SATURDAY: The Captains lost the finale of their Western Division road trip, falling to the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers in the rubber game of a three-game series, 4-2. The teams traded runs early. Wisconsin took the lead in the third on a sacrifice fly by David Fry, the Captains tied it in the top of the fourth on an RBI single by **Jesse Berardi**, the Timber Rattlers jumped back in front on a run-scoring wild pitch in the bottom of the fourth and Lake County evened the score again when **Miguel Jerez** homered to lead off the fifth. The Timber Rattlers took the lead for good when Fry hit a two-out double in the seventh and scored on a single by Gabriel Garcia. Wisconsin added one more run in the eighth on an RBI double by Connor McVey. Timber Rattlers reliever Max Lazar struck out eight over four scoreless innings for the win. Captains lefty reliever **Kellen Rholl** gave up the go-ahead run in the seventh and was saddled with the loss.

TOURING AMERICA'S DAIRYLAND: The Captains went 3-2 in their road trip to Wisconsin from Monday to Saturday last week. Lake County began the trip with three straight wins. The Captains won two at the Beloit Snappers (Oakland A's) before game three of the series was cancelled due to rain, and then won game one at the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers (Milwaukee Brewers). Lake County lost the last two games at Wisconsin to wrap up the trip.

INTERDIVISION RECAP: The Captains played their last 11 games against Western Division opponents and went 5-6 (2-4 at home; 3-2 on the road). At home, Lake County was swept in a three-game series by the Quad Cities River Bandits (Houston Astros) and took two out of three from the Kane County Cougars (Arizona Diamondbacks). On the road, the Captains won both games against the Beloit Snappers (Oakland Athletics) and lost two out of three at the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers (Milwaukee Brewers). The Captains' pitching staff had a 3.00 ERA in their interdivision games and tallied the second-most strikeouts against cross-division opponents with 118 in 96 IP (1.106 K/9). Offensively, the Captains had the third-lowest batting average in the Midwest League in interdivision play at .210. Lake County outscored its opponents, 47-38 (+9).

SO, YOU LIKE PROSPECTS?: During this seven-game homestand, Classic Park will see three teenage shortstops who rank among their organization's top prospects. The Captains' 19-year old shortstop **Tyler Freeman** is ranked by *MLB.com* as the Indians' #3 prospect, the Fort Wayne TinCaps have 19-year old shortstop Xavier Edwards who is the San Diego Padres' #12 prospect and the Bowling Green Hot Rods boast the Tampa Bay Rays' #1 prospect in the 18-year old Wander Franco. In addition, Freeman (#100) and Franco (#12) are ranked among the top 100 prospects in baseball by *MLB.com*. The trio also represents three of the best contact hitters in Class-A baseball. Freeman has the lowest K% in Class-A at 6.2% (fourth-lowest in MiLB), Edwards has the third-lowest K% in Class-A at 8.3% (12th-lowest in MiLB) and Franco has the sixth-lowest at 10.3% (28th-lowest in MiLB). *All K% numbers and rankings from *Fangraphs.com*

RED HOT BERARDI: **Jesse Berardi** has been on a tear in the month of May. Berardi is hitting .321 with four doubles in eight games. He has a slash line of .321/.424/.464 in that span with five runs and three RBI. He has increased his batting average from .215 to .256 during this stretch.

IN THE PARK: The Captains' pitching staff has not allowed a home run in six games. The last time Lake County surrendered a long ball was May 4 when Buddy Kennedy went deep in the first inning off **Juan Mota**. The Captains have given up the second-fewest homer in the Midwest League with 15.

AMONG THE BEST: **Will Benson** and **Tyler Freeman** rank among the top five in the Midwest League in several offensive categories. Benson is second in HR (6), fourth in RBI (23), fourth in XBH (15) and fifth in SB (9). Freeman leads the league in R (30), is second in 2B (12) and fourth in XBH (15).

FOUR-HOMER HISTORY: **Will Benson** became the first player in Captains history to hit four home runs in a single game when he accomplished the rare feat on April 18 against the South Bend Cubs. Benson hit a two-run homer in the first, a solo home run in the third, a grand slam in the fourth and a solo homer in the sixth. He is now the fifth player in Midwest League history to produce a four-home run game and the fourth to do so in the MWL regular season. The three others who hit four home runs in a MWL regular season game are Garrett Jones (2002; Quad Cities River Bandits), Mike Bishop (1978; Quad Cities Angels) and Bobby Smith (1959; Clinton Pirates). Eric Battersby (1999; Burlington Bees) is the only player ever to hit four home runs in the MWL postseason game.

THAT'S WEIRD: The last time somebody hit four home runs in a minor league game was May 25, 2014 when Mike Ford went deep four times for the Charleston RiverDogs (Class-A, Yankees) against the Hickory Crawdads in Hickory, NC. Ford, coincidentally, made his Major League debut Thursday night (the same night Benson hit four homers) for the Yankees against the Royals.

INDIANS FOUR-HOMER GAMES: The last four-home run game by a member of the Cleveland Indians organization was on June 10, 1959 when Rocky Colavito hit four homers in a game against the Baltimore Orioles at Memorial Stadium in Baltimore, MD. The last time an Indians minor leaguer hit four homers in a game was on September 3, 1948 when Leonard Cross went 7-for-7 with four homers for the Spartanburg Peaches in a 30-6 win over the Asheville Tourists at Duncan Park in Spartanburg, SC. The Peaches' third baseman hit all four of his homers in the first four innings. The Peaches were members of the Class-B Tri-State League.

OFF TO THE RACES: **Ruben Cardenas** hit an inside-the-park home run on April 16 in Bowling Green. It was the first inside-the-park homer by a Captains hitter since **Sam Haggerty** hit one on August 8, 2016 against the Dayton Dragons.

TOP PROSPECTS: Lake County features seven of the Indians' Top 30 prospects (including on the Injured List), according to *MLB.com*. **SS/2B Tyler Freeman** (#3), **C Bo Naylor** (#4), **RHP Luis Oviedo** (#8), **2B/SS Jose Fermin** (#23), **OF Will Benson** (#25), **OF Quentin Holmes** (#27) and **SS Marcos Gonzalez** (#28).

TOP PICKS: The Captains' roster includes two former first round draft picks and the Indians' #1 draft selections from each of the last three years with **OF Will Benson** (2016; 1st round – 14th overall), **OF Quentin Holmes** (2017; 2nd round – 64th overall) and **C Bo Naylor** (2018; 1st round – 29th overall). *The Indians did not have a first round pick in 2017.

LAST TIME OUT: McCarthy earned the win on Monday at Beloit after holding the Snappers to one run over five innings. The right-hander gave up a first inning run and then blanked Beloit over the next four frames. He struck out five, walked two and surrendered just three hits in a 9-1 Captains victory.

2018: McCarthy came out firing to start his pro career. After being drafted in the 18th round, the right-hander went to the Arizona Leaguer where he went 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA in nine relief outings. He struck out 20 and walked just two across 20 innings, earning a promotion to Short-Season Mahoning Valley. With the Scrappers, McCarthy made four starts and worked in relief twice, posting a 0.43 ERA and a 1-1 record. In 21 innings, he fanned 16 and again walked just two.

PERFECT GAME: McCarthy pitched the first perfect game in Seton Hall history during his sophomore year on April 15, 2016. The right-hander struck out eight and needed just 88 pitches (69 strikes) to pitch nine perfect frames against the LIU-Brooklyn Blackbirds. The performance was also the first perfect game in Big East history.

SETON HALL RECORD BOOKS: McCarthy finished his Seton Hall career ranking second in program history in career starts (50), fourth in innings pitched (300) and eighth in strikeouts (211).

COLLEGE ACCOLADES: 2018 All-Big East 2nd Team, 2016 All-Big East 1st Team, 2016 ABCA All-Region 2nd Team, 2015 Freshman All-American

18th IS THE CHARM: McCarthy was drafted in the 18th round of the MLB Draft in back-to-back years. Following his junior season in 2017, the right-hander was selected by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 18th round (544th overall). The Indians then took McCarthy last year, following his senior season, in the 18th round (553rd overall).

FRESHMAN & SOPHOMORE STAR: McCarthy put up his best numbers at Seton Hall during his freshman and sophomore years. He posted a 2.19 ERA his first year on campus and a 2.38 as a sophomore. All-in-all, his sophomore year was his best with career-highs in strikeouts (84), innings (102), K/9 (7.41) and K-BB (4.67).

CONTROL PITCHER: McCarthy finished his four-year college career with a 1.91 BB/9 rate and a 3.30 K-BB. He exhibited better control as a sophomore with a career-high 4.67 K-BB, made up of a career-high 7.41 K/9 rate and a 1.69 BB/9 rate that was his second-best season in that regard. McCarthy's K-BB dipped all the way down to 2.19 his junior year (46 K, 21 BB) and ticked back up his senior year to 3.25 (52 K, 16 BB).
