fifth in batting average and ninth in RBI.

Strikeout City: The RiverDogs pitching staff has thrived in striking out opposing hitters all season. Entering play tonight, the RiverDogs are third in the league in strikeouts, nine behind league leader Delmarva despite playing one fewer game than the Shorebirds and second place Columbia. They lead the league by averaging 11.0 strikeouts per game. Taj Bradley is third in the league with 55 strikeouts and Cole Wilcox is tied for fifth with 50.

That's Gross: Reliever Andrew Gross allowed three runs in his first appearance of the 2021 season back in May. In his 12 appearances since, he has not allowed another run. After tossing 3.0 perfect innings on Tuesday night, Gross has put together 27.0 consecutive scoreless innings, lowering his earned run average to 0.92. That scoreless innings streak is the longest active streak in MiLB and the second-longest of the season. Ken Waldichuk of Hudson Valley worked 30.2 innings without allowing a run earlier in the season.

Awards Season: The RiverDogs swept the weekly honors in the Low-A East last week with Curtis Mead being named Player of the Week for a second straight time and Andrew Gross earning recognition as the circuit's Pitcher of the Week. The pair have joined John Doxakis, now at High-A Bowling Green, as RiverDogs to be selected for weekly honors. Mead hit .450 with four doubles and seven RBI in the series against Augusta. Meanwhile, Gross tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one baserunner in two relief appearances.

Prized Pups: The RiverDogs roster contains seven members of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Rays prospects. The highest ranked of that group is starting pitcher Cole Wilcox who came in at #9. Outfielder/catcher Heriberto Hernandez is the most highly regarded position player at #13. The rest of the list is filled out by starting pitchers Seth Johnson (#15), Taj Bradley (#21) and Ian Seymour (#22), shortstops Osleivis Basabe (#24) and Alike Williams (#25) and outfielder Nick Schnell (#30).

RIVERDOGS FIELD STAFF

Manager: Blake Butera

Butera is in his first season as the manager of the RiverDogs after two seasons at the helm in Hudson Valley with the Rays former short-season affiliate. He led the Renegades to a postseason berth in both seasons, including a league-most 45 wins in 2018 and a share of the league's best record in 2019. Butera coached with the Leones del Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the cancellation of the 2020 minor league season. At the time he received the managerial job in Hudson Valley, Butera was the youngest manager (25) in all of Minor League Baseball. The native of Metairie, Louisiana was drafted by the Rays in the 35th round of the 2015 Amateur Draft out of Boston College and appeared in 80 minor league games over two seasons. At Boston College, he was voted team captain his senior year and finished his career as the Eagles' all-time leader in walks (112) and at-bats (774). His father, Barry, reached Triple-A with the Red Sox and his brother, Barry, spent two seasons in the Astros minor league system after being selected out of Boston College in the 2009 Amateur Draft.

Pitching Coach: R.C. Lichtenstein

Lichtenstein begins his first year as the pitching coach for the RiverDogs and his 17th year in the Rays organization. Lichtenstein has served as pitching coach at several stops in the Rays farm system including Southwest Michigan (2005-06), Vero Beach (2007-08), Bowling Green (2009-11) and Double-A Montgomery (2012-19). Throughout his career in baseball, the 52-year old has also coached in the Milwaukee Brewers organization and managed two independent squads.

Hitting Coach: Wuarnner Rincones

Rincones enters his first season with the RiverDogs after spending the 2019 season in the same role with the Princeton Rays. In total, he has spent six years as Princeton's hitting coach and four seasons with the GCL Rays. In his playing days, Rincones, spent two years (1994-95) in the farm system of the Chicago White Sox, compiling a .278 batting average over 129 career games.

Coach: Sean Smedley

Smedley enters his first season on the RiverDogs staff after serving as an assistant for the Short-Season Hudson Valley Renegades in 2017 and 2018. He received his first opportunity post-playing career with the Rays as the video coordinator of the Princeton Rays in 2016 before transitioning to the coaching staff in 2017. He was slated to be the manager at Princeton before the 2020 season was canceled. As a player, Smedley was signed by Tampa Bay as an undrafted free agent in 2013 out of Texas A&M International. He played parts of three seasons in the Rays minor league system, reaching Low-A Bowling Green in 2014-15.

Athletic Trainer: Tsutomu Kamiya

Kamiya enters his first season as the athletic trainer for the RiverDogs after holding the same role for two seasons with the short-season Hudson Valley Renegades. Kamiya was slated to rejoin Hudson Valley in 2020 before the season was canceled.

Strength Coach: James McCallie

McCallie enters his first season as the strength and conditioning coach for Charleston and his eighth with the Rays organization. He spent 2017-19 in the same role with the Low-A Bowling Green Hot Rods. McCallie has also served as strength and conditioning coach for the GCL Rays and Port Charlotte. He graduated from the University of Alabama at Birmingham with a B.S. in Exercise Science. He holds his CSCS and RSCC through the National Strength and Conditioning Association as well as his USAW Level 1 through USA Weightlifting.
