YESTERDAY: The Captains lost the third game in their four-game series against the Fort Wayne TinCaps, 6-4. TinCaps starter Mason Thompson struck out a career-high nine batters over five innings. He held the Captains to two runs on three hits, en route to the win. Captains starter **Francisco Perez** also had a solid outing, allowing three runs – two earned – over six innings. He struck out six, walked none and allowed five hits, but still took the loss. Austin Smith retired the final five Captains in order to earn his first save of the year. Robbie Podorsky led Fort Wayne offensively with a 4-for-4 performance that included a double, an RBI, a stolen base and two runs scored.

JUNE REVIEW: Lake County finished June with an 11-15 record. The Captains' offense averaged 4.5 runs per game and slashed .236/.307/.378. The pitching staff posted a 4.35 ERA and posted an 8.5 K/9 rate with a 2.8 K/BB rate.

NEW MAN IN TOWN: The Captains received RHP **Nick Sandlin** from the rookie-level Arizona League yesterday. Sandlin, whom the Indians selected in the second round (67th overall), is the first 2018 draft pick to join the Captains. Sandlin was named the **Perfect Game** National Pitcher of the Year, Conference USA Pitcher of the Year and Conference USA Michael L. Slive Male Athlete of the Year this season after leading the nation in WHIP (0.71) and ERA (1.06) at Southern Mississippi. Sandlin and Captains LHP **Kirk McCarty** were teammates at Southern Mississippi. The last time the Captains received a player who had been drafted that year was in 2016 when OF **Andrew Calica** (11th round) and LHP **Ben Krauth** (16th round) joined Lake County.

WALK-OFF MAGIC: Nine of the Captains' 19 victories at Classic Park this year have come on walk-offs. Lake County beat Fort Wayne on Opening Night with a walk-off single by **Jorma Rodriguez**. The Captains have won two games on walk-off homers (**Oscar Gonzalez**: May 14 vs. SB & **Ulysses Cantu**: May 25 vs. GL). Lake County has also won two games on walk-off passed balls (April 23 vs. WM & May 5 vs. BEL). **Todd Isaacs** hit a walk-off, two-run single to beat Dayton on June 5. Isaacs then hit a walk-off single in the 10th inning against Lansing on June 12. On June 14, **J.J. Berardi** hit a walk-off single in the 10th to beat Lansing again. **Nolan Jones** beat Fort Wayne with a walk-off single in the 11th on June 29. The Captains had only one walk-off win in 2017.

THE HERO: **Todd Isaacs** has had a hand in four of the Captains' nine walk-off victories. He scored the game-winning runs on Opening Night (single by **Jorma Rodriguez** vs. FW) and on April 23 (passed ball vs. WM). He then produced walk-off singles against Dayton and Lansing on June 5 and June 12. Last year, Isaacs delivered the Captains' only walk-off win with a home run against Bowling Green to clinch the 1,000th win in team history.

HOME COOKING: The Captains have posted a 19-19 record at Classic Park, but are 13-29 on the road this season. Lake County has a run differential of -19 at home and a -54 run differential on the road.

HOME RUN KINGS: The Captains lead the Midwest League in home runs with 68. Cedar Rapids is in second with 65 homers. Lake County, however, is 12th in runs scored with 334.

WHO'S HOT?

- **Nolan Jones:** Led the team with a .852 OPS in June (minimum 15 games). Leads the team and is 19th in the Midwest League with a 130 WRC+.
- **Oscar Gonzalez:** Has gone 7-for-20 (.350) in his last six games with a home run, a double and a triple. Slashed .284/.320/.474 during June and led the team that month with four homers and 18 RBI.
- **Josh Rolette:** Since being activated from the Disabled List on June 12, Rolette has slashed .324/.385/.471 (.855 OPS). He hit his first career home run on June 27 at Lansing.

MIDWEST LEAGUE ALL-STARS: Three Captains were named to the Midwest League Eastern Division All-Star Team for 2018: OF **Will Benson**, LHP **Kyle Nelson** and RHP **Tommy DeJuneas** (DL). Benson and Nelson played in the 54th MWL All-Star Classic in Lansing, while DeJuneas could not play due to injury. Benson started in right field and went 1-for-2 with a single. Nelson retired both batters he faced in the seventh inning. He struck out Quad Cities' Bryan De La Cruz looking and got Clinton's Ryan Costello to line out to centerfield.

HOME RUN DERBY: **Will Benson** finished second in the 2018 Midwest League Home Run Derby on June 19 in Lansing. Benson hit 23 home runs, but was bested by Bowling Green catcher Ronaldo Hernandez. The Hot Rods' backstop won the final round with 13 home runs against Benson's 10.

DRAFT REPORT: The Indians have now signed 27 selections from the 2018 MLB Amateur Draft. Cleveland's Competitive Balance Round A selection (41st overall), RHP **Lenny Torres, Jr** is the highest draft selection the Indians have signed to date.

LAST TIME OUT: Mejia allowed five runs – two earned – over 3.2 innings on Tuesday and took the loss at Lansing. The right-hander had allowed one run over the first three innings, but the fourth inning unraveled after one unfortunate play. With runners on second and third and two outs, Norberto Obeso chopped a grounder up the middle and Mejia tried to make the play with his bare hand, but saw the ball glance off his hand and toward third for an infield single. A run scored on the play, which might have been a routine grounder to shortstop, and the inning continued with a hit-by-pitch, an error and a two-run single that ultimately knocked Mejia out of the ballgame. The Captains nearly came back from an 8-1 deficit and lost, 8-7.

HOMERLESS STREAK ENDS: Entering 2018, Mejia had allowed just one home run in his career. It came on June 13, 2015 when Mejia was in the Dominican Summer League and surrendered a long ball to Orlando Marquez of the Astros' affiliate. The right-hander did not allow another home run until exactly three years later, on June 13, 2018, when Ryan Noda of the Lansing Lugnuts homered in the third inning and Brock Lundquist homered two batters later. Noda's homer ended Mejia's streak of 57 consecutive appearances without a home run allowed.

DISABLED LIST STINT: Mejia was on the Disabled List from April 20 to June 7 with an arm injury.

LAST SEASON: Began 2017 with Mahoning Valley, but moved to the AZL at the end of June after just two appearances for the Scrappers. He returned to Mahoning Valley at the start of August and remained there for the rest of the season. In the Arizona League, Mejia posted a 3.14 ERA over 10 appearances in the bullpen. With Mahoning Valley, he struck out 31 in 22.2 innings against just five walks.

SWING AND MISS: Posted the 3rd-highest swinging strike percentage (22.1%) in all of Short Season MiLB last year (min. 20 IP)

LOW BABIP: Posted the lowest BABIP (.146) in all of Short Season MiLB last year (min. 20 IP). This is, perhaps, thanks to a GB% of 65.9% that led Mahoning Valley and ranked 9th-highest in all of Short Season MiLB (min. 20 IP)

Hockey Background: Jones played hockey and baseball growing up and played club hockey with the sons of former NHLers Keith Primeau, Daniel Briere and Chris Pronger, among others. Jones' brother, Peyton, is the starting goalie for Penn State University's hockey team and became the program's all-time wins leader this past December.
Bulked Up: Jones added 30 lbs to his frame ahead of his senior high school season. He credits a strict weight-training program with his brother, Peyton.
