Series (W-L-T):	0-1-0	Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds hit the road for their first trip of the season beginning tonight in Round Rock, Texas against the Express. It's the first of 16 matchups between the two rivals in 2019. Tonight, left-hander Taylor Hearn starts for Nashville against right-hander Forrest Whitley for Round Rock.

Series Sweeps:	0-0	Taylor Hearn: 24-year-old Taylor Hearn starts for the Sounds tonight. He is currently ranked by MLB Pipeline as the #11 prospect in the Texas organization. The left-hander is making his second start of the season after getting the ball for the Sounds on Opening Day. Hearn split last year between Double-A Altoona and Double-A Frisco after the Texas Rangers acquired him from the Pittsburgh Pirates in a July 31 trade for reliever Keone Kela. In 24 starts in 2018, he went 4-8 with a 3.49 ERA. Hearn is in his fifth professional season and has a career mark of 11-21 with a 3.54 ERA in 74 games (61 starts). He was drafted by the Washington Nationals in the 5th round of the 2015 MLB Draft out of Oklahoma Baptist University.

vs. LHP:	0-0	Forrest Whitley: 21-year-old Forrest Whitley starts for the Express tonight. He is currently ranked by MLB Pipeline as the #1 prospect in the Houston organization. Whitley is making his 2019 debut. The San Antonio native pitched only 26.1 innings in 2018 due to being suspended for 50 games without pay by the Commissioner's Office for a violation of the Minor League Drug Prevention and Treatment Program. Whitley did later pitch in the Arizona Fall League where he led the circuit in strikeouts. In his 26.1 innings with Double-A Corpus Christi, he went 0-2 with a 3.76 ERA in 8 starts. He allowed 15 hits and 11 walks to go along with 34 strikeouts. Whitley is 6-8 with a 3.29 ERA in 39 games (32 starts) in his minor league career. The Astros drafted him in the first round (17th overall) of the 2016 MLB Draft out of Alamo Heights (TX) High School.

Last Outing: Hearn was tagged with a loss in his Triple-A debut against Iowa on April 4. The southpaw went 5.0 innings and allowed 4 runs (all earned) on 6 hits. Hearn did not walk a batter and struck out 9, just 1 shy of his career-high.

Against Opponent: Hearn has never faced Round Rock in his career.
