Tonight's Game: The Nashville Sounds welcome the Las Vegas Aviators for the first of a three-game series. It's the first and only time the two teams will meet during the 2019 season. Tonight, right-hander Tim Dillard starts for Nashville against right-hander Jake Buchanan for Las Vegas.

Tim Dillard: 35-year-old Tim Dillard starts for the Sounds in the series opener tonight. The right-hander is 4-5 with a 4.60 ERA in 17 games (7 starts) in 2019. Dillard's ERA ranks 9th-best among qualifying Pacific Coast League pitchers. He last pitched on June 7 in a start against Tacoma in which he picked up his 4th win. He allowed 2 earned runs in 6.1 innings and struck out a season-high 7 batters. Dillard is the Nashville Sounds all-time leader in innings pitched (619.1), wins (43), strikeouts (370), runs allowed (344) and walks (212) and is currently second all-time in games (226) and home runs allowed (51). In his career, Dillard has pitched in 73 big league games and 495 minor league games. He signed a minor-league free agent contract with the Texas Rangers on December 21, 2018.

Jake Buchanan: 29-year-old Jake Buchanan starts for the Aviators tonight. The right-hander is 3-4 with a 6.25 ERA in 12 starts for Las Vegas in 2019. In 59.0 innings, Buchanan has allowed 76 hits and 25 walks to go along with 38 strikeouts. The North Carolina native last pitched on June 6 against Round Rock. He was tagged with the loss in Round Rock's 26-11 win at Las Vegas Ballpark. He allowed 5 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks in 5.0 innings. He walked a pair and gave up a pair of home runs. Buchanan signed with Oakland as a minor league free agent in November of 2018 after spending last year in the Diamondbacks organization. He made 26 starts (27 games overall) with Reno and went 11-9 with a 5.17 ERA. Buchanan has Major League time with Houston (2014-15), Chicago (2016) and Cincinnati (2017). He was originally drafted by the Houston Astros in the 8th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of North Carolina State.

Welcome Back, Old Friends: Las Vegas and Nashville meet for the first time since Oakland and the Sounds parted ways this past offseason. Over the four years as Triple-A affiliate of the Athletics, the Sounds posted a 289-276 record with 1 playoff appearance (2016). 11 current Aviators are former Sounds - Paul Blackburn, Ben Bracewell, Ryan Dull, Daniel Mengden, Norge Ruiz, J.B. Wendelken, Franklin Barreto, Jorge Mateo, Sheldon Neuse, Dustin Fowler and Nick Martini. The entire Las Vegas Field Staff, led by Manager Fran Riordan, is the same as in Nashville for the 2018 season.

High-Flying Offense: Nashville pitching will have their hands full with a prolific Las Vegas offense during the three-game set. Las Vegas ranks second in the Pacific Coast League in batting average (.290), runs scored (430), doubles (145) while leading the league in triples (29). They have also hit the 6th-most home runs (93) in the league and are tied for 6th in stolen bases (47).

Pill Finding His Way as a Hitter: Since joining the team in late May, pitcher-turned-hitter Tyler Pill has hit safely in 9 of the 12 games he has played in and has a .289 (13-for-45) average. Pill has hit safely in 5 consecutive games. During the streak he's hitting .368 (7-for-19) with 4 runs scored, 2 RBI and 1 walk.

Down Home: The Sounds return home to First Tennessee Park for a seven-game homestand. The club has had its struggles at home with a 10-23 record. In the 33 games, the Sounds have averaged only 3.94 runs per game (130/33) and owns a team batting average of .231. It's the 2nd-lowest home average in the PCL, ahead of only the .227 clip Memphis is hitting at home. Of active Sounds, infielder Andy Ibanez has the best home numbers with a .310 (31-for-100) batting average.

Let's Get It Started: Seth Maness' 5 shutout innings and Pedro Payano's 1 earned run in their respective starts on the road trip continued the hot start by Nashville starters in June. Through 9 games in June, Nashville starters are 3-1 with a 3.27 ERA (41.1 IP/15 ER). They have issued 11 walks with 32 strikeouts and have allowed only 4 home runs. Relievers are 0-5 with a 5.84 ERA (37.0 IP/24 ER). Bullpen arms have issued 25 walks with 49 strikeouts and have allowed 6 homers.

17 Straight for Davidson: Matt Davidson collected a hit in the road trip finale on Monday and extended his on-base streak to 17 games - his longest of the season. He's hitting .270 (17-for-63) with 9 runs scored, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI and 11 walks with a .403 on-base percentage during the streak. Davidson is tied with Hunter Cole for the longest on-base streak by a Sound in 2019. El Paso's Ty France has the longest active streak in the PCL at 23 games.

Davidson on the Cusp of 200 Home Runs: Slugger Matt Davidson drilled his 17th home run of the season Thursday night, and his 199th as a professional. Davidson has 150 home runs in minor league ball and 49 in the big leagues. Davidson's 17 home runs in 2019 ranks 6th in the Pacific Coast League.

Tocci Time: Outfielder Carlos Tocci is swinging it well over his last 10 games to the tune of a .390 (16-for-41) batting average. In the 10-game stretch, Tocci has 9 runs scored, 1 double, 1 home run, 7 RBI, 4 walks and 2 stolen bases. His average has gone from .220 to .254 during the timeframe.

Cole-Fired Hot: Outfielder Hunter Cole is red-hot at the plate and has hit safely in 12 consecutive games. Since May 17, Cole leads the Pacific Coast League in hitting with a .533 (24-for-45) average. He has 15 runs scored, 5 doubles, 4 home runs, 13 RBI and 5 walks during the 12-game hitting streak. Cole left last Tuesday night's game due to injury and was placed on the 7-day injured list Wednesday.

Cole's Streaks: In addition to his 12-game hitting streak in which he's hitting .533 (24-for-45), Hunter Cole has also reached safely in 17 consecutive games, setting the new season-high for Nashville. He has reached safely in every game beginning May 5 and is hitting .484 (30-for-62) with 17 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 16 RBI and 7 walks with a .536 on-base percentage.

Last Outing: Dillard last pitched on June 7 in a start at Tacoma. The right-hander logged his second quality start of the season, going 6.1 innings and allowing 4 runs (2 earned) on 7 hits. Dillard walked two batters and recorded a season-high 7 strikeouts. He threw a season-high 98 pitches, 66 for strikes in Nashville's 7-5 win.

Against Opponent: Dillard is appearing against Las Vegas for the first time in 2019.
