

## No Days Off: The Art of a Bullpen Session

From the outside looking in, a bullpen session — side work starting pitchers and sometimes relievers undergo between outings — can seem rather monotonous. Pitcher sets up on rubber. Pitcher goes into windup. Pitcher pitches. Catcher catches. Catcher throws ball back. Lather, rinse, repeat for 20-to-30 pitches. Well, that's not exactly how the Delmarva Shorebirds like to view their bullpens. In their eyes, each session is a blank canvas upon which they can continually try out the art of pitching.

"In general, what I'm looking for in a bullpen session is how is the delivery looking, how is everything timed up. I want to make sure the hand



everything timed up, I want to make sure the hands are working in sequence," said Shorebirds pitching coach Justin Ramsey. "I'll move around the guys as they are throwing, making sure everything is lined up.

"It's going to be different for each pitcher, some guys are looking more at pitch execution or sequence or something to that effect. Other times it's going to be a lot more mechanical focused. We might have three guys throwing a bullpen session one day and each guy is going to get on the mound and have a different idea of what they are working on."

The typical Shorebirds bullpen session starts well before the pitcher first throws off the mound. The first step is warming up. This involves stretching, running, and utilizing weighted baseballs. Each player



has their own regimen that they prefer, but for the most part everybody follows upon the same basic path. First it is running and stretching, and after that everybody pairs up and throws on flat ground, basically a pre-session sans mound. These flat ground sessions can be useful to tinker around with pitch grips, get the arm loose, and lock in the body.

While the pitchers are warming up, the Shorebirds video team sets up the Edgertronic camera behind the mound to capture everything the pitcher does. The Edgertronic camera takes video at extremely high frame rates, allowing Ramsey to slow things down to show his pitchers. Combine this with other analytical information Ramsey has at his disposal and that makes a wealth of knowledge to look at during bullpen sessions.

"The information that's out there now and the information that they have the ability to look at and learn from has completely changed the dynamic of the game," said Ramsey. "Looking at the Edgertronic video and how the ball is coming out of the hand and different things we can







manipulate to maximize the efficiency of the pitch, whether it's hand positioning or a ball positioning thing, this stuff is now readily available."

Once a pitcher finally ascends the mound and starts his session, each guy has a little bit of a different preference of how they go about their sessions. For reliever Reed Hayes, it's all about maintaining his repertoire.

"I like to use the bullpen to get the feel right for all three of my pitches: fastball, slider, and changeup," said Hayes. "I'm just working on all three pitches and trying to maintain them. Our bullpen sessions are touch and feels, so that's usually about 10 to 14 pitches. In a bullpen, I won't throw a fastball or any of my pitches at game speed or max effort. I save my best pitches for the game."



On the opposite side of Hayes is Shorebirds starter Ryan Wilson. With a six-man rotation, Wilson has a bit more time in between his outings, which he likes to use for constant development during the season.

"When I am throwing my mid-week side sessions I can stretch it out and go up to around to 30 pitches instead of a shorter one thanks to the six-day rotation," Wilson said. "This allows me to still develop my pitches in between starts. You're not just dreading having to throw or still being sore, and when you do get to that next start you can truly get better every day."

Bullpen sessions may look like brainless work, but the brainwork that does go into them provides the clearest proof that Shorebirds pitchers take every opportunity they can to grow each day.

## COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT




It's a year of celebration for the Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore which is celebrating 35 years of philanthropic impact on Maryland's Lower Eastern Shore. Since 1984, CFES has granted more than \$83 million in grants and scholarships - now THAT is something to celebrate! In honor of the Foundation's anniversary, CFES launched the Spark Campaign, which aims to provide more than \$210,000 in combined funding for the three education foundations serving the Lower Eastern Shore. The Wicomico County Education Foundation, Worcester County Education Foundation and Somerset County Public Schools are the beneficiaries of this anniversary initiative.

Participating education foundations have until October 15, 2019 to each raise at least \$35,000. Each education foundation will be empowered to use their funds to best meet the needs of local students in their respective counties.



## Pickering Remains Delmarva King of Crash



When the Shorebirds first became a Baltimore Orioles affiliate in 1997, fans would be forgiven for thinking they'd caught on with Oakland instead. During that magical season, Delmarva played host to a minor league equivalent of the famed Bash Brothers of those late-'80s Athletics juggernauts. One was Ryan Minor, as synonymous with Shorebird baseball as anyone in franchise history. The other was until that year a little-known late round entity from the U.S. Virgin Islands: Calvin Pickering.

Pickering joined the Orioles as a 35th-round pick after moving from St. Thomas to Florida. In 1996 the first baseman put up impressive numbers with Bluefield in the Appalachian League,

pounding 18 home runs in 60

games. The next year he arrived in Salisbury, part of the first team the Orioles sent to Perdue Stadium after the Shorebirds' affiliation switched from Montreal after the 1996 season. That inaugural Delmarva team went to the South Atlantic League championship series before losing to Savannah; it would be up to Pickering and company to take it over the top.

From the onset, the Eastern Shore faithful knew they were in for a generational home run chase. Pickering and Minor matched each other every step of the way, emerging as daily power threats amongst a team that relied mainly on speed and lockdown relief pitching. By the time the season wound down, the teammates stood shoulder to shoulder: Pickering with 25 home runs, Minor with 24.

More importantly, their Shorebirds stood with a 77-65 record,







good for a Wild Card berth in that year's three-tiered SAL playoffs. They swept Hickory in the opening round before meeting a Charleston (WV) team that edged them out by one game for the North Division crown. Undaunted, Delmarva outpaced the AlleyCats and took the series 2-1. From there it was onto the championship series, and redemption: a 2-0 sweep of Greensboro to claim the city's first Sally League title.

For Pickering, the ride didn't stop there. He bashed 31 home runs with 114 RBIs the next year with Double-A Bowie, earning a September call-up to the Orioles. His first of 14 career big league round-trippers came off Yankees ace David Cone on September 19 at Camden Yards. He was in the lineup the next night, batting one spot ahead of fellow Shorebird bruiser Ryan Minor as the latter suited up at third base in place of Cal Ripken, Jr.



Pickering split his time between Triple-A Rochester and the Orioles in 1999 before spending the next injury-shortened season entirely in the minors. In late 2001 he was traded to Cincinnati and then claimed off waivers by Boston, where he played 17 late-season games for the Red Sox. He bounced around from there, back to Cincinnati for a spell and then for 42 games over the 2004 and '05 seasons with Kansas City. After giving it a go in Korea and in stateside independent leagues, Pickering retired in 2008 at age 31.

Twenty-two years later, his name still litters the Shorebird record book: top-five totals in batting average (.311), slugging (.554), total bases (246), extra-base hits (57), and runs scored (88). Most significantly, his 25 home runs remain untouched as the Delmarva single-season record. The last time anyone significantly threatened Pickering's total — or Minor's runner-up tally of 24 — was in 2005 when Jason Fransz slugged 22 bombs; nobody else has ever eclipsed 20.

For the time being, Calvin Pickering can take comfort in his title as the Shorebirds' Colossus of Clout. Perhaps it will take a new generation of Bash Brothers to fuel each other in a chase to dethrone him.

#### ATHLETIC TRAINER ADRIAN GONZALEZ

Before a recent home game in mid-July, Shorebirds radio voice Will DeBoer caught up with athletic trainer Adrian Gonzalez. Gonzalez is in his second year with the Shorebirds and fifth in the Orioles organization; he spent 2017 with the Aberdeen IronBirds and the two summers before that in the Gulf Coast League.

WD: What was it like coming back to Delmarva and familiar circumstances around the ballpark, the facilities, the league, et cetera?

AG: Well I'm definitely a little more comfortable than last year. Last year was my first full season, and a lot of the inner workings are different. This year I kind of had a plan in mind for how I was going to handle things. It's definitely nice being familiar with the surrounding area and the ballpark in general. And then with the team, there were guys coming back on it I was familiar with. It's good; it's nice being comfortable where you are.

WD: What was the biggest shock to the system of coming to the South Atlantic League last year?

AG: Well one thing everyone always said was the bus rides. I think that's because we're one of

the furthest teams up north in the South Atlantic League. That, and probably dealing with only a 25-man roster. So you kind of have to play around, and being in my role it's when anyone gets hurt, everyone's always going to wonder "How long is this guy going to be out?" or "Are we going to have enough guys to be able to play this series?" So there's a lot more communication with everyone throughout the organization about medical issues.

WD: What's the hardest time of the year to keep guys healthy?

AG: I'd probably say around this time that we're at right now. Kyle says a lot of times with this group of guys, "This is where your money is made, July and August." Everyone says that it's the dog days of summer. Some of them haven't played this many games in a season before. How many games are we at, 90 games now? So it's the durability that helps. And then the summer heat, some people aren't used to it over in this area. It gets to be really hot and humid.

WD: And then with the team winning the first half the way they did and knowing the playoffs are coming, that's at maximum two more weeks you've got to keep the guys healthy.

AG: Yeah. We always talk to these guys about making sure they're getting enough rest and coming to me, or making sure they're keeping up with strength and conditioning with Tim Chiarolanza. And to just keep up what they've been doing to get them here. Obviously we've had some turnover with some guys, but a lot of the core people are still here, and they know what they need to do to get themselves ready day in and day out.



### Surgical Wilson Quietly Rises to Ace Status

A quick glance through the Delmarva Shorebirds' starting rotation and you'll find a staff stuffed to the brim with talent. You have last year's first-round pick in Grayson Rodriguez accompanied by fourth-round pick Drew Rom. Kick in Gray Fenter, who has had a sub 2.50 ERA the entire year, plus Nick Vespi and Hector Guance, who have stymied hitters all year long. Hiding amongst this thicket is the best starting pitcher for Delmarva in the second half: lefty Ryan Wilson.

Wilson, a 33rd round pick by the Orioles back in 2017, didn't even start this season with the Shorebirds. But for the

southpaw, he's pretty used to never having anything guaranteed, starting with his college days.

"I was just a preferred walk-on at Pepperdine and I had no idea what that role was even going to be, I just wanted to pitch," Wilson said. "I came in that fall and just worked my rear end off and ended up throwing 90 innings as a freshman."


After his freshman season with Pepperdine, Wilson shifted into a bullpen role for his sophomore campaign and was utterly dominant. In 42.2 innings, Wilson allowed just three earned runs (0.63 ERA) and notched six saves. For his final season as a junior, Wilson moved back into the rotation as the Waves' Friday night starter and had a season that propelled him onto the Orioles' draft board. He was ultimately selected in the 33rd round in 2017.

After being drafted and spending that summer in the Gulf Coast League, Wilson debuted with the Shorebirds in 2018, pitching primarily out of the bullpen. Wilson tallied an 0-3 record with a 3.50 ERA

in 61.2 innings, picking up 58 strikeouts. Still uncertainty loomed, as Wilson did not break camp with the Delmarva and didn't make his first appearance for the squad until a spot-start in mid-May. But, since cementing his role in the starting rotation, Wilson has gone on to new heights, being named the SAL Pitcher of the Week for July 8-14 after throwing seven shutout innings to beat West Virginia on July 9, striking out a career-high 11 batters.

The award was just the cherry on top. From June 15 to July 15, Wilson made six starts (all Quality Starts), posting a 4-1 record with an 0.92 ERA over 39 innings. During that span he walked seven batters and struck out 44, and opponents hit just .130 off him. This success is just a culmination of hard work for Wilson.

"I went back to my old routine that I had in college and I

feel like my arm is in good shape and I can go six or seven innings without getting tired," said Wilson. "This season I think I have a better understanding of what makes my pitches good when I'm throwing them correctly and what I'm doing wrong when I cut my fastball or pull my change-up, so just small things."

Unlike other members of the pitching staff who might wield a high-90s fastball, Wilson's four-seamer hovers in the high 80s to low 90s. This means he has a smaller margin for error and must be locked in on each and every pitch.

"I've never thrown hard, maybe I will at some point in my life," said Wilson. "Even when I was young I was never that guy that threw hard, so at a young age I had to learn how to pitch and I'm thankful for it because now I can read hitters well and see the holes in their swings. When I do make a bad pitch, it may be a bigger outcome, but I just have to focus on hitting my spots."






