TODAY'S GAME: The Mississippi Braves and the Pensacola Blue Wahoos will meet for the fifth time at Trustmark Park tonight in what will be the series finale between the two teams. With the series tied 2-2, tonight's game will be a rubber match between the two teams. RHP Enderson Franco (0-0, 4.32) who has spent most of his 2018 season as a reliever out of the M-Braves bullpen, will get the start for the M-Braves tonight. Franco's mound mate will be Pensacola right-hander Wyatt Strahan (1-1, 5.00). For Franco, his start against the Blue Wahoos tonight will be his first of the season. For Strahan, his start tonight will be his third with the Blue Wahoos in 2018.

LAST TIME OUT: The Mississippi Braves earned their second consecutive victory against the Pensacola Blue Wahoos on Thursday night to even the series 2-2. M-Braves starting pitcher, Wes Parsons had his best outing of the season. The Clarksville, TN native tossed 4.0 innings of shutout baseball, allowed just one hit, one walk and struck out seven. Parsons' seven strikeouts on Thursday night are a season high for the right-hander in 2018. Mississippi native, Austin Riley led the way for the M-Braves offensively. The M-Braves third baseman went 3-3 at the plate with two doubles, a single, a walk and a RBI. Riley leads the M-Braves with a .408 AVG (20-49), three homeruns, two triples, six doubles and 13 RBI.

THIS DAY IN BRAVES HISTORY: In 1982, with a 4-2 win over the Reds, the Braves record their 12th consecutive victory to establish a major-league record for the most victories from the beginning of the season. The previous mark had been set a year earlier by the Oakland A's.

HAMMER TIME: Jackson, MS native **Chris Maloney** enters his first season as the M-Braves manager and is the seventh skipper in franchise history.

- Maloney attended Jackson's St. Joseph High School and graduated from Mississippi State University in 1983.
- Maloney spent the previous six years on the St. Louis Cardinals Major League coaching staff as the team's third base coach (2016-July 2017) and first base coach (2012-15).
- Prior to joining the Cardinals, Maloney was the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) manager for five seasons (2007-11), leading the team to winning records in four of his five seasons.
- Maloney ranks ninth among active minor league managers in wins with 1,350 entering the 2018 season.

PROSPECTING: The Atlanta Braves farm system was ranked by MLB Pipeline as No. 2 in Major League Baseball. The M-Braves roster features two of the Top 100 in RHP **Kyle Wright** (No. 30) and INF **Austin Riley** (No. 97). The roster has six of the Top 30 Atlanta prospects in Wright (No. 2), Riley (No. 8), RHP **Touki Toussaint** (No. 11), C **Alex Jackson** (No. 14), OF **Travis Demeritte** (No. 21), LHP **Ricardo Sanchez** (No. 27).

VIDEO BOARD: In its second season above the LF wall, at 68 feet wide by 28 feet high (1,904 square feet), the state-of-the-art Panasonic HD video board is approximately four-times larger than the previous video display at Trustmark Park (2005-2016). The board is the largest single display in the Southern League and the largest in Central and South Mississippi.

TODAY'S GAME

- Enderson Franco who has made four appearances out of the M-Braves bullpen in 2018, will make his first start of the 2018 season with the M-Braves tonight in the M-Braves series finale against the Pensacola Blue Wahoos.

LAST TIME OUT

- Franco's last appearance with the M-Braves came on April 16 against the Pensacola Blue Wahoos. The right-hander tossed 2.0 innings of relief, allowed six hits, four runs, all earned, walked one and struck out two.

ACQUIRED

- Selected by the Braves from the Miami Marlins in the minor league phase of the 2015 Rule 5 Draft on December 10, 2015.

2017 SEASON

- Appeared between three levels of the Braves system, combining to go 6-6 with a 3.86 ERA (52 ER/121.1 IP) between Rome (A), Gwinnett (AAA) and Florida (A+). Made two relief appearances with Rome before transferring to Gwinnett on 4/22. Made two starts with the G-Braves before being assigned to Florida on 5/7 and making 19 starts over the remainder of the season. Franco's 106.2 innings with Florida paced the FireFrogs staff, and his 121.1 combined innings were 10th most among Braves farmhands.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2016 SEASON

- Played his first season in the organization with High-A Carolina and established new career highs in appearances (26) and innings (144.0) while going 6-12 with a 4.69 ERA (75 ER/144.0 IP) over 25 starts. Franco's 144.0 innings of work were fourth most by a Braves farmhand on the season. Tossed the second shutout of his career in his final start of the season, holding Winston-Salem to just three hits and two walks over 7.0 innings in a 5-0 Mudcats win.

2015 SEASON

- Combined to make a then career-high 25 starts between two clubs and two organizations, going 6-12 with a 6.29 ERA (75 ER/126.0 IP) between Bowling Green (A) of the Rays system and Greensboro (A) of the Marlins. Went 5-6 with a 3.89 ERA in 13 starts for Bowling Green before being acquired by the Marlins in exchange for an international bonus pool slot on 7/2.

2014 SEASON

- Made 13 starts with Low-A Hudson Valley and produced a career-low 3.28 ERA and a career-best seven wins in his first season in the Tampa Bay organization.

2013 SEASON

- Went 2-5 with a 5.05 ERA (29 ER/51.2 IP) at rookie-level Greenville. Following the season, was selected by the Tampa Bay Rays from the Houston Astros in the minor-league phase of the 2013 Rule 5 draft on 12/12.
