YESTERDAY: The Captains lost their second straight game, losing to the Dayton Dragons, 4-1. Lake County starter **Eli Morgan** struck out a career-high nine batters over six innings of work and left with the game tied. A two-run home run by Miles Gordon in the eighth inning broke the tie and gave Dayton the lead. The Dragons scored one more run in the inning thanks to a pair of Captains errors.

WALK THIS WAY: Through four games, the Captains lead the Midwest League with 36 walks, a .397 OBP and a .775 OPS. Lake County has walked eight or more times in four of its first six games, including a 10-walk game against Fort Wayne.

ROSTER MOVES: Ahead of Monday's game, the Indians added **INF Dillon Persinger** to the Captains' roster from extended spring training. Before Saturday's game, the Indians placed Captains **3B Nolan Jones** on the Disabled List.

2017: The Captains finished with a record of 54-85, the second-worst record in team history. Lake County, however, broke the club home run record by hitting 153 homers. The mark was just two home runs shy of the Midwest League single-season record, set by the 1961 Waterloo Hawks with 155. **Emmanuel Tapia** broke the Captains' individual single-season home run record with 29 home runs. He broke the record on his last at-bat of the season at Great Lakes.

TOP PROSPECTS: The Captains feature five players in the Indians' Top 30 Prospects, according to *Baseball America* and *MLB.com*: **INF Nolan Jones** (BA #4, MLB #4), **OF Will Benson** (BA #10, MLB #7), **OF Oscar Gonzalez** (BA #20, MLB #18), **INF Ernie Clement** (BA #24, MLB #24) and **RHP Eli Morgan** (BA #29, MLB #28)

TOP PROSPECTS OF 2017: The Indians' Top-30 Prospects list on *Baseball America* and *MLB.com* has six players who were on the 2017 Captains: **RHP Shane Bieber** (BA #5, MLB #8), **RHP Aaron Civale** (BA #14, MLB #10), **OF Conner Capel** (BA #15, MLB #12), **C Logan Ice** (BA #19, MLB #21), **3B Gavin Collins** (BA #27, MLB not ranked) and **LHP Brady Aiken** (BA #28, MLB #29).

BIG LEAGUE DEBUTS: Seven former Captains players made their Major League debut in 2017, bringing the total number of ex-Captains in the big leagues to 74. The Captains graduates who got the call last year are **OF Bradley Zimmer** (Indians - 2014 Captains), **RHP Paolo Espino** (Brewers - 2007-09), **OF Clint Frazier** (Yankees - 2014), **OF Carlos Moncrief** (Giants - 2011), **OF Anthony Santander** (Orioles - 2013-15), **OF Greg Allen** (Indians - 2015) and **C Francisco Mejia** (Indians - 2015-16).

CALLAWAY'S BIG CALL: Former Captains Pitching Coach **Mickey Callaway** was named the new manager of the New York Mets on October 23, 2017. Callaway becomes the first ever Captains coach or manager to become a Major League manager. He was the pitching coach for the 2010 Captains who won the Midwest League championship.

"BUD" IN THE BIGS: Former Captains Manager **Mark Budzinski** was added to the Indians' Major League coaching staff during the 2017 offseason. His role will include advance preparation, player performance and on field pre-game work. Budzinski was the Captains' manager in 2014. He becomes the seventh former Captains coach or manager to reach the big leagues.

LAST TIME OUT: Hillman pitched three innings against Fort Wayne last Friday before the ballgame was suspended due to snow. In the first inning, Hillman allowed three runs on a two-run homer by Tirso Ornelas and an RBI double by Carlos Belen. Three Captains errors in the second inning cost the lefty three unearned runs. The game was resumed on Sunday in Fort Wayne and the Captains came back from a 6-2 deficit to win, 10-8.

SCOUTING REPORT: Hillman's fastball sits 89-92 MPH, but has historically dropped to the high-80's as the season wears on. The changeup is Hillman's best secondary pitch and can develop into an above-average offering. Hillman's curveball has good shape and depth and is expected to be at least average. Hillman has a quick arm and clean mechanics, which makes him a natural strike-thrower. He also boasts good athleticism and has some room to grow into his 6'2" frame. Scouts believe Hillman may need to add strength to stick as a starter, but he has the tools to be a dependable back-end starter at the big league level.

LAST SEASON: Pitched with the Captains and posted a 7-10 record with a 6.08 ERA. Hillman enjoyed his most success in June, when he owned a 2.89 ERA in five starts (28 IP). The southpaw had an ERA over 5.00 in every other month.

PROSPECTING: Was ranked as the Indians' #12 prospect heading into the 2017 season, according to *MLB.com*.

SHOWING FLASHES: Hillman struggled at times in 2017, but showed signs of brilliance with the Captains. The lefty flirted with no-hitters twice in three starts from June 28 to July 9. On June 28, the southpaw took a perfect game into the sixth inning and had a no hitter through 6.1 innings against Great Lakes. The lefty finished with just one hit and no runs allowed over seven innings, though he did not factor in the decision in a 4-0 loss. Two starts later, on July 9 against West Michigan, Hillman retired the first 11 batters he faced before hitting a batter and then carried a no-hitter through 5.2, only to have it broken up on a bloop single. Hillman earned the win, pitching seven innings and allowing two runs on two hits and striking out a career-high nine batters. Strangely, both of Hillman's near no-hitters came in day games at Classic Park with **Li-Jen Chu** catching.

BIG LEAGUE MENTOR: Hillman transferred to Olympia High School (FL) before his sophomore year and became teammates with 2014 Twins first-round selection Nick Gordon. Gordon's father, Tom "Flash" Gordon, the former MLB All-Star closer, became Hillman's legal guardian and mentor. Hillman credits Flash for many of the improvements he has had on the mound in the last few years.

HIGH SCHOOL POWERHOUSE: When Hillman was drafted in 2015, he became the fourth graduate of Olympia High School (FL) in the last four years to be selected in the top 60 picks of the MLB Draft: Nick Gordon (Twins), Jesse Winker (Reds) and Walker Weickel (Padres).

DURABILITY: Hillman has struggled with durability in amateur and pro ball. In the past, Hillman's fastball has dropped in velocity in the latter portion of the season. In 2016 with Mahoning Valley, the numbers reflected his fatigue. Hillman posted a 0.89 ERA through his first six starts and 3.24 ERA in the first half, en route to a New York-Penn League All-Star selection. But the lefty fell off after the All-Star Break with a 9.00 ERA.

World Baseball Classic: Isaacs represented Great Britain in the 2016 WBC Qualifiers, as a native of The Bahamas. The Bahamas have produced seven big leaguers in baseball history.

Contact Hitter: Friis was one of the toughest batters in the nation to strikeout last year (his junior season). He was in the top-100 in the nation with 11.3 AB/K
Small Ball: Friis hit one home run in three years as Indiana State's starting shortstop. His lone homer came in the first game of his senior year against Illinois State
Sycamores in the Draft: Friis was one of four Indiana State players selected in last year's draft: RHP Will Kincannon (11th round — CWS), RHP Jeremy McKinney (31st round — WAS) and RHP Damon Olds (33rd round — KC). The class was the largest Sycamore draft class since 2009.
Hometown Haunts: Auburn, WA was originally incorporated as Slaughter, WA after Lt. William Slaughter, who died in a skirmish fighting Native Americans in 1855. At the time, the main hotel in the town was called the "Slaughter House."

Pull Hitter: Vicente has pulled the ball over 60% in three of his previous four Minor League seasons. Last year was the only time he fell short of the 60% mark, pulling the ball 59.1% of the time.
Maximizing Power: Vicente posted a HR/FB rate of 21.4% last year, ranking second on the Captains behind Emmanuel Tapia whose 29 home runs broke the team's single-season record. Though Vicente only had 124 plate appearances compared to Tapia's 505.
