Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds continue their abbreviated three-game series this afternoon against the Omaha Storm Chasers. Omaha captured last night's opener 6-2 behind a solid outing from Trevor Oaks. Today right-hander Frankie Montas starts for the Sounds against right-hander Clay Bucholz for the Storm Chasers.

Frankie Montas: 25-year-old Frankie Montas starts for the Sounds in today's matinee. The right-hander is making his fourth start of the season. After a shaky first start, Montas has allowed two runs in his last two starts combined. He went 0-2 with a 5.22 ERA in 9 games (8 starts) with Nashville in 2017 and went 1-1 with a 7.03 ERA in 23 games (0 starts) with Oakland. He is ranked by *Baseball America* as Oakland's #21 prospect. Montas has a career minor league record of 16-28 with a 3.94 ERA. The Sainagua, Dominican Republic native was traded to Oakland along with Jharel Cotton and Grant Holmes from the Los Angeles Dodgers in exchange for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick on August 1, 2016.

Clay Bucholz: 33-year-old Clay Bucholz gets the ball for the Storm Chasers. The right-hander is making his first start of the season for Omaha. Bucholz began the season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas and made one start for the Travelers. He threw 4.2 shutout innings and allowed just one hit while walking two and striking out five. Bucholz made two starts for Philadelphia in 2017 before undergoing season-ending surgery to repair a torn flexor tendon in his right forearm. The Nederland, Texas native is a two-time All-Star with Boston and won the 2013 World Series with the Red Sox. He signed a minor league contract with Kansas City on March 19, 2018. Bucholz was originally drafted by Boston in the supplemental round (42nd overall) of the 2005 MLB Draft out of Angelina College.

2018 Standings: The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Southern Division standings in 2018: First: 1, Second: 7, Third: 8, Fourth: 0.

Get Low: Nashville's lowest ERA in a single month since 2005 came in April 2006 when the pitching staff posted a 2.79 mark. Currently Nashville boasts a PCL-best 2.46 ERA.

Get Through the First: Today's starter Frankie Montas has allowed six runs in his three starts this season. All six of the runs have come in the first inning including four in his season debut in which Montas failed to get out of the first frame. His first inning ERA is 16.87 (2.2 IP/5 ER). Six of the eight hits he has surrendered and three of his four walks have all come in the first inning as well.

Save The 'Pen: While the Sounds would like Montas to eat up some innings today, they may have to rely heavily on their bullpen once again. The last time Montas pitched more than 4.0 innings in a game was August 21, 2015 when he lasted 5.0 innings with Double-A Birmingham. He has appeared in 50 games and made 17 starts since then.

Forget Being PC, Be More Offensive: The Sounds bats have had a hard time producing runs at times in the early part of 2018. The team scored three or fewer runs for the 11th time in 16 games last night and are 13th in the PCL in runs scored with 60. Nashville is 3-8 when failing to score four runs in a game.

Boss Man Boyd: BJ Boyd went 1-for-4 last night to extend his on-base streak to a team-high 11-games. Since the streak began April 9 he is batting .366 (15-for-41) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 11 RBI, and drawn 5 walks. Boyd's 11-game streak is tied for the 7th longest active streak in the PCL. The seven-game hitting streak he is currently on is also tied for the 7th longest active streak in the PCL.

Struggling Mateo: The Sounds leadoff man has struggled setting the table recently. In his last seven games Jorge Mateo is 4-for-29 including a career-long 0-for-19 stretch. He has struck out eight times in that span.

You Don't Have to Earn It: The Sounds yielded two unearned runs last night and have now allowed 17 unearned runs on the season. Only Round Rock (24) have surrendered more unearned runs than Nashville in the PCL.

ERA Leaders: Nashville pitchers have the best ERA in the Pacific Coast League at 2.46. Both James Naile and Jeremy Bleich allowed their first runs of the season last night but six pitchers for Nashville have yet to allow an earned run. The list includes Daniel Gossett (8.0 IP), Bobby Wahl (6.0 IP), Josh Lucas (4.2 IP), Lou Trivino (4.1 IP), Jake Sanchez (2.1 IP), and Melvin Mercedes (1.0 IP).

Bullish 'Pen: Nashville's bullpen has been dominant to begin 2018. Through the first 16 games of the season, the 'pen has a 1.88 ERA (67.0 IP/14 ER). The relievers have allowed 44 hits and 23 walks while recording 61 strikeouts.

Last Outing: Montas last pitched on April 16 against the Omaha Storm Chasers in what was his third start of the season. He tossed three innings and yielded two runs, one earned, on three hits while walking two and fanning two. The right-hander threw 56 pitches, 35 for strikes.

Against Opponent: Montas has faced the Storm Chasers twice in his career. On July 15, 2017, he started against Omaha and tossed four scoreless innings in Nashville's 11-5 win. Montas allowed two hits, did not walk a batter, and struck out five in the no-decision. He also faced them once this season in his most recent start.

- Tonight's start is the fourth of the season for Montas.

- Ranked by *Baseball America* as Oakland's #21 prospect entering the 2018 season.
- Began 2017 on Oakland's Opening Day roster, his first MLB Opening Day roster.
- Placed on Nashville's 7-day disabled list with an oblique strain on August 13, 2017 and missed the remainder of the season.
- Has been traded three times in his career - most recently on August 1, 2016 as part of the trade that sent Rich Hill and Josh Reddick to Los Angeles (NL).
- Started the 2016 season in the Dodgers organization where he pitched for Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Oklahoma City.
- Was named a 2015 Southern League All-Star.
- Pitched for the World Team in the 2015 All-Star Futures Game in Cincinnati.
