**Tonight's Game:** The Nashville Sounds play game two-of-five at Round Rock for the final leg of the three-city road trip. It's the third of four meetings between the two teams in 2019. Tonight, right-hander Tim Dillard starts for Nashville against right-hander Cy Sneed for Round Rock.

**Tim Dillard:** 35-year-old Tim Dillard starts for the Sounds today. The right-hander is 1-2 with a 5.93 ERA in 10 games (3 starts) in 2019. Dillard last pitched at Memphis on May 12. He earned the loss after allowing six runs in five innings on nine hits. He struck out one batter, bringing him four strikeouts away from tying the Jamie Werly's franchise record. Nashville lost the game, 7-2, as he threw 88 pitches, 62 of them strikes. Dillard is the Nashville Sounds all-time leader in innings pitched (587.0), wins (40) and runs allowed (324) and is closing in currently second all-time in games (219), strikeouts (348), home runs allowed (47) and walks (203). In his career, Dillard has pitched in 73 big league games and 485 minor league games. He signed a minor-league free agent contract with the Texas Rangers on December 21, 2018.

**Cy Sneed:** 24-year-old Cy Sneed starts for the Express in game two of the series tonight. The right-hander is making his second appearance against Nashville this season. He threw 4.0 innings in relief on April 9 in Nashville. He allowed three hits and one run (a home run to Willie Calhoun) while walking none and striking out two. The Sounds won 3-1 in the contest. The Elko, Nevada native has covered 28.1 innings in seven games (two start) innings and has allowed 31 hits and nine walks to go along with 23 strikeouts. Sneed last pitched in a start at Omaha on May 10 where he earned the win after going 5.1 innings and allowed two runs on six hits and two walks while striking out two. In his Minor League career, Sneed is 33-34 with a 4.23 ERA in 121 games (91 starts). The Houston Astros traded for him from Milwaukee on November 19, 2015 in exchange for Jonathan Villar. He was originally drafted by the Brewers in the third round of the 2014 MLB Draft.

**2019 Standings:** The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Northern Division standings in 2019: First: 1, Second: 0, Third: 4, Fourth: 36.

**Sneed vs. Nashville:** In his appearance at Nashville on April 9, Sounds hitters went 3-for-15 (.200) against him. In the 3-1 win, Nashville hitters went as followed: Bandy, 0-1, K | Davidson, 0-2 | Granite, 0-2 | Ibanez, 1-2 | Tocci, 0-1 | White, 0-2, K.

**Yordan is Trouble:** Round Rock's Yordan Alvarez is hitting very well against Nashville this season. After going 3-for-5 with three runs, a double, two home runs and six RBI last night, he is hitting .409 (9-for-22) with three doubles, four home runs and 17 RBI in seven games against the Sounds. His four home runs are the second-most by an opponent this season (Memphis' Tyler O'Neill has six). His six RBI was the most RBI in a game against Nashville since Albuquerque's Justin Sellers had six on July 9, 2013 at Albuquerque.

**Searching for Series Win #1:** As Nashville begins its 10th series tonight, they search for series win number one. Overall in nine series, the Sounds are 0-7-2. Nashville and Round Rock have played 6 official games and the Express lead the season series, 5 games to 1.

**Eli is Streaking Again:** With two hits on Thursday at Round Rock, Eli White stretch his hitting streak to 6 games - his third streak of at least 5 games. Over his last 6, White is hitting .400 (8-for-20) with 4 runs scored, 2 home run, 3 RBI and 2 walks. His longest hitting streak of the season was 11 games from April 17-30.

**That's a Trip:** Going into tonight's game against Round Rock, the Sounds are currently 3-5 on the now 12-game road trip. Not including the May 10 suspended game in Oklahoma City, Nashville batters are hitting .276 (75-for-272) with 39 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs, 36 walks, 74 strikeouts and 7 stolen bases during the trip. Nashville pitching has a 6.45 ERA (67.0 IP/48 ER) with 80 hits allowed, 16 home runs allowed, 20 walks issued to go with 49 strikeouts.

**It's Gonna be May:** Zack Granite has enjoyed a red-hot month of May at the plate. In 14 games in May, the outfielder is hitting .368 (21-for-57) with 8 runs scored, 2 doubles, 3 RBI, 4 walks and 5 stolen bases. Granite's .368 batting average in the month is the 14th-highest in the Pacific Coast League with at least 10 games played. Granite is currently on an 12-game hitting - the longest active streak of any player currently in the PCL.

**Carpenter Stays Clean:** Nashville reliever David Carpenter turned in his 10th-consecutive scoreless outing yesterday and has not allowed a run since joining the club on April 12. The right-hander has tossed 1.0 inning in each of his 10 appearances and has allowed only 5 hits while collecting 7 strikeouts. Opponents are hitting .161 against him while Carpenter is a perfect 5-for-5 in save situations.

**Jason Wood at the Helm:** Jason Wood was named the 29th manager in Nashville Sounds franchise history on January 8, 2019. The California native is managing the Rangers' Triple-A team for the fifth consecutive season and has a career managerial mark of 595-562. As part of an 18-year professional playing career, Wood played for the Sounds in 2000 and 2001 and is now the second former Sounds player to return and manage the club (Marty Brown, a player in 1988-89, a manager in 2001-02).

**Last Outing:** Dillard earned his 40th career win with Nashville throwing 6.0 shutout innings as a "follower" to Wei-Chieh Huang. He allowed 4 hits and 1 hit batter while striking out 1 batter. He threw 63 pitches, 46 of them strikes as the Sounds won 4-2.

**Against Opponent:** Dillard has face Round Rock twice this season and recorded 3 punchouts in both outings. His last made a relief appearance against Round Rock on April 16 this season. He allowed 4 runs on 5 hits and no walks in the 11-2 loss.
