**Tonight's Game:** The Nashville Sounds and San Antonio Missions play game two of a four-game series tonight at First Tennessee Park. Nashville won the series opener last night, 6-5. Tonight, right-hander Pedro Payano starts for the Sounds against right-hander Zack Brown for the Missions.

**Pedro Payano:** 24-year-old Pedro Payano starts for the Sounds in tonight's game. The right-hander is 2-3 with a 5.70 ERA in 10 games (9 starts) for Nashville in 2019. Payano has pitched in Double-A, Triple-A and the big leagues this year. He last pitched on August 26 in a start against the Storm Chasers in Omaha. He was tagged with the loss after he allowed 5 runs (4 earned) on 4 hits and 4 walks over 4.0 innings in Nashville's 5-0 setback. Payano has pitched in 8 games with Double-A Frisco and was 3-1 with a 4.43 ERA in 42.2 innings prior to being transferred to Nashville on May 29. He has logged 22.0 innings in the big leagues and is 1-2 with a 5.32 ERA in 6 games (4 starts). Payano spent his 2018 season with Frisco where he went 5-10 with a 5.54 ERA in 25 games (22 starts). The New York City native is 43-37 in his minor league career with a 3.69 ERA while covering 141 games (124 starts). He was signed by the Texas Rangers as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

**Zack Brown:** 24-year-old Zack Brown starts for the Missions tonight. The right-hander is 3-7 with a 5.72 ERA in 24 games (22 starts) with San Antonio in 2019. In 111.2 innings, he has allowed 133 hits and 62 walks to go along with 92 strikeouts. Pacific Coast League batters are hitting an even .300 off of him into tonight's game. Brown last pitched on August 25 in a relief appearance against Oklahoma City. He tossed 3.0 scoreless innings and allowed only 1 hit in San Antonio's 4-0 win. Brown garnered numerous awards in 2018 when he went 9-1 with a 2.44 ERA in 22 games (21 starts) for Double-A Biloxi. He struck out 116 batters over 125.2 innings and limited opponents to a .207 batting average. The Indiana native is ranked by MLB Pipeline as Milwaukee's #3 prospect. He was drafted by the Brewers in the 5th round of the 2016 MLB Draft out of the University of Kentucky.

**2019 Standings:** The Sounds have spent the following amount of days in the American Northern Division standings in 2019: First: 1, Second: 1, Third: 49, Fourth: 91.

**August Heat:** Nashville has played their best baseball in August with a 19-8 record into tonight's final game. They have the second-best record in the Pacific Coast League behind only the 21-7 mark Memphis has compiled. A win tonight would give the 2019 Sounds the third 20-win month in the last 10 years. In May of 2016, Nashville went 22-8 and in August of 2016 the Sounds went 21-9.

**Bash Brothers:** Matt Davidson (32) and Patrick Wisdom (30) are the first pair of Sounds teammates to hit at least 30 home runs in the same season. They join Fresno's Yadiel Hernandez (32) and Brandon Snyder (31), Las Vegas' Seth Brown (37) and Mark Payton (30), and Salt Lake's Jared Walsh (36) and Jose Rojas (31) as the only pair of teammates in the Pacific Coast League to eclipse the 30-homer mark.

**A Team of Power:** Nashville continues to flirt with the team home run record of 183 set in 1999, but will likely fall shy with only three games remaining. After the home runs by Andy Ibanez and Patrick Wisdom last night, Nashville has 174 home runs in 2019. They will need nine over the final three games of the season to tie the record.

**One Final Series:** The Sounds continue their final four-game homestand of the season tonight. Nashville is 28-39 at First Tennessee Park in 2019. The 28 wins are the second-fewest home wins in the Pacific Coast League, ahead of only Salt Lake's 25-42 mark. With Nashville's win in Omaha Thursday, they closed their road schedule with a 36-32 record away from First Tennessee Park.

**Climbing the Home Run Board:** Infielder Matt Davidson launched his 32nd home run of the season for Nashville Thursday night, moving into 5th all-time in single-season team history. He is tied with Renato Nunez (2017) and Chad Hermansen (1999). The home run record is 34, shared by Steve Balboni (1980) and Brian Dayett (1982). Davidson has been on a home run tear in August, hitting 8 homers in 23 games and 6 over his last 12 games. The 32 home runs are tied for 6th-most in the Pacific Coast League.

**All Sorts of Lists:** Not only is Davidson climbing the franchise leaderboard in single-season home runs, he also ranks in the top-10 on the single-season RBI list. His two RBI Thursday night gives him 96 in 2019, tied for 6th-most in team history. Mat Gamel (2011) and Brian Dayett (1982) also drove in 96 runs in a single season for Nashville. The single-season leader is Steve Balboni who drove in 122 runs in 1980.

**Congrats to Carpenter:** Nashville closer David Carpenter was named to the All-Pacific Coast League team on Monday. The team is selected through voting by the league's managers and media representatives. Carpenter leads all of Triple-A Baseball with 20 saves and is 2-0 with a 1.77 ERA (7 ER/35.2 IP) in 36 games. He is the first Sound to be recognized on the All-PCL Team since Renato Nunez in 2017, and he's the first Nashville pitcher to garner the honor since Jimmy Nelson in 2014. Carpenter is the first Sound to be named to the All-PCL team as a relief pitcher since all-time saves leader Mark Corey in 2003.

He walked 4 batters and recorded 2 strikeouts as Nashville was shutout 5-0. Payano earned his third loss of the season with the Sounds and threw 84 pitches, 46 for strikes.

**Against Opponent:** Payano pitched at San Antonio on July 16 in a start. He went 2.2 innings and allowed 5 runs on 6 hits with 4 walks and 4 strikeouts. The Sounds lost the game 6-5, but Payano earned no decision.
