**Tonight's Game:** The Nashville Sounds and New Orleans Baby Cakes begin their series tonight at First Tennessee Park. New Orleans got the best of Nashville last season as the Sounds went 6-10 against the Baby Cakes. Tonight, right-hander Pedro Payano starts for the Sounds against right-hander Dustin Beggs for the Baby Cakes.

**Pedro Payano:** 24-year-old Pedro Payano starts for the Sounds tonight. The right-hander is making his Triple-A debut. He has spent 2019 with Double-A Frisco, where he was 3-1 in 8 starts with a 4.43 ERA. Payano has struck out 49 batters in 44.1 innings while walking just 18. He last pitched on May 23 in a start at Corpus Christi and threw 6.0 shutout innings while allowing two hits and a walk while striking out four. He got a no-decision in Frisco's 5-4 loss in 11 innings. Payano spent his 2018 season with Frisco where he went 5-10 with a 5.54 ERA in 25 games (22 starts). The New York City native is 41-34 in his minor league career with a 3.57 ERA while covering 131 games (115 starts). He was signed by the Texas Rangers as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

**Dustin Beggs:** 25-year-old Dustin Beggs starts for the Baby Cakes in tonight's game. The right-hander is making his 8th appearance of the season for New Orleans. The Colorado Springs native is 3-1 with a 3.98 ERA and has covered 40.2 innings. He pitched in 3 games (2 starts) for Double-A Jacksonville before being promoted to New Orleans, going 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA. Beggs last pitched on May 25 versus Iowa and earned the win when the Baby Cakes won 6-3. He allowed 3 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts. He spent the 2018 season between Single-A Greensboro, Advanced-A Jupiter and Jacksonville, where he combined for a 6-5 record and allowed just a 2.12 ERA. In his minor league career, Beggs is 22-15 with a 3.42 ERA in 78 games (53 starts). He was drafted by Miami in the 16th round of the 2016 MLB Draft out of the University of Kentucky.

**Opener Against New Orleans:** Tonight's series will begin the final season for Nashville Against New Orleans due to their relocation to Wichita, Kansas next season. Nashville has clinched the all-time series against New Orleans, going 177-151. After this 4-game series, Nashville will face them next in a 5-game series in New Orleans from June 20 - 24.

**So. Much. Baseball:** The Sounds have played in four extra-inning games this season, all of which have come against Round Rock. They are 1-3 in those games. Two of the extra-inning games went at least 12 inning, including last night's game that took 4 hours and 36 minutes to complete. The Express won 13-12. The two teams totaled 38 hits (Round Rock 22, Nashville 16). The Sounds 16 hits tied a season-high (May 26 vs. Round Rock)

**An Unexpected Debut:** Infielder Tyler Depreta-Johnson was added to Nashville's roster on Wednesday, but wasn't listed in the lineup that night. He was hitting .232 with Single-A Hickory before being called up. Instead of making his Triple-A debut in the batter's box, Depreta-Johnson found himself on the mound for the 12th and 13th inning of an extra-inning marathon. Unfortunately, he was pegged with the loss as he allowed 4 runs (2 earned), 3 hits (one home run) and no walks. He did, however, strike out slugger Yordan Alvarez, who leads the league in batting average and RBI.

**Another Record Broken:** After coming into last night's extra-inning game, Tim Dillard set the franchise record in walks when he had to intentionally walk Yordan Alvarez in the 11th inning. He passed Hugh Kemp and Dillard has 208 walks for Nashville in his career.

**White's Big Series:** Nashville shortstop Eli White enjoyed a big series against the Express. White played in all 5 games and is hitting .391 (9-for-23) with 2 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 2 walks. His average has gone from .250 to .268 over the 5-game stretch.

**Homestand Summary:** Through 9 games in the 13-day homestand (not including the suspended game from April 18), the Sounds are hitting .263 (84-for-319) and are scoring 6.00 runs per game (54 R/9 G). Meanwhile, Nashville's pitching staff is 4-5 with a 5.82 ERA (85.0 IP/55 ER) with 36 walks to 75 strikeouts. The Sounds have hit 10 home runs total in the span, with two coming from Hunter Cole, Matt Davidson and Andy Ibanez each.

**Wei-Chieh Dominance:** With two more scoreless innings for Nashville, Wei-Chieh Huang has now tossed 9.0 shutout innings for Nashville. He is 1.2 innings short of tying the team's season-high scoreless innings streak (David Carpenter). Huang is 1-0 with 4 walks to 13 strikeouts with Nashville. He has limited hitters to a .111 batting average and owns a 0.78 WHIP.

**Cole-Fired Hot:** Outfielder Hunter Cole is red-hot at the plate and has hit safely in 12 consecutive games. Since May 17, Cole leads the Pacific Coast League in hitting with a .533 (24-for-45) average. He has 15 runs scored, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 13 RBI and 5 walks during the 12-game hitting streak. Cole left Tuesday night's game due to injury.

**Cole's Streaks:** In addition to his 12-game hitting streak in which he's hitting .533 (24-for-45), Hunter Cole has also reached safely in 17 consecutive games, setting the new season-high for Nashville. He has reached safely in every game beginning May 5 and is hitting .484 (30-for-62) with 17 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 16 RBI and 7 walks with a .536 on-base percentage.

**Trying to Play .500 Ball in May:** Through 27 games in the month of May, the Sounds are sitting at 13-14. Nashville totaled 8 wins in the entire month of April. They have two remaining games to finish at least .500 in the month. Through the first 27 games of May, the Sounds are hitting .262, compared to .224 in April.
