**Tonight's Game:** The Nashville Sounds and Fresno Grizzlies play game two of a three-game series tonight at Chukchansi Park. Nashville took game one last night, 12-3. Tonight, left-hander Brock Burke starts for the Sounds against right-hander Scott Copeland for the Grizzlies.

**Brock Burke:** 23-year-old Brock Burke starts game two for the Sounds tonight. The left-hander is making his Triple-A debut after being promoted from Double-A Frisco yesterday. The southpaw went 3-5 with a 3.18 ERA in 9 starts with the Roughriders in 2019. He also made one minor league rehab start with the AZL Rangers (June 17) and Single-A Hickory (June 24). Burke's last start was on August 2 on the road in Amarillo. He earned his third win of the season and went 6.0 innings against the Sod Poodles. He allowed 1 run on 5 hits in Frisco's 5-2 win. Burke didn't walk a batter and struck out 7. Over his last three starts, Burke has allowed only 2 earned runs on 12 hits in 16 2/3 innings while recording 20 strikeouts. Burke was acquired in a three-team trade from the Tampa Bay Rays on December 21, 2018. He spent the 2018 season with Advanced-A Charlotte and Double-A Montgomery where he went 9-6 with a 3.08 ERA in 25 games (22 starts). MLB Pipeline names Burke as the Rangers #7 prospect. Tampa Bay drafted him in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft out of Evergreen (CO) High School.

**Scott Copeland:** 31-year-old Scott Copeland starts for the Grizzlies in game two of the set. The right-hander is 4-5 with a 6.62 ERA in 26 games (14 starts) with Fresno. In 84.1 innings, he has allowed 99 hits and 46 walks to go along with 79 strikeouts. Pacific Coast League batters are hitting .290 against him. Copeland's last appearance was a start against San Antonio on August 2. He got a no-decision after tossing 6.0 shutout innings in Fresno's 1-0, extra-inning loss. He scattered 2 hits and 4 walks to go with 9 strikeouts. Copeland spent his 2018 season with the New York Mets organization and pitched with 1 game with New York, 8 games with Triple-A Las Vegas and 14 games with Double-A Binghamton. He also pitched 5 games with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2015. In 225 games (203 starts) in the minor leagues, he has a career record of 74-75 with a 4.25 ERA. The Nationals signed him to a minor league contract on February 12, 2019.

**2019 Standings:** The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Northern Division standings in 2019: First: 1, Second: 1, Third: 30, Fourth: 88.

**Powerful Words of Wisdom:** Patrick Wisdom's monster game last night was his team-leading third multi-homer game of the season and the ninth in his career. Wisdom's three-hit game matched his season high and was the 30th three-hit game of his career. He also matched a season-high with three runs scored, the 10th time he has had three runs in a game in his career. Wisdom's four RBI was a season-high, just one shy of his career-high five. Since June 18, Wisdom has hit 16 home runs in 38 games, the second-most in the Pacific Coast League behind only Jared Walsh of Salt Lake with 18.

**18 Knocks:** Last night's 18-hit barrage matched Nashville's single-game high in 2019. They also had 18 hits on June 25 at Memphis and June 22 at New Orleans.

**Triple Double:** Leadoff man Zack Granite placed his name in the record book last night with a pair of triples. Granite is the 14th player to have two triples in a game for the Sounds, and first since Jorge Mateo accomplished the feat on July 24, 2018 at Las Vegas.

**Granite's 4x4 Night:** Zack Granite notched his team-high fourth 4-hit game of the season last night. His four 4-hit games represent over half of Nashville's seven individual 4-hit games. Granite scored 4 runs for the second time this year and is the only Sounds player to do so in 2019.

**Pacific Conference Parks:** Last night was Nashville's eighth game of the season in a Pacific Conference Park. The Sounds had a seven-game road trip to Reno and Tacoma from June 4-10. In the eight games, they have scored 50 runs on 86 hits with 28 extra-base hits. They are averaging 6.25 runs per game and 10.75 hits per game.

**On the Road Again:** Nashville continues a span in which they are playing 19 road games in 23 days. To date, the Sounds have played the fewest road games in the Pacific Coast League with 51. Nashville is 24-27 on the road compared to 24-38 at First Tennessee Park. Zack Granite has been the team's best hitter on the road with a .344 average (63-for-183) with 30 runs, 6 doubles, 5 triples, 2 home runs and 16 RBI.

**Davidson's Turnaround:** Infielder Matt Davidson has reached safely in 25 straight games, but his hot hitting started long before. In 49 games since June 1, Davidson is hitting .304 (58-for-191) with 28 runs scored, 12 doubles, 10 home runs and 40 RBI. In 53 games prior to June 1, Davidson was hitting .209 (40-for-191) with 32 runs scored, 8 doubles, 16 home runs and 38 RBI.

**We're Going up the Quad and to the Gymnasium:** Six Nashville Sounds have hit safely in at least four consecutive games. Christian Lopes and Patrick Wisdom have 4-game hitting streaks, Matt Davidson has hit in 5 straight, Andy Ibanez and Eli White have 7-game streaks and Nick Solak has hit safely in 8 consecutive games.

**Alternating Wins and Losses:** Since a July 24 loss at home to Oklahoma City, the Sounds have alternated wins and losses. Their last 12 games have been with the following result: loss vs. Oklahoma City, win vs. Oklahoma City, loss at New Orleans, win at New Orleans, loss vs. El Paso, win vs. El Paso, loss vs. El Paso, win vs. Albuquerque, loss vs. Albuquerque, win vs. Albuquerque, loss vs. Albuquerque, win at Fresno.

**Eli is White Hot:** Shortstop/Center Fielder Eli White has turned it around in his last seven games after a tough month of July in which he hit .161 (14-for-87) with 28 strikeouts. White has hit safely in each of his last seven and is hitting .481 (13-for-27) with 6 runs scored, 1 double, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 1 stolen base since July 31.

**Davidson's On-Base Streak:** Infielder Matt Davidson has reached base safely in 25 consecutive games, the longest on-base streak by a Sounds player in 2019. During the streak, Davidson has an on-base percentage of .373 and is hitting .320 (32-for-100) with 16 runs scored, 6 doubles, 6 home runs, 21 RBI and 5 walks. It's the second-longest active streak in the Pacific Coast League behind Oklahoma City's Gavin Lux at 31 games.
