Series (W-L-T):	1-9-3	Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds and the Reno Aces are set to begin their only set of games this season tonight at Greater Nevada Field. Last season, Reno got the best of Nashville as the Sounds lost two-of-three games. Left-hander Wes Benjamin gets the ball for the Sounds against right-hander Braden Shipley for the Aces.

Series Sweeps:	0-1	Wes Benjamin: 25-year-old Wes Benjamin starts for the Sounds tonight. The left-hander is making his 12th start of the season and is 1-5 with an 7.63 ERA while covering 48.1 innings. Benjamin has yielded 52 hits and 22 walks to go with his 37 strikeouts. He last pitched on May 29 in a start against Round Rock and allowed 6 runs (all earned) on 11 hits in 5.1 innings. He got a no-decision and struck out one batter in Nashville's 13-12 loss in 13 innings. Benjamin spent the majority of his 2018 season with Double-A Frisco where he went 5-6 with a 3.62 ERA in 15 starts. The southpaw spent nearly two months on the disabled list from June 7-July 31 with a left elbow strain. Despite missing time, Benjamin led the Frisco staff in wins and ranked among team leaders in strikeouts (3rd), starts (T3rd) and innings (4th). In his minor league career, Benjamin is 22-23 with a 4.24 ERA while covering 73 games (70 starts). The Rangers drafted the Illinois native in the 5th round of the 2014 MLB Draft out of Kansas University.

June:	0-2	Braden Shipley: 27-year-old Braden Shipley starts for the Aces tonight. The right-hander is 1-2 with a 9.23 ERA in 15 games (5 starts) for Reno in 2019. He has tossed 39.0 innings and has allowed 53 hits and 21 walks to go along with 42 strikeouts. Pacific Coast League batters have a .327 batting average against Shipley. His last appearance was a start on May 29 at Albuquerque, where he allowed 4 runs on 3 hits (3 home runs) and 4 walks while striking out a season-high 8 batters in a no-decision. Shipley has played with the Arizona Diamondbacks partially in each season from 2016-2018, where he totaled a 4-6 record and a 5.49 ERA. In his minor league career, he's 38-39 with a 4.66 ERA in 146 games (111 starts). The Oregon native was originally drafted by Arizona in the 1st round (15th overall) in 2013 out of the University of Nevada-Reno.

Nashville hosted a seven-game homestand with this exact scheduling format in 2018, where the Sounds hosted the Aces from Tuesday, June 5 to Thursday, June 7 and the Rainiers from Friday, June 8 to Monday, June 11. Nashville did not fare well in that homestand, as they went 2-5, winning just one game in each series. There was also a day off before that homestand and after it.

Lead After 8:	16-0	The Road Warriors: Nashville is doing better on the road than they are at home this season, going 12-12 away from First Tennessee Park. The Sounds have a better winning percentage on the road (.500) than the Reno Aces do at home (13-15, .464). Five active Sounds batters have at least 65 plate appearances on the road (2.7 PA per game), where Zack Granite leads those hitters with a .324 average (33-for-102). Matt Davidson leads in road home runs with 9. The Sounds are hitting .257 and are averaging 5.46 runs per game (131 runs/24 games). Four pitchers have at least 16.0 IP (0.2 IP per game), with Seth Maness owning the best ERA of 3.38 and Tim Dillard having the most wins with 3. As a team, Nashville has a 6.00 ERA on the road with 180 strikeouts to 96 walks.
