TODAY'S GAME: The Mississippi Braves will face the Mobile BayBears for the first time in 2018 tonight. After wrapping up a five-game home series with the Pensacola Blue Wahoos last night, the M-Braves hit the road and traveled to Mobile, AL where they will take on the Mobile BayBears in a five-game road series at Hank Aaron Stadium. RHP Kyle Wright (0-2, 4.15) who was selected by the Atlanta Braves as the fifth overall pick in last year's draft will be the M-Braves Saturday night starter. Wright's counterpart on the mound will be Mobile right-hander, Jose Rodriguez (1-0, 1.86).

LAST TIME OUT: The Mississippi Braves were defeated by the Pensacola Blue Wahoos by a final score of 5-0 on Friday night. Much like previous nights, Pensacola took an early lead that they would not surrender, after scoring three runs in the top of the second inning. RHP Enderson Franco (0-1, 6.00) suffered the loss for the M-Braves. Pensacola right-hander, Wyatt Strahan (2-1, 3.00) earned the win and also finished his night at the plate by going 2-for-2 with an RBI. Alay Lago provided a bright spot for the M-Braves despite Friday night's loss. The M-Braves second baseman went 2-for-3 at the plate with a walk and raised his batting average from .275 to .302.

THIS DAY IN BRAVES HISTORY: In 2002, Atlanta shortstop Rafael Furcal ties a major league record, which was last previously done by White Sox outfielder Lance Johnson in 1995, by hitting three triples in a game. The last Braves player to hit three three-baggers in one contest was Danny O'Connell, who accomplished the feat at County Stadium in 1956 when the team played in Milwaukee.

HAMMER TIME: Jackson, MS native **Chris Maloney** enters his first season as the M-Braves manager and is the seventh skipper in franchise history.

- Maloney attended Jackson's St. Joseph High School and graduated from Mississippi State University in 1983.
- Maloney spent the previous six years on the St. Louis Cardinals Major League coaching staff as the team's third base coach (2016-July 2017) and first base coach (2012-15).
- Prior to joining the Cardinals, Maloney was the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) manager for five seasons (2007-11), leading the team to winning records in four of his five seasons.
- Maloney ranks ninth among active minor league managers in wins with 1,350 entering the 2018 season.

PROSPECTING: The Atlanta Braves farm system was ranked by MLB Pipeline as No. 2 in Major League Baseball. The M-Braves roster features two of the Top 100 in RHP **Kyle Wright** (No. 30) and INF **Austin Riley** (No. 97). The roster has six of the Top 30 Atlanta prospects in Wright (No. 2), Riley (No. 8), RHP **Touki Toussaint** (No. 11), C **Alex Jackson** (No. 14), OF **Travis Demeritte** (No. 21), LHP **Ricardo Sanchez** (No. 27).

VIDEO BOARD: In its second season above the LF wall, at 68 feet wide by 28 feet high (1,904 square feet), the state-of-the-art Panasonic HD video board is approximately four-times larger than the previous video display at Trustmark Park (2005-2016). The board is the largest single display in the Southern League and the largest in Central and South Mississippi.

TODAY'S GAME

- Atlanta Braves No. 2 overall prospect, Kyle Wright, will make his fourth start, second road start of the 2018 season with the Mississippi Braves tonight against the Mobile BayBears in Mobile, AL. The right-hander from Huntsville, AL will look to secure his first win of the 2018 season tonight against the BayBears.

LAST TIME OUT

- Wright suffered his second loss of the season on April 16 against the Pensacola Blue Wahoos. In his outing against the Blue Wahoos, Wright pitched 1.0 innings, allowed four hits, four runs, all earned, one homerun, issued two walks, and struck out one.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Selected by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (fifth overall) of the 2017 draft out of Vanderbilt.
- Ranked as the No. 30 overall prospect in MLB.com's Top 100 ranking. In the Atlanta Braves organization ranked No. 4 according to Baseball America and Baseball Prospectus and No. 2 by MLB.com.
- Pitched three years for Vanderbilt University, and in 61 career games, 35 starts, went 19-11 with a 2.78 ERA (79 ER/255.1 IP) and 290 strikeouts.
- Named first team All-SEC by the league's coaches and a Second Team All-America by Baseball America after going 5-6 with a 3.40 ERA (39 ER/103.1 IP) over 16 starts for the Commodores in 2017.
- Became the fifth Vanderbilt pitcher drafted in the first round over the last four years, while at least one Vanderbilt pitcher has been selected in the draft's first two rounds for seven consecutive seasons...Is the second Vanderbilt pitcher drafted by the Braves in the first round, joining LHP Mike Minor, who the club chose seventh overall in 2009.

NOTES

- Made his professional debut with rookie-level GCL Braves and Single-A Florida, going a combined 0-1 with a 2.65 ERA in nine games, all starts...Fanned 18 while walking six.
- Started his organizational debut on 7/17 vs. GCL Yankees West, going 1.2 innings and allowing one run while striking out three...Pitched twice more for the GCL club, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings each time.
- Made his Single-A debut on 8/1 at Dunedin, retiring all six batters he faced in the start.
- Finished his first season on 9/1 at Daytona...Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings, allowing one hit with three strikeouts.
