Well-Rounded Moore Takes Reins



At the beginning of last June, Kyle Moore was entrenched as hitting coach with the Frederick Keys, slowly but surely making his way up the Orioles minor league coaching ladder. By the end of the month, he had been uprooted and installed as manager of the Aberdeen IronBirds, named to the position barely a week before Opening Day after an Achilles injury to would-be skipper Kevin Bradshaw. Such a rapid rise would have made Moore's head spin if he had ever had time to think about it.

"[The first thing you learn is] your cell phone rings off the hook from 8:00 a.m. to game time," said Moore with a chuckle, ironically during a phone interview from the O's spring training complex in Sarasota. "You can't ever put it down because you're no longer just responsible for 12 hitters. The biggest change is now you're responsible for every player and every staff member and a lot of things that go on off the field."

This time, Moore knew what to expect when the Orioles tabbed him manager of the Delmarva Shorebirds over the winter. With more heads-up for this gig than his last, the 33-year-old ex-catcher has been able to prepare for his return to the dugout on his own terms.

"I like to do a lot of work on the computer, planning and scheduling, throwing some colors on some graphs," said Moore. "I'm a planner and I want to know what's around every corner. So that's been really nice, as opposed to getting a call on June 10 that you're going to manage on June 18. It's almost like a 'what you've got is what you've got,' but now I've got some time to actually design some things, which has been fun."

Moore brings more than just spreadsheets and a keen eye for design to the manager's office. Now entering his 10th season in the Orioles system, he assumes the Shorebirds mantle with one of the most wide-ranging coaching backgrounds in recent memory.

Moore signed with the O's as an undrafted free agent in 2010, content to play baseball until someone "ripped the jersey off his back." He played most of that summer in Delmarva and began transitioning to coaching the next spring. Spurred by his exercise science degree from the University of Alabama, Moore became Shorebirds strength and conditioning coach in 2012. He served as fourth coach in Frederick and Bowie each of the next two seasons before returning to Delmarva in the same role in 2015. The next year, it was back to Delmarva as hitting coach, a role he reprised in 2017 and the first part of 2018 before his sudden promotion to IronBirds manager.

"It's been super beneficial, because I see the game from a lot of different eyes," said Moore. "Sometimes the longer you're away from the game as a player, the easier it seems, and the less recovery

you think the players need. But if you've been there for a while, you understand how difficult the game is, and also how important recovery is. So that's the two things that I've learned from all those positions that I've held, as well as from playing: baseball is hard, and the season is long, and you have to plan accordingly."

Moore won't be alone as he navigates his first full season as a manager. His young family will join him in Salisbury for the summer; look for wife Whitney, year-old daughter Madilyn, and black lab Malu to be familiar faces around Perdue Stadium as they help Dad wrap his head around the latest chapter of his baseball life.

"Life's really an adventure [for them], you know," said Moore. "Dad doesn't have a 9-to-5 where he comes home every night at the same time and does everything the same as a schedule. Some people may hate that, but my family at this point has done really well with it. So this going to be our own little adventure, and [we're going to] do this all together."

Ex-Shorebird Strikes It Rich Out West

Days turned into weeks, weeks into months. Anticipation grew with speculation rampant. Finally, the bombshell broke on February 21: Manny Machado was headed to San Diego, signing with the Padres for \$300 million over 10 years. The ex-Oriole golden boy had just inked the richest free-agent contract in sports history... until the Phillies threw \$30 million more at Bryce Harper roughly two weeks later.

The eyes of all baseball have been glued to Machado since he broke with Baltimore in 2012. And yet the year before that, the man

with more than a quarter of a billion dollars in the bank was just a fresh-faced 18-year-old, riding the bus like any other Delmarva Shorebird.

After dipping his beak in the waters the summer before, Machado began his minor league career in earnest at Perdue Stadium on April 7, 2011, lacing a two-run triple in the bottom of the sixth to lift the Shorebirds to a season-opening 2-1 win over Greensboro. He closed that first month with a flourish, belting five home runs in seven games as part of a 10-game Delmarva winning streak.

Injuries briefly sidelined Machado, but he returned to action in early June to close out the first half. That month, Machado and four other Shorebirds headlined the South Atlantic League All-Star Game, held at Perdue Stadium for the second time. All of the Eastern Shore came out to see the future face of the franchise, not to mention future National League MVPs in Hagerstown's Bryce Harper and Greensboro's Christian Yelich.

Days after the festivities, though, came the inevitable: Machado was headed to High-A Frederick, promoted by the Orioles after just half a season. In 38 games with the club, he hit .276 with eight doubles, six home runs, and 24 RBIs.

About 14 months later, the Orioles called the 19-year-old Machado up to the majors straight from

The next night, pure Manny Magic: his first major-league home run in the bottom of the fifth, followed by his second blast one inning later. It was clear after those two days: this teenage superstar, barely a year removed from Low-A, was about to hit the baseball stratosphere.

Oriole fans know the rest of the story: the four All-Star

appearances, the pair of threehomer games, and enough web gems to fill a diamond

mine. The height of Machado's power had to be the week-and-a-half in August 2017 when he hit three grand slams, including a walkoff slam to beat the Angels — his third home run of that August 18 game. Anyone at Camden Yards that night will testify that in that moment, they witnessed the man who could've been the greatest Oriole who ever lived.

It wasn't to be, of course. The economics of baseball left Baltimore little choice but to trade Machado last July. The deal brought back five Dodger prospects, including current top O's farmhand Yusniel Diaz. As for Machado, despite a tumultuous October that ended with him on one knee after chasing the final Chris Sale breaking ball of the World Series, he was still instrumental in bringing Los Angeles its second straight National League pennant.

Now tucked 123 miles further south down Interstate 5, Machado has become the Face of the Friars, giving an identity to arguably Major League Baseball's most anonymous franchise. For hundreds of fans across Delmarva, though, Manny Machado remains the most memorable face to ever suit up for their Shorebirds.

With the 24th season of Delmarva Shorebirds baseball in sight, Shorebirds radio voice Will DeBoer sat down with general manager Chris Bitters to explore the ins and outs at Arthur W. Perdue Stadium in 2019.

- WD: Opening Day always seems to be a strange brew of last-minute scrambling to execute plans that were made six months in advance, doesn't it?
- CB: You know, it does. When you end the season you feel like, "Oh, we've got six months to plan and prepare and get ready for next year." But there's a lot to do in those six months, and then it really flies by. And then obviously with all of the renovation projects we've got going on, the weather plays a role and can sometimes compact those things into a much smaller window.
- WD: We've got a lot of new "fan-forward" renovations this year, as you've called them. The most significant one has to be the new 360 Deck, which gives the ballpark more of a "big time" feel.
- **CB:** I would agree. In the old days the old ballpark more or less "died" at third base and first base. Now we have the ability for fans to get up and take a stroll, and on top of all that, it has numerous feet of drink rails. We've also added some drink rails down the left field line, where the grassy berm is at, and on the second level concourse. So there are significantly more places for fans to stand and eat and enjoy the game, whether it's for a shorter period of time to just grab a hot dog or a beer, or whether it's much more longer-engagement if they choose. So we're excited about those new nesting areas.
- WD: The large-scale renovations are pretty much done at this point, right?
- CB: Yeah, we're coming to the end of this four or five year cycle. There will be some more renovations coming this offseason. What those are exactly we don't know; our goal right now is to sit back and enjoy the fans' interaction with those spaces, and there's a little opportunity this summer or next year to say, 'what would we do differently?' Hopefully by midseason we'll have a list of final projects, but as for the big hula-hoops, they've all been swung now.
- WD: We recently threw our hat in the ring for the MiLB Copa de la Diversión this year and launched our Gallos de Delmarva look. It seems like that's already resonated with the community.
- **CB:** Yeah, that's an exciting opportunity to participate in it, along with 72 other minor league teams. The response has been fantastic on social media; a lot of people thought well of the logo and the look and what we're doing. When you look at our roster, approximately 30 percent of major and minor league players are of Latin descent, and it's a great way to engage in that community, so I'm excited to continue to plan those nights.



Grenier Starts Strong in O's System



Baseball fans across the country had their eyes glued on Omaha last June for Game 2 of the College World Series. With Arkansas one out away from a title, Oregon State shortstop Cadyn Grenier laced a game-tying single into left. His teammate followed with a go-ahead home run to eventually win the game, and the Beavers won the next day to clinch their third national championship. At the center of all of it was Grenier, whose cool approach under pressure turned the tide for the orange and black.

One week later, Grenier was still sporting orange and black, but everything else had changed. The Orioles firstround draft pick had moved from the West Coast to the East, with a \$1.8 million signing bonus in hand, bypassing shortseason Aberdeen to make his pro debut for the Delmarva Shorebirds.

"For some reason, it feels like orange has followed me everywhere," said Grenier of the familiar color palette when he joined his new organization in July. "My first club ball team was orange, my high school had orange, then college, and now the Orioles and Delmarva are all orange teams. It's been pretty cool to see that keep going."

While he arrived in Salisbury to Fourth of July fanfare, Grenier didn't debut with the Shorebirds until July 5. He went 0-for-4 with two strikeouts but made several good plays at shortstop. The next night he got his first two hits, including an eighth-inning triple, and scored a pair of runs in Delmarva's 9-3 win over Hagerstown.

Two days later on July 8 against Hickory, Shorebirds fans got a glimpse of the grace under fire that made Grenier famous in Omaha. Tied 1-1 in the bottom of the ninth, Grenier led off with a line drive single to left. With Zach Jarrett at the plate next, Grenier stole second base against dangerous Crawdad catcher Yohel Pozo. On the very next pitch, Grenier swiped third base, sliding in headfirst ahead of another Pozo laser.

Then-Delmarva manager Buck Britton later revealed the steal of third was unprompted; Grenier stole it on pure instinct. His derring-do on the basepaths changed the complexion of the inning, which Mason McCoy ended with a two-out walkoff single, scoring Grenier to propel the Shorebirds to a 2-1 win.

"He's come out of the draft and hit the ground running," said Britton days after Grenier's heroics. "We knew he was a defensive guy in high school, but I think he's surprised some people with how quickly he's adjusted to the league offensively."

While Grenier's glove work more than lived up to billing, success with the bat came in spurts; he batted .216 with a .630 OPS over 43 games for the Shorebirds in 2018. Despite the low average, when Grenier made solid contact, the ball seemed to jump off the lumber. He stroked 12 doubles in his 43 games, a pace that would've had him at 39 two-sackers in a full 140-game season.

Grenier's top offensive moments came late in the season. On April 18 – Scrapple night at Perdue Stadium – he belted a go-ahead triple to left with two out in the bottom of the eighth, helping Delmarva beat Rome 4-2.

Eight days later in Greensboro, Grenier checked off the one box he had yet to fill in his rookie season. With the Shorebirds down 4-3 in the top of the ninth, Grenier crushed a full count offering from Michael Mertz into the picnic deck in left field, a game-tying home run for his first professional round-tripper. That opened the spigot on a three-run Delmarva ninth on the way to a 6-4 win and four-game sweep over the Grasshoppers.

With half a season of pro experience under his belt, Grenier enters his first full calendar year as an Oriole minor leaguer as the organization's No. 17 prospect. No matter where in the system he starts the season, he knows his future is as bright as any orange-and-black prospect.

"It's all worth it for me," said Grenier late last season. "I'm continuing to get better, continuing to progress with my game, and that's about all I could ask for."




