Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds welcome the Round Rock Express to First Tennessee Park for the first of a six-game series. It's the final time the two teams will meet in the 2019 season. Tonight, right-hander Ronald Herrera starts for Nashville against left-hander Cionel Perez for Round Rock.

Ronald Herrera: 24-year-old Ronald Herrera starts for the Sounds tonight. The right-hander is making his 5th start and 7th appearance overall. In 6 games (4 starts), Herrera is 0-3 with a 14.73 ERA. He has logged 11.0 innings and has allowed 20 hits and 5 walks to go along with 12 strikeouts. He last pitched on May 20 in a start against the Express and allowed 5 runs on 7 hits (3 home runs) in 3.1 innings. Herrera missed the entire 2018 season after he had surgery to repair a torn flexor tendon on June 11. Herrera spent most of 2017 in the minor leagues, where he combined for an 8-1 record with a 1.91 ERA between the GCL Yankees East, Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton-Wilkes Barre. He served two stints with the New York Yankees and made two appearances. Herrera was traded to Texas from New York-AL in exchange for Reiver Sanmartin on November 20, 2017. He was originally signed by the Oakland Athletics on May 31, 2012.

Cionel Pérez: 23-year-old Cionel Pérez starts for the Express in tonight's tilt. The left-hander is 0-0 with a 6.51 ERA in 8 games (7 starts) for Round Rock. In 27.2 innings, he has allowed 33 hits and 18 walks to go along with 25 strikeouts. Pérez last pitched on May 19 in a start against Nashville and allowed 4 earned runs on 6 hits in 5.0 innings. He spent the 2018 season between Double-A Corpus Christi, Triple-A Fresno and Houston. In the minors, Pérez totaled a 7-1 record with a 2.08 ERA in 20 games (11 starts). He was 0-0 with a 3.97 ERA in 8 relief appearances with the Astros. In his minor league career, the Cuban-Native is 13-5 with a 3.69 ERA in 49 games (34 starts). He was signed by Houston as a non-drafted free agent on December 9, 2016.

Against Pérez: Nashville faced Cionel Pérez on May 19 in Round Rock. He has faced the following active Sounds - Cole: 1-2, RBI; Davidson: 1-3, R, 2B, 2 K; Fontana: 1-1; Granite: 0-3, R, 2 K; Moore: 0-2, 2 K; Tocci: 1-1, R, RBI; White: 0-3; Wisdom: 1-1, R, 2 BB.

A Handful of RBI for Moore: Catcher Adam Moore drove in 5 runs last night, just 1 shy of his career-high. It's the most runs a Sound has knocked in since BJ Boyd had 6 RBI on August 9, 2018 at Colorado Springs.

Comeback Kids: Nashville scored yet another come-from-behind win last night, overcoming a season-high 6-run deficit to beat the Redbirds. The Sounds have trailed at some point in each of their last 4 wins. The last time they led from start to finish was in a 6-3 win at Round Rock on May 18.

KKKKKKKKKKKKKKK: Nashville pitcher recorded 14 strikeouts last night, matching their season-high previously set on Opening Day against Iowa. Starter Wes Benjamin recorded 6 punchouts in 5.1 innings, and the bullpen quartet of Taylor Guerrieri, Wei-Chieh Huang, Kyle Bird and Brett Martin combined for 8 strikeouts in 3.2 innings.

Another Breakthrough at Home: One night after matching a season-high 8 runs at home, the Sounds scored 10 to set another season-high. The 18 runs scored in back-to-back home games is the most during a two-game stretch for Nashville at First Tennessee Park in 2019.

4 is the Magic Number: Nashville plated 10 runs last night and is now 16-12 when scoring 4 or more runs in a game, and 11-2 in their last 12 games when scoring 4+ runs. When scoring 3 or less the team is 3-16.

Cole-Fired Hot: Outfielder Hunter Cole is red-hot at the plate and has hit safely in 8 consecutive games. Since May 17, Cole is 3rd in the Pacific Coast League in hitting with a .516 (16-for-31) average. He has 11 runs scored, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 10 RBI and 4 walks during the 8-game hitting streak.

Del Pozo Punches: Sounds reliever Miguel Del Pozo was a bright spot Wednesday night. The southpaw tossed 2.0 scoreless innings and recorded every out via strikeout. Over Del Pozo's last 4 outings, he has totaled 5.0 scoreless inning while allowing only 1 hit. His ERA has dropped from 9.45 to 6.87 during that span.

Mayday: The starting pitching for the Sounds has scuffled during the month of May, compiling a 6.85 ERA (92.0 IP/70 ER) in the first 22 games. In the 92.0 innings starters have covered in May, they have issued 38 walks and have allowed 19 home runs while recording only 53 strikeouts.

Trying to Play .500 Ball in May: Through 22 games in the month of May, the Sounds are sitting at 11-11. Nashville totaled 8 wins in the entire month of April. The team has 7 games left in the month. Through the first 22 games of May, the Sounds are hitting .252, compared to .230 in April.

Jason Wood at the Helm: Jason Wood was named the 29th manager in Nashville Sounds franchise history on January 8, 2019. The California native is managing the Rangers' Triple-A team for the fifth consecutive season and has a career managerial mark of 601-564. As part of an 18-year professional playing career, Wood played for the Sounds in 2000 and 2001 and is now the second former Sounds player to return and manage the club (Marty Brown, a player in 1988-89, a manager in 2001-02).

Last Outing: Herrera last pitched on May 20 in a start against the Express at Dell Diamond. Round Rock hit 3 home runs off of the right-hander but Nashville came out on top, 8-6. Herrera went 3.1 innings and allowed 5 runs (all earned) on 7 hits and 1 walk. He struck out 3 and threw 66 pitches, 42 for strikes.

Against Opponent: Herrera has pitched against Round Rock once in his career - his last time out.
