Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds and Tacoma Rainiers play game two of a four-game series tonight at Cheney Stadium. It's the first and only series between the two teams in 2019. Right-hander Seth Maness starts for Nashville against right-hander Tyler Cloyd for Tacoma.

Seth Maness: 30-year-old Seth Maness starts for the Sounds in the series finale. The right-hander is 3-1 with a 4.24 ERA in 7 starts with Nashville. Maness has tossed 40.1 innings and has allowed 49 hits and 4 walks to go along with 21 strikeouts. He last pitched on June 2 in a home start against New Orleans. It was his third quality start of the season as he went 6.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 8 hits and no walks while striking out 2. The Sounds lost 7-4, breaking Maness' team win streak of 5 when he was starting. Maness spent his 2018 season with Triple-A Omaha but made only 5 appearances (1 start) and went 0-1 with a 4.63 ERA in 11.2 innings. The veteran has pitched in the big leagues with the St. Louis Cardinals (2013-16) and the Kansas City Royals (2017). In 252 Major League games, the North Carolina native is 18-10 with a 3.21 ERA. Maness is 23-11 with a 3.45 ERA in 87 games (46 starts) in his minor league career. The St. Louis Cardinals drafted him in the 11th round of the 2011 MLB Draft out of East Carolina University.

Tyler Cloyd: 32-year-old Tyler Cloyd starts for the Rainiers tonight. The right-hander is 1-4 with a 5.65 ERA in 8 starts for Tacoma in 2019. He last pitched on June 2 in a start against El Paso and was tagged with the loss. Cloyd allowed 5 runs on 7 hits and 2 walks in 4.0 innings. Tacoma lost the game, 5-3, at Southwest University Park. In 36.2 innings with Tacoma, he has allowed 49 hits and 19 walks to go along with 34 strikeouts. The Nebraska native has a career minor league mark of 72-50 with a 3.83 ERA in 230 games (178 starts). He has 27 games (17 starts) in the majors, going 5-9 with a 6.35 ERA and 85 strikeouts to 42 walks. Cloyd was originally drafted by Philadelphia in the 18th round of the 2008 MLB Draft.

2019 Standings: The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Northern Division standings in 2019: First: 1, Second: 0, Third: 4, Fourth: 57.

From the Atlantic to the Pacific: Both starters tonight began the 2019 season in the independent Atlantic League before being signed to Pacific Coast League teams. Sounds start Seth Maness made one start with High Point and earned a win, going 6.0 innings and allowed one run on three hits and a walk while striking out five batters. Tyler Cloyd had his contracted selected on April 19 by Seattle from Somerset before making an appearance with the Patriots.

Good Fridays, Bad Saturdays: The Sounds are now 7-1 on Fridays after last night's win. However, the Sounds have followed their Fridays with poor performances, going 1-6 on Saturdays. Hitters are batting .210 on Saturday versus .255 on Fridays.

Hot Chase: Chase d'Arnaud is heating up for Nashville, hitting safely in 6 of his last 8 games. Since May 29, he is batting .267 (8-for-30) with 8 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 9 RBI, 5 walks, and a stolen base. Last night's home run was d'Arnaud's 6th of the season.

Tough Times in Tacoma: Since joining the Pacific Coast League in 1998, the Sounds have played in Tacoma 49 times and own a record of 19-30. The only series win the Sounds have had in Tacoma was in 2002 when they took three of four games against the Rainiers.

Davidson on the Cusp of 200 Home Runs: Slugger Matt Davidson drilled his 17th home run of the season Thursday night, and his 199th as a professional. Davidson has 150 home runs in minor league ball and 49 in the big leagues. Davidson's 17 home runs in 2019 ranks 6th in the Pacific Coast League.

Ibanez is up to Seven: Sounds infielder Andy Ibanez has hit safely in seven consecutive games. It's the fourth time in 2019 that Ibanez has put together a hitting streak of at least five games. Since the streak started on May 29, he's hitting .414 (12-for-29) with 9 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 5 walks and 1 stolen base.

Southpaws on Deck: Nashville is scheduled to face two more left-handed starters over the next three days after facing lefties Alex Young and Anthony Vasquez the last two games. The Sounds are hitting .270 (149-for-551) as a team against left-handed pitchers in 2019. Matt Davidson has the highest batting average for a current Sound against lefties with a .309 (17-for-55) clip. The .309 average includes 4 doubles, 4 home runs and a 1.024 OPS.

Hit The Road: The Sounds collected another 8 hits last night to keep up the hot bats on the road. In 28 road games, Nashville is hitting .267 (262-for-982) as a team with an OPS of .799. By comparison, Nashville is hitting .231 (247-for-1068) as a team in 33 home games.

Tocci Time: Outfielder Carlos Tocci is swinging it well over his last 10 games to the tune of a .390 (16-for-41) batting average. In the 10-game stretch, Tocci has 9 runs scored, 1 double, 1 home run, 7 RBI, 4 walks and 2 stolen bases. His average has gone from .220 to .254 during the timeframe.

14 Straight for Davidson: Matt Davidson collected a hit and a walk last night and extended his on-base streak to 14 games - his longest of the season. He's hitting .288 (15-for-52) with 9 runs scored, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI and 10 walks with a .423 on-base percentage during the streak.

Cole-Fired Hot: Outfielder Hunter Cole is red-hot at the plate and has hit safely in 12 consecutive games. Since May 17, Cole leads the Pacific Coast League in hitting with a .533 (24-for-45) average. He has 15 runs scored, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 13 RBI and 5 walks during the 12-game hitting streak. Cole left last Tuesday night's game due to injury and was placed on the 7-day injured list Wednesday.

Cole's Streaks: In addition to his 12-game hitting streak in which he's hitting .533 (24-for-45), Hunter Cole has also reached safely in 17 consecutive games, setting the new season-high for Nashville. He has reached safely in every game beginning May 5 and is hitting .484 (30-for-62) with 17 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 16 RBI and 7 walks with a .536 on-base percentage.

Against Opponent: This is Maness' first career appearance against Tacoma.
