

### MIDSEASON SHOREBIRDS CATCH ON QUICKLY

It's the blessing and curse of watching players move on to their next step toward The Show. The Delmarva Shorebirds know a thing or two about that emotional rollercoaster.

Five different Opening Day Shorebirds – T.J. Nichting, Michael Baumann, Zach Muckenhirn, Travis Seabrooke, and Zac Lowther – have moved up the ladder to the High-A Frederick Keys this season. Stir in the unfortunate nature of injuries throughout the year and you have some key roster spots that are in need of filling. That's where the next wave of talent steps in to make their mark and attempt to fill the void left.

These players come into a situation the average Joe can relate to. The challenge of moving to a new city and trying to find your way in a new working environment can be a tough task, but for these players, familiarity is key, especially with a few familiar faces around.

Outfielder Jaylen Ferguson joined the team after being

called up from extended spring training in Sarasota, Fla. mid-May. Ferguson said that his transition to Delmarva was pretty seamless, considering some of the players in his old clubhouse made the jump to Delmarva not too long ago.

"Tve been playing with these guys basically last year, so there was nothing really new as far as getting adjusted to the guys," said Ferguson.

Pitcher Tim Naughton echoed Ferguson's comments and said familiarity with the current group allowed for no problems getting settled into the clubhouse mid-season.

"I played with a lot of the guys last season at Aberdeen so I had a chance to meet them before," said Naughton. "Obviously we are wearing a new jersey, but I met them all before so it was a lot of familiar faces."

Minor League Baseball is a grind of a season with 140 games from April until the first week of September, and that's just the regular season. In short-season Aberdeen, the season runs around 76 games from mid-June

to early September. The clubhouse may feature familiar elements, but the longer season in Low-A presents some newer elements that take some getting used to.

There's travel, which is synonymous with baseball in the minors and takes on new meaning when the next level jump has been accomplished. For the Shorebirds, the shortest bus ride is three hours to Hagerstown, and the longest takes upwards of 12 hours to Rome.

"In extended, the longest bus ride is an hour," Naughton said. "My second day here we had a 10-hour bus ride [to Hickory], but you won't hear me complain about travel. Just get some shuteye on the bus."

Another different experience is the stands being full of spectators, who provide the cheerful morale boost at home or supply the magical sound of heckling on the road. In extended



spring training, there are few crowds and little fanfare, allowing players to focus on refining their skills.

Pitcher Cameron Ming said the crowd factor played a more helpful role for him in his experiences between extended spring training and Delmarva.

"In extended there really aren't people watching, so it's hard to get that external adrenaline from any fans since there aren't any," said Ming. "When you join a full season team you kind of get the crowds that get you powered with adrenaline on the mound and makes you more focused."

On the individual level, not every player can say they have a call-up tale quite like Max Hogan. Hogan was promoted to the team in early May and not too long after had to take a little detour back to Sarasota to pick up a little something important: his car.

"We were actually in Columbia, and when team came back from Columbia to Salisbury I flew back to Sarasota and then drove my car back on the off day," said Hogan. "It was 17 hours back up to Salisbury, so that was an adventure."

Ultimately, having a skipper at the helm with a contagiously enjoyable personality helps players adjust. Shorebirds manager Buck Britton has earned that ringing endorsement from his players.

"Buck's been awesome," said Hogan. "He's a player's coach, and his resume speaks for itself. He's a great manager and an enjoyable guy to be around."



Scott currently works for Terminix, and is also pursuing a career in elementary school teaching. His son Aiden (pictured from a game earlier this season) is a baseball fanatic, and plays catcher and shortstop for the Lower Sussex Pat Knight Tournament Team. Aiden is a tough out on the bases, as he's been clocked at only 6.1 seconds for 120 feet (the distance from home plate to 2nd base), and has also competed in the Scotts Pitch Hit & Run competitions.

Magee also has an extensive history in photography over the last 20+ years. ## ALUMNI UPDATE

#### HADER BREAKS RELIEVER MOLD IN MILWAUKEE

Every few years, the major leagues discover the "next big thing" in bullpen usage. This year, the title falls on Milwaukee Brewers reliever and former Shorebird Josh Hader, who works as if he wouldn't look out of place in the "cookie cutter" stadiums of the 1970s and simultaneously shatters the mold of modern relief pitching.

Hader has lit up National League opposition this season and is a big part of the Brewers' ascent to the top of the Senior Circuit. Through the end of May, the southpaw is 2-0 with a 1.09 ERA and six saves over 19 outings. With a fastball and slider that look virtually identical until right before they reach the plate, Hader has notched an eye-popping 66 strikeouts



over 33 innings, or two strikeouts for every three outs he gets. In an April 30 game in Cincinnati, Hader struck out all eight hitters he faced in a 2.2-inning save, the longest all-strikeout appearance in major league history.

Perhaps the clearest illustration of how valuable Hader has been for the Brew Crew, Milwaukee has won all 19 games in which the longhaired fireball has appeared.

For Hader, a Millersville, Md. native, the pro baseball journey began for his home-state Baltimore Orioles. The O's drafted the Old Mill High School man in the 19th round in 2012. After a summer in Sarasota and Aberdeen, Hader joined the Delmarva Shorebirds in 2013. In 17 starts, the 19-year-old went 3-6 with a 2.65 ERA and 79 strikeouts over 85 innings, far from the prodigious punchout numbers of his current iteration. Hader's finest hour in Salisbury came in a June 9 win against Lakewood; he tossed 6.2 scoreless innings, finishing one out shy of a complete-game shutout. Five





days later in Hickory, Hader held the Crawdads to one hit over 6.1 frames, earning another dub for Luis Pujols' ballclub.

Delmarva was as high as Hader would get in Baltimore farm, however. That trade deadline, the Orioles traded him to Houston as part of the Bud Norris trade, and he finished out the season with the Quad Cities River Bandits in the Midwest League. Two years later, the Astros shipped him to Milwaukee in a larger package for Mike Fiers and Carlos Gomez.

After surviving the pitching nightmare of Triple-A Colorado Springs, Hader made his big league debut for the Brewers on June 10, 2017 in Arizona, becoming the 98th former Shorebird to make it to The Show. Pitching in relief for the first time since the end of his Astro tenure, Hader tossed a scoreless seventh. He cruised through his first month and picked up his first career win on

23

July 7 at Yankee Stadium, striking out seven over three innings.

By the end of the season, Hader was an integral part of a Brewers team that finished one game out of the Wild Card race, boasting a 2.08 ERA with 68 strikeouts over 47.2 innings. But not even Milwaukee diehards could anticipate how effective their lanky left-hander would be when the calendar turned to 2018.

Hader's turned an unconventional journey into a dark horse campaign for the NL Cy Young, and he has a legitimate chance of breaking the single-season relief pitching strikeout record of 181, set by Boston's Dick Radatz in 1964. More so than any other former Shorebird currently in The Show, Hader strikes the most fear in his opponents on a day-to-day basis.

## COACH BOBBY ROSE, PART I

Before a recent game against Greensboro, Shorebirds radio voice Will DeBoer sat down with bitting coach Bobby Rose. Rose is in bis first season both with Delmarva and in the Baltimore Orioles system. Before joining the O's, he coached in the Texas Rangers system from 2013-2017, moving up the ladder from short-season Spokane to High-A Down East.

- WD: You retired from playing in the mid-2000s, when did you decide you wanted to get into coaching?
- JL: Well it wasn't actually my idea to get back into coaching. I was retired and enjoying my wife, and my wife came up to me and said, 'What are your plans for the rest of my life?' And she said 'There's something more for you: coaching.' And I said, 'You're out of your mind!' Because I had been out of the game for so long, and in order to get into the game you need some contacts, and I had lost my contacts. Fortunately I was able to reach out to some distant friends, and they were kind enough to get me an opportunity to get me back in the game.
- WD: What was it like that first year in Spokane, just making the adjustment from player to civilian to coach?
- JL: It was a difficult adjustment because I had been away for so long and didn't know what to expect. It was a different generation of kids, and I had to get adjusted to them. It was a challenge at first, but I embraced it. I like what I'm doing right now and feel comfortable doing it. The kids these days are challenging in their own way, and the challenge is something I look forward to every day.
- WD: For two years you coached the High Desert Mavericks, who don't even exist anymore. I imagine it can be tough being a hitting coach there because the offensive numbers were so inflated.
- JL: The wind blew out 20-30 mph every night. Guys who wouldn't normally hit two home runs end up hitting 10. It wasn't really a good reflection of the player you're dealing with, but everybody in the league got to play there, and it just happened to be our home field.
- WD: You were with the Mavericks in 2016, the final year they were there, and they end up winning the California League championship. What was it like to manage in a place where the whole organization was a dead man walking and then to go out and be "champions forever"?
- JL: To be able to do it at that place at that time with that group of kids was a tremendous feat. I had family members that live in the area, so they were able to come out and participate and enjoy the moment. A championship is a championship no matter where you're winning it, and the feeling you get from it is something that you'll cherish forever.



#### JARRETT FORGES OWN PATH ON DIAMOND

On April 26, the Shorebirds trailed the Kannapolis Intimidators 3-2 with a man on first and two out in the bottom of the ninth. At the plate stood Zach Jarrett, already locked in during a sizzling month. On an 0-2 pitch, Jarrett launched a fly ball deep to left. Nearly 4,000 Perdue Stadium faithful knew right off the bat it wasn't coming back.

And in a flash, the son of NASCAR Hall-of-Famer Dale Jarrett had clocked walkoff home run to beat the team named for fellow racing legend Dale Earnhardt, Sr. It's as close as "Jarrett passes Earnhardt on the final lap" as we'll get off the speedway.

"As I'm pitching to him for many years and putting him in different situations, that's a situation that you always wanted to be in," said Dale Jarrett of his son's heroics. "With the bat in your hand and a chance to

win the game. And for Zach to do it against that team, it was even more special."

Born in 1994, Zach grew up at the height of his father's power; Dale won the 1999 Winston Cup and his second and third Daytona 500s before Zach went to elementary school. Despite growing up immersed in such a dynastic sport – Dale's father Ned won two Grand National Series – Zach never showed much interest in that particular family business.

Rather, the young Jarrett took after his mother Kelley's side of the family. Maternal grandfather Jasper Spears played minor league baseball in the Brooklyn/L.A. Dodgers system from 1949-59, spending five seasons in Triple-A.

"[Spears] was always glad to share stories, give Zach advice, and just help with his interest in the game," said Dale of his father-in-law, who passed in 2010 just shy of 80 years old. "[Zach] took an interest in baseball around age 5, and once he started that, baseball was always where his focus was.

"His work ethic was that of 'I want to do whatever it takes.' So he would stay out there until it was dark, and he would spend many hours to become better. And he showed the interest to travel and do everything that you need to do, so we were glad to accommodate that."

After a successful multi-sport career at Hickory High School – not too far from L.P. Frans Stadium, where the South Atlantic League's Crawdads play – Jarrett became a Charlotte 49er, rooming with future Shorebird teammate T.J. Nichting all four years. Along came the 2017 MLB Draft, and with it, a 28th-round call from the Baltimore Orioles.

After an initial summer in short-season Aberdeen, Jarrett surged out of the gate for Delmarva in 2018. In the second inning of his first game he made a home run-robbing catch in left field; the next inning in his first at-bat, a home run. The walkoff blast – followed hours later by a trip to his hometown in Hickory – was icing on the cake for Jarrett, who blazed his way to Orioles Minor League Player of the Month in April on the back of a 1.063 OPS.

"There's nothing better than seeing all your hard work in the offseason pay off, and I just thank my teammates and my coaches for pushing me every day," said Zach while reflecting on his April laurels. "To have them every day, especially in spring training, they helped me through the process. It was a great honor."

The map of the Sally League means Jarrett gets to play a bulk of his games close to home. Family is a frequent guest at Shorebird road games – Dale, Kelley, even sisters Karsyn and Natalee, making the trip from New York City to see their bro in action. All the while, Zach forges ahead knowing that this is a sport he can call his own.

"Through my own career it was always, 'Well, you're following in your father's footsteps, what are the pressures there," said Dale. "Zach's in something totally different. So to see him work that hard to make a name for himself, and to do what he loves, and to be rewarded with an opportunity to play professional baseball, it's a huge thrill for all of us."


