**Today's Game:** The Nashville Sounds travel to Oklahoma City to begin a four-game series with the Dodgers tonight. It's the first of 16 meetings between the two clubs, and first of two trips to Bricktown (August 19-22) for the Sounds this year. Tonight, right-hander Wei-Chieh Huang starts for the Sounds against right-hander Dennis Santana for the Dodgers.

**Wei-Chieh Huang:** 25-year-old Wei-Chieh Huang starts for Nashville in game of the series tonight. The right-hander is making his Triple-A debut after bypassing the level earlier this season in a promotion from Double-A Frisco to Texas. Huang was 1-0 with a 1.86 ERA in 6 games (1 start) for the Roughriders. In 9.2 innings, he allowed 7 hits and 2 walks while racking up 14 strikeouts. Huang's last outing was on May 1 in a relief role with the Rangers. He tossed a scoreless inning in Texas' 7-5 loss to the Pittsburgh Pirates. He has appeared in two games with the Rangers and is 0-0 with a 2.70 ERA in 3.1 innings. Huang split his 2018 between Advanced-A Visalia, Double-A Jackson and Double-A Frisco, compiling a 7-3 mark with a 3.33 ERA in 38 games (2 starts). The Rangers acquired Huang in a July 31, 2018 trade with the Arizona Diamondbacks.

**Dennis Santana:** 23-year-old Dennis Santana starts for Oklahoma City in tonight's series opener. The right-hander is 0-1 with a 7.04 ERA in 2 starts with the Dodgers this year. Santana was placed on the 7-day injured list on April 26 and reinstated today. His last appearance was a start against the San Antonio Missions on April 25. He allowed 2 runs on 5 hits in 5.1 innings in Oklahoma City's 8-3 loss. Santana got a no-decision after striking out 6 and throwing 71 pitches, 50 for strikes. He also has 3 appearances with Los Angeles and has owns a 0-0 record with a 7.20 ERA in a relief role. He split his 2018 between Double-A Tulsa (8 games), Oklahoma City (2 games) and Los Angeles (1 game).

**2019 Standings:** The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Northern Division standings in 2019: First: 1, Second: 0, Third: 4, Fourth: 27.

**Searching for a Winning Streak:** A win tonight would give the Sounds their first 3-game winning streak of the season. Nashville's last back-to-back wins prior to their current was April 26 and 28 at Iowa. They lost the next game, 19-5.

**Davidson's Run-Producing Night:** Last night's 4-RBI game for Matt Davidson was the first of its kind by a Sounds hitter in 2019. Davidson leads the club with 6 multi-RBI games and his 24 on the season is tied for 14th-most in the Pacific Coast League. He also added his team-leading 9th 2-out RBI and 2 more go-ahead RBI to give him a team-high 5.

**Granite is Perfect on the Base Paths:** Outfielder Zack Granite notched his 5th stolen base of the season last night. He's one of only five players in the PCL to have at least 5 stolen bases without being caught. He joins Omaha's Brett Phillips (9), Omaha's Humberto Arteaga (6), Las Vegas' Franklin Barreto (5) and Round Rock's Kyle Tucker (5).

**Comeback Kids:** The win last night was the second consecutive come-from-behind victory for the Sounds. Nashville trailed 4-0 on in game two of Sunday's doubleheader and then 3-1 last night, before coming back to grab wins in both games. It's only the second time the Sounds have won a game when trailing after six innings. On April 12 at San Antonio they trailed 1-0 after six and won 7-3.

**Nine Straight for Willie:** With another base hit last night, Willie Calhoun has hit safely in 9 consecutive games for the Sounds. During the 9-game streak, he's hitting .355 (11-for-33) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 4 home runs, 9 RBI and 6 walks. It's tied for the 4th-longest active streak in the Pacific Coast League behind Iowa's Donnie Dewees (11), El Paso's Jose Pirela (10 games) and Fresno's Taylor Gushue (10).

**Words of Wisdom:** Nashville infielder Patrick Wisdom has played in 11 games for the Sounds in 2019 and has reached safely in each of the them. Despite his .171 average, his on-base percentage is .370. Going back to the 2018 season, Wisdom has reached safely in 18 consecutive Triple-A games.

**On the Road Again:** Having played only 12 road games so far this season (2nd-fewest in the Pacific Coast League), the Sounds embark on a 13-game, 14-day road trip beginning tonight. Nashville is hitting .231 on the road compared to .224 at home. Despite playing in 7 less road games, the Sounds have 22 home runs on the road compared to 14 at home. The team's OPS is .775 on the road at .666 at First Tennessee Park.

**Carpenter Stays Clean:** Nashville reliever David Carpenter turned in his 8th-consecutive scoreless outing last night and has not allowed a run since joining the club on April 12. The right-hander has tossed 1.0 inning in each of his 8 appearances and has allowed only 5 hits while collecting 5 strikeouts. Opponents are hitting .200 against him while Carpenter is a perfect 4-for-4 in save situations.

**The Dreaded Big Inning:** A large part of Nashville's tough start can be attributed to allowing the big inning. Sounds' opponents have manufactured 28 innings of 3 or more runs in the first 31 games of the season. Nashville pitching has allowed 13 3-run innings, 8 4-run innings, 2 5-run innings, 1 6-run inning, 1 7-run inning, 1 8-run inning, 1 9-run inning and the 15-run 1st inning by Iowa on April 28. On the other side, Nashville hitters have produced only 11 innings of at least 3 runs. The offensive high was the 7 runs scored in the 8th inning on April 12 at San Antonio.

**Jason Wood at the Helm:** Jason Wood was named the 29th manager in Nashville Sounds franchise history on January 8, 2019. The California native is managing the Rangers' Triple-A team for the fifth consecutive season and has a career managerial mark of 592-557. As part of an 18-year professional playing career, Wood played for the Sounds in 2000 and 2001 and is now the second former Sounds player to return and manage the club (Marty Brown, a player in 1988-89, a manager in 2001-02).
