## NEWS & NOTES

**FRIDAY NIGHT:** The TinCaps saw a 3-0 lead turn into a 6-3 loss to the Loons. **Luis Roman** and **Blake Hunt** had RBI singles in the second and third innings, while **Agustin Ruiz** went 3-for-3 with a hit by pitch.

**HAIL TO THE VICTORS:** University of Michigan pitching coach **Chris Fetter** is a former TinCaps pitcher. Fetter, a Carmel, Ind., native and Carmel HS alum, graduated from Michigan in 2009, was drafted by the Padres in the 9th round, and then pitched in 7 games for the 'Caps later that summer (6 starts, including 2 in the postseason as Fort Wayne won the Midwest League title). Fetter returned to the Fort in 2012 to make 3 starts and 3 relief appearances. He finished his TinCaps career with a 2.21 ERA... Fetter transitioned to the role of a coach for Double-A San Antonio in 2013 (when TinCaps manager **Anthony Contreras** spent part of that season there as a player), then worked as a scout for the Angels, became Ball State's pitching coach for the 2016 season, joined the Dodgers as a minor league pitching coordinator for 2017, and returned to Ann Arbor last year.

**HOT CAPS:** Fort Wayne has won 6 of its last 8 games—all against teams with winning records (Bowling Green, Lake County, and Great Lakes).

**X IS A FACTOR:** Infielder **Xavier Edwards** leads the MWL in batting average (.339) and ranks 2nd in OBP (.398). He has the 2nd lowest swinging strike % in the league, as he's swung and missed at only 4% of the pitches he's seen. His K% of 11% is the 5th lowest in the league. With 26 BB vs. 31 K, his 0.84 BB/K is 6th. When he's put the ball in play, 48% of the time he's hit it the opposite way—highest rate in the MWL. Meanwhile, he's posted a BA of .519 this season on the first pitch of an at bat. 28 of Xavier's league-leading 83 hits (33%) have come while swinging in an 0-0 count.

**MAKING HIS MARK:** Infielder **Tucupita Marcano** has struck out in only 10% of his plate appearances this season, the 4th lowest K% in the MWL. He's swung and missed at just 4% of the pitches he's seen, the 5th lowest rate in the MWL.

**LITTLE POWER:** Outfielder **Grant Little** doubled twice on Thursday, marking the first time he's had multiple extra-base hits in a game this season. Little has struck out at a just 14% rate this season, 9th lowest in the MWL.

**POWER SURGE:** Outfielder **Agustin Ruiz** has launched 3 homers over his last 10 games after not homering in his first 51 games of the season. His 38 RBIs on the year rank 10th in the MWL... Ruiz matched his career-best with 3 hits Friday night, his 3rd 3-hit game of the year and 2nd in a 5-game span.

**HOT CURRY:** In 22 games since May 26, outfielder **Michael Curry** has slashed .319/.415/.493 (.908 OPS) with 6 doubles, 2 home runs, and 11 RBIs. Curry is 7th in the MWL in OPS during this time.

**CATCHING ON:** Catcher **Juan Fernandez** started his season 0-for-18 at the plate but is 28-for-80 (.350) since. He's currently on a season-best 11-game on-base streak.

**SOUTHPAW SUCCESS:** Infielder **Luis Almanzar** has hit .269 with a .406 OBP versus lefties this season (compared to .202/.284 vs. RHP). As a team, the 'Caps have slashed .252/.348/.327 (.675 OPS) vs. LHP and .243/.326/.345 (.671 OPS) vs. RHP. For context, in the 16-team MWL, that OPS vs. LHP ranks 8th, while their OPS vs. RHP ranks 10th.

**MELLY-ON:** Infielder **Kelvin Melean** has hit safely in 4 consecutive games after he went 5 games in a row without a hit (which followed 4 straight with a hit.)

**RECORD-SETTER:** Anthony Contreras has won 228 games as manager of the TinCaps since he started in 2016. On Thursday he surpassed **Doug Dascenzo** (who won 227 games from 2007-09) for the most wins by a manager in franchise history. More important to AC than wins, since he began managing in 2014 in the Arizona League, he has had 19 players who've reached the big leagues. (Contreras managed Short-Season Tri-City in 2015.)

**ALL-STARS:** The TinCaps were represented in Tuesday's Midwest League All-Star game by **Xavier Edwards**, who started at second base, plus starting pitcher **Ryan Weathers** and reliever **Henry Henry**. Edwards off with a single and stole second base. He finished 1-for-3, while Henry tossed 0.1 scoreless innings.

**FIRST HALF REVIEW:** The TinCaps went 33-35 in the first half, finishing in 5th place in the 8-team Eastern Division. Their best record was at 6-2, while they were as many as 7 games below .500 at 15-22 after May 15. Offensively, the 'Caps slashed .245/.331/.343 as they averaged 4.19 runs per game. In the 16-team MWL, Fort Wayne ranked tied for 9th in runs/game, 6th in AVG, 5th in OBP, 11th in SLG, and 9th in OPS. Their 61 stolen bases ranked 8th... On the mound, the TinCaps' 4.02 ERA ranked 10th. They had the fewest BB/9 (2.9), tied for the 6th most K/9 (9.2), and had the best BB/K (3.12).

**ANOTHER HONOR FOR PARKVIEW FIELD:** Parkview Field won the Best of the Ballparks Low-A fan vote through Ballpark Digest, becoming the first ballpark to win the fan-voted honor 3 times. The home of the TinCaps beat out the home of the South Atlantic League's Augusta GreenJackets, SRP Park.

**FOREVER YOUNG:** The average age for a TinCaps position player thus far has been 20.2, the youngest in the Midwest League (MWL average: 21.2). The average age for a 'Caps pitcher is 20.9, also the youngest (MWL average: 21.9). This marks the 6th consecutive year Fort Wayne has had the league's most youthful lineup, going back to 2014. The TinCaps had the youngest pitching staff in the league in 2016 and ranked tied for 2nd youngest in '18, while ranking 2nd youngest in '12, '13, and '17.

**260 TO THE SHOW:** 182 former Fort Wayne players have reached the big leagues since the franchise was founded in 1993. 9 'Caps alums have broken through this year with SS **Fernando Tatis Jr.**, RHP **Chris Paddack**, LHP **Nick Margevicius**, RHP **Pedro Avila**, RHP **Gerardo Reyes**, INF **Ty France**, C **Austin Allen**, and LHP **Logan Allen** appearing for the Padres, plus INF **Josh VanMeter** with the Reds.

**WELCOME BACK:** 12 of the team's 24 active players appeared in at least 1 game with the TinCaps before 2019: LHP **Joey Cantillo**, C **Juan Fernandez**, RHP **Henry Henry**, INF **Justin Lopez**, RHP **Adrian Martinez**, INF **Kelvin Melean**, RHP **Gabe Mosser**, RHP **Jose Quezada**, OF **Agustin Ruiz**, RHP **Austin Smith**, LHP **Ryan Weathers**, and RHP **Carlos Belen**, who was a corner infielder with the 'Caps in 2016 and '18.

**IN THE DUGOUT:** Anthony Contreras is back for his 4th season as TinCaps manager, becoming the first skipper in the franchise's 27-year history to lead the team for more than 3 years... Hitting coach **Jonathan Mathews** (2nd season), fielding coach **Jhony Carvajal** (3rd), athletic trainer **Allyse Kramer** (3rd), and strength coach **Sam Hoffman** (2nd) are also back. **Matt Williams** is the team's new pitching coach, succeeding **Burt Hooton**—the club's pitching coach for the last 6 seasons—who's missing the season as he recovers from knee surgery in March.

**PADRES ON DECK:** MLB.com, Baseball America, and ESPN have rated San Diego's farm system as baseball's best. The 'Caps have 4 players on MLB.com's Top 30 list for the Pads (see list on Page 1). Not to be overlooked, ESPN's Keith Law ranks INF **Justin Lopez** at No. 19. He also notes RHP **Efraín Contreras** as another to watch with OF **Agustin Ruiz** & LHP **Joey Cantillo**.

**VAMOS TINCAPS:** A team of Padres minor league prospects ventured to Mexico City to play the Diablos Rojos del México and open up Estadio Alfredo Harp Helú, which is named after a member of the Padres' ownership team, with a pair of games March 23-24. Both games drew a sell-out crowd of 20,000+ fans and Mexican President **Andrés Manuel López Obrador** threw out the ceremonial first pitch. LHP **Ryan Weathers** started Game 1, while RHP **Efraín Contreras** and **Adrian Martinez** also pitched, joined by catcher **Blake Hunt**, infielders **Xavier Edwards**, **Justin Lopez**, **Tucupita Marcano**, and outfielders **Grant Little** and **Agustin Ruiz**. The Padres on Deck team impressively won both games.

**CAPS ON MiLB.TV:** For the first time, this season TinCaps home games are available to watch on MiLB.TV (in addition to being broadcast around Indiana for Xfinity customers on Comcast Network 81). Fans can save \$10 on their subscription by using the promo code TINCAPS.

**ON THE FRANCHISE:** The franchise was founded in 1993 as the Fort Wayne Wizards. The team was affiliated with the Minnesota Twins from 1993-98. The organization has been affiliated with the San Diego Padres since '99. The Wizards played at Memorial Stadium, about 3.5 miles north of Downtown Fort Wayne. The team moved into Parkview Field in 2009 and rebranded as the TinCaps, paying homage to John Chapman aka Johnny Appleseed, who's buried in Fort Wayne.
