#### Yesterday's Game

- ✦ The Blue Jays won their Opening Day matchup against the Threshers 5-4 in Clearwater thanks to a strong performance by T.J. Zeuch and the bullpen. Zeuch allowed 4 runs on 4 hits while striking out 5 over 6.0 innings. The Jays scored early, once in the first following a pair of singles by Josh Palacios and Logan Warmoth, once in the second on a HR by Nash Knight, and twice in the third on a double by Riley Adams and a single by John La Prise. Clearwater answered with a pair of HR, a solo shot by Jose Pujols in the third and a 3-run shot off the bat of Adam Hasely in the sixth. With the score tied 4-4 in the seventh, Ivan Castillo hit a one-out triple and scored on a wild pitch. Justin Dillon (H), Travis Bergen (H), and Kirby Snead (S) combined to hold the Threshers hitless from the seventh inning on.

- ✦ The Blue Jays held a 9-6 record against the Threshers in 2017.
- ✦ The Blue Jays clinched the North Division Wild Card on August 31, 2017 in Clearwater, defeating the Threshers 5-3 to eliminate Clearwater from playoff contention.
- ✦ As a team, Dunedin hit just .226 against Clearwater in 2017. Clearwater held an identical .226 average against Dunedin.

#### Under New Leadership

- ✦ The Blue Jays coaching staff has a new look in 2018. With manager John Schneider promoted to AA-New Hampshire and hitting coach Corey Hart with AAA-Buffalo, the Blue Jays added a pair of MLB veterans to their coaching staff.

**Manager: Casey Candaele:** Joins Dunedin for his pro managerial debut. Played 18 seasons in pro baseball, including 9 in the Majors with Montreal, Houston, and Cleveland. Finished 4<sup>th</sup> in ROY voting in 1987. Retired as a player in 2000. Worked in the Texas Rangers system as Field Coordinator and Infield/Base Running Coach before serving as the Mariners 1B Coach in 2016 and 2017.

**Hitting Coach: Donnie Murphy:** Played 9 seasons in the Majors with Kansas City, Oakland, Florida, Chicago, and Texas from 2004-2014. Retired in 2015 and served as the Lansing Lugnuts hitting coach in 2016 and 2017.

#### Top Prospects

- ✦ The Blue Jays open the season with 4 of the organization's top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline) on their roster. Leading the pack is 2017 1<sup>st</sup> round pick RHP Nate Pearson, ranked as the #4 overall prospect in the organization. Right behind Pearson is 2016 1<sup>st</sup> round pick RHP T.J. Zeuch, the #9 prospect in the organization, giving Dunedin a powerful 1-2 punch in their rotation. 2017 1<sup>st</sup> rounder SS Logan Warmoth (#5) and 3<sup>rd</sup> rounder C Riley Adams (#16) round out Dunedin's talented core.

#### Giocatore di Baseball

- ✦ Blue Jays catcher Alberto Mineo aims to become just the eighth player born in Italy to play in the Majors Leagues and only the second (Alex Liddi, 2011) player born and raised in Italy to make the bigs. Born in Gorizia, Italy (NE Italy on Slovenian border), Mineo trained at the MLB European Academy before being signed by the Cubs as a 16-year-old in 2010. Selected in the Minor League portion of the Rule 5 draft in December by the Blue Jays, Mineo slashed .278/.374/.358 with South Bend (A) in 2017.

#### 2017 Recap

- ✦ With the Florida State League Championship series canceled due to the impending arrival of Hurricane Irma, the Dunedin Blue Jays won a share of the Florida State League's title by defeating the Tampa Yankees 2-1 in a three-game North Division championship series. The Blue Jays held a 72-66 record on the season, second in the North Division, and made the playoffs as a Wild Card. Led by OF Connor Panas, the FSL's HR champ, and superprospects Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Bo Bichette, the Blue Jays led the league with 642 runs scored, more than 60 more than the next closest team.

## TODAY'S START &amp; HIGHLIGHTS:

- 2015 21st round pick out of Tennessee Wesleyan. Went 5-2 with a 1.96 ERA his final year of college, striking out 59 in 59.2 innings. Spent two college seasons at Tacoma Community College before transferring to Tennessee Wesleyan.
- Strong pro debut following the 2015 draft. Posted a 2.42 ERA at Bluefield and a 2.52 ERA in Vancouver.
- Made 17 appearances (3 starts) for Lansing in 2017 before being called up to Dunedin. Had a 3-2 record and 4.50 ERA in 40.0 innings prior to his promotion. Made 16 appearances (10 starts) for Dunedin down the stretch, posting a 4.47 ERA in 56.1 innings.
- Finished the 2017 season strong, going 2-1 with a 3.98 over 31.2 innings in the month of August.
- Pitched for the Canberra Cavalry of the Australian Baseball League in the off-season, striking out 16 batters in 16 innings. Canberra finished second, dropping a 3-game championship series to the Brisbane Bandits.
- In his most impressive professional start, threw a 9 inning complete game shutout against the West Michigan Whitecaps on 6/25/16 while with Lansing.

Travis BERGEN, LHP, #29

2017: Rk/A, 1-1, 9 G, 18.1 IP, 15 H, 6 ER, 8 BB, 22 K, 2.95 ERA

Versus Left: .167 AVG      Versus Right: .233 AVG

- 2015 7th round pick out of Kennesaw State. Threw 214.2 IP in college, posting a 3.10 ERA primarily as a starter.
- A late season add to A-Vancouver, threw 5.2 shutout innings of relief, allowing just 3 hits while striking out 7 in the 2017 Northwest League playoffs.
- Injuries kept him off the field for over 3 months of the 2017 season. Posted a 2.95 ERA in 18.1 innings between R-Bluefield and A-Vancouver, making 9 appearances and 7 starts.

Justin DILLON, RHP, #22


